SIERRA MADRE NEWS BRIEFS

From The City Manager's Report

PLANNING COMMISSION

The next Planning Commission meeting is scheduled for Thursday, January 19, 2017 at 7:00 pm. The Planning Commission will conduct a public hearing regarding Municipal Code Text Amendment 16-05 (MCTA-16-05) to amend Chapter 17.60.056-Discretionary Demolition Permit for single family dwellings and duplexes 75-years of age or older. Concerns have been raised by the Commission and community regarding the practical application of the Discretionary Demolition Permit process specific to the requirement to obtain a historical resource evaluation report and the 25% construction exemption requirement. The Planning Commission is recommending elimination of the 25% construction exemption and expanding the application of the ordinance to all structures 75 years of age or older. The Commission also amended the definition of "demolition," to include the destruction and removal, in part or in whole, of the foundation, exterior walls, roof structure, exterior framing, exterior siding, finish cladding material, porches, chimney and architectural details, thereby requiring all applications proposing one or more above to prepare a historical resource evaluation report.

The Commission will also continue a public hearing scheduled for January 19, 2017, for a certificate of appropriateness for 126 E. Mira Monte Avenue to February 16, 2017 at the request of the applicant.

STONEGATE

The Planning and Community Preservation Department is continuing to review the resubmitted applications for Hillside Development Permits and Conditional Use Permits for properties within the Stonegate development. The Department received resubmittals the week of May 9, 2016 consisting of Lots 7, 21, and 22, resubmittals the week of June 6, 2016 for Lots 1 and 2, and resubmittals the week of August 1, 2016 for lots 16, 17, 19, 25, and 26. A submittal for Lot 23 was received on September 15, 2016. The plans are in various stages of review by staff to determine if the applications are complete and to confirm if staff comments were addressed since the last submittal prior to being scheduled before the Planning Commission at a noticed public hearing.

PLANNING & BUILDING AND SAFETY ACTIVITY

The Planning and Community Preservation Department is currently processing 41 development applications.

PUBLIC WORKS RAIN/SPREADING OPERATIONS

The Water Department completed its annual maintenance of the spreading grounds just in time for the recent storm events. Between October 1, 2016 and January 12, 2017 we have received 11.8" of rain and counting. In that same period we have spread approximately 147 AF of local runoff and 118 from the Santa Anita Dam (BSA). Official BSA spreading totals will be confirmed with LA County once they are available.

Not all water can be diverted to our spreading grounds. During heavy periods of rain the County is unable to divert water to our spreading basins. Once outflow volumes are stabilized and the County is able to control discharge flows spreading operations resume. We anticipate we will be spreading water the week of July 16th, indefinitely until the dam reaches its minimum pool.

WELL DEPTH GAGE

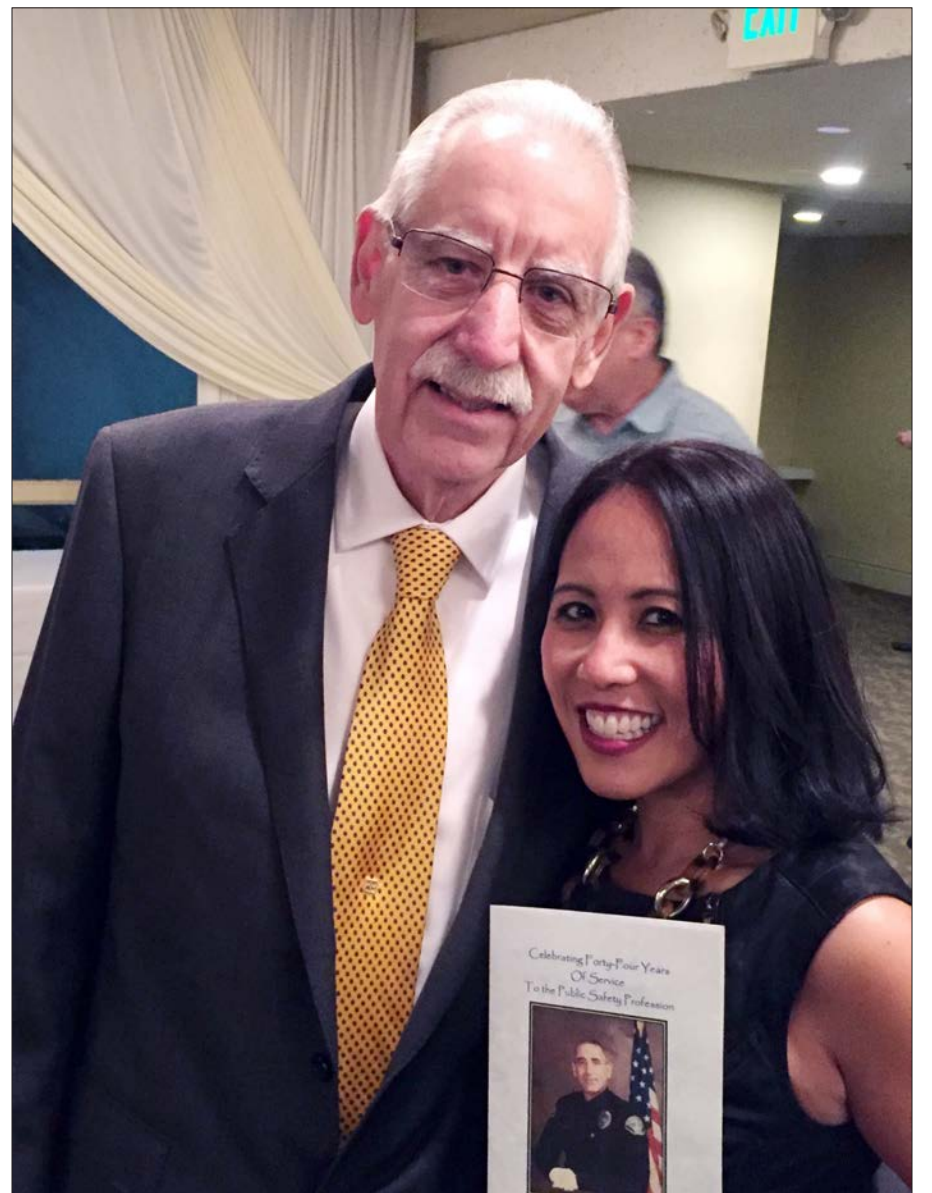
The Water Department will be evaluating the condition of the Well Depth Gauge currently on display at Sierra Vista Park with plans of relocating it to Kersting Ct. The ground water level marker will be adjusted on a weekly basis to reflect the most current water levels in the aquifer.

FLUSHING

Most of the distribution system has transitioned back to well water with the exception of a couple of areas. These include the extreme far reaches of the distribution system and a few isolated pockets where we have long detention times as well as low flow. These mainlines are among the oldest water mains composed of unlined steel pipe with heavy tuberculation. In these areas we find that flushing into the tanker is ineffective. In order to maintain water quality, in terms of color and disinfectant residual it is necessary to flush directly onto the street with a diffuser. This method allows for a much larger volume of water and flushing at the desired rate of 3.5 feet per second. (310 gallons per minute on a 6" pipe) The areas of concern include the North West portion of the distribution system, Valley Vista Drive / Acacia Street and a small pocket of zone 2 including sections of Sturtevant, Old Ranch Rd and Pleasant Hill. Flushing the in the pocket of zone 2 is diverted into the spreading grounds for groundwater recharge.

The priority will always be to use the tanker first. If the desired effects are not obtained we will have to flush with a diffuser onto the street. This is essential to maintain a healthy distribution system.

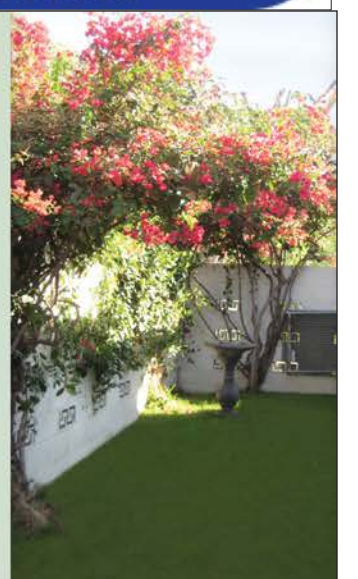

The City of Sierra Madre gives notice, pursuant to State of California law, that the City Council will conduct a public hearing to consider recommending adoption of Ordinance 1385 amending Chapter 17.08 ("Definitions") Section 17.08.020 ("Words, terms, phrases defined"), Chapter 17.60 Section 17.60.030 ("Conditional Use Permits-When Required"), and a new Chapter 17.94 ("Group Living Facilities Subject to a Conditional Use Permit"). The Planning Commission recommended approval of the proposed text amendment to the City Council at a public meeting held on January 5, 2017. The amendments would afford the City the ability to better regulate unlicensed and licensed group living facilities serving more than seven (7) residents by imposing operational and distance requirements through a conditional use permit to preserve the residential character of neighborhoods and to provide some protection to a vulnerable population in the absence of State or Federal licensing or other regulatory oversight. The conditional use requirements will establish a framework for the inclusion of housing and care facilities for people with disabilities in the City.

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: An Initial Study was prepared for the 2014-2021 Housing Element in accordance with the City's guidelines implementing the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). This Initial Study was undertaken for the purpose of deciding whether the measures identified in the Housing Element to fulfill the City's Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) allocation may have a significant effect on the environment. On the basis of the Initial Study, the Planning Commission and City Council concluded that they will not have a significant effect on the environment, and a Negative Declaration was adopted by City Council on July 28, 2013. Furthermore, the project qualifies for an exemption from the CEQA review pursuant to Title 14, Section 15061(b)(3) of the California Code of Regulations as it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility the adoption of this Ordinance may have a significant effect on the environment, because it will impose regulations and standards for unlicensed and licensed group living facilities serving seven (7) or more residents to ensure protection of the residential environment and character of the City of Sierra Madre.

APPEAL: If in the future anyone wishes to challenge the decision of the City Council in court, one may be limited to raising the issues that were raised or presented in written correspondence delivered to the City Council at, or before, the scheduled public hearing. SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY

Walking Sierra Madre...The Social Side

We are loving the rain, and you probably are, too. It's so nice to wake up at night and hear rain falling on the parched leaves of the avocado tree outside our window. Everything looks so green and beautiful around town and all the trees are looking like they might decide to live after all.

You can't really tell from the picture, but this rose is a beautiful pale yellow, which I picked yesterday morning from one of our three remaining tree roses. Yes, friends and neighbors, we have gone from an all-time high of about 80 roses 'round and about our place to 8. The spider mites have defeated me, but this rose is so beautiful I might just hang in there with the five last remaining roses below the wall. There's a big pot with nothing in it on the front terrace where I might put in another rose tree. What's that thing Albert Einstein said about insanity: "Insanity: doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results!" That's me and roses.

The orange tree has oranges and the lemon trees have lemons, but due to the drought and not enough water, they are half the size they should be and I haven't tried one of the oranges yet, but am hoping they are sweet and delicious. Maybe I'm holding off on peeling one as I'm not up for the disappointment if they aren't good.

The 50-plus year old camellia in front, that I figured was on its last legs, has two pink and white striped blossoms and many buds on it and the new camellia is covered with buds. Rain is grace, indeed! The rye grass seed our landscape maintenance expert, Gerardo, sprinkled around last Spring has sprouted with a vengeance and we have green lawn all over the place. Of course, the weeds are also sprouting alarmingly, but we're ignoring those for the moment.

Winter class session starts at Creative Arts Group on January 16th and if one of your New Year's resolutions is to try something new you've never done before, this might be a good place to start. "A Long Forgotten Tragedy... The Fever Never Lets Go"

"My Mexican partner at the time, Tomas Alvarado, called Don Tomas, and I were camped on a hillside above a gulch where we had staked our unofficial claim, and each day worked away at our dry washer, panning out the heavy sand from the bottom of the riffles, elated with the yellow nuggets and dust we found. We sold for \$20.00 per ounce, Mexican currency. The peso was worth fifty-five cents of a U.S. Dollar at that time. I was the only gringo in the community of about forty Mexicans. We packed in our food by burro, and usually our water as well, from a much larger camp fifteen miles west, near the Pacific Ocean. All in all, there were approximately 600 prospectors spread over a twenty-five mile square area that was the latest "El Dorado," who were, for the most part, a hard-bitten collection of misfits, adventurers, army deserters and criminals. Now and then, a woman would follow her man into this wild, rough country, and they were fought over or passed around. They came to provide a little comfort, and to cook for their husbands. One of these was a beauty, probably in her late teens, who kept camp for her husband, a big, very dark, pock-marked, but muscular man who certainly had more Indian than Spanish blood flowing through his veins. In the evenings after Don Tomas and I had eaten our supper and were resting by the fire, the girl, Rosita, would come down the hill and seat herself on a big mesquite log, which was our only piece of furniture, warm her bare feet by the fire and amuse us with tales of her girlhood in Mexico City; far away stories of life in a convent, innocent escapades with girlfriends, and running away with Francisco, marrying him and coming to this wilderness to find gold." 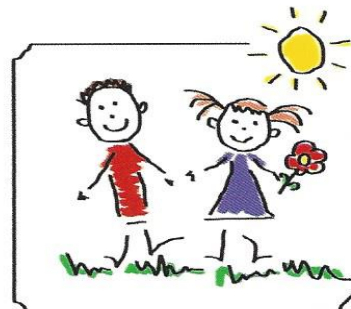

Arrests Made in Double Homicide

In response to the Jan. 6, double homicide and the injuring of two others, the Pasadena Police said they have increased patrols throughout the city. On Jan. 7, a fifth person was shot and expected to recover.

Pasadena Police detectives believe the shootings are gang related and have a nexus to the communities of Duarte and Altadena.

Special Enforcement officers have arrested 10 armed suspects, believed to be connected to local street gangs.

On January 7, at approximately 4:40 p.m., Pasadena Gang Enforcement Officers conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle with two occupants. One of the suspects fled from the car and a foot chase ensued. Ultimately, both suspects were arrested and were in possession of loaded firearms at the time of their arrests. A third suspect was arrested in relation to this investigation. All are believed to be members of gangs.

"I am extremely proud of the men and women of the Pasadena Police Department who have worked tirelessly in the pursuit of these predators and others like them who live within our community," said Sanchez. "These arrests and seizures serve as a vivid reminder that high capacity weapons are in the hands of criminals. I am hopeful that through robust police enforcement strategies, along with information sharing among law enforcement organizations, we will arrest those persons responsible for the recent murders and bring them to justice."

Council Candidates Debate Immigration

The pubic got their first chance Tuesday night to hear from candidates running for City Council Districts, 5 and 7 during a debate at Pasadena City College that included the topic the using police to enforce immigration laws.

The debate was held by the political action group, ACT and moderated by former Sierra Madre Mayor John Buchanan.

All three candidates for District 3 supported Pasadena as a sanctuary city, prohibiting the use of police to enforce immigration laws. The district has the largest Hispanic population they said.

"I don't want to see the children suffer, said Aida Morales a city activist running for District 3. "Because they are afraid right now, that they are going to be picked up at the school."

Long time District 3 City Councilmember, Victor Gordo said he knew all too well having been born in Mexico and raised in Pasadena by his family as immigrants.

Some District 7 candidates had a different view.

"A lot of gang related activity does involve some immigration issues," said Phil Hosp an attorney with an international law firm running for District 7. "And I think you're trying to cure a problem with an overly broad ordinance and would not do anything and prevent them (police) from doing their job."

Sheena Tahirramani, running for District 7, co-founder of Pasadena-based, SVN Public Relations also said she would not support an ordinance stopping police from dealing with immigration.

District 7, incumbent Andy Wilson said he did not want people thinking the police were hunting them down and praised the city for its diverse immigrant population. Krystal Lopez Padley a local writer running for District 3 said she take would take it one step further asking, "how do we safeguard our city, it's not enough to just declare us a sanctuary city... but to make sure immigrants are safe here."

"We need to send a message that is loud and clear to Washington and our county supervisors and our state capital," Witt said. "That Pasadena will have nothing to do with the potential deportation of 11 million of our friends and neighbors."

Also dealing with police, most candidates were not in favor of a civilian oversight of the department, or they danced around the subject, with the exception of Morales who simply said "yes," she wanted a Police Oversight Committee.

Councilmember John Kennedy is running unopposed in District 3 and did not participate in the debate.

ARCADIA, Calif. – The Arcadia Historical Society’s 11th “History Lives Here” historical marker, featuring the many railroads that once crisscrossed Arcadia as well as Lucky Baldwin’s stately Hotel Oakwood will be unveiled at 2 p.m. Thursday, January 26, 2017.

The marker will be unveiled at the Arcadia Transit Plaza, the former site of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway’s Arcadia Depot. Earlier this year the Foothill Gold Line resurrected train service and a station platform at the same location.

For several decades in the first half of the 1900s, three different train lines, tracks, stations, and two control towers, converged within a couple blocks of each other in Downtown Arcadia where passengers could also board the iconic Los Angeles Red Cars. Directly across the street once stood Lucky Baldwin’s elaborate Hotel Oakwood, one of the region’s finest hotels in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

The “History Lives Here” markers are just one of the many regular activities and events created

year-round by the non-profit Society and are an integral part of the Society’s mission to create broader public awareness of noteworthy historical events, people, and landmarks in Arcadia. Since the first Marker was dedicated in October 2007, others have been dedicated at Santa Anita Park, the Arboretum, L.A. County’s Arcadia Park, The Derby restaurant, Adams’ Pack Station in the Angeles National Forest, and several other historical locations in Arcadia.

The Society would like to thank the City of Arcadia for co-funding and installing this and many of the Markers.

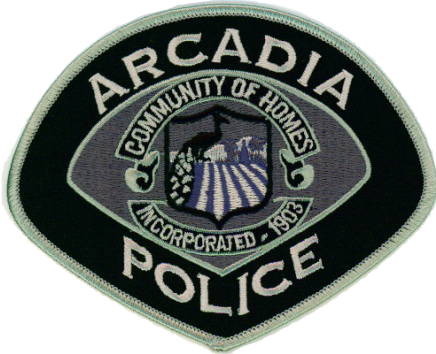

INCIDENT – FELONY GRAND THEFT

The Arcadia Police Department is committed to reducing property crimes by taking a proactive approach to catch criminals as they commit crimes. The police department has procured a number of GPS tracking devices in an effort to apprehend thieves. Detectives have partnered with citizens and local businesses by placing bait packages equipped with tracking devices, which notify police personnel when packages have been stolen.

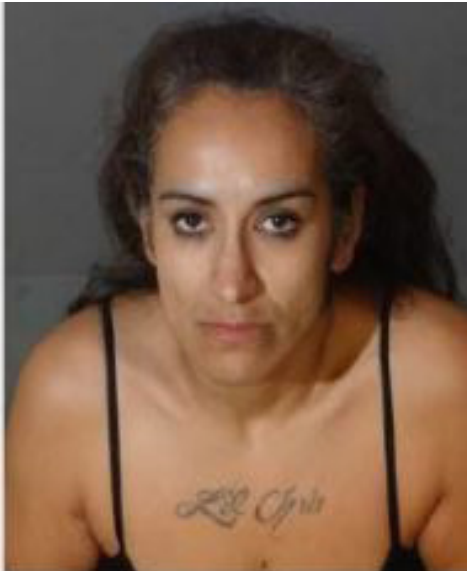

PASADENA UNIFIED ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR FRENCH DUAL LANGUAGE IMMERSION PROGRAM IN 2017-2018

Pasadena, CA -- The Pasadena Unified School District (PUSD) is accepting applications for a French dual language immersion program in the 2017-2018 academic year after a group of parents approached district officials with a proposal to add a third language to the district's successful dual language programs. PUSD currently offers dual language immersion programs in Spanish and Mandarin. "The ability to speak more than one language can enhance brain function, academic performance and business acumen," said Superintendent Brian McDonald. "As a school system committed to responding to the needs and interests of Pasadena area families, we are expanding opportunities for multilingual education that prepare our students to compete on a global scale."

Enthusiastic interest from a series of meetings with parents and an online survey prompted district officials to propose opening a French kindergarten, first, and second grade program in 2017-2018, with plans to expand the program into upper grades each year. The proposal is scheduled for discussion and action by the Board of Education in January.

Applications for the K-2 French dual language program will be accepted during the district's annual Open Enrollment-School Choice process, which is January 12 through February 3, 2017. Families of entering kindergarten students can apply for the program online at 2017.open-enrollment.info. Families of entering first and second grade students must schedule an appointment with the district's Language Assessment and Development Department at 626.396.3600 ext. 88280. All applicants who identify as French-dominant will be assessed for language fluency.

The French program will begin at Altadena Elementary School

and may be moved to another site at a later time.

Pasadena Unified's Dual Language Immersion Program launched in 2008 and expands to higher grades each year. The programs pair native and non-native speakers of the target language who access subject matter content in both English and the target language. The programs begin in kindergarten with 90 percent of instruction in the target language. Gradually the instruction shifts to 50 percent in English and 50 percent in the target language, prompting the student to master academic subjects in both. Pasadena Unified's proposal reflects a national trend as dual-language programs grow in popularity across the country. Experts estimate there are at least 2,000 in the U.S. — a jump from about 260 in 2005. A joint U.S. Department of Education-American Institutes for Research report shows 39 states and Washington, D.C. were offering dual-language education during the 2012-13 school year, with Spanish and Chinese programs cited as the most commonly used languages.

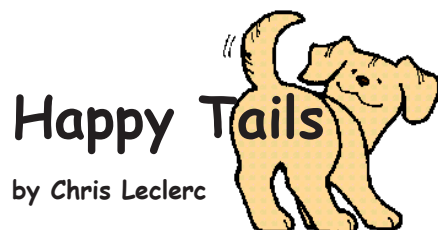

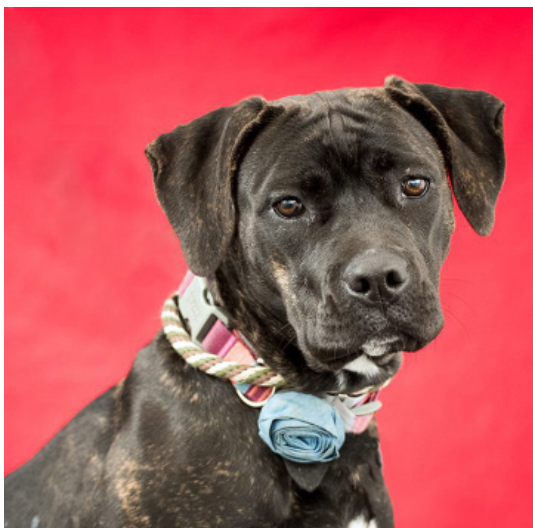

TIPPING ANOTHER VIEW

Just this past week I went to the wonderful Chop House in Pasadena, the subject of tipping came up and was asked about tipping at lunch, seems my guest is was under the impression that lunch time was no tip time, she was sure that it was 10% for lunch and %15 for dinner, if this makes sense to you please read on. My dearly departed pappy Elmer Dills would tell me, don't argue sex, politics and or religion, I must add tipping to the list. I have used this topic many times on my radio show, Dining with Dills on AM 830 KLA Radio to get the phones buzzing.

There is a new law on the books, actually an old law that is now be enforced. Starting January 1, the IRS will classify automatic gratuities as service charges that are taxable as regular wages and subject to payroll tax withholding. That might sound like a bunch of arcane tax law mumbo jumbo, but what it means is that restaurants have to treat those tips like regular wages.

Typically, the IRS left it up to the waiter or tipped employees to declare that money. But with this new change the waiter won't see those "tips" until payday—instead of the end of the shift. And restaurants will have to withhold federal income, Social Security and Medicare taxes on that money, too.

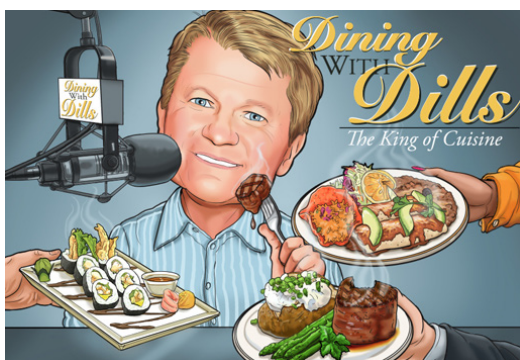
What it means for the diner is that those automatic 18% gratuity charges on tables of 6 or more may well be a thing of the past. The addition has been added onto large parties to ensure that servers are paid for catering to a large group.

That doesn't mean you should use this an excuse to start stiffing people. Remember, the minimum wage laws here in the States for tipped workers is still at a shocking \$2.13 an hour. (California thankfully pays all of it's workers, tipped or untapped, a minimum of \$10/hour.) The new rule actually went into effect in June of 2012, however the IRS postponed enforcement until January 2014 to give restaurateurs enough time to adjust and properly comply.

While it might seem great to have some freedom as a customer, the service industry isn't so excited about the idea.

Tips... To insure proper service. Here is my rundown and no it hasn't changed in twenty years of reviewing

Anyone in any country that provides a service should be rewarded.

10% buffet plus \$2 directly to busboy that brought you water and had to clean up after the kids through Jell-O on the ground.

\$1 for each drink at the bar

\$2 for a to go order, as long as they got it right

12% fair service, means they brought you the food and came back with your check

15% Good service brought you your food and drinks and refilled drinks and asked how was it

18% Very Good service all of the above plus asked you if your meal was prepared to your liking

20-25% All of the above, brought items in proper order, waited for you to ask for check, asked if there is a validation needed and please ask for me next time.

One more note... I subtract 5% when the server blames the kitchen for a mistake, got it !!

CHICKEN AND BROCCOLI STIR-FRY

Ingredients

1 pound boneless skinless chicken breast, cut into 1-inch pieces
2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
2 teaspoons finely chopped gingerroot
1 medium onion, cut into thin wedges
1 cup baby-cut carrot, cut lengthwise in half
1 cup chicken broth (from 32-ounce carton)
3 tablespoons soy sauce
2 teaspoons sugar
2 cups broccoli flowerets
1 cup sliced fresh mushrooms (3 ounces)
1/2 cup diced red bell pepper
2 teaspoons cornstarch
1 cup hot cooked Chinese plain noodles

Directions

1. Spray 12-inch nonstick skillet with cooking spray; heat over medium-high heat. Add chicken, garlic and gingerroot; stir-fry 2 to 3 minutes or until chicken is brown.
2. Add onion, carrots, 3/4 cup of the broth, the soy sauce and sugar. Cover and cook over medium heat 5 minutes, stirring twice.
3. Add broccoli, mushrooms and bell pepper. Cover and cook about 5 minutes, stirring occasionally, until chicken is no longer pink in center and vegetables are crisp-tender.
4. Mix cornstarch with remaining 1/4 cup broth; stir into chicken mixture. Cook, stirring frequently, until sauce is thickened. Serve over noodles.

HOW TO ORGANIZE YOUR AFFAIRS

Dear Savvy Senior,
My wife and I would like to get our personal and financial affairs in order so our kids will know what's going on if we get sick or die. What tips can you offer?
Procrastinating Paul

Dear Paul,
Organizing your key information and getting your personal and financial affairs in order is a great gift to your loved ones.

To help you get started, your first step is to gather up all of your important personal, financial and legal information so you can arrange it in a format that will benefit you now, and your loved ones later. Then you'll need to sit down and create various lists of important information and instructions of how you want certain things handled when you die or if you become incapacitated. Here's a checklist of areas you need to focus on.

PERSONAL INFORMATION

Contacts: Make a master list of names and phone numbers of close friends, clergy, doctors, and professional advisers such as your lawyer, accountant, broker and insurance agent.

Medical information: Include a list of medications you and your spouse take, along with any allergies and illnesses.

Personal documents: Include such items as your birth certificates, Social Security cards, marriage license, military discharge papers, etc.

Secured places: List all the places you keep under lock and key or protected by password, such as safe deposit boxes, safe combination, security alarms, etc.

Service providers: Provide contact information of the companies or people who provide you regular services such as utility companies, lawn service, etc.

Pets: If you have a pet, give instructions for the care of the animal.

End of life: Indicate your wishes for organ and tissue donation (see organdonor.gov), and write out your funeral instructions. If you've made pre-arrangements with a funeral home include a copy of agreement, their contact information and whether you've prepaid or not.

LEGAL DOCUMENTS

Will, trust and estate plan: Include the original copy of your will and other estate planning documents you've made.



Financial power of attorney: This document names someone you trust to handle money matters if you're incapacitated.

Advance health care directives: These documents (see caringinfo.org) – a living will and medical power of attorney – spell out your wishes regarding your end-of-life medical treatment when you can no longer make decisions for yourself.

FINANCIAL RECORDS

Financial accounts: Make a list of all your bank accounts, brokerage and mutual fund accounts, and any other financial assets you have.

Debts and liabilities: Make a list of any loans, leases or debt you have – mortgages owed, car loans, student loans, medical bills, credit card debts. Also, make a list of all credit and charge cards, including the card numbers and contact information.

Company benefits: List any retirement plans, pensions or health benefits from your current or former employer including the contact information of the benefits administrator.

Insurance: List the insurance policies you have (life, long-term care, home, auto, Medicare, Medigap, prescription drug, etc.) including the policy numbers, agents and phone numbers.

Property: List real estate, vehicles and other properties you own, rent or lease and include documents such as deeds, titles, and loan or lease agreements.

Taxes: Include the location of your tax records and your tax preparer's contact information.

Keep all your organized information and files together in one convenient location, ideally in a fireproof filing cabinet or safe in your home. Also be sure to review and update it every year, and don't forget to tell your loved ones where they can find it. If you need help, get a copy of "12 Critical Things Your Family Needs to Know." This is an excellent 60-page workbook available at 12criticalthings.com for \$15 or \$19 for the downloadable versions, or \$25 for a printed copy.

PREPARING THE WAY FOR THE FIRST INTERSTELLAR FLIGHT

The European Southern Observatory (ESO) has signed an agreement with the Breakthrough Initiatives to adapt the Very Large Telescope instrumentation in Chile to conduct a search for planets in the nearby star system Alpha Centauri. Such planets could be the targets for an eventual launch of miniature space probes to Alpha Centauri by the Breakthrough Starshot initiative.

The discovery in 2016 of a planet, Proxima b, around Proxima Centauri, the third and faintest star of the Alpha Centauri system, adds even further impetus to this search.

Knowing where the nearest exoplanets are is of paramount interest for Breakthrough Starshot, a research and engineering program launched in April 2016, which aims to demonstrate proof of concept for ultra-fast light-driven “nanocraft,” laying the foundation for the first launch to Alpha Centauri within a generation.

Detecting a habitable planet is an enormous challenge due to the brightness of the planetary system’s host star, which tends to overwhelm the relatively dim planets. One way to make this easier is to observe in the mid-infrared wavelength range, where the thermal glow from an orbiting planet greatly reduces the brightness gap between it and its host star. But even in the mid-infrared, the star remains millions of times brighter than the planets to be detected, which calls for a dedicated technique to reduce the blinding stellar light.

Detecting and studying potentially habitable planets orbiting other stars will be one of the main scientific goals of the upcoming European Extremely Large Telescope (E-ELT, <http://www.eso.org/e-elt>). Although the increased size of the E-ELT will be essential to obtaining an image of a planet at larger distances in the Milky Way, the light collecting power of the VLT is just sufficient to image a planet around the nearest star, Alpha Centauri.

BREAKTHROUGH STARSHOT is a \$100 million research and engineering program aiming to demonstrate proof of concept for a new technology, enabling ultra-light unmanned space flight at 20% of the speed of light, and to lay the foundations for a flyby mission to Alpha Centauri within a generation.



The Starshot concept envisions launching a “mothership” carrying about a thousand tiny spacecraft (on the scale of centimeters) to a high-altitude orbit and then deploying them. Ground-based lasers would then focus a light beam on the crafts’ solar sails to accelerate them one by one to the target speed within 10 minutes.

If an Earth-size planet is orbiting within the Alpha Centauri system’s **habitable zones**, Breakthrough Starshot will try to aim its spacecraft within 1

astronomical unit (the Earth-Sun distance, or 93 million miles) of it. From that distance, a craft’s cameras could potentially capture an image of high enough quality to resolve surface features. The fleet would have about 1000 spacecraft, and each one (dubbed a StarChip) would be a **very small centimeter-sized vehicle** weighing a few grams. The spacecraft would be propelled by a square-kilometre array of 10-kilowatt ground-based **lasers** with a combined output of up to 100 gigawatts.

Each spacecraft would transmit data back to Earth using a compact on-board laser communications system using its solar sail as an antenna and the propulsion array as the receiver. A swarm of about 1000 units would compensate for losses caused by interstellar dust collisions en route to the target.[]

“THE LORD OF THE FLIES”

A plane crashes on some remote island, and only the British school children survive. A classic story of survival begins. The boys –after having attended not a single “survival school” -- learn to hunt, make shelters, make fire (using Piggy’s spectacles, or eye glasses), and to enjoy themselves. After all, with all the adults gone, there’s no one to enforce rules, so we do what we want, right? Then the battle for power begins. One side is for some sort of orderly life, and the other side wants to live by rule of might.

“Lord of the Flies” has been widely viewed and widely discussed. What does it mean? What does it tell us about our basic human nature? Is our desire to do good and cooperate with others a skill that must be learned and maintained? Are we essentially animals who need to learn to control our animal natures?

The movie (and book) begins with the boys experiencing a sort of innocent paradise, as they swim and cavort and learn about foods in their adult-free world. The obvious need for leadership results in a vote between Ralph, who represents order and the rule of law, and Jack, who represents immediate fulfillment of desires, power, and even savagery. Ralph wins the election.

In the beginning, Ralph and Jack are not depicted as being all that different. Indeed, they are friends. Ralph is set on doing the best for all, helping the weak, making sure that everyone is fed. Jack seems more intent on his own power ambitions.

A conch shell is chosen as a sign of leadership, and an indication of who has the “floor” during meetings. But Jack forms his own band and moves away from Ralph. Jack chooses to disregard the blowing of the conch. That choice leads to further division and animosity. Eventually, the conch is destroyed when a boulder rolls onto it, symbolizing the loss of one of the symbols of their chosen civility, somewhat akin to someone in a board meeting tossing the gavel out the window.

Jack’s group steals Piggy’s specs to make fire, another strike at cooperation and civility. Jack’s group also lets the signal fire go out, showing that Jack has lost his focus of trying to get off the island.

In analyzing The Lord of the Flies, countless analogies have been used to describe the social dichotomy that it depicts, such as users vs. takers, or producers vs. consumers, or urban vs. rural, or primitive vs. civilized, etc. Perhaps it is the same old story of Cain vs. Abel, or the farmers vs. the ranchers. The story has even been used to illustrate political parties in various countries. But is it that simplistic?

Jack and his group finally devolved to the point where murder was justified. Jack and his group started to hunt Ralph. Jack’s desire for total power would be solidified with the elimination of Ralph (the last opposing force). As Jack’s group chases Ralph along the beach, they all confront a force they all have to reckon with – the rescuing sailors. The sailors are tall, dressed in white, somber. It’s as if the children butted up against the gods of the universe, and now the day of reckoning comes.

A group of men landed on the island and watch in amazement at the behavior of the “children”. The look on the children’s faces express their thoughts. Jack realizes his reign as a petty tyrant in his island empire is over; Ralph is relieved his life is saved, and now he’ll be going back to his real home.

We see something in the childrens’ faces: now they have to account for their actions to a higher power. The choices that each of us make in life have ramification that ripple through our lives. “Ralph” and “Jack” represent the choices we make. What legacy will we leave? What actions will we ultimately be accountable for when the sailors get to shore?

The amateur film-makers who created the original “Lord of the Flies” did so during the boys’ summer vacation. They tracked the lives of the boys who acted in this movie, and the boy-actors were all high achievers in their personal lives. The boys later related that making the movie deeply affected them. Even though it was described as “just a movie,” many of the boys realized in their personal adult lives that it was far better to work hard to choose the upward, inclusive way of Ralph, rather than to ever find oneself descending into Jack-ness.

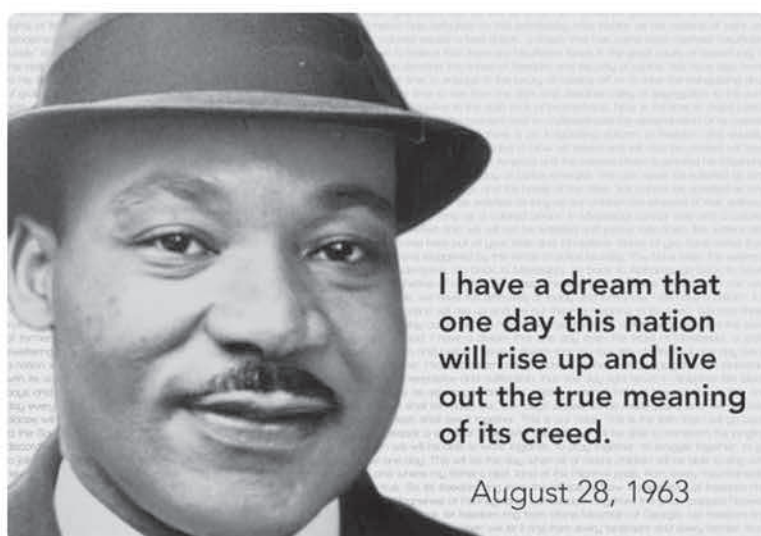

CMT: COMMUNITY MEDIATION TEAM WORKING FOR OUR COMMUNITIES

The Community Mediation Team is a partnership of Committed Monrovia, Duarte and L.A. County Leaders and Stakeholders who identify, assess, and address the needs of individuals and families, who reside or work in our communities, through effective communications and proper resource matching. CMT, a grassroots team is, open to all community members and is a safe venue for discussion and information sharing.

The Meeting Facilitators are Larry Spicer, Co-Chair Monrovia, Lois Gaston, Co-Chair Duarte, and Lillian Cabral, Co-Chair from the County area.

Larry Spicer is Monrovia's Mayor Pro tem; Lois Gaston, past Duarte Mayor and Council Member. Other elected officials included Duarte Mayor Margaret Finlay, Mayor Pro-Tem John Fasana, Council Members Tzeitel Paras-Caracci and Liz Reilly, Duarte School Board Member Tom Reyes, and Monrovia-Arcadia -Duarte Town Council Vice Chair/ Monrovia School Board Vice President Terrence Williams.

Law Enforcement included Monrovia Police Chief Jim Hunt, Captain Alan Sanvictores and Chaplain Terrence Brown; from the Sheriff's Department Temple Station Commander Captain Corone Jacob, Sgt. Kearny from the Duarte Station, and Lt. Bishop and Sgt. Richardson from OSS (Operations Safe Street).

Kevin Paris from the Probation Department, and members of the Clergy, various agencies and concerned citizens attended from Pasadena and Altadena.

Monrovia Police Chief Hunt gave a briefing on the December 28 shooting on Alta Vista Drive. (Please visit this publication's website mtnviewsnews.com)

LASD Captain Jacob related that Temple Station is working with Altadena Station, and Pasadena PD concerning the area shootings. OSS Lt. Bishop said that the Sheriff's Department has pulled personnel from other areas and there have been 8 additional detectives on Saturday and 10 on Sunday following the shooting in Duarte. This was reiterated by Brian Villalobos from Duarte Public Safety Office.

Normally these meetings are on Mondays at 5:30 pm; this emergency meeting was called on a Wednesday because of the recent increase in shootings in our areas. Aida Torres from the Public Safety Office explained that the City of Duarte is applying for a special grant that would last from June 16, 2017-August 15, 2020. It would provide Mental Health Services and Substance Use Disorder Treatment and Prevention Programs for people in the Criminal Justice System.

To apply for this grant funding, the City of Duarte must develop a Local Advisory Committee that includes local stakeholders who have experience and expertise in the prospective programs and/or services to be implemented by the proposal.

Duarte Public Safety Office is asking for help to reach all stakeholders impacted by the proposal to join them. They need representatives with knowledge on Adult Education, community trade schools, Housing Mental Health Professionals and more. The next meeting of the CMT-Community Mediation Team is 5:30 pm, Monday, January 23, 2017. The meeting usually lasts an hour. Immediately following the CMT meeting, the Proposition 47 Local Advisory Committee will meet. Please contact Aida Torres at the Duarte Public Safety Office for further information. COUNTY VOTES TO EXPAND "MENTAL EVALUATION TEAMS" AND ESTABLISH MENTAL HEALTH "TRIAGE HELP DESK"

LOS ANGELES COUNTY – To help prevent use-of-force incidents and improve outcomes for individuals with mental health issues, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved a motion by Supervisors Kathryn Barger and Mark Ridley-Thomas which seeks to expand the number of Mental Evaluation Teams (MET teams) from 10 to 23.

"Proactive and compassionate engagement that includes a mental health expert will reduce confrontations and provide access to treatment for individuals in crisis instead of incarceration," said Supervisor Barger. "Expanding this vital program will also help law enforcement in its effort to avoid use of deadly force, protect the public, save lives and money."

"These MET teams provide a proven and effective approach in dealing with individuals suffering from mental illness," said Supervisor and Board Chairman Mark Ridley-Thomas. "It makes perfect sense that we expand this program to ensure success throughout the County."

MET teams consist of a mental health clinician paired with a Sheriff's Deputy who respond to emergency calls involving psychiatric crisis or critical incidents and provide immediate assistance to those in need. Los Angeles County was the first in the nation to develop co-response teams as a pilot program in the early 1990s. Since MET service began in January, 1993, the Department of Mental Health has partnered with 35 law enforcement agencies, including the Los Angeles Police Department, to develop more than 80 co-response teams.

MET teams responded to 1,154 calls for service during FY2015-2016. Of these calls, 64% resulted in hospitalizations for mental health treatment and less than 1% resulted in an arrest proving that these teams reduce adverse outcomes and prioritize treatment over incarceration.

Recent publicized reports describing con-frontations between law enforcement personnel and individuals with untreated mental illness reveals the severity of the problem. Although most interactions between law enforcement and those with mental illness end peacefully, it is estimated that 10% of law enforcement calls involve individuals who are mentally ill -- and such interactions carry a high risk. In situations where minor crimes are driven by mental illness, rather than criminal tendencies, diversion into treatment -- including psychiatric hospitalization -- is a more effective response.



SOMETHING 'FISHY' MAY BE GOING ON AT L.A. SUSHI RESTAURANTS

Next time you order halibut, red snapper or yellowfin tuna at a sushi restaurant in the Los Angeles area, you may want to ask for proof of what's on your plate.According to a four-year study published on Wednesday by researchers at the U.C.L.A. and Loyola Marymount , nearly half of the fish served at more than two dozen highly-rated sushi restaurants in the city is mislabeled."Half of what we're buying isn't what we think it is," said Paul Barber, a UCLA professor who led the study."Fish fraud could be accidental, but I suspect that in some cases the mislabeling is very much intentional, though it's hard to know where in the supply chain it begins."Demian Willette, co-author of the study, said that while mislabeling of food is nothing new, what was surprising was that it would be so prevalent, especially in a food-conscious market like Los Angeles."We didn't really expect that because Los Angeles is a very foody culture and in general people are very conscious about what they eat." Willette said the study, conducted between 2012 and 2015, looked at 26 sushi restaurants that were highly rated on the reviewing sites Yelp and Zagat.Biology students at UCLA were sent out to the restaurants over the four years to collect samples of 10

popular varieties of fish used for sushi. The samples were then tested for DNA.Willette said of 364 samples tested, 47 percent showed that the sushi was mislabeled.About the only sure bet was salmon, which was mislabeled only about one in 10 times, and bluefin tuna which was never swapped for a different kind of fish."But out of 43 orders of halibut and 32 orders of red snapper, DNA tests showed the researchers were always served a different kind of fish," the study says.Yellowfin tuna was also swapped on seven out of nine orders, usually for bigeye tuna, a vulnerable and overexploited species."In some cases, the same restaurant was substituting multiple fish on menus," Willette said. "So say they would propose three types of tuna when they actually served the same type."He said halibut was often swapped for cheaper species of flounder considered overfished or near threatened while red snapper was substituted for sea bream.Some of it is price, and some of it is regulations and wholesalers," he said.One piece of advice from L.A. Health Dept." I would say if you're going to a sushi restaurant, probably avoid the halibut and red snapper," he said. "Eat salmon because salmon is almost always salmon."

TOM Purcell**A TRILLION REASONS WHY U.S. DEBT IS INCOMPREHENSIBLE**

Get this: The U.S. Treasury says that America's debt grew by another trillion dollars in 2016.

If you're like me and you find it difficult to grasp how much a trillion really is, econ4u.com, an educational project of the nonprofit Employment Policies Institute, offers a mind-blowing illustration.

"Let's say someone told you to wait for something. If you waited one thousand seconds, it'd only take about seventeen minutes. If you waited one million seconds, you'd have to wait about 11 1/2 days. But if you waited one trillion seconds, you'd have to wait 31,688 years."

Heck, I remember the old days when a billion used to be a number so big nobody could comprehend it.

One billion hours is equal to more than 114,000 years — which would take us back to the Stone Age.

Not long ago, we measured our national debt in billions of dollars. Now we do so in trillions of dollars — numbers that are extremely difficult to comprehend.

Consider: One trillion is equal to 1 thousand billion. If you had \$1 trillion in cash, reports econ4u.com, you could buy 282 billion Big Macs, or 3.1 million Ferrari 599 GTBs, or 769 new Yankee Stadiums, or 28,571 flights into space as a tourist, or 66.7 billion copies of Oliver Stone's "Wall Street."

If you had \$1 trillion in debt and paid it back at the rate of \$10 million a day, it would take you 273 years — on an interest-free loan.

Our federal deficit has been averaging nearly \$1 trillion a year since the collapse of 2008 — causing us to rack up around \$8 trillion in new debt during President Obama's administration.

To cover our nearly \$4 trillion annual budget, the U.S. Treasury spends about \$1 billion every two hours — accumulating \$1 billion in new debt about every eight hours.

Still not comprehending how much \$1 trillion is? Then you'll like this description by Bill Bryson, one of my favorite authors, from his book "Notes from a Big Country."

Bryson asks his readers to guess how long it would take to initial and count 1 trillion \$1 bills if you worked without stopping.

"If you initialed one dollar per second," writes Bryson, "you would make \$1,000 every seventeen minutes.

After 12 days of nonstop effort you would acquire your first \$1 million. Thus, it would take you 120 days to accumulate \$10 million and 1,200 days — something over three years — to reach \$100 million. After 31.7 years you would become a billionaire. But not until after 31,709.8 years would you count your trillionth dollar."

We all understand that very large numbers are OK so long as they add up. So long as we have trillions of dollars coming in to the government to balance out the trillions of dollars we have going out, we should be OK — but we haven't been OK.

Regardless of what you think about President-elect Donald Trump and our new, Republican-controlled House and Senate, you'd better hope their policy changes unleash the pent-up economic vitality of our country.

You'd better hope we double Obama's 1.9-percent average growth rate so that we can generate the government receipts we need to pay our debts and meet our obligations.

Hey, our national debt is almost \$20 trillion, for goodness' sake — that's 20,000 billion dollars.

If you still can't comprehend how big our debt is, consider this slightly modified illustration from econ4u.com:

If the U.S. government printed \$1 million bills, "a whole bathtub's worth of them wouldn't equal a trillion dollars." And 20 bathtubs full of \$1 million bills still wouldn't be enough to cover our national debt.

**LEFT TURN/RIGHT TURN****JOHN L. MICEK****THE CIRCUS IS NOW THE STANDARD**

Just nine days before becoming Leader of the Free World, President-elect Donald Trump wasn't talking about economic policy. He wasn't talking about global security or how he plans to improve the welfare of nearly 319 million Americans.

Instead, he kept cozing up to a dictator, scorned a free press and the idea of government transparency and upped the ante in his ongoing beef with the nation's intelligence community.

Welcome to the circus - and to America's new normal: A vain, combative and self-involved leader who's given to referring to himself in the third person, name-dropping all the people who like him, and who thinks no story - the one about himself - is more important to the civic life of the nation.

In his first news conference since the election, Trump, the incoming chief executive, sounded a lot like candidate Trump, reiterating pledges to build a border wall on America's southern border (and to make Mexico implausibly pay for it); to be the "greatest jobs president that God ever created" and to simultaneously repeal and replace Obamacare - without offering any clue on how that might happen or what might replace it.

The ostensible purpose of the 90-minute news conference at Trump Tower in Manhattan was to discuss how Trump plans to disentangle himself from his myriad of business interests and turn the day-to-day management of them over to his sons.

But surprising no one, it was hijacked by the bombshell news Tuesday that Trump had been told about an uncorroborated report that the Russian government holds compromising information on him.

Trump denounced the release of the report "as a disgrace," calling BuzzFeed.com, the online news organization that made the controversial decision to publish it "a failing pile of garbage" that will "suffer the consequences" for running the dossier of allegations claimed to have come from a former British intelligence officer.

Comparing the leak to "something Nazi Germany would have done," Trump used a Russian government statement to defend himself against the allegations included in the dossier.

Russian "President [Vladimir] Putin put out a statement today that this fake news was fake news," Trump said, gobsmackingly adding that he "respected" the Russian government for that action.

Backhandedly, he also credited some news organizations for deciding against running it.

"They looked at that nonsense that was released by maybe the intelligence agencies, who knows, which would be a tremendous blot on their record if they did that," Trump said, keeping up his ongoing and very public dispute with the nation's intelligence community. "A thing like that should never have been written and it certainly should have not been released."

In what may have been his strongest language to date, Trump mildly scolded Putin for the hacking, saying he "shouldn't do it." But he stopped well short of an outright condemnation.

"I think it was Russia, But I think we also get hacked by other countries and other people," he said, referencing the 2015 cyber-attack on the federal Office of Personnel Management that compromised the identities of 22.1 million people.

Sadly, but not surprisingly, Trump continued to speak warmly of an ex-KGB thug backing Bashar Assad in Syria, saying that "if Putin likes Donald Trump, guess what folks, that's an asset not a liability."

"I hope I get along with Vladimir Putin," said Trump, who actually praised the information about Hillary Clinton brought to light by an act of cyber-terrorism by a hostile foreign government.

"If I don't do you honestly believe Hillary would be tougher on Putin than me? Does anyone believe that? Give me a break," he bragged.

The bravura performance was interrupted halfway through by a long monologue by Trump's attorney, Sheri Dillon, who offered tortured explanation of how Trump will disentangle himself from his business dealings.

In short, he'll turn his companies over to his sons, but won't totally divest himself of them.

Incredibly, Trump still doesn't seem to think that the inevitable conflicts arising from such an action are what they are: A looming minefield of scandal and corruption.

"I could run my business and run the government at the same time," he said. "I'd be the only one who could do that."

Then, just for good measure, he picked a fight with CNN's Jim Acosta, refusing to take the reporter's questions and dismissing the cable network as "fake news," even though it did not publish the intelligence dossier.

Taken together, Trump's public statements at his first news conference in 168 days clearly signaled how he intends to govern: It's not about the voters. It's not about accountability. It's all about him.

CHRISTINE FLOWERS**NAVIGATING THE SEAS OF RACIAL DIFFERENCES**

I don't usually live my days according to a particular theme. No planning goes into them, unless I'm celebrating a birthday or some other exceptional event. But every now and then, in a sort of strange serendipity, the day comes together around people, places and ideas that have a strange symbiosis. So it was last Tuesday.

First, on the radio, there was the confirmation hearing of Jeff Sessions or, as the Democrats insisted on calling him, Jefferson Beauregard Sessions, just to make sure we recognized his despicable Dixie pedigree. It was similar to all of those conservatives who insisted on calling our president "Barack Hussein Obama" to remind us of, well, you know what.

It seemed as if Sessions was on trial for his past as a man of a certain age raised in a certain place, during a certain time. If you dig deeply enough into the histories of Southerners who came of age in the 1950s and 1960s, you inevitably find traces of horrible words spoken, troublesome associations made, jokes that weren't funny and an insensitivity born of the historical moment. Sessions is a product of his past. And yet, others testified to his change of heart, his prosecution of racist men in white sheets, his befriending of men and women of color and a colorblind style of mentoring.

After that, on the same radio station, I heard that Dylann Roof, a man who murdered innocent black churchgoers in an effort to start a race war in South Carolina, had been sentenced to death. Even those who oppose the death penalty had to feel some sense of justice in that. And I do not oppose the death penalty.

Later that evening, I went with a friend to see the movie "Hidden Figures," about the African American female trailblazers at NASA who played a critical - and, until recently, unknown - role in the space program. There is a scene at the end of the movie in which John Glenn basically refuses to get in the Friendship 7 capsule until one of those black "computers" played by Taraji P. Henson does the numbers in her head and calculates the accuracy of his splashdown. It might have been Hollywood, but it sent chills down my spine.

And then I came home, turned on the TV and watched President Obama's speech, the one I'd had the presence of mind that morning to DVR. It was moving, as most of his speeches are, and particularly compelling because it was the last major address he'd give the American people as an occupant of the White House.

I won't get into the substance because I disagree with so much of his agenda. I did not vote for him, and I'm at peace with that. But he made the attempt, as he usually does, to rise above the partisan labels and talk to us as Americans. Some who were already predisposed to find fault heard him criticizing "us" or "them" and dismissed his words as just another late and final dig against Trump voters. I didn't hear that, even though I absolutely heard his disdain for them in the past.

What I noted in the speech, and it could have been entirely of my own imagining, was a wistfulness at how close we Americans come to perfection and then willfully step away from it. Of course, one man's perfection is another man's Obamacare, but I think that, generally speaking, we spend more time hating than debating, more time whining than shining, more time inciting than uniting.

Looking at those attacking Sessions, I saw unforgiving avengers who really just wanted to fight the Civil War all over again. Then, when I heard about Roof's sentencing, I saw the real face of racism and understood why some might still be armed for battle.

Watching that movie with those gentle, dignified women made me think of my father who, when he went to Mississippi to register black voters in 1967, encountered courage in the oppressed and oppression from the cowards. That quiet dignity, steel-backed and patient, makes the coarse, divisive chants of "No justice, no peace" seem like the work of spoiled, embittered children. Black lives do matter, of course, but so do good manners.

Which brings me to Obama. The words of this man, who has been accused of fomenting racial divisions by people on both sides of the color divide, were reminiscent of the dignified rhythms of the past. Tuesday was a day when old racists were challenged and redeemed, when murderous bigots were put down, when hidden figures of historic importance were finally illuminated and when the first black president, with trepidation and his own brand of hope, passed the baton.

And we, imperfect but with promethean potential, pick it up. And move on.
