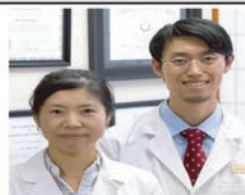

### Body of missing South Pasadena boy found

The body of a missing 5-year-old boy was found last week near Lake Cachuma in Santa Barbara County. Officials said the remains of Aramazd Andressian Jr. were discovered June 30 after police received new information on the case. Andressian Jr. had been missing since April.

Aramazd Andressian Sr., the boy's father, has been charged with his murder. Andressian Sr. pled not guilty to the charge and is due back in court August 16. His bail was set at \$10 million.

Andressian Sr. was arrested late last month in Las Vegas after authorities feared his was planning to flee the country.

## Council to Hear Panda Inn Predevelopment Plan

The city council is set to hear Monday night, for the first time, plans for a large multiuse project on Foothill Boulevard that include the remodel and expansion of Panda Inn restaurant, the construction of 258 multi-family units, remodeling of the existing CFT Gateway Center office building and adding additional parking to the area.

The report is for information only and the council will take no action.

According to the city staff report the site, on the south side of East Foothill Boulevard, between Halstead Street and Rosemead Boulevard, consists of three parcels of land and has a total size of approximately 4.3 acres (187,410 square feet). The site is currently developed with a one-story, 7,400 square foot commercial restaurant building, an 11-story, 121,590 square foot office building, and surface parking areas for the buildings.

The proposed project includes:

- Construction of a 258-unit multi-family residential (Urban Housing) complex consisting of two buildings totaling 239,168 square feet;
- Remodel of an existing one-story, 7,400 square-foot Panda Inn Restaurant building and a 535 square-foot addition, resulting in a 7,935 square-foot restaurant;
- Exterior remodel of the first

and second floors of the existing CFT Gateway Center office building; and

- 737 parking spaces, including spaces for the existing office building-provided in two levels of subterranean parking, two levels of above-grade podium parking, one level of at-grade podium parking, and at-grade surface lots.

The number of residential units proposed with this project is 258 units; 26 of the units would be provided as on-site affordable housing units pursuant to the Inclusionary Housing Requirements of the Zoning Code.

The next steps for the project include, Public hearings before the Design Commission are required for the proposed project. In addition, an environmental review would occur consistent with the requirements of CEQA. The following identifies the steps in the review process:

- Conduct environmental review per CEQA;
- Concept and Final Design Review by the Design Commission.

Pursuant to the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), an environmental review of the project would occur to analyze the project's potential environmental impacts, as identified by State and local

environmental guidelines. At this time, it is not known what level of review will be required according to the report.

The Design Commission will be the review authority for the environmental review.

The city council meets Monday at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chamber, Pasadena City Hall 100 North Garfield Avenue, room S249. The agenda allows for public comment on the issue at the time of the report.

## DUI and Driver License Checkpoint on Friday

Pasadena Police Department Traffic Unit will be conducting a DUI/Driver License Checkpoint on Friday, between the hours of 7:00 p.m. to 2:30 a.m.

Officers will be looking for signs of alcohol and/or drug impairment, with officers checking drivers for proper licensing, delaying motorists only momentarily. When possible, specially trained officers will be available to evaluate those suspected of drug-impaired driving, which now accounts for a growing number of impaired driving crashes.

DUI Checkpoints like this one are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests, affording the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence. Locations are chosen with safety considerations for the officers and the public.

Drivers are encouraged to download the Designated Driver VIP, or "DDVIP" free mobile app for Android or iPhone. The DDVIP app helps find nearby bars and restaurants that feature free incentives for the designated sober driver, from free non-alcoholic drinks to free appetizers and more. The feature-packed app even has social media tie-ins and even a tab for the non-DD to call Uber, Lyft or Curb.

Drivers caught driving impaired can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to include jail time, fines, fees, DUI classes, license suspensions and other expenses that can exceed \$10,000 not to mention the embarrassment when friends and family find out.

Funding for this checkpoint is provided to Pasadena Police Department by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, reminding everyone to 'Report Drunk Driver - Call 9-1-1'.

While in Congress, Attorney General Becerra was the first Latino to serve as a member of the powerful Committee on Ways And Means, served as Chairman of the House Democratic Caucus, and was Ranking Member of the Ways and Means Subcommittee on Social Security. Becerra stepped down from Congress to assume the office of state Attorney General.

## New Invasive Mosquito Species Found In Pasadena

Eggs from the Aedes albopictus mosquito that can infect humans with viruses such as Zika, dengue and chikungunya have been found in monitoring traps in Pasadena, the Pasadena Public Health Department (PPHD) announced today.

Health Officials emphasized there are no reported cases of locally transmitted Zika or the other two viruses by this type of mosquito in Pasadena.

"It is important for the public to be aware of the presence of this mosquito, which is different than the local variety of the insect, and to take steps now to help protect yourself and your family against these mosquitoes," PPHD Health Officer Dr. Ying-Ying Goh said.

More than a dozen mosquito egg traps have been placed throughout Pasadena by the San Gabriel Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District (SGVMVCD) and four traps tested positive for eggs indicating that the Aedes albopictus mosquitoes,

commonly called the Asian tiger mosquito, are now in Pasadena. Positive identification was confirmed on June 21.

Additional action steps to take to fight against all types of mosquitoes include:

Empty, scrub clean with hot water, turn over, cover--or throw out--unused outdoor items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths or flowerpots.

Keep swimming pool water clean, sanitized and filtered. Same with ponds or birdbaths.

Wear insect repellants containing DEET when outdoors.

Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants when outdoors if weather permits.

Check window and door screens for holes, repair or replace.

When traveling, choose lodging that has air conditioning and screens.

## STAFF ASSESSING INTERIM OLD TOWN PARKING ADJUSTMENTS, PROPOSED PARKING TIME LIMIT ENHANCEMENTS SET FOR MOTAB CONSIDERATION ON JULY 11, 2017

During the past few months, staff has been assessing a variety of different parking adjustments in Old Town to respond to merchant inquiries regarding possible ways to improve the overall parking situation. As part of our assessment, there are several short-term, medium-term, and long-term projects that have been identified, and on July 11, 2017, several of the short-term Old Town parking adjustments will be presented for review. Those adjustments include:

- Begin offering valet parking in Old Town
- Make adjustments to inconsistent red curb markings on Lime Avenue, just east of Myrtle Avenue
- Increase on-street parking time for spaces located on Lime Avenue and Lemon Avenue

(between Ivy Avenue and Myrtle Avenue) from 90 minutes to 3 hours.

Begin merchant education program encouraging merchants and employees to park in the Paragon and Colorado Commons parking structures.

These proposed interim Old Town parking adjustments are relatively simple changes that can be made in short order pending review and consideration by MOTAB. Concurrently, the City is continuing to develop other proposed parking improvements, which includes identification of private parking lots that could be jointly used for public parking and making capital upgrades in Old Town. We will continue to work on developing these concepts!

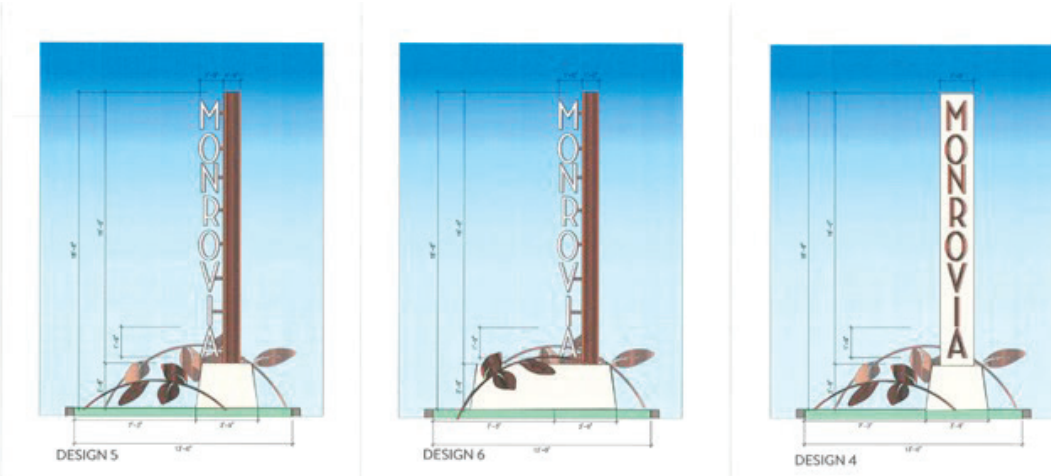

## PUBLIC ART UPDATE – EAST HUNTINGTON DRIVE MONUMENT ENTRANCE SIGNAGE SET FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE ART IN PUBLIC PLACES COMMITTEE



Spurred on in part by the improvements at Station Square (and the “Monrovia” entryway monument sign located just south of I-210 Freeway off of Myrtle Avenue), staff has been working to develop a coordinated design concept for entryway monument signs throughout the City. To that end, given the median landscape improvements that were recently completed on Huntington Drive, we have been developing signage concepts for both the east end and west end of the main east-west arterial corridor in Monrovia.

Given the progress that has been made to date, we wanted to share that the Art in Public Places Committee will soon be considering recommended entryway monument art for the east end of Huntington Drive. As a surprise sneak-peak, we wanted to share a few of the preliminary monument signage concepts that have been developed for review, which include the following proposals:

The Art in Public Places Committee will be reviewing these concepts at one of their upcoming meetings, and based on feedback received from that

group, a formal recommendation will be forwarded to the City Council for consideration in the very near future.

It is also important to note that the City is working on an entry monument sign for the west end of Huntington Drive, which is being coordinated in concert with a larger capital improvement initiative that involves new signals and some roadway realignment work at Huntington Drive / 5th Avenue. That project should be ready for consideration toward the latter part of the calendar year.

Finally, as the Huntington Drive entry monument sign project moves forward, the City is simultaneously developing a coordinated entryway monument signage program for the entire community. We are assessing other entry-point locations into Monrovia where signage would be appropriate, and the overall plan will be developed with a consistent design theme.

We are excited about these pending art in public places projects!

## CLASSICAL FOR THE CANINE

They say that music can play a major part in altering the mood of the human being and I am convinced this is true from my own experience. If I am feeling low on the energy level and need a boost, I play a selection from one of my favorite classic rock or bluegrass albums and before I know it I am up and about, dancing in my living room. On the other hand, if I'm feeling kind of edgy, I can select one of my favorite Chopin nocturns and in short order I find myself calming down and relaxing.

Music inspires us humans in so many ways but what, if anything, does it do for a dog? Numerous research studies have been conducted to determine how sounds might effect the mood and behavior of the canine. Among the more scientifically important studies is one performed by Belfast-based psychologist and animal behaviorist Dr. Deborah Wells in 2002.

Dr. Wells undertook a research program to determine the influence of five types of auditory stimulation on the dog: human conversation, classical music, heavy metal music, pop music, and a silent control (no music at all). The results of Dr. Wells' study clearly indicated that classical music had a marked soothing effect on dogs in animal shelters when compared to the other types of auditory stimulation.

In the discussion section of her published research Dr. Wells states, "Classical music resulted in dogs spending more of their time resting than any of the other experimental conditions of auditory stimulation. This type of music also resulted in a significantly lower level of barking. Research suggests that calming music may have a beneficial effect on humans, resulting in diminished agitation, improved mood and lower levels of stress. Although the specific effect of classical music on dogs remains unknown, the findings from this study suggests that it may, as in humans, have a calming influence."

Wells also observed that heavy metal music tended to agitate the dogs, which was mainly manifested by increased frequencies of standing, fretting and barking. Upon completion of the project, Dr. Wells stated, "Further work is still required to unravel the specific acoustic elements that dogs respond to." Wells' research inspired a small group of American scientists & musicians to embark on a subsequent study of their own.

Their mission was to take bioacoustics research to a higher level. In 2005, neurologist Susan Wagner initiated and directed the Bioacoustics Research & Development (BARD) project. Working closely with her associates Joshua Leeds (sound researcher) and Lisa Spector (concert pianist), Wagner came up with some very interesting and enlightening results which she and Spector later included in a book titled Through a Dog's Ear.

Sound is a complex phenomenon consisting of energy waves, the speed

of which are measured in units called hertz (Hz). A single Hz unit equals one wave cycle per second. The normal range of sound heard by the average healthy, hearing human is about 20-20,000 Hz.

Although audible frequencies vary from one species to another, most animals have a much higher range of perception than that of the human, and dogs can receive up to at least 50,000 Hz.

Volume or loudness of sound is measured in decibels (dB). A whisper is measured at a range of about 30 dB's and a normal conversation occurs somewhere in the range of 50 dB's, while the average rock concert measures in at around the 130 dB range although this particular measurement would vary considerably with today's advanced sound technology.

Perception of sound is what we call hearing. Dr. Wagner refers to the hearing side of sound as the science of psychoacoustics, which involves an individual's psychological and physical orienting response to incoming Hz frequencies. In lay terms, it is the way one perceives what one hears, both biologically and mentally (and perhaps even spiritually).

Although I typically prefer to refrain from using technical terminology in this light-reading column, I describe these terms to help explain the overall point I wish to emphasize, which is the positive impact that classical music can have on animals - particularly on dogs.

Interestingly, although perhaps not unpredictably, the final outcome of Dr. Wagner's 2005 study on how sounds affect the behavior of the dog re-confirmed the findings of Dr. Wells' research project back in 2002. In short, because of physical sound receptors and ability to interpret what is heard, a dog's response to sound is much like that of a human, although perhaps more intense.

Therefore, because of the way a dog hears and responds to sound, it is safe to assume that classical music is an excellent choice to bring relaxation and rest to our canine companions. Not that it took a scientific study to prove that to me. I've seen the results in my home when my Molly goes from barking at the leaf blower to laying quietly on her bed, just because I turned on the Chopin. So when it comes to calming the canine in my home, classical is definitely our music of choice.

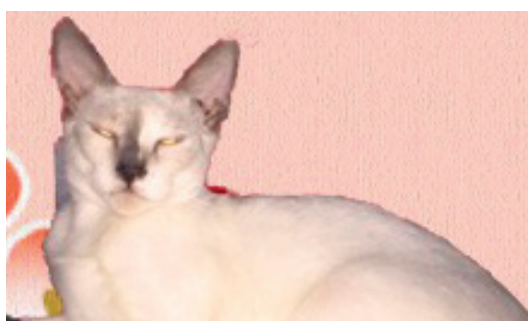

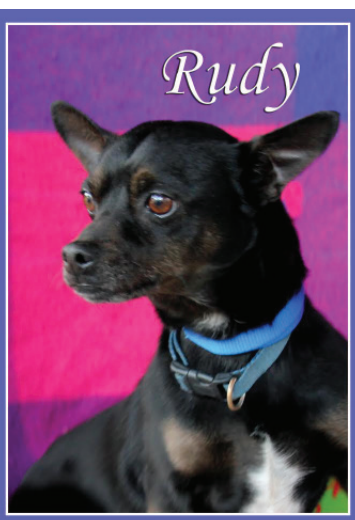

### THE JOY OF YOGA YOGI COOL DOWN



Inspired by the recent high temperatures, I thought I'd give a few of my favorite techniques for an effective yogi cool down.

Begin with a cooling asana practice and stay out of hot yoga, at least for the summer. There are practices that can be satisfying from a cardiovascular point of view and still cool the body while calming the mind. Gravitare toward a gentler, less rigorous practice that may hold poses longer.

Second, add a cooling pranayama, or breath practice, to your day. Sitali (rolling the tongue lengthwise) and Sitkari (inhaling through the teeth) are excellent for transforming your inhalations into an air conditioner for you! Sitkari is practiced by inhaling through the teeth, closing the mouth, then exhaling through the nose. With Sitali, the tongue is

rolled lengthwise and saliva is gathered in the center. Then inhale, bringing in the cool air and saliva down the throat. Close the mouth and exhale out the nose. Repeat several times. Both can aid in soothing excess heat and hot emotion. Lastly, try giving as much attention to what you are putting into your body with food and drink as you would your physical asana practice. My favorite summer foods include: watermelon, cucumber, cilantro, and coconut. I also use spices such as cardamom and turmeric for their calming and anti-inflammatory properties.

Are you feeling overloaded? Think of cooling excess heat by balancing your schedule too. Strive to lessen the burden in some way to steer clear of overheating, exhaustion, and irritation.

## NEW MEDICARE CARDS DEBUT NEXT YEAR

Dear Savvy Senior,

I just received my Medicare card in the mail and was surprised to see that the ID number is the same as my Social Security number. I know it's a bad idea to carry around anything that displays my Social Security number because it makes me vulnerable to identity theft. Wasn't the government supposed to stop putting Social Security numbers on Medicare cards?

New Beneficiary

Dear New,

Many people new to Medicare are surprised to learn that the ID number on their Medicare card is still identical to their Social Security number (SSN). After all, we're constantly warned not to carry our SSN around with us, because if it gets lost or stolen, the result could be identity theft.

But the card itself tells beneficiaries to carry it with you when you are away from home so you can show it at the doctor's office or hospital when you need medical care. Here's what you should do to protect yourself.

#### New Medicare Cards

For starters, you'll be happy to know that the government is in the process of removing SSNs from Medicare cards, but with 58 million beneficiaries, it's a huge undertaking that will be implemented gradually. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services will start sending the new cards in April 2018, but it will take until December 2019 before SSNs are removed from all cards.

Under the new system, a randomly generated 11-character Medicare Beneficiary Identifier will replace the SSN-based health claim number on your new Medicare card, but your Medicare benefits will not change.

You will receive information in 2018 letting you know about the new Medicare card, with an explanation of how to use the new card and what to do with your old one. You can start using your new Medicare card with the new number as soon as you receive it, and there should be a transition period in 2018 and 2019 when you can use either the old card or the new card.



#### Protect Your Identity

Until your new Medicare card is issued, here's what you can do to protect your SSN on your current card. The Privacy Rights Clearinghouse, a national consumer resource on identity theft, recommends that you carry your Medicare card only when you visit a health care provider for the first time, so the provider can make a copy for their files. Otherwise, make a photocopy of your card and cut it down to wallet size. Then take a black marker and black out the last four digits of your SSN, and carry that instead in case of an emergency.

If your Medicare card does happen to get lost or stolen, you can replace it by calling Social Security at 800-772-1213 or contact your local Social Security office. You can also request a card online at SSA.gov/MyAccount. Your card will arrive in the mail in about 30 days.

If your Medicare card that contains your SSN gets lost or stolen, you'll need to watch out for Medicare fraud. You can do this by checking your quarterly Medicare summary notices for services or supplies you did not receive. You can also check your Medicare claims early online at MyMedicare.gov (you'll need to create an account first), or by calling Medicare at 800-633-4227. If you spot anything suspicious or wrong, call the Inspector General's fraud hotline at 800-447-8477.

Also, watch for other signs of identity theft. For example, if someone uses your Social Security number to obtain credit, loans, telephone accounts, or other goods and services, report it immediately to the Federal Trade Commission at IdentityTheft.gov (or 877-438-4338). This site will also give you specific steps you'll need to take to handle this problem.

#### IF YOU GIVE A CAT A STEROID...

It was summer, 1982. Regan was President, the longest baseball game at Wrigley Field lasted 22 innings, and the lowest August temperature in Cleveland was a cool 38°F. But such was not the case in southern California. Rather than being remembered for this trivia, the summer of 1982 was remembered as a particularly bad flea season. However, the fleas didn't bother me. I was six months away from being born, so I was well insulated.

My grandma had gone to visit family in Michigan, and left my mom in charge of watching Boots, her cat. Being pregnant and having other distractions, Mom did not immediately realize that Gran's house had become infested with fleas! They had taken up residence in the shag carpet (this was early 80's, remember). One day when she went to feed Boots, Mom found him languishing on the carpet, his blood-drained body nearly dry to the bone. (Think Terry Thomas in "The Abominable Dr. Phibes." You must see this dark comedy classic if you haven't already!)

She and Dad took quick action and brought Boots to a vet in Arcadia. He prescribed steroid treatments that were administered in a series of shots. But unbeknownst to everyone, "The Madness of Boots" had begun.

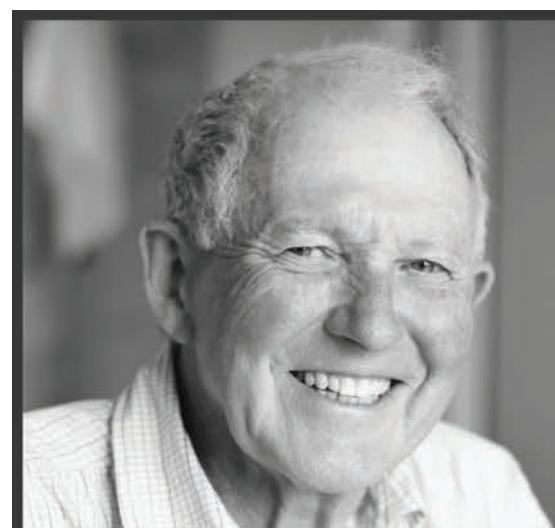

## NASA'S JUNO SPACECRAFT TO FLY OVER JUPITER'S GREAT RED SPOT JULY 10

Just days after celebrating its first anniversary in Jupiter orbit, NASA's Juno spacecraft will fly directly over Jupiter's Great Red Spot, the gas giant's iconic, 10,000-mile-wide storm. This will be humanity's first up-close and personal view of the gigantic feature—a storm monitored since 1830 and possibly existing for more than 350 years.

"Jupiter's mysterious Great Red Spot is probably the best-known feature of Jupiter," said Scott Bolton, principal investigator of Juno from the Southwest Research Institute in San Antonio. "This monumental storm has raged on the solar system's biggest planet for centuries. Now, Juno and her cloud-penetrating science instruments will dive in to see how deep the roots of this storm go, and help us understand how this giant storm works and what makes it so special."

The data collection of the Great Red Spot is part of Juno's sixth science flyby over Jupiter's mysterious cloud tops. Perijove (the point at which an orbit comes closest to Jupiter's center) will be on Monday, July 10, at 6:55 p.m. PDT. At the time of perijove, Juno will be about 2,200 miles above the planet's cloud tops. Eleven minutes and 33 seconds later, Juno will have covered another 24,713 miles and will be directly above the coiling crimson cloud tops of Jupiter's Great Red Spot. The spacecraft will pass about 5,600 miles above the Giant Red Spot clouds. All eight of the spacecraft's instruments as well as its imager, JunoCam, will be turned on during the flyby.

As of July 4 Juno had logged exactly one year in Jupiter orbit. At the time, the spacecraft had chalked up about 71 million miles in orbit around the giant planet.

"The success of science collection at Jupiter is a testament to the dedication, creativity and technical abilities of the NASA-Juno team," said Rick Nybakken, project manager for Juno from NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, California. "Each new orbit brings us closer to the heart of Jupiter's radiation belt, but so far the spacecraft has weathered the storm of electrons surrounding Jupiter better than we could have ever imagined."

Juno launched on Aug. 5, 2011, from Cape Canaveral, Florida. During its mission of exploration, Juno soars low over the planet's cloud tops—as close as 2,100 miles. During these flybys, Juno is probing beneath the obscuring cloud cover of Jupiter and studying its auroras to learn more about the planet's origins, structure, atmosphere and magnetosphere.

Early science results from NASA's Juno mission portray the largest planet in our solar system as a turbulent world, with an intriguingly complex interior structure, energetic polar aurora, and huge polar cyclones.

The Great Red Spot's first sighting is often credited to Robert Hooke, who described a spot on the planet in May 1664; however, it is likely that Hooke's spot was in the wrong belt altogether (the North Equatorial Belt, versus the current Great Red Spot's location in the South Equatorial Belt). More convincing is Giovanni Cassini's description of a "permanent spot" the following year, 1665. The spot has been monitored almost continuously since 1830.

JPL manages the Juno mission (<https://www.nasa.gov/juno>, <http://missionjuno.org>) for the principal investigator, Scott Bolton, of Southwest Research Institute. The Juno mission is part of the New Frontiers Program managed by NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, Alabama, for the Science Mission Directorate. Lockheed Martin Space Systems, Denver, built the spacecraft. JPL is a division of Caltech in Pasadena.

## "WILD QUINOA" GROWS IN EVERYONE'S YARD

## NOTE: I HAVE MANY MORE PICTURES

These days, everyone wants to eat the hip "new" nutritional foods, especially if the foods are served by the latest hot chef's restaurant where all the beautiful people go. You know, plants like kale, collards, chia, quinoa, and many others.

Quinoa (*Chenopodium quinoa*) is a seed that has been used for centuries in Mexico and S. America, and it's a great food that is being re-discovered by chefs and ordinary people who want to eat healthier food. In the past, quinoa seeds and leaves were used in countless recipes, and the plant was highly revered.

But did you know that there is a close relative to quinoa that grows wild just about everywhere in Sierra Madre, and Southern California? In fact, it grows pretty much everywhere in the world these days, and is more often regarded as a weed to be pulled and discarded.

## LAMB'S QUARTER

I'm speaking of lamb's quarter (*Chenopodium album*), a European native that is today found all over the world. Though this spinach relative is an extremely common cosmopolitan plant, it rarely gets the respect it deserves. In fact, it is typically regarded as an agricultural pest and an urban weed. Gardeners pull it up and poison it and throw it into the trash can. This is another example of our culture's chosen ignorance because lamb's quarter is possibly the most nutritious green plant you can eat!

We have this mistaken notion that anything really good must come from China or Tibet or a Brazilian rain forest. Since lamb's quarter is in everyone's backyard, we hardly notice it -- unless we're without money or starving.

## NUTRITIONAL ANALYSIS

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, 100 grams of lamb's quarter leaf contains 4.2 grams of protein, 309 mg. of calcium, 72 mg. of phosphorus, 80 mg. of vitamin C, and a remarkable 11,600 International Units of vitamin A. The small black seeds are also an excellent protein source, used just as you'd use quinoa seeds.

Even if you're not concerned about the vitamin and mineral content, you'll find that lamb's quarter is a delicious, hearty plant that can be used in many dishes.

Generally, you use lamb's quarter in any way that you'd use spinach. Lamb's quarter leaves can be picked and added to green salads. The flavor is similar to spinach. The leaves can also be steamed as you'd steam spinach, and then seasoned with butter or herbs. Most of your guests won't detect that they're not eating spinach.

Lamb's quarter leaves can be added to soups, stews, omelettes, bread batter, and even quiche. The leaves can be steamed, and cheese grated over



the top before serving. The tender stems can be steamed, and served as you'd serve asparagus or string beans.

Lamb's quarter is a late spring and summer weed around here, and so I use all that I can during the season. I also dry a lot which I then can store and reconstitute later. I also like to freeze as much as I can, which I then add to soups and stews throughout the year when the plant has died back. As lamb's quarter goes to seed and dies back, you can easily collect the seeds. I generally rub my hand along the stem and collect the seeds into a large salad bowl. When all the seeds are dry, I rub them all between my hands, and blow off the chaff until I am left with only the black seed. These seeds are then added to bread batter, pancake and biscuit batter, and soups.

This is such a common urban plant world wide that no hobo or homeless person should ever go hungry where lamb's quarter is found. It grows all over the Sierra Madre area and nearby areas in parks, in back yards, in fields, in vacant lots, along railroad lines, and often in the wilderness areas along trails. When I harvest lamb's quarter, I just pinch off the tips and never uproot the plant. This way, it lives longer and I have an extended supply of the greens.

## IDENTIFICATION

Lamb's quarter is easily recognized by its roughly toothed leaves that are somewhat triangular in shape. The leaves are covered with a fine white mealiness which causes water to bead up on the leaf surface. The older stems often have red stripes and red in the axils.

If you're not sure of the identity of a wild plant you intend to eat, don't eat it! Take the time to send someone a picture of the plant, or take the plant to a specialist.

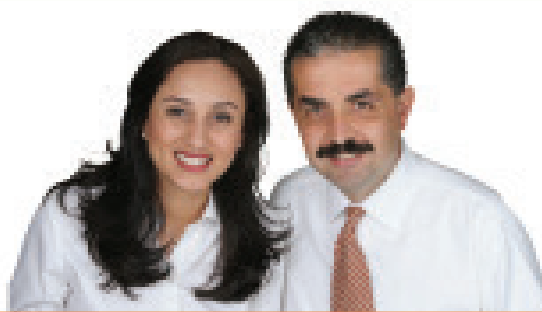

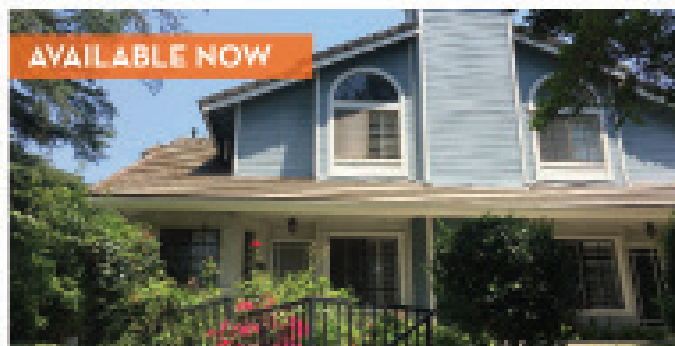

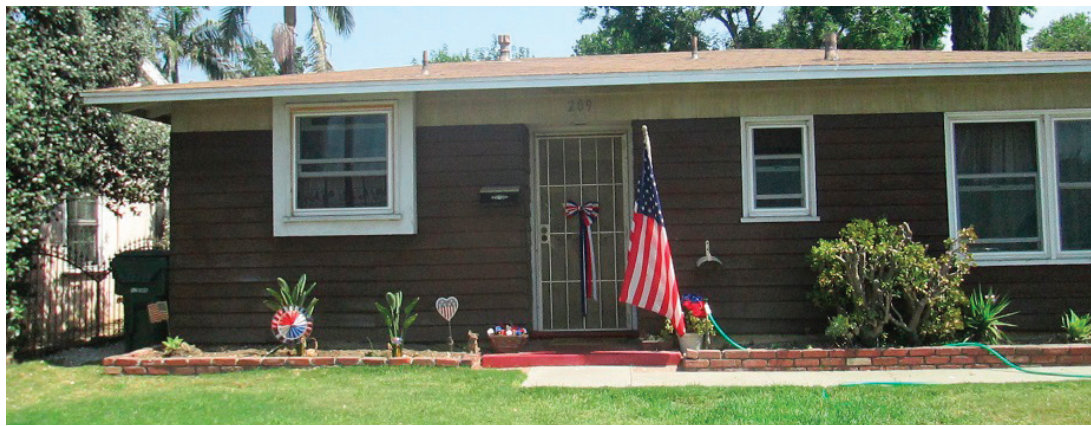

### PROUD OF MY COUNTRY

As I put up Fourth of July decorations, I thought about our great country.

Why am I proud to be an American? My mom told me her mother-in-law, returned to Italy for visits, but was thrilled to come home to the USA. Grandma came as a preteen, met Grandpa; they married and raised five children. Grandpa and his brothers founded a successful statue business. My grandparents lived in a 3 story Victorian row house and had a bungalow at North Wildwood, N.J. They loved the USA!

My Dad stayed back in First Grade; he couldn't speak English. But he was so smart, he skipped 2nd grade! He went to the University of Pennsylvania on a scholarship, and worked as a chemical engineer; he had 14 patents! Only in America! Land of Opportunity!

My favorite story is Uncle Pete Carolfi. He was an Italian Prisoner of War at Fort Dix. My dad's sister, Natalie, grew up saying, "I'll never marry an Italian", but followed Pete back to Italy and married him there. Pete left ALL his family behind in Italy, but became a successful sculptor. He and his sons were commissioned by the City of Philadelphia to do a statue of George Clymer, a Signer of the Declaration of Independence in front of Independence Hall. His work is also at Caesar's Palace, Atlantic City, and N.J.'s Cherry Hill Mall. Only in America. Truly land of opportunity!

Why do I love this great land? I lived five years abroad as a military wife. Two years, 1978-1980 were in Taegu, Korea. We were fortunate; My husband Richard's assignment necessitated us living on Camp Walker. Most did not. One American family was robbed twice, then moved into a small apartment for safety reasons.

First off post, "NO HOME CAN EVER BE WITHOUT A PERSON INSIDE." Once my Korean students were explaining, "Chusok", their Thanksgiving. All families meet at the eldest son's house. Mira, my student was staying home. Only her parents and brothers were going to attend. She had to "Housesit". Usually families in the city hired a young woman from the countryside. The girl was a live-in maid/babysitter. These country girls welcomed

an opportunity to live in a nice home in the city and experience city life. Mira's family was kind and wanted their girl to spend her holiday in the country with her own family. So Mira remained at home while her parents and brothers went to the Uncle's House for Chusok.

Besides someone having to PHYSICALLY be in the house 24/7, all houses, rich or poor had 6 feet concrete walls around them. No pretty lawns! It reminded me of prison!

Then, there was the curfew. In 1978-80, while there, the curfew was from midnight -6am, and NO ONE went on the streets or you would be arrested! Clubs closed at 11pm; movies ended 11pm: Everyone had to be home by midnight! My friend had a miscarriage. It was awful. The ambulance took her, but her husband couldn't go. There was no room in the ambulance, plus there was no way for him to get home.

The worst experiences were during President Pak's assassination. The Girl Scouts' field trip had to be canceled-we were afraid to leave the post. Because of his position, my husband Richard had a military vehicle at home and once drove to Kimpo Airport; the Secretary of Defense gave him an important communication. I had no idea of what Richard was dealing with.

With Pak's assassination came the threat of evacuation. We were terrified. Army wives had their documents and their children's papers, plus all our "doggy" tags. We had to be ready to leave quickly. Our neighbors, the Military Chaplain and wife had the responsibility of a Military Police couple's baby. All military personnel remained behind no matter what. So this couple had made these arrangements for their baby daughter.

Then our beloved Pets! My neighbor and I agonized over them. They could not be taken home. What would we do with them? The last worst solution was the Army Vet would have to put them down. Thank God it never reached that point.

For all of the above reasons, I am proud to be an American. It is a land of Opportunity! I have seen what my immigrant relatives accomplished. I am truly grateful to have a front lawn and for the whole family to take a trip together! God Bless America!

### NAPOLITANO WELCOMES \$300,000 WATER GRANT FOR SAN GABRIEL RIVER PROJECT

(AZUSA, CA) Today, Rep. Grace F. Napolitano (D-El Monte) congratulated the San Gabriel River Water Committee on being awarded a \$300,000 Bureau of Reclamation WaterSMART Drought Resiliency Project Grant it received for the construction of a new river gate inlet structure near the existing Azusa-Duarte Tunnel Inlet on the San Gabriel River. Napolitano requested in a February 2017 letter that the Bureau of Reclamation support the Committee's grant application. Her full letter can be viewed here.

"Congratulations to the San Gabriel River Water Committee on being awarded new federal funds to improve water delivery to residents of Azusa, Duarte, and other San Gabriel Valley cities," Napolitano said. "We are thrilled this project's grant request was fulfilled, and we welcome new federal dollars to help address our San Gabriel Valley's water needs. The new gate will provide better water management practices, which are especially vital during ongoing drought

conditions, while enhancing safety and systems operations along the San Gabriel River."

The San Gabriel River Inlet Replacement Infrastructure Project will replace the existing river gate, which was constructed in the 1880s and is insufficient and unsafe to operate, with a motorized weir gate. The project also includes the installation of remote operating technology to operate the ditch gate structure in real-time, to more efficiently manage water deliveries. The grant covers \$300,000 of the total project cost of \$689,093; the remaining money will be local funding.

Napolitano is a long-time promoter of conservation, water recycling, desalination, and groundwater management as solutions to Southern California's water needs. She is a current member and the former top Democrat on the House Committee on Natural Resources' Water, Power, and Oceans Subcommittee, which oversees the Bureau of Reclamation.

**REPUBLICANS AND DEMOCRATS PUSHING BACK AGAINST TRUMP**

Pennsylvania Gov. Tom Wolf hit the nail on the head last week when he refused to play along with the Trump administration's invasive and unwarranted request for unfettered access to his state's

voter rolls.

"The right to vote is absolute and I have no confidence that you seek to bolster it," Wolf, a Democrat, wrote to Kris Kobach, vice chairman of President Donald Trump's hilariously misnamed Election Integrity Commission.

If you're just tuning in, Kobach, who is Kansas' Republican Secretary of State and a 2018 GOP gubernatorial hopeful, was on a fishing expedition for sensitive information about voters from all 50 states.

The data he sought included party affiliation, the last four digits of voters' Social Security numbers and their voting history back to 2006.

The bipartisan panel has been charged with uncovering evidence of voter fraud in American elections.

It would be easy to accuse Wolf, who is up for re-election next year, of merely playing politics with an unpopular White House. And there may be some glimmer of truth to that. But it is also true that 44 states have partly or fully rebuffed Kobach's request.

Delbert Hosemann, Mississippi's Republican Secretary of State, rejected the request, telling one newspaper that Trump's commission could "go jump in the Gulf of Mexico and Mississippi is a great state to launch from."

That bipartisan agreement stems from the simple fact that the request is not only unnecessarily invasive, but also because there is no evidence of widespread voter fraud in the American electoral system.

That's a conclusion that's been buttressed by study after study, most notably, an important 2014 analysis of voter fraud by Loyola Law School professor Justin Levitt. Levitt analyzed 14 years' worth of voting data and found just 31 possible incidents of fraud from roughly 241 fraudulent ballots, The Washington Post reported.

That's out of, by the way, more than 1 billion votes cast during that same time frame, as CNN noted recently.

That mountain of evidence has not stopped Trump from claiming, without proof, that millions of votes were cast illegally in his 2016 campaign against Democrat Hillary Clinton.

"In addition to winning the Electoral College in a landslide, I won the popular vote if you deduct the millions of people who voted illegally," Trump tweeted last November.

(For the purposes of clarity, Trump did not win in a landslide and there were not millions of illegal votes cast in the 2016 election.)

So what might Kobach, who is casting the widest possible of nets, be really after in this unusually offensive request for voters' personal information and habits?

It's a red herring, intended to distract public attention away from the ongoing - and legitimate - investigation into allegations of electoral meddling by Russia.

But something more pernicious might also be at work.

Given this White House's heavy-handed tactics when it comes to dealing with political opponents, and past Republican efforts to disenfranchise whole swaths of the American electorate, I'm going with the explanation offered by Myrna Perez at the Brennan Center for Justice at New York University Law School.

"The concern is that this going to be used to justify regressive and disenfranchising federal law," Perez told The Washington Post.

Wolf raised similar concerns in his own letter to Kobach, arguing that such a wholesale disclosure would violate state law and that there was no assurance that the data would be handled securely.

"Your request implies that your office may undertake a systematic effort to suppress the vote in Pennsylvania," he wrote.

Trump narrowly won the Keystone State in 2016, prevailing over Clinton 48.2 percent to 47.5 percent.

It is not unrealistic to suggest that Kobach's commission may be trying to identify future opposition voters and then raise barricades to their participation in the electoral process.

And even if that is not the case, the fact remains that Kobach's commission is in pernicious search of a solution to a non-existent problem. The data suggests that it's a futile exercise.

In the meantime, states must continue to resist this unreasonable exercise in federal power.

**SUPREME COURT STRIKES BLOW FOR RELIGIOUS LIBERTY**



Normally, the most notable part of a Supreme Court decision is not the dissent.

But Monday, Justice Sonia Sotomayor penned a dissent that is much more interesting in its transparency than the relatively mild majority opinion written by Chief Justice John Roberts in a case being watched by everyone interested in the tension between church and state, and the status of that crumbling wall.

In Trinity Lutheran Church of Columbia v. Comer, a seven-person majority held that the state of Missouri could not single out faith-based organizations for exclusion from grants that would have paid for property maintenance. The facts are fairly simple. Trinity Lutheran is a church that also ran a preschool program. In 2012, it applied for a grant from a state program to make playgrounds safer. It's request for funds to resurface its playground was denied based on a state constitutional provision that forbade the use of taxpayer funding to religious institutions.

That provision was modeled on what is known as the "Blaine Amendment," a proposed amendment to the U.S. Constitution based in an antipathy toward Catholics. Over a century ago, in the wake of the Civil War, a Republican congressman named James Blaine proposed the amendment to prevent, in part, public money going to parochial schools that were filled with immigrant children.

Many states adopted the language of the original federal amendment, even though it had failed to muster a two-thirds majority in the Senate. Some of these "mini-Blaines" are still on the books.

Which brings us to Missouri.

Trinity Lutheran sued the state, claiming that the only reason it was being denied funding was because it was a religious institution. And, as Roberts wrote in a "you think?" moment, that's pretty self-evident:

"There is no question that Trinity Lutheran was denied a grant simply because of what it is ... a church."

So the only question that remained was, is this exclusion constitutional?

Seven members of the court, including some of the more liberal justices, said "no." According to the chief justice, "the exclusion of Trinity Lutheran from a public benefit for which it is otherwise qualified, solely because it is a church, is odious to our Constitution all the same, and cannot stand."

I like the use of the word odious. Every now and then a Supreme Court justice has to tell it like it is, and cut through that genteel lexicon that makes it difficult to believe that there are human beings on that highest of benches. This was not simply an illegal, distasteful bit of discrimination against people of faith. It was odious.

Of course, not everyone would agree with that conclusion, including most of the members of the ACLU. Every time there is a suggestion that public funds are going to assist religious organizations, the fearsome prospect of a theocracy raises its head. Whether it be a caliphate or Christendom, the church-state separatists are immediately mobilized.

And one of the true believers, excuse the pun, sits on the court. Sotomayor, a woman who wore a Catholic school uniform for many years, railed against the majority decision. Her words seem particularly over the top, since Roberts took great pains to limit the majority holding to cases involving "playground resurfacing," and reserved judgment on whether it could be extended to other types of discrimination. It was more about discriminating against entities solely because they were churches or, as Roberts wrote "churches need not apply."

Sotomayor wasn't buying that. She clearly saw the diagrammed sentence on the wall:

"If this separation [of church and state] means anything, it means that the government cannot ... tax its citizens and turn that money over to houses of worship. ... The court today blinds itself to the outcome this history requires and leads us instead to a place where separation of church and state is a constitutional slogan, not a constitutional commitment."

That's powerful stuff.

Sotomayor sets this up as if the poor taxpayers of Missouri were being forced to pay to prevent some Christian kid from scraping his knees on a rough playground. She makes this seem as if it's then a slippery slope to having taxpayers subsidize the erection of a Mormon Temple, or buy new central air for a mosque. Funny, right?

Well actually, maybe not. While I strongly reject the idea that the wall between church and state was built to keep religion out of the public square, it is clear that this case isn't just about playgrounds. It could change the way that we think about people and places of faith, and their relation to the secular state.

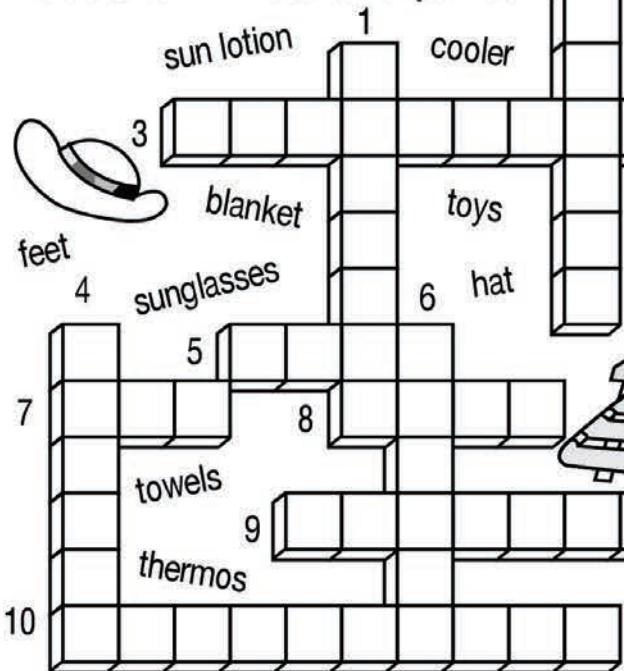

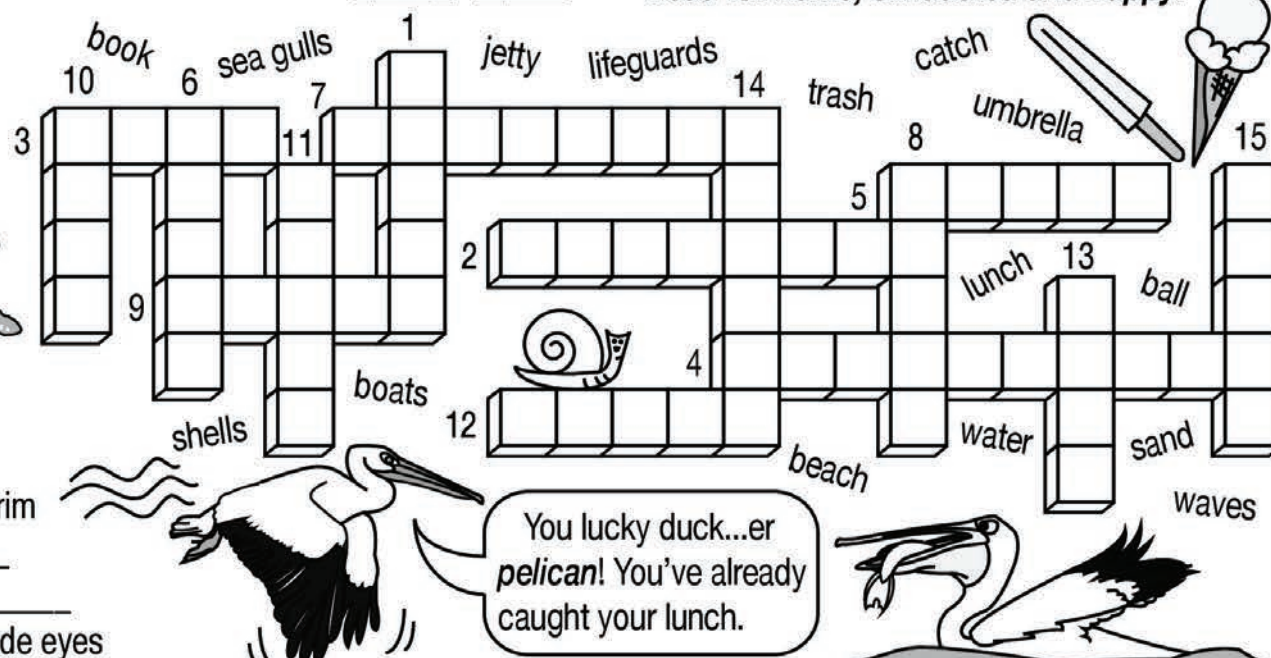
