CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH

Sierra Madre Congregational Church as a new Pastor and his name is Josh Swanson!

Four years ago, Josh Swanson was attending a class at Mater Dolorosa Passionist Retreat Center and as he walked by Sierra Madre Congregational Church (SMCC) he thought to himself "I wonder how someone gets to be the pastor of a church like that." His question has no doubt been answered!

A Long Beach native, Josh Swanson served as both a Youth Pastor and as lead Pastor at churches in Orange County, Long Beach and Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Swanson said he has felt connected to God his whole life. Growing up, his grandmother was the "spiritual matriarch of the Swanson Clan." He says that while there are some Christians who embody a "holier than thou" hypocritical attitude towards the world, his grandmother was the "antithesis of [that].". She was a model of hope, love and joy.

The church is a huge part of Josh Swanson's life. He met his wife Alicia through the church; while they were "aware of each other in high school," as he puts it, they did not start dating until afterwards. The church is what drew them together, and they were married on September 11, 1999. He says that "she's awesome." Together, they have had four beautiful daughters: Audrey (16), Mia (14), Lucy (12), and Eve (8).

The family has already settled into Sierra Madre, and Swanson mentions that while he loves his office and the view, his other favorite place in Sierra Madre is Mother Moo's Creamery.

Swanson sees SMCC's location as perfect. Situated right next to Memorial Park, the church is in the heart of town and is a fixture of the community. He says that his goal is to help the church connect with the community and "encourage our people to be great neighbors and be a benefit...we don't just want our physical buildings to add value, but also our people." The buildings are important, but so are the people.

As part of his goal to renovate the church facilities, Swanson also wants to grow the congregation and he is hoping to attract a diverse crowd. He quotes Psalms 127:1, which he says has been stuck in his head since he came to Sierra Madre, "Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labor in vain..." He also emphasizes that "The real work of building is building human lives."

Speaking of buildings, though, the pastor has already done a lot of work in the few short months he's been here. He officially started in February of this year and after only two or three weeks on the job he decided to pull all of the carpet out in the Old North Church building in order to freshen up the interior and take advantage of the beautiful hardwood floors underneath. He has moved the main offices next door to the Old North Church, in what used to be the youth room. Walking into that building is like walking into a catalogue. Everything is designed around the mid-century modern aesthetic, a deliberate choice as that particular aesthetic blends the old and the new in a way that is very much reflective of



Christianity-an ancient religion that is relevant still today.  
Swanson also described the mid-century modern aesthetic

as a logical choice for the church because of its beauty. He says that God gave us the gift of a world filled with beauty, and Swanson wanted to reflect that inside the church. He quotes Genesis 2:9 "The Lord God made all kind of trees grow out of the ground, trees that were pleasing to the eye and good for food." That balance between physically nourishing and visually pleasing is important to Swanson and he wants his work to reflect that.

His current projects are redoing what will be the youth room and redoing the main sanctuary. Just like in the Old North Church, he has pulled out all the carpet and the beautiful pine wood brightens up the room. The walls are now painted white to make the stained-glass windows stand out better, and Swanson wants to change out the chandelier fixtures for something more streamlined to better complement the architecture of the church. Both of the buildings still have a way to go before they are complete, but it is easy to see that they will be beautiful once the work is done.

The church is also getting a new name. Officially, SMCC will now be called Christ Congregational Church Sierra Madre, but the abbreviated version will be Christ Church Sierra Madre, or simply Christ Church. The church will be hosting an open house for the community so that everyone can see the work that has been done and can connect directly with the church. That will take place on Sunday, October 21st. Do not miss it!

ENHANCED TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT YIELDS  
FEWER COLLISIONS

After a reported upswing in traffic collisions in Sierra Madre in 2017, City Council directed staff to initiate a traffic mitigation plan and provide data on how many traffic collisions have occurred so far this year and why, when, and where they are happening. Chief of Police, Joe Ortiz, presented the results of the detailed study during the City Council meeting on September 11. The determination was that most traffic violations occurred in the areas of Baldwin Ave. from Suffolk Ave. to Northeast Highland Ave., and Sierra Madre Blvd. from Mountain Trail Ave. to South Hermosa Ave. This hotspot area had the highest amount of both injury and non-injury traffic collisions. As a result, this section of the city became designated for enhanced enforcement by Sierra Madre PD.

In order to raise awareness and provide the public with information

about safe driving, SMPD met in-person with residents and connected through social media outlets and press releases. Topics of discussion included the risks of speeding, texting and distracted driving, not stopping at stop signs, and making U-turns.

In 2017, a total of 400 tickets were issued to drivers who failed to comply with these traffic laws. The worst violation was failure to stop at stop signs, which resulted in 255 citations. In April 2018, a traffic officer was designated to the area with high collision rates. Citations rose as a result from May through August. "We made a lot of friends," Chief Ortiz quipped. "The good news is that we have only had five traffic collisions since deploying the traffic officer in May of this year," he added.

In 2017, traffic collisions with injuries jumped 24% over 2016 numbers, and non-injury collisions were up a

whopping 46%.

However, as some areas are seeing reductions other sections are still hotspots for speeding, despite increases in citations. "There are still streets in the city that we're still conducting daily/weekly enforcement on and people aren't slowing down no matter how many citations are issued," Ortiz acknowledged. One in particular, is southbound traffic on Hermosa Ave. in the morning and northbound in the evening; when people are anxious to get to work and back home again.

Ortiz is hoping that he will see more positive results on Hermosa as well. Council Member John Capoccia, reassured Ortiz that citations work after admitting that he received two speeding tickets on Hermosa Ave. years ago. "I would like to say that it does work," Capoccia joked.

### KATIE Tse.....This and That DAY AT THE MUSEUM

Happy Fall! My parents and I are getting ready to make our annual visit to Oak Glen. If you've never been, you must go. Nestled in the foothills of Yucaipa, Oak Glen is close enough for a day trip, and far away enough to get you out of the congestion of L.A. And, of course, there's the apples. Not only are there all kinds of exotic varieties like Mutsu, Winesap, and Pippin, but there's also an endless number of apple-inspired breads, pastries, jams, and adorable mini donuts. Last year I finally gave in and bought a bag of the freshly fried donuts from Snow Line, worth every calorie. But perhaps the most unusual thing at Oak Glen is its "museum." We probably won't go there this time. But the one and only time we went was memorable enough.

A short walk up from the main thoroughfare, the front of the museum is essentially a pet shop. There are several parrots in cages, pet food, toys, and a box with large, unusual beetles on the counter (that should have been the first tip off). A nice lady who worked there talked with us for a while and then asked if we'd like to take a \$3 tour of the museum in the back. "It has over 500 different species of animals" she said. As we paid she added, "Some are even live." (That should've been the second tip off).

The first thing I noticed on our self-guided "tour" was the abundance of textured plaster on the interior walls, reminiscent of the line for "Thunder Mountain" at Disney Land. We turned the corner and were met by a large polar bear and two small seals --all stuffed. The polar bear was fixed in a walking position, facing the viewer, teeth bared. The seals, on the other hand, were lying there stiff as bloated boards. This just isn't the sort of thing one expects to see, especially in southern California. We must have lingered there for a moment with our mouths open. "So, I guess this isn't the live portion" my dad remarked.

The following displays included a bobcat, mountain goat, and a wolverine. It didn't seem to matter whether or not these animals would have actually shared the same habitat in real life. In death they were all brought together in one big, stiff family. Eventually we came along to the live exhibits.



In most of the small enclosures the animals were either hiding or being attended to by a museum worker I supposed (more on that later). There wasn't anything as dramatic as a giant polar bear, but they had some frogs, lizards, snakes, and spiders. Eventually we came to the rabbits, chickens, parakeets, and a large, energetic iguana. Most of them were roaming around in open-air pens. One of the rabbits was missing an ear. The iguana was by far the most lively of the bunch. It took a keen interest in my mom, and kept vigorously nodding its head and sticking out its tongue at her. When she moved to the other side it followed after her, and climbed up the cage walls to get closer. There were two huge "things" on its neck that looked like thick slices of zucchini. Maybe it had iguana goiter. Although it seemed bent on captivating Mom, we eventually pulled ourselves free from it and exited the museum.

Driving home, we laughed about the odd displays and their unusual use of taxidermy. "You know, a lot of those cages weren't secure" Dad said. "What do you mean?" we asked. "Well, a lot of them were closed, but not actually locked. That's why I was real careful where I was stepping." "Well, I guess it would be bad to squish one of their frogs or lizards," I remarked. "No," Dad replied, "I was more concerned about the scorpions. They appeared to be missing." And so ended another exciting trip to Oak Glen. A little excitement is fine, but I prefer the kind that's not poisonous...

### WALKING SIERRA MADRE... The Social Side By Deanne Davis



"Now the culture is made of old things. It's a collage. Art made out of art is not art."

You're supposed to make art out of life." Fran Lebowitz

"He who works with his hands is a laborer. He who works with his hands and his head is a craftsman. He who works with his hands and his head and his heart is an artist." St. Francis of Assisi

Tom Tomlinson is definitely an artist, who works with not only his hands and his head, but his heart is drawn to things that others might not see as "art." Starting as a kid commissioned to take out the trash, he took out what looked more like treasures to him than trash and began to create. I first saw Tom's work at the Creative Arts Group show, "Re:Imagination. Art Uncommon," which was last March 23-April 27th. This show was a real eye-opener for me as it was a collection of works created with up-cycled materials. Think pieces of distressed wood - gnarled, worm-eaten, wire, nuts and bolts...all crying out Discarded! Unwanted! But it's really true that one man's trash is another man's treasure.

Let me quote Tom on what his vision is for these treasures among the trash: "Collage and assemblage to re-new and re-organize materials that have lost their original purpose or function."

Things that have been tossed, lost, eroded by use, intent, indifference or accident. The wood, paper, metal and plastic pieces that constitute these constructions take on new meaning when introduced into different re-lationships, are re-surrected, and the parts meld into a completely different whole." In short, beauty from what looked useless and unwanted.

Tom, (pictured here in April of this year at an industrial museum in Germany with his Sierra Madre baseball cap ready to wear) and his wife, Corrine, have been residents of Sierra Madre since 1972 by way of Vienna, Austria, Monrovia and La Canada. Vienna, Austria? Yes! Tom was awarded a Fulbright Fellowship for a year in Vienna, while he was at USC, to write a dissertation involving being an historian in the world of the 1800's to around 1930. Originally from Washington, DC, Tom's interest in the world and how it got to be the way it is, is an undercurrent to what he is doing now. Speaking of the world and the way it is now, we got onto the topic of graffiti around the world. Tom informed me that graffiti is nothing new. He climbed

the Great Pyramid of Giza in 1965 and found French names and the date - 1796 - carved into the top. Napoleon's troops. In essence, we all have to leave our mark on the world one way or another.

Tom views the world through what people are throwing away. Things rust and wear out but Tom puts them into a different relationship. They are not leftovers, they are reassembled into a new life. One of Tom's pieces especially touched me. The picture of an old-fashioned suffering saint, eyes cast up to heaven as tears streaked her face, a halo of stars 'round her head. The piece, entitled "Lacrymosa," has a tiny newspaper clipping attached to the upper corner, essentially where this sad woman's eyes are focused. It's an obituary clipped out of the Times detailing the death of someone's 26 year old daughter from a drug overdose. It is filled with pain, unimaginable pain. Someone had given Tom the picture of the saint and he paired it with the legs from a 1950's table, some shotgun shells, some empty drug vials. "Lacrymosa."

Asking Tom where he acquires his materials, he said he's always on the lookout for something that catches his eye. There's beach combing, a few special junkyards, people send him stuff. Cancelled stamps are featured on most of his art pieces as he's been a collector since he was 7 or 8 years old and he has a stamp dealer friend who sends him pounds of the most destroyed, cancelled, used up stamps possible a couple of times a year.

In addition to the Creative Arts Group here in town, Tom has exhibited his work at the University of Redlands, Occidental College and you might have seen some of his pieces at Century Books on Green Street in Pasadena, which is a bookstore AND an art gallery.

"In my kid mind and hands, paper met paste, metal and wood became parts for imagined machines, small constructions, forts... you know...stuff to play with. 70 years later, I'm still playing. Child-man meets detritus!"

If you see Tom Tomlinson's name associated with an art showing, park the car, go in and take a look. His work is re-purposeful, re-imagined and re-freshingly different.

## Orchard Hardware to Close



In an abrupt move Wednesday, officials of Lowe's, the parent company of Orchard Supply Hardware, said they plan to close all Orchard stores, including locations in Pasadena and South Pasadena.

All 99 Orchard Supply Hardware, as well as the distribution facility that services those stores across the country are expected to close within months, "by the end of fiscal 2018," they said.

"While it was a necessary business decision to exit Orchard Supply Hardware, decisions that impact our people are never easy," said Marvin R. Ellison, Lowe's president and CEO. "We will be providing outplacement services for impacted associates, and they will be given priority status if they choose to apply for other Lowe's positions."

Company officials said it was unclear how many employees will be affected.

Ellison said the decision to exit Orchard Supply Hardware was part of Lowe's Business Outlook. The announcement was made during their "Lowe's Reports Second Quarter Sales and Earnings Results."

As of Friday the Orchard Supply Hardware website was replaced with a single banner saying, "Store Closing Sale. Prices Slashed, 10-30 percent off." Items can no longer be purchased on the website.

The Pasadena Orchard store is located 3425 E. Colorado Blvd and the South Pasadena store is at 452 Fair Oaks Ave.

## PETA Protests AAA's SeaWorld Promotions

About two-dozen PETA (People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals) protesters took to the Pasadena office of Automobile Club of Southern California Wednesday to urge the company to end its promotions of SeaWorld.

"We're urging the company to cut ties with SeaWorld and join the ranks of dozens of other companies that have stopped supporting SeaWorld, Taco Bell, South West and Jet Blue [airlines]," Katerina Davidovich said.

Davidovich said "By promoting SeaWorld they are promoting animal abuse."

AAA listens to their members she said, "So we really hope that anyone that's a member of AAA will recognize that SeaWorld is

incredibly cruel and ask them to cut ties."

According to Davidovich over 40 Orcas have died along with 800 other marine mammals at SeaWorld. The website [seaworldofhurt.com](http://seaworldofhurt.com) list all the Orcas in a time line starting in 1971, including the parks most famous Orca Shamu.

Davidovich said they will continue to protest AAA, "as long as there are promoting SeaWorld."

In 2016 the state put a complete ban on the breeding of killer whales in captivity, SeaWorld has also said they stop conducting theatrical shows, also part of the Orca Protection and Safety Act.

Davidovich said the act is a great first step, "Orcas and other animals are still being imprisoned at SeaWorld so we still have a long way to go."

She said there goal would be to get SeaWorld to release all the animals in their parks into seaside sanctuaries, "Where they could dive deep and swim further and have some

resemblance of a natural life, while still benefitting from human care when needed."

## Police DUI Campaign Through Labor Day

The Pasadena Police Department has started participating in a high-visibility national enforcement campaign, "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over."

Pasadena Police Department will have a special emphasis during this 18-day mobilization to enforce all traffic violations by deploying DUI Saturation Patrols.

During this extended period, Police and Sheriff's Departments statewide, along with the California Highway Patrol, will increase the number of officers on the road to stop suspected drunk or drug impaired drivers and motorcyclists.

The campaign started last night and runs through the Labor Day holiday weekend, which is one of the deadliest times of year in terms of alcohol-involved traffic deaths. One-third of all traffic deaths involve drunk drivers.

Pasadena Police Department will show zero tolerance for impaired driving or riding and joins efforts by the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) to educate drivers that "DUI Doesn't Just Mean Booze." If you take prescription drugs, particularly those with a driving or operating machinery warning label, you may be impaired enough to get a DUI. Marijuana can also be impairing and result in a DUI, especially in combination with alcohol or other drugs.

To avoid a DUI Pasadena Police Department has a few tips.

- Use public transportation or a ride sharing service to get home.
- Have a friend or family member who is about to drive buzzed or impaired? Take the keys away and make arrangements to get them home safely.
- Report drunk drivers – call 911.

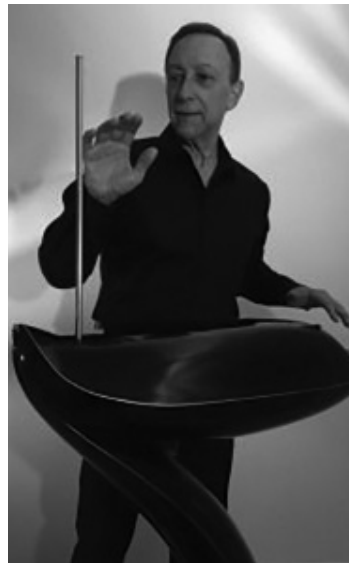

**Warrant / Possession of Methamphetamine – Suspect Arrested**

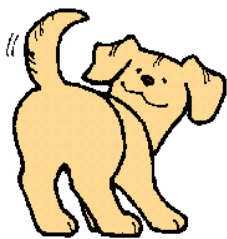

## PRETENTIOUS, POWERFUL PLANTS OF PREY

### Happy Tails

Throughout most of my years growing up I considered plants to be live, yet, for the most part, inanimate objects that help feed us, keep our air oxygenated, and add ornamental appeal to our environment. I am sure most would agree that these are all true facts about plants, but some varieties of that gorgeous green growing fauna we tend to take for granted, are much more active and animated than we might expect.

The plant species that prey on insects and small animals are the ones that fascinate me the most. Who isn't amazed by the beast-like behavior of the Venus flytrap? I remember when "Little Shop of Horrors" came out when I was a kid, and thinking the screen-writer had created the concept of a predator-like plant, until I learned that they really do exist. Of course, they have yet to find one that speaks like the one in the film, but the feats that they are capable of are remarkable enough.

The following narrative was written by contributors to the Botanical Society of America ([www.botany.org](http://www.botany.org)) and provides a very interesting and informative summary about the origin and development of several plants that prey on foods other than the micro-nutrients found in water and soil. I hope you find it as fascinating as I did.

Carnivorous plants have the most bizarre adaptations to low-nutrient environments. These plants obtain some nutrients by trapping and digesting various invertebrates, and occasionally even small frogs and mammals. Because insects are one of the most common prey items for most carnivorous plants, they are sometimes called insectivorous plants. It is not surprising that the most common habitat for these plants is in bogs and fens, where nutrient concentrations are low but water and sunshine seasonally abundant. As many as thirteen species of carnivorous plants have been found in a single bog (Folkerts, 1982). Most plants absorb nitrogen from the soil through their roots. But carnivorous plants absorb nitrogen from their animal prey through their leaves specially modified as traps.

Traps work in a variety of ways. Pitfall traps of pitcher plants are leaves folded into deep, slippery pools filled with digestive enzymes. Flypaper (or sticky or adhesive traps) of sundews and butterworts are leaves covered in stalked glands that exude sticky mucilage. Snap traps (or steel traps) of the Venus flytrap and waterwheel plant are hinged leaves that snap shut when trigger hairs are touched. Suction traps, unique to bladderworts, are highly modified leaves in the shape of a bladder with a hinged door lined with trigger hairs. Lobster-pot traps of corkscrew plants are twisted tubular channels lined with hairs and glands.

Carnivorous plants are fascinating because, even when they are not trapping insects, their unusual forms are intriguing. However, you should not collect plants in the wild because most of them are relatively rare. Habitat destruction and over collection are two of the greatest conservation threats to carnivorous plants. If you are interested in growing carnivorous plants in your home or classroom, purchase the plants from a reputable grower who uses tissue culture or vegetative means to grow the plant, or starts them

from seeds.

We now know that the carnivorous habit evolved independently in many plant lineages (Albert et al., 1992; Ellison and Gotelli, 2001; Cameron et al., 2002; Muller et al., 2004). Pitfall traps evolved independently in four plant groups (the eudicot orders Caryophyllales, Oxalidales, Ericales, and the monocot family Bromeliaceae), and sticky traps, in at least three (the Caryophyllales, Ericales, and Lamiales). These are examples of convergent evolution. In contrast, the snap trap and lobster-pot traps evolved only once among carnivorous plants.

Carnivorous plants have features to attract, trap, kill, and digest prey, and absorb nutrients. A number of plants have only some of these characteristics. Glands that secrete sticky substances are found in many plants. Pitcher-like tanks are common in bromeliads and in few other plants. While perhaps not fully fledged sticky traps or pitfall traps, these features hint of the potential for carnivory. The list of plants described as near carnivorous, protocarnivorous, or borderline carnivorous is quite diverse, including *Ibicella lutea* (Mameli, 1916), *Dipsacus* (Christy, 1923), *Passiflora foetida* (Radhamani et al., 1995), *Paepalanthus bromeloides* (Jolivet, 1998), and *Geranium viscosissimum* and *Potentilla arguta* (Spomer, 1999). No single definitive list exists. *Ibicella lutea*, which has not been studied since 1916 (Juniper et al., 1989), is sometimes listed as carnivorous, and *Catopsis berteroniana* is sometimes described as borderline. The ability to digest prey and absorb the amino acids is considered the real clincher.

Carnivory is more widespread than just the plant and animal kingdoms. The fungi kingdom has flesh eaters also (Pramer, 1964). Living in the soil are over 200 species of fungi (identified as zygomycetes, basidiomycetes, and hyphomycetes) that use special structures to trap nematodes. Like carnivorous plants, these fungi have the ability to trap prey and to absorb nutrients from the body of their prey. The traps of fungi come in two general types: constricting rings (active traps) and adhesive structures (passive traps). These trap types occur in separate fungi lineages (Ahren et al., 1998).

Exploring and learning more about the amazing world of carnivorous plant life somehow gave me a broader perspective on how I view the greenery that surrounds me and makes this world such a gorgeous place to live. I even find myself talking out loud to the trees and flowers from time to time, as I pass by them while walking through town. Hey, we all need to hear a few encouraging words now and then, so why not them too? Love and let live.

Last week we talked about earthquake preparedness, and disaster planning in general. Be sure to watch this paper for news of the upcoming CERT meetings held in Sierra Madre.

### SIERRA MADRE CERT

Sierra Madre residents are lucky that there is a very active CERT group which meets at least once a month in the Hart Building in Memorial park. The purpose of CERT is to train individuals in the details of being prepared individually, and how to work together in the aftermath of any major disaster.

You can learn more about Sierra Madre CERT group by checking them out on Facebook, or their web page at [www.sierramadreemergency.org](http://www.sierramadreemergency.org). CERT means Civilian Emergency Response Training, so you can learn what to do in emergencies.

### MORE THAN STUFF

While it is important to be prepared with batteries, and water, and food, and cooking devices, and toilet paper, and all the stuff that makes your life continue in a somewhat regular manner, don't forget that survival planning is about more than having the stuff.

If you lived in New Orleans during Hurricane Katrina, all your stuff would be underwater and you'd have to decide where to go, and what to bring, and how to get there.

If you live in North Carolina where Hurricane Florence is hammering the Atlantic Coast, your stuff might get blown away.

Survival and self-reliance includes "the stuff," but it includes so much more.

I have long advocated that you get to know your neighbors and develop local relationships that involve working together during normal times. If you know your neighbors and you do things together (dinners, building projects, giving rides, etc.), then you are far more likely to jump into action with your neighbors after an emergency. Neighborhood Watch activities are a great way to develop these skills.

Besides developing relationships with others, you should never stop learning new skills, such as you might learn at a local CERT meeting.

Don't overlook your physical fitness! In a serious emergency where you must leave your home, or where you cannot rely upon a car, your body is your vehicle. If you don't exercise, and are out of shape, you will not be able to perform well.

Those who plan ahead for a major hurricane have the luxury to load up the car or truck and drive out of town. Just look at the thousands of cars on the highways who were fleeing the path of Florence. But if you wait too long, highways are so jammed to become useless. Remember the pictures of Woodstock, New York, during the rock festival? There were so many cars that people simply abandoned that and walked.

If a major quake hit the L.A. basin, there'd be no time to "get ready" unless you were already somewhat ready. If you had to depart, you are at a severe disadvantage, having to flee, and go "somewhere" with the mob of panicked people who are also fleeing to who-knows-where.

If you take the time to regularly walk around your neighborhood, or even bicycle, you will experience many benefits besides being more earthquake-ready. You will feel better physically! And as you walk, or bike, around, you will see aspects of your own neighborhood that you didn't know existed. You will meet neighbors, and you will realize that yes, you can be your own vehicle. Though you could never carry as much gear on your bicycle or back as you could in your truck, walking and bicycling at least free your mind and body to the potentials you've probably forgotten you had. ### TIME TO SUPPORT OUR LOCAL BUSINESSES AND SOME GREAT FOOD EVENTS ARE ON THE CALENDAR

It's time to give the small retailer some love and affection. Fred and Levy Fedial have owned Gerlach's Liquor store in Pasadena for many years. I think when I was a student at nearby Blair High School is when they took over. These guys truly know their wines. Recently I talked to owner Fred on how they buy wines for their limited space and how they can compete with the big box boys. Fred told me straight out they can't compete, but where else can you go where the owners have gone to over 200 wine tastings and their knowledge of wines is available on a day to day basis? I asked Fred to give me a stand-out good value wine. I was told that when they do find a wine that they can personally recommend they simply buy more of it so they can pass the savings on to their customers.

Fred suggested one that I wrote about several years ago, Leese Fitch's Cabernet Sauvignon from Sonoma County. A steal at \$12 a bottle, this cabernet sauvignon is a blend of cabernet sauvignon California grapes from the region. I first sampled the Leese-Fitch at the Sonoma Wine Festival, and Fred's recommendation is right on! This cabernet goes great with a goat cheese salad, crusty sourdough bread, or even goat cheese pizza. The blending of this cabernet brings the alcohol content down to a modest 13.5%. Its flavor starts with a hint of blackberry and then somehow bursts into a dark cherry, with notes of vanilla that come from the French and American oak barrels.

Cabernet Sauvignon is one of the world's most widely recognized red wine grape varieties. It is grown in nearly every major wine-producing country among a diverse spectrum of climates from Canada's Okanagan Valley to Lebanon's Beqaa Valley where it found new homes in places like California's Santa Cruz Mountains, Napa Valley, and Sonoma. Its popularity is often attributed to its ease of cultivation—the grapes have thick skins and the vines are hardy and naturally low-yielding, budding late to avoid frost and other dangers.

Leese-Fitch Cabernet 2015 retails for \$14, and can be found on sale at many fine retailers for \$12. I found this bargain at Gerlach's on Fair Oaks in Pasadena.

## LEGACY OF NASA'S DAWN, NEAR THE END OF ITS MISSION:

*Reveals Solar System Time Capsules, Breaks Engineering Barriers*

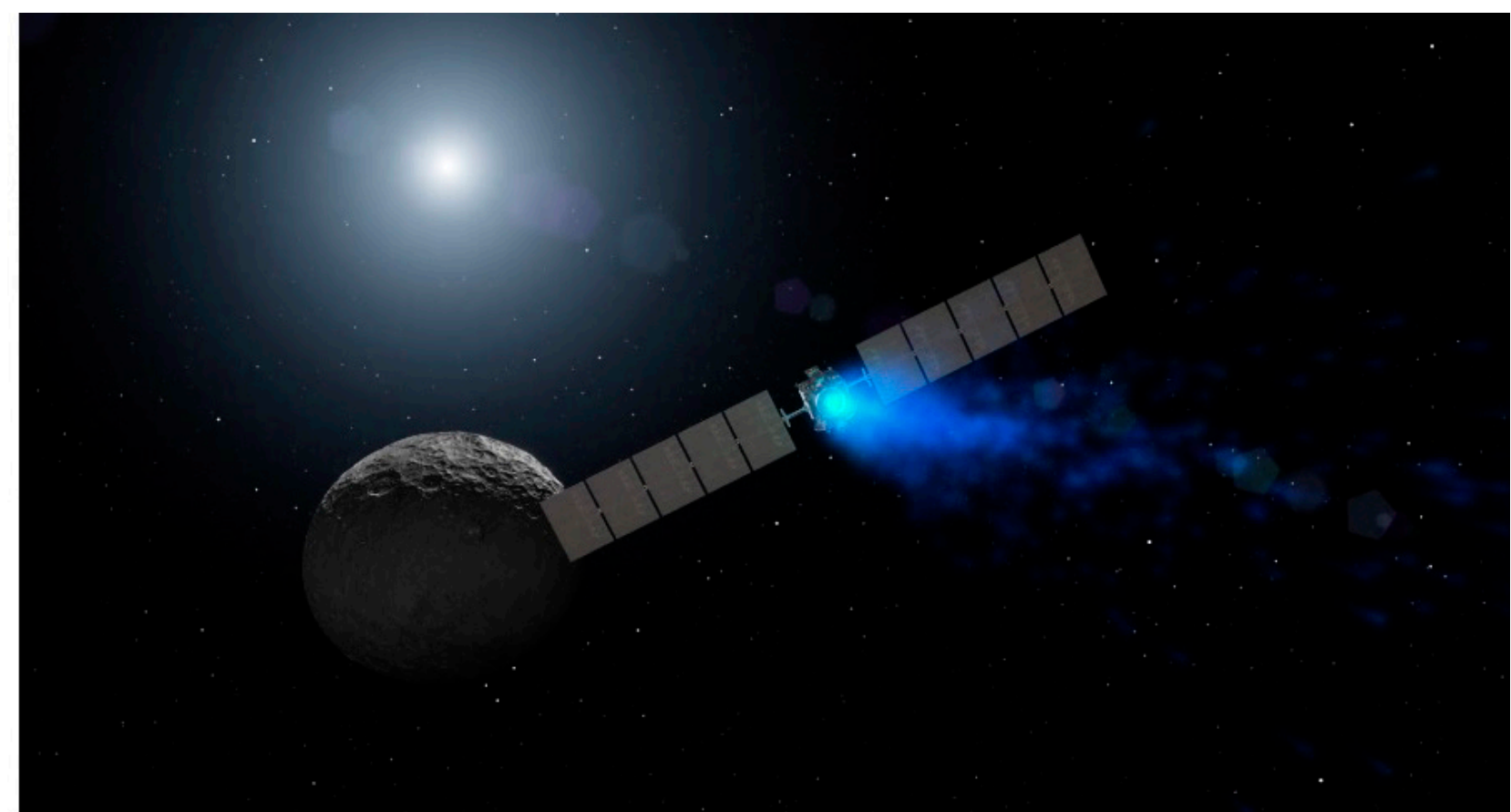
NASA's Dawn mission is drawing to a close after 11 years of breaking new ground in planetary science, gathering breathtaking imagery, and performing unprecedented feats of spacecraft engineering.

Dawn's mission was extended several times, outperforming scientists' expectations in its exploration of two planet-like bodies, Ceres and Vesta, that make up 45 percent of the mass of the main asteroid belt. Now the spacecraft is about to run out of a key fuel, hydrazine. When that happens, most likely between mid-September and mid-October, Dawn will lose its ability to communicate with Earth. It will remain in a silent orbit around Ceres for decades.

"Although it will be sad to see Dawn's departure from our mission family, we are intensely proud of its many accomplishments," said Lori Glaze, acting director of the Planetary Science Division at NASA Headquarters in Washington. "Not only did this spacecraft unlock scientific secrets at these two small but significant worlds, it was also the first spacecraft to visit and orbit bodies at two extraterrestrial destinations during its mission. Dawn's science and engineering achievements will echo throughout history."

When Dawn launched from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station in Florida in September 2007, strapped on a Delta II-Heavy rocket, scientists and engineers had an idea of what Ceres and Vesta looked like. Thanks to ground- and space-based telescopes, including NASA's Hubble Space Telescope, the bodies in the asteroid belt between Mars and Jupiter were visible -- but even the best pictures were fuzzy.

From 2011 to 2012, Dawn swept over Vesta, capturing images that exceeded everyone's imaginings—craters, canyons and even mountains. Then on Ceres in 2015, Dawn showed us a cryovolcano and mysterious bright spots, which scientists later found might be salt deposits produced by the exposure of briny liquid from Ceres' interior. Through Dawn's eyes, these bright spots were especially stunning, glowing like diamonds



scattered across the dwarf planet's surface.

"Dawn's legacy is that it explored two of the last uncharted worlds in the inner Solar System," said Marc Rayman of NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena California, who serves as Dawn's mission director and chief engineer. "Dawn has shown us alien worlds that for two centuries were just pinpoints of light amidst the stars. And it has produced these richly detailed, intimate portraits and revealed exotic, mysterious landscapes unlike anything we've ever seen."

Dawn is the only spacecraft to orbit a body in the asteroid belt. And it is the only spacecraft to orbit two extraterrestrial destinations. These feats were possible thanks to ion propulsion, a tremendously efficient propulsion system familiar to science-fiction fans and space enthusiasts.

Pushed by ion propulsion, Dawn reached Vesta in 2011 and investigated it from surface to core during 14 months in orbit. In 2012, engineers maneuvered Dawn out of orbit and steered it though the asteroid belt for more than two years before inserting it into

orbit around the dwarf planet Ceres, where it has been collecting data since 2015.

All the while, scientists gained new insight into the early stages of our Solar System, fulfilling Dawn's objective. The mission was named for its purpose: to learn more about the dawn of the Solar System. It targeted Ceres and Vesta because they function as time capsules, intact survivors of the earliest part of our history.

### WHICH FLU SHOT IS RIGHT FOR YOU?

Dear Savvy Senior,

I've been reading that there are a bunch of different flu vaccines for seniors this flu season. Which flu shot is right for me?

Flu-Conscious Carol



Neither of these vaccines uses chicken eggs in their manufacturing process.

Fear of needle vaccines: If you don't like needles, and you're between the ages of 18 and 64, your options are the "Fluzone Intradermal" or "AFLURIA" vaccine.

The Fluzone intradermal flu shot uses a tiny 1/16-inch long micro-needle to inject the vaccine just under the skin, rather than deeper in the muscle like standard flu shot. While the AFLURIA vaccine is administered by a jet injector, which is a medical device that uses a high-pressure, narrow stream of fluid to penetrate the skin instead of a needle.

You should also know that if you're a Medicare beneficiary, Part B covers all flu vaccinations, but if you have private health insurance, you'll need to check with your plan to see which vaccines they do or don't cover.

#### Pneumonia Vaccines

Two other important vaccinations the CDC recommends to seniors, especially this time of year, are the pneumococcal vaccines for pneumonia. Around 1 million Americans are hospitalized with pneumonia each year, and about 50,000 people die from it.

The CDC recommends that all seniors, 65 or older, get two vaccinations - Pnevnr 13 and Pneumovax 23. Both vaccines, which are administered just once at different times, work in different ways to provide maximum protection.

If you haven't yet received any pneumococcal vaccine you should get the Pnevnr 13 first, followed by Pneumovax 23 six to 12 months later. Medicare Part B covers both shots, if they are taken at least one year apart.

Dear Carol,

It wasn't that long ago that if you wanted to get protected from the flu, you simply got a flu shot. But now days, there are so many flu vaccine options you might feel like you are ordering off a menu. To help you decide which flu shot is right for you, you need to consider your health, age and personal preferences. Here's what you should know.

#### Flu Shot Options

Just as they do every year, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends a seasonal flu shot to everyone 6 months of age and older, but it's especially important for seniors who are at higher risk of developing serious flu-related complications. The flu puts more than 200,000 people in the hospital each year and kills an average of 24,000 - 80 to 90 percent of whom are seniors. Here's the rundown of the different vaccine options (you only need to get one of these):

Standard flu vaccines: If you want to keep things basic, you can't go wrong with a "standard (trivalent) flu shot," which has been around for more than 40 years and protects against three different strains of flu viruses. This year's version protects against two A strains (H1N1 and H3N2), and one influenza B virus.

Or, for additional protection, you should consider the "quadrivalent flu vaccine" that protects against four types of influenza - the same three strains as the standard trivalent flu shot, plus an additional B-strain virus.

Senior specific vaccines: If you're age 65 or older and want some extra protection, you should consider the "Fluzone High-Dose" or "FLUAD."

The Fluzone High-Dose has four times the amount of antigen as a regular flu shot does, while the FLUAD contains an added ingredient called adjuvant MF59. Both vaccines provide a stronger immune response for better protection.

Egg allergy vaccines: If you're allergic to eggs, your flu shot options are "Flucelvax" or "FluBlok."

The Market Action Index has been trending down lately, while inventory and days-on-market are climbing. The trends imply a weakening market.

### Supply & Demand

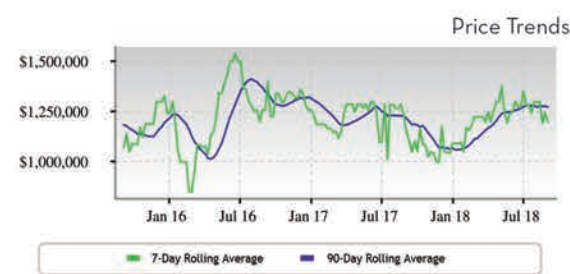
The market has been cooling over time and prices plateaued for a while. Despite the consistent decrease in MAI, we're in the Seller's zone. Watch for changes in MAI. If the MAI resumes its climb, prices will likely follow suit. If the MAI drops consistently or falls into the Buyer's zone, watch for downward pressure on prices.



The Market Action Index answers the question “How’s the Market?” by measuring the current rate of sale versus the amount of the inventory. Index above 30 implies Seller’s Market conditions. Below 30, conditions favor the buyer.

### Price

The market seems to have paused around this plateau. The Market Action Index is a good leading indicator for the durability of this trend.



### Quartiles

### FOOTHILL GOLD LINE UPDATE: GLENDORA TO MONTCLAIR PROJECT PROPOSALS RECEIVED

Today, the Construction Authority reached a major milestone on the Glendora to Montclair project. The four shortlisted teams competing for the Alignment Design-Build Contract submitted proposals in response to tens of thousands of pages of engineering and project information provided to each team over the last several months. Proposals include each team's technical method to completing the design and construction of the 12.3-mile project, their management approach, proposed key personnel, financial bid and more.

The Construction Authority will once again use a "best value" approach to evaluating the proposals, where the technical merits of the team and their approach are weighted approximately equally with the bid price. Over the next several weeks, six committees of transportation and industry experts, attorneys, financial professionals and partner agencies will review different elements of the proposals and then come together to provide

their overall ratings and recommendations. I will use this information to make a formal recommendation to the board of directors.

Below is a picture of the four sets of proposals being prepared to be sent off to the evaluation committee members:

In preparation to award this important contract, the Construction Authority continues to make progress in our efforts to reduce potential delays for the winning team who will build the project. To that end, we are working closely with the freight line operator to eliminate the current pole line communication system, which uses mostly overhead lines located within the shared rail corridor to communicate with safety equipment at crossings. The pole lines need to be removed to make room for the freight tracks to be relocated and the light rail system installed. ### REMEMBERING JOHN "PEPE" SALERNO: SEVENTEEN YEARS LATER

September 11, 2001. A day forever etched in everyone's heart and mind. Who can forget witnessing the horror of the terrorist attacks shown on television? There was so much carnage, so many lives lost- victims of the attack and brave responders who immediately rushed to their aid, putting their own safety aside.

I grew up in Westfield, N.J. Like neighboring cities, many residents commuted to NYC for work. Sixty Union County residents lost their lives that day.

One victim was John "Pepe" Salerno Jr. of Westfield. He was only thirty-one years old. He and wife Danielle lived on Carleton Rd., a few houses from my mom's. At the time of the tragedy, their lives seemed perfect; they were remodeling their home, and awaiting the birth of their first child.

Pepe's home town was Port Washington, New York. As a youth he was very athletic-played both football and lacrosse in the Youth Athletic League. In High School, he was a stand-out in lacrosse, setting school records, and there met his Danielle. Collegiately, he received full scholarships in lacrosse, and played two years for Nassau Community College, 89-90, and for St. John's University 91-92, again setting records. But Pepe realized the importance of education and earned a degree at St. John's in economics. After college, he played pro lacrosse for the New York Saints, all the while developing a sales career which led him to Cantor Fitzgerald on Wall St. in 1994.

Cantor Fitzgerald sent him to London and Tokyo, where he and Danielle worked and resided from 1994-1998. After a transfer to the New York Office, they settled in Westfield N.J.

Pepe succeeded in his career as a broker, but what was most dear to his heart was giving back to the community and sharing his talent. After he and Danielle moved to Westfield, Pepe volunteered to be head coach of the town's 5th and 6th grade youth lacrosse team from 1998-



2001. Pepe loved the kids and they loved him. Those who knew him remember his infectious smile and his favorite saying, "There is no 'I' in team." He would be so proud to know that the young Westfield boys wore his initials on their helmets throughout their high school and collegiate lacrosse careers.

When looking at one of Pepe's recent websites, I found so many heart-warming remembrances: One of his former players wrote, "The 5th grade 1999 Westfield lacrosse team knew John in a completely different way than most people and I think that is part of the reason he had such a profound impact on our lives. He spoke to us not as a superior, but as a friend. He helped us not just on the lacrosse field, but in life as well. He was a best friend, and to us, he was family."

Months after "Pepe's death, Danielle gave birth to their son, John Salerno III, known as "Jack". When young, he spoke of his Daddy in Heaven. He is now seventeen.

It was very rough for Danielle and "Pepe's family after his sudden tragic death. Besides Danielle, he left behind his mother and stepfather, Jo Ann and Skip Cohen, father John Salerno, Sr., sister Dina Connelly, her husband and three children and younger brother Michael Cohen. Eventually they founded the "John "Pepe" Salerno Foundation to provide for the 105 children who lost fathers that day.

After a few years and much prodding, Danielle met Jason Behan. Danielle said that he treats Jack like his own son, and she loved him for that. They married, and together they have three sons, Harrison, Theodore and William.

The Town of Westfield has a 2011 Memorial Park, dedicated on September 11, 2002 to commemorate the lives of all victims of September 11th. The main glass spire contains all victims' names while the twelve granite pillars are dedicated to the twelve from Westfield. Pepe will live forever in the hearts and minds of both his beloved family and all those whose lives' he touched.

### PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCIES NATIONWIDE UNITE TO RAISE FUNDS, AWARENESS TO FIGHT BREAST CANCER

Police officers, sheriff deputies and other public safety agencies will kick off a two-month campaign starting Sept. 17 to raise funds for breast cancer research, treatment and education.

Officers, deputies and safety officials will wear pink versions of their uniform patch to stimulate conversations and increase awareness about the lifesaving benefits of early breast cancer detection and intervention. Each agency also will sell the pink patch the agency designed, along with pins, T-shirts, stickers or other commemorative items to raise funds for either City of Hope or another breast cancer-focused organization.

Tied to Breast Cancer Awareness Month in October, the [Pink Patch Project](#) is a collaborative effort managed by the Los Angeles County Police Chiefs' Association and includes more than 360 public safety agencies from across the nation.

Some of the California public safety agencies participating in the campaign come from Alameda, Los Angeles, Napa, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, San Diego, Santa Cruz and Ventura counties.

The Pink Patch Project, now in its fourth year, has raised more than \$430,000 for City of Hope's breast cancer research, treatment and education programs. This year, the goal is to raise \$400,000 for City of Hope.

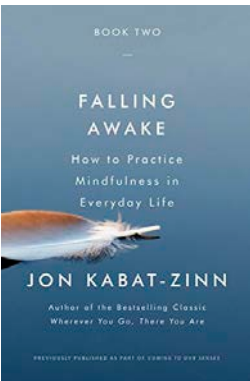
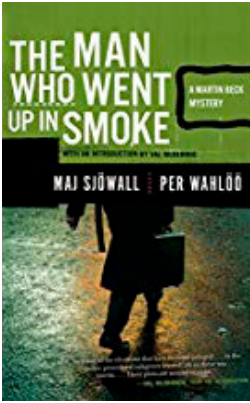

DON'T TRANSFER OWNERSHIP OF YOUR HOUSE TO YOUR KIDS BEFORE YOU READ THIS

With the cost of long-term care (LTC) skyrocketing, you may be concerned about your (or your elderly parents') ability to pay for lengthy stays in assisted living and/or a nursing home. Such care can be massively expensive, with the potential to overwhelm even the well-off.

Because neither traditional health insurance nor Medicare will pay for LTC, some people are looking to Medicaid to help cover this cost. To become eligible for Medicaid, however, you must first exhaust nearly every penny of your savings.

Given this, you may have heard that if you transfer your house to your adult children, you can avoid selling the home if you need to qualify for Medicaid. You may think transferring ownership of the house will help your eligibility for benefits and that this strategy is easier and less expensive than handling your home (and other assets) through estate planning.

However, this tactic is a big mistake on several levels. It can not only delay—or even disqualify—your Medicaid eligibility, it can also lead to numerous other problems.

Medicaid Changes

In February 2006, Congress passed the Deficit Reduction Act (DRA), which included a number of provisions aimed at reducing Medicaid abuse. One of these was a five-year “look-back” period for eligibility.

This means that before you can qualify for Medicaid, your finances will be reviewed for any “uncompensated transfers” of your assets within the five years preceding your application. If such transfers are discovered, it can result in a penalty period that will delay your eligibility.

If you transfer your house to your children and then need LTC within five years, it may significantly delay your qualification for Medicaid benefits—and possibly prevent you from ever qualifying.

A potentially huge tax burden

Another drawback to transferring ownership of your home is the potential tax liability for your child. If you're elderly, you've probably owned your house for a long time, and its value has dramatically increased, leading you to believe that by transferring your home to your child, he or she can make a windfall by selling it.

Unfortunately, if you do that, she or he will have to pay capital gains tax on the difference between your home's value when you purchased it and your home's value at the time she or he received it. Depending on the home's worth, these taxes can be astronomical.

In contrast, by transferring your home at the time of your death, your child will receive what's known as a “step-up in basis.” It's one of the only benefits of death, and it allows your child to pay capital gains taxes based on the value of the home at the time of inheritance, rather than the value at the time you bought it.

Debt, Divorce, Disability, and Death

There are numerous other reasons why transferring ownership of your house to your child is a bad idea. If your child has significant debts, his or her creditors can make claims against the property to recoup what they're owed, potentially forcing your child to sell the home to pay those debts.

Divorce is another problematic issue. If your child goes through a divorce while the house is in his or her name, the home may be considered marital property. Depending on the outcome of the divorce, this may force your child to sell the home or pay his or her ex a share of its value.

The disability or death of your child can also lead to trouble. If your child becomes disabled and seeks Medicaid or other government benefits, having the home in his or her name could compromise eligibility, just like it would your own. And if your child dies before you and has ownership of the house, the property could be considered part of your child's estate and be passed on to your child's heirs, creating a problem for you.

No substitute for proper estate planning  
Given these potential problems, transferring ownership of your home to your children as a means of “poor-man's estate planning” is almost never a good idea. Instead, follow a sound estate planning strategy designed to protect your assets while enabling you to better afford whatever long-term healthcare services you might require.

Yoga strengthens the outside and leads us inside. It challenges us to identify what prevents the experience of full embodiment of joy and love in our lives.

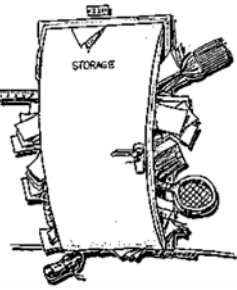

ALL TALK, NO ACTION: A REPUBLICAN METAPHOR

Congressional Republicans continue to abet and excuse Donald Trump's relentless assaults on democratic norms and the rule of law. But if we were to focus on one particular guy who best embodies that spinelessness, someone who is a veritable metaphor for a party in moral eclipse, I strongly nominate Ben Sasse.

The junior Republican senator from Nebraska has been furrowing his brow about Trump ever since the 2016 campaign, tut-tutting in high-minded language about how the paranoid narcissist is a clear and present danger. But rarely in modern times has such eloquent rhetoric been twinned with such hapless inertia. He talks like a sane person, but whenever the chips are down, he enables Trump's insanity by doing nothing.

After everything that's happened over the past week, I can't listen to Sasse anymore. When an anonymous senior Trump administration staffer wrote in The New York Times that aides are working overtime to protect America from an amoral loon, Sasse confirmed the substance of the piece. He said it was "similar to what so many of us hear from senior people around the White House, you know, three times a week." Well, that's nice to know. The so-called commander-in-chief is mentally unhinged and policy-ignorant, and Sasse and his colleagues learn this anew "three times a week."

When Sasse surfaced on "Meet the Press," he continued his lament: "The president was elected in 2016 because he wanted to disrupt everything ... The question is, disruption to what end? ... It's pretty clear that this White House is a reality show-soap opera presidency ... Right now, it just feels like there's way too much drama every day."

But what is he prepared to do about it? Nothing, except to pine for a Trump regime that will never be: "What you'd like is ... a policy process where a president can in a dispassionate way deliberate about lots of information and lots of advice and wisdom and counsel and then make a long-term decision." Trump needs to focus on "long-term vision-casting for America ... 10 years in the future, not 10 hours in the future."

Right. All that will happen on the same day that unicorns cavort on the South Lawn.

And when Brett Kavanaugh was grilled last week by the Senate Judiciary Committee - and it became obvious that he has lied under oath about his past use of hacked Democratic emails, and that he won't recuse himself from cases involving Trump - did committee member Ben Sasse voice a desire to stop Kavanaugh's ascent? Nope. He'll vote yes, along with the rest of the Senate GOP. His big contribution to the hearings was an unprofound assessment on day one about how the confirmation process has become "an election battle for TV."

Sasse, a Yale history PhD and former small-university president, constantly depicts himself as a free-thinking soul who claims not to care whether he gets re-elected in 2020. And he likes to fret publicly about how Trump has ruined the Republican brand (he said in July, "I think my party is in a bad way"). But if that's how he feels, and if he's truly indifferent about re-election in a state that Trump carried by 25 percentage points, why not put his words into action?

The GOP barely holds the Senate, 51-49. The chamber could be tied in knots if only Sasse joined forces with Jeff Flake and Bob Corker. Like Sasse, Flake and Corker talk big about Trump and do nothing. And they have less of an excuse, because they're 2018 lame ducks who will be gone in January. Three renegade Republican senators, backing their words with action, could arguably hold up Kavanaugh's nomination - or halt other Trump priorities - unless the Senate leadership first agrees to move the bill, currently in limbo, that protects Robert Mueller from being fired; or move the bill, currently in limbo, that curbs Trump's ability to unilaterally start a war; or move a bill, currently in limbo, that would better protect our elections from foreign cyberattacks.

But Sasse's refusal to use senatorial leverage renders his words hollow. History will be harsh on those who saw danger and shrank from confronting it. Trump is counting on all Republicans to remain gutless.

As the philosopher John Stuart Mill warned in an 1867 address, "Bad men need nothing more to compass their ends, than that good men should look on and do nothing."

RECALLING 9/11: WE'RE NOT SO DIVIDED AFTER ALL

On Sept. 11, 2001, I was driving along the Beltway to a Falls Church, Va., office building when a radio announcer said a plane had flown into the North Tower of the World Trade Center in New York City.

"What a horrible accident," I remember thinking. I was doing communications work for a big technology company. I parked my car and just as I was getting situated in my cubicle inside the office building, I heard the television blaring in my client's office.

He told me a second plane had flown into the South Tower of the World Trade Center. Soon, we learned that a third plane had flown into the Pentagon. We took the elevator to the top floor with several others. Only 9 miles from the Pentagon, we could see smoke billowing into the sky.

Radios and TVs were turned up. Local announcers were relaying reports of additional attacks, many of which would turn out to be untrue.

Dulles International Airport was under attack? Reagan National Airport? The White House? The Capitol? How many more hijacked planes were out there? Where would they strike next?

It was total chaos. Here I was in an impersonal office building as people cried, called loved ones, even prayed aloud.

We all experienced the horrific events of 9/11 in different ways and there was nothing special about my experience — except that I was living in the Washington, D.C., region when it happened.

Lucky for me, I had been regularly attending St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Alexandria, Va.

A small church in a rapidly gentrifying area, its mostly black congregation can be described in one word: cheerful.

The first and third Sundays of every month, a 30-person choir belts out gospel music that would fill even the most cynical among us with hope and joy.

Father McBready, an Irishman of the Josephite order, was the pastor there in 2001. His Irish lilt and wit produced many uplifting sermons — none more uplifting than on the first Sunday after the attack.

The church was packed that morning, all of us feeling the same inability to comprehend the violence inflicted on so many innocents.

Father McBready began his sermon by telling us about a wonderful woman whose marriage he had presided over a few years before. She and her husband recently had been blessed with a son — and both she and her son were aboard one of the planes that struck the World Trade Center.

He said that in the midst of such sadness, however, there is hope: Tragedy reduces us to our most basic selves, helping us renew our efforts to lead virtuous lives. It helps us escape the narrowness of ourselves to join together with others to help those in need.

After the choir sang joyously, 200 people held hands and prayed as one. Filled with a renewed sense of hope, we were eager to do something, anything, to help our neighbors in need — donate funds, make sandwiches for first responders at the Pentagon, volunteer our time, etc.

It's been 17 years since the 9/11 tragedy. We appear to be a divided, cynical people, but I don't buy it.

God forbid such an alarming event ever happens in America again. But if it does, millions of Americans from every walk of life will come together as one to help our neighbors in need.

Just as we did after 9/11.

RESISTANCE IN THE WHITE HOUSE



The stories of chaos, craziness and betrayal going on inside the Trump White House are nothing to worry much about.

White House staffers attempting to influence, question or thwart a president's ideas or goals are as old as George Washington, Richard Nixon — or Ronald Reagan.

As we've recently seen, it's just a lot easier today for un-named White House insiders to get their criticism or embarrassing stories instantly published. It doesn't matter how dubious the journalism is, or who writes it. If it's anti-Trump, it's always fit to print.

Bob Woodward's gossipy best-seller "Fear" was built mostly on anonymous sources, unattributed quotes or second-hand anecdotes. Omarosa's crazy White House tell-all "Unhinged" was only slightly less credible.

But the New York Times hit a new low in its war on Trump last week.

It published an anonymous op-ed piece written by a Trump adviser who claimed that he and some of his fellow White House "resistance" members were so concerned with the president's actions and mental state that they contemplated using the 25th Amendment to remove him.

Maybe it's all true. Maybe it's all BS. We'll find out the real story someday, but it's certainly not new.

After my father was shot in 1981, some of his top advisers were seriously worried about his mental stability.

According to Bill O'Reilly in "Killing Reagan," they considered using the 25th Amendment to remove him on grounds of mental incapacity and even gave him a test. My father passed the test with flying colors and, according to the history books, did his job pretty well afterwards.

No one read about those concerns my father's advisers had about his mental state in a New York Times op-ed piece as they were occurring. Likewise, no one read about how he trumped his top advisers on his decision to invade Grenada.

When he called a White House meeting to vote on the idea, the final tally was 7-3 to not invade. My father was one of the three.

Two days later, the world woke up to see TV images of American forces capturing the island. When one of his shocked advisers called and said, "Mr. President, I thought we had a vote and we decided not to go," my father said, "Yes, we did. But my vote cancelled your seven."

No one at the time read about that "fight" with his White House staff in the papers, just as they never learned how his advisers tried to prevent him from speaking two of his most famous lines.

They kept deleting "Mr. Gorbachev, tear down that wall" from his Berlin Wall speech and they also tried to stop him from referring to the Soviet Union as "the Evil Empire."

The most important "fight" my father had with his advisers came in 1986, however, when he met with Mikhail Gorbachev at the nuclear missile summit in Reykjavik.

Everyone in the liberal media desperately wanted him to sign a nuclear arms treaty with the USSR — any treaty.

My father's staffers were worried about his political legacy. Preferring a weak deal to no deal at all, they urged him to sign a treaty he did not think was good enough.

My father shocked his advisers, the media and most everyone in the Free World by saying "nyet" to Gorbachev in Iceland and walking out of the summit without signing anything.

Everyone in the liberal media thought he was nuts, of course. But his decision turned out to be a great geopolitical move that became a key turning point in the Cold War.

If the Washington Post had published an anonymous op-ed from one of my father's worried advisers at the time, I bet history would not have turned out so well.
