GOURDIKIAN PLEADS GUILTY TO ILLEGAL GUNS SALES

A former Pasadena police Lieutenant pled guilty in court Thursday, to federal charges related to selling at least 108 firearms without a license, as part of a plea deal with prosecutors.

Vasken Kenneth Gourdikian of Sierra Madre also pled guilty to making false statements about the gun sales. As part of the deal with the U.S. Attorney's Office, Gourdikian is expected to be sentenced to 30 months in prison, three years of supervised release and pay a fine. His sentencing is set of Feb. 4.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Jennifer Chou said Gourdikian was a gun dealer and not a hobbyist as he claimed.

"He was buying them, acquiring inventory, he was advertizing them online, he was selling them direct to buyers," Chou said. "He was selling them very quickly after he was able to take physical custody of the firearms."

According to court documents, of the guns Gourdikian sold, 80 were "off-roster" firearms, guns that cannot be purchased or sold by the public in California.

Mark Werksman, Gourdikian's Attorney said he could have sold the guns legally if he had paid \$25 for the license.

"Vasken Gourdikian meant no harm to the community," Mark Werksman, Gourdikian's Attorney, "In fact at times he didn't know he was violating federal law and it's really a shame that his distinguished career in law enforcement ended this way"

Gourdikian resined from the Pasadena police force in March. He was a 23 year veteran and the departments pubic spokesperson.

Gourdikian's troubles started when a firearm he had



sold was recovered at a crime scene by a neighboring police department and traced, by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, to him in 2016.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH INTENSITY DRUG TRAFFICKING AREA REPORTS THAT THE LEGALIZATION OF RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA HAS HAD NEGATIVE IMPACTS IN COLORADO

Last week, the Rocky Mountain High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (RMHIDTA) Strategic Intelligence Unit published their annual report on the impact of the legalization of marijuana in Colorado. RMHIDTA has published annual reports every year since 2013 to track issues related to marijuana use in Colorado.

Of note, the RMHIDTA was established by the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) in 1996. As of 2017, the program has 30 RMHIDTA designated counties in 4 states (Colorado, Montana, Utah, and Wyoming), and the group's mission is to support the national drug control strategy of reducing drug use.

A copy of the report can be found on the RMHIDTA website, and additional information about the RMHIDTA can be found online at www.RMHIDTA.org. In addition, some of the startling highlights in the report have been compiled for your reference below.

As of June 2017, there were 491 retail marijuana stores in the state of Colorado, compared to 392 Starbucks and 208 McDonald's.

Since recreational marijuana was legalized, marijuana related traffic deaths increased 151%, while all Colorado traffic deaths increased 35%.

Since recreational marijuana was legalized, traffic deaths involving drivers who tested positive for marijuana more than doubled from 55 in 2013, to 138 people killed in 2017.

This equates to one person killed every 2 ½ days compared to one person killed every 6 ½ days. The percentage of all Colorado traffic deaths that were marijuana related increased from 11.43% in 2013, to 21.3% in 2017.

Colorado past month marijuana use for those ages 12 and older is ranked 3rd in the nation and is 85% higher than the national average. The yearly rate of emergency department visits related to marijuana increased 52% after the legalization of recreational marijuana (2012 compared to 2016)

The yearly rate of marijuana-related hospitalizations increased 148% after the legalization of recreational marijuana (2012 compared to 2016) 65% of local jurisdictions in Colorado have banned medical and recreational marijuana businesses.

WALKING SIERRA MADRE.. The Social Side By Deanne Davis

"Experience the magic of the floats before they make their debut in the 2019 Rose Parade. During the final stages of preparation a variety of seeds, bark, fruits and vegetables, grasses and of course, flowers are being applied to the floats by experienced professionals as well as hard working volunteers."

"The optimist sees the rose and not its thorns; the pessimist stares at the thorns, oblivious to the rose." Kahlil Gibran

Dick Sappington, our "go-to" guy for the Sierra Madre Rose Floats for the past 21 years or so is way more concerned about being sure our float is within all the parameters of the Rose Parade Rule Book than whether the roses have thorns or not. Said Rule Book, over the 100 years of the Tournament of Roses, has grown from a few hazy details – including the famous "Never on Sunday!" Rule – to a volume ¾" thick as new rules are added whenever something goes wrong. Float builders must now be sure they follow rules to the letter as they will most definitely be enforced by the Tournament inspectors. Most important rule of the Tournament of Roses: You Don't Stop The Parade!! If your float is so foolish as to stop the parade, that means an immediate \$1,000.00 fine. If there's some way you could have prevented your float from having the bad taste to stop the parade then you're really in trouble. Our fantastic floats have been towed four times. Each time our float folks end up in front of a group where you are judged guilty till proven innocent. Needless to say, Dick's major concern is to be sure beyond a shadow of a doubt that our float will keep going and not break down in any way at all.

Building the float is fun, Dick says. It's built by people who enjoy creating mechanical things. The basic system is a custom-made chassis, out of industrial steel and truck components per Tournament regulations. Any repairs or upgrades to the chassis must be completed early in the year. A metal lattice is created out of ¼" steel rods, welded together to form the shape of the float. This year's float design is based on the oriental garden at Sierra Madre Elementary School. Once the design is approved, the builders start with the bare chassis.

Great detail is used to make sure every curve is just right. Individual structures are built that will go on top of the float. These structures, like one of the lanterns this year will often be assigned to one person who might spend a number of months building it with great care.

Dick's wife, Kay, is head of decoration and she does the floral design. She's also the one who deals with the hundreds of volunteers in December. This year the building crew of construction guys numbers nine. Dick works two days a week on this hobby of his - Sunday and Thursday, where you can find him at our barn. Over the years, he has worked on all the independent floats, South Pasadena, Burbank, Cal Poly – Dick is still an advisor with the Cal Poly gang. He really likes



working with 50 or 60 engineering students who are not, as Dick puts it, "millennials!" For Dick, the fun part is the design engineering aspect – every float is a new toy. He has acquired a massive cross-section of skills over the years: mechanical engineer, hydraulics expert, automotive genius and electrical-electronic know-how. As a motorcycle rider-builder, car builder and rider, ex-military and even farming, Dick learned it all along the way. He's one of those guys who can create whatever's needed. His training has been living a mechanical life, playing with many many toys.

There will be more hydraulic lifts on our float this year than ever before. A lift is raised or lowered 14' and we will have 9 vertical functions this year! 4 cattails, 3 trees, 2 lanterns and a waterfall in the back. Dick builds for the crowds along Colorado Blvd., not necessarily for the television cameras. His final words were, "If I can't weld it, I can't work with it!" No problem, our float is one weld after another.

The Sierra Madre Rose Float would not be possible without the volunteer builders and the many residents who donate to the Rose Float Association. 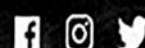

Pasadena Tax Return Preparer Shut Down

A federal court has issued last week an order that permanently bars a tax return preparer who operated offices in Pasadena – as well as other cities in California, Colorado and Kansas – from preparing federal income tax returns, United States Attorney Nick Hanna announced Wednesday.

Maria Del Consuelo Vazquez is the subject of a permanent injunction filed Monday by United States District Judge Fernando M. Olguin. In Monday's order, Judge Olguin also prohibited Vazquez from owning a tax return preparation business.

Vasquez operated tax preparation business in Pasadena; Corona; Santa Ana; Brighton, Colorado; and Hutchinson, Kansas under a Nevada corporation she called MCV Business Network, Inc. In recent years, Vazquez filed thousands of tax returns for clients under her IRS-issued Preparer Tax Identification Number (PTIN).

According to a lawsuit filed by federal prosecutors on July 13 and testimony presented to the court, Vazquez substantially inflated or completely fabricated charitable contributions and unreimbursed employee business expenses to illegally generate federal income tax refunds for her clients or to substantially understate clients' tax liabilities.

"Vazquez prepared and filed a total of 9,216 tax returns from January 1, 2015 to May 21, 2018 with her PTIN," Judge Olguin wrote. "Based on the average deficiency of \$2,830.29 from her audited returns, that suggests Vazquez's fraudulent returns have resulted in harm of over \$26 million to the United States from January 1, 2015 to present."

Caltech Opens the New Bechtel Residence

Caltech's newest undergraduate residence, the 211-bed Bechtel Residence—named for Caltech life trustee Stephen D. Bechtel Jr.—officially opened its doors to students on Monday.

The first new undergraduate housing facility to open on campus in more than two decades, Bechtel is a multiuse residence that will house undergraduates from all class levels along with two faculty in residence, a half-dozen graduate resident associates, and a residential life coordinator. The beds in Bechtel will now make it possible for Caltech to offer all of its undergraduates the opportunity to live on campus throughout all four years of their education.

"Completion of the Bechtel Residence is a milestone in our efforts to provide on-campus housing for all our students and, most importantly, creates a new model of residential experience for this millennium," says Joe Shepherd, the vice president for student affairs and Allen V. C. Davis and Lenabelle Davis Leadership Chair.

The 95,000-square-foot residence, composed of six distinct but interconnected structures arranged around an expansive interior courtyard, was intentionally designed to promote interaction among its residents. Although all of the student rooms are singles, nearly all have been set up in apartment or suite configurations with



anywhere from four to 12 rooms in each shared space. The residence also has a 400-person dining hall, community lounges, and a kitchen on each floor; in addition, there are four study rooms and multiple laundry facilities throughout the complex.

"This thoughtfully and beautifully designed new building provides new opportunities to enrich and enhance the Caltech undergraduate experience," says Antonio Rangel, the Bing Professor of Neuroscience, Behavioral Biology, and Economics, who will be living in Bechtel with his family as the new head faculty in residence. "Take for instance, the full whiteboards in every suite—what a great tool for student collaboration."

By providing the additional space needed to house all undergraduates on campus, Bechtel also has freed up Caltech-owned off-campus apartments and houses for graduate student use. Both the ability to house all undergrads on campus and the ability to

provide more space for graduate students have been longtime goals for enhancing residential life.

Work on Bechtel, which is situated at the north end of campus alongside Avery on Moore Walk, began in 2016.

Governor Signs Suicide Prevention Legislation

Governor Jerry Brown this week signed SB 972, suicide prevention legislation authored by Senator Anthony J. Portantino, D-La Cañada Flintridge.

"I would like to thank Governor Brown for signing SB 972 and his support on this important issue. As a father and a legislator, the safety of our children continues to be a priority. My hope is to foster an open dialogue about suicide and to help prevent these horrific tragedies. If one life can be saved through this bill then all of our efforts will have been worth it," commented Senator Portantino.

Senator Portantino is a strong advocate for suicide prevention and mental health policy. SB 972 requires public, charter, and private schools that serves pupils from 7 - 12 and higher education to print the National Suicide Prevention Hotline telephone number on student identification cards. Adolescent suicide and self-inflicted injury are a serious social and public health concern. According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, suicide is the second leading cause of death among young people ages 15-24.

I was actually surprised that I had never before heard of the organization, as they are located here in Southern California, and have been in operation for 34 years. Because animals are such a big part of my life, I try to support as many rescue and rights advocate groups as I can, so I was quite anxious to learn more about this one.

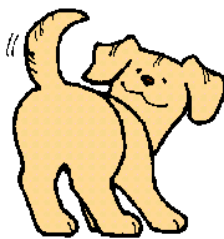
Living Free Animal Sanctuary is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that I think is uniquely worthy of support because of their commitment to rescuing otherwise euthanized pets from high-kill shelters and promising them a loving home outside of a cage for the duration of their lives. There are many non-profits that rescue animals and work hard at finding them homes through foster and adoption programs. However, due to limited space and resources, the animals are often kept in cages with no guarantee of a home where they can roam freely and receive all the love and attention they need.

Founded in 1980, Living Free was among the first privately-funded, no-kill sanctuaries to rescue dogs and cats from imminent shelter euthanasia. The sanctuary's founder, Emily Jo Beard (1923-1989), was strongly passionate in her belief that freedom, reverence and justice should prevail for all life, not just human-kind, and that philosophy is what drove her to carry out her mission. Beard understood that the human's position of "dominion" over animals means guardianship and stewardship, versus power and tyranny. Inspired by the beliefs of Albert Schweitzer, and with a goal to provide hope and dignity to animals, she decided to devote her life to the cause.

Today, the staff and volunteers at Living Free Sanctuary continue to carry out Beard's original mission with equal compassion. Located at 54250 Keen Camp Rd. in Mountain Center, CA off highway 74, the sanctuary offers animals a gorgeous setting in the San Jacinto Mountains. They are open to the public 11am-4pm daily, except Wednesdays, for visitors to come and see the good work they are doing with the animals.

CHEF MIA WASILEVICH COOKS WITH WEEDS

Speaking in Sierra Madre this coming week

Mia Wasilevich is a chef, photographer, and naturalist who has learned to combine wild foods with her love of cooking. She is the author of a cookbook focusing on invasive and naturalized weeds entitled Ugly Little Greens (Page Street Publishing 2017). She's currently a food stylist in Los Angeles, California. On Thursday, September 27, you can listen to her talk about local wild foods at the Sierra Madre CERT meeting, 7 p.m. at the Hart Building in Memorial Park.

GETTING STARTED WITH WILD FOODS

As a young child, Mia traveled to many countries, including Central and South America, Australia, New Zealand and Europe. It became evident to her that what Americans consider "weeds" or wild plants are often regarded as food in many parts of the world.

Mia noticed that weeds and invasive plants make an appearance as food in many cultures. For example, morning glories in Asia, various types of nettles in Africa, and lambs quarters in India.

Mia began to wonder why this art of wildcrafting had faded from our own culture, except for in a few vintage cookbooks. Eventually, she met a prolific set of teachers, foragers, and "foodies" in the Los Angeles area and it inspired her to use weeds in everyday cooking. She calls these "everyday weeds" which she attempts to make into recipes as interesting as possible, while keeping it simple.

She's experimented with unique dishes made from many wild foods, but mainly focuses on invasive plants, non-native plants which were brought here or have migrated here, or whose seeds hitched a ride on travelers inadvertently. Some of the native wild plants she uses include the acorn. One of her first creations was the acorn burger, which is a substantial and tasty meat substitute. She also developed elderberry ketchup and barbeque sauce that have become yearly staples of hers when the berries are abundant.

Among the invasive green plants she uses, most can be used interchangeably and can substitute familiar vegetables such as spinach, lettuce and mustard greens. For example, chickweed (Stellaria media) and miner's lettuce (Claytonia perfoliata) are two greens that pop up seemingly everywhere

whenever it rains in the early spring and winter and carpet most backyards and hillsides. They have a lovely, delicate texture and can replace lettuce or anywhere you want a cool, fresh, and green taste. They are excellent raw but can be cooked as potherbs, as well. The chickweed is a common European plant, while miner's lettuce is a native.

"My favorite plants to harvest are drought-tolerant black sage (Salvia melifera) when it grows profusely and, of course, the stinging nettle (Urtica dioica) which many people forage when they are first learning to identify plants," she explains. Mia likes to infuse creams and chocolates with black sage for a wonderful heady, mint-like experience. She also likes the nettle plant, which she says is "completely unique and I refuse to believe it tastes like spinach." Mia describes nettles as a plant which embodies "medicine as food," lending a complex green flavor to whatever dish it graces. She also makes a "Nettle-ade" which uses dried nettle tea, preserved lemon, sparkling water and a bit of honey or agave.

She has created menus for special events that have included cactus and tequila paletas (popsicles) with habanero ants, lambs quarters (Chenopodium) seed croquettes with corn milk and sweet white clover (Melilotus albus), white fir (Abies concolor) sugar beignets and cream among other creations.

Mia, who is half Native American (from the Southwest) and half Russian (via Argentina), grew up in Nevada and Southern California.

"That's a lot of food culture right here," she explains. "During my many childhood travels, the very local ingredients made the foods of various places we traveled very special and memorable to me."

She points out that living in the Los Angeles area, she doesn't have to drive far to have an authentic ethnic food experience from just about anywhere in the world.

"Once I reached adulthood and was introduced to wild plants and foraging, I couldn't think of a reason not to use them for food as long as it was sustainable. Foraging is a practice in being self-reliant. In addition, the plants that are in my book are authentic to my environment, and they are also universal. This means that these plants grow in many places all over the world and are used by so many cultures in so many different ways. I think that's neat."

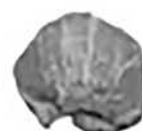

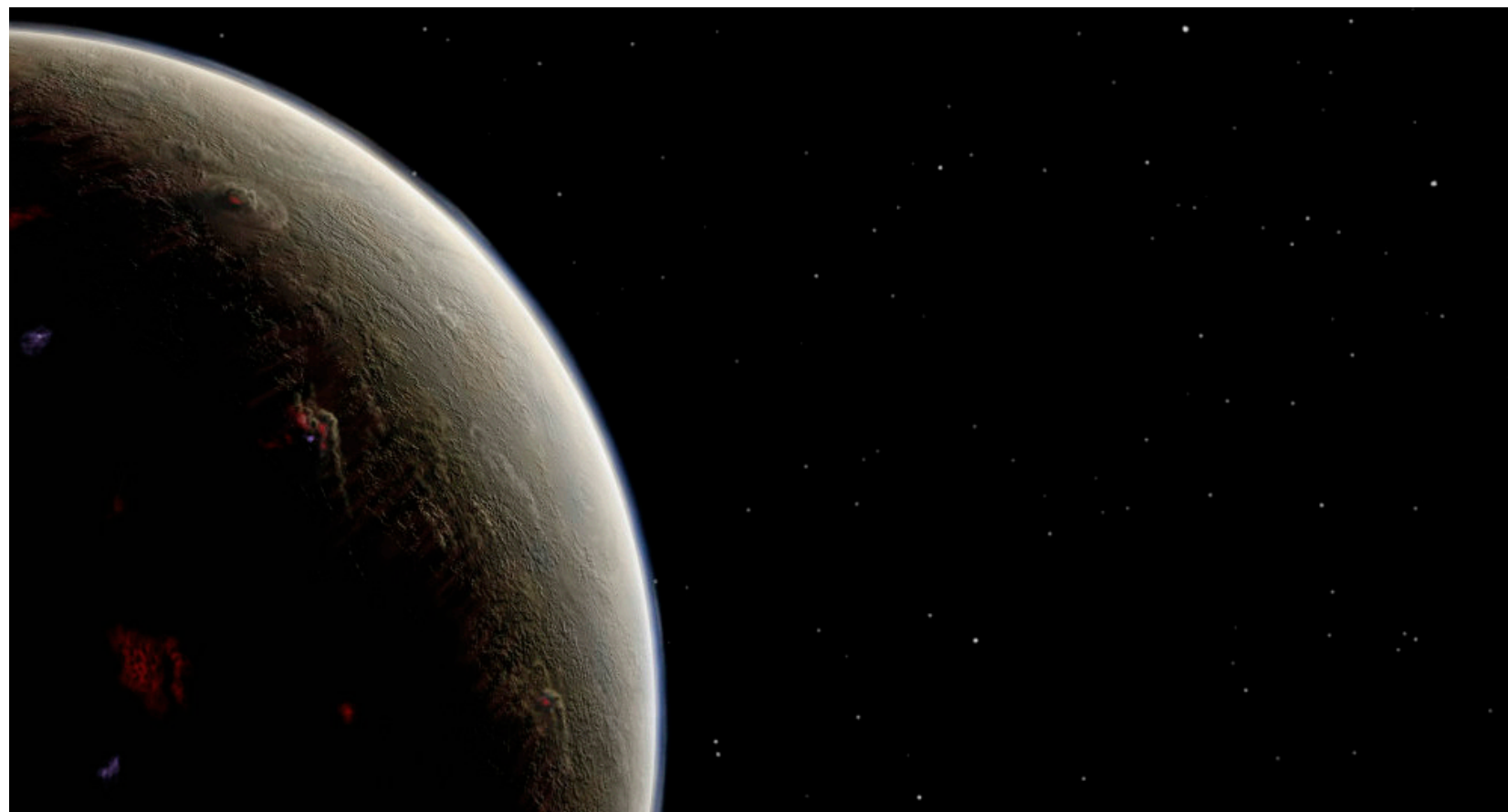
EXPLORING STRANGE NEW WORLDS: "STAR TREK" PLANET VULCAN FOUND, NEW PLANET COULD BE SPOCK'S HOME WORLD

Among the TV series Star Trek's many charms are its rich universe of characters and planets. Now, the Dharma Planet Survey, in a new study led by University of Florida (UF) astronomer Jian Ge and team including Tennessee State University (TSU) astronomers Matthew Mutterspaugh and Gregory Henry, has shown that science fiction may be a little less so; the Dharma project has discovered what may be Star Trek's famed planet Vulcan.

"The new planet is a 'super-Earth' orbiting the star HD 26965, which is only 16 light-years from Earth, making it the closest super-Earth orbiting another Sun-like star," says Ge. "The planet is roughly twice the size of Earth and orbits its star with a 42-day period just inside the star's optimal habitable zone." The discovery was made using the Dharma Endowment Foundation Telescope (DEFT), a 50-inch telescope located atop Mt. Lemmon in southern Arizona. The planet is the first "super-Earth" detected by the Dharma Survey.

"The orange-tinted HD 26965 is only slightly cooler and slightly less massive than our Sun, is approximately the same age as our Sun, and has a 10.1-year magnetic cycle nearly identical to the Sun's 11.6-year sunspot cycle," explains Mutterspaugh, who helped to commission the Dharma spectrograph on the TSU 2-meter automatic spectroscopic telescope. "Therefore," he adds, "HD 26965 may be an ideal host star for an advanced civilization."

"Star Trek fans may know the star HD 26965 by its alternative moniker, 40 Eridani A," says Henry, who collected precise brightness measurements of the star at TSU's automated observatory needed to confirm the presence of the planet. "Vulcan was connected to 40 Eridani A in the publications 'Star Trek 2' by James Blish (Bantam, 1968) and 'Star Trek Maps' by Jeff Maynard (Bantam, 1980)," explains Henry. In a letter published in the periodical "Sky and Telescope" in July 1991, Gene Roddenberry, the creator of Star Trek, along with Sallie Baliunas, Robert Donahue, and George Nassiopoulos of the Harvard-Smithsonian Center



for Astrophysics confirmed the identification of 40 Eridani A as Vulcan's host star. The 40 Eridani star system is composed of three stars. Vulcan orbits the primary star, and the two companion stars "would gleam brilliantly in the Vulcan sky," they wrote in their 1991 letter.

"Vulcan is the home planet of Science Officer Mr. Spock in the original 'Star Trek' Sci-Fi series," says Henry. "Spock served on the starship Enterprise, whose mission was to seek out strange new worlds, a mission shared by the Dharma Planet Survey."

"This star can be seen with the naked eye, unlike the host stars of most of the known planets discovered to date. Now anyone can see 40 Eridani on a clear night and be proud to point out Spock's home," says Bo Ma, a UF postdoc on the team and the first author of the paper just published in "Monthly Notices of the Royal Astronomical Society."

"This discovery demonstrates that fully dedicated telescopes conducting high-cadence, high-precision radial velocity observations in the

near future will continue to play a key role in the discovery of more super-Earths and even Earth-like planets in the habitable zones around nearby stars," says Ge. "I am very grateful to the donor of our Dharma Planet Survey, Mr. Mickey Singer, who recognized the importance of this project and has continuously provided support to make this and future discoveries possible."

ARCADIA UNIFIED CUTS RIBBON ON NEW \$7.5 MILLION FACILITIES AND MAINTENANCE YARD



Arcadia Unified School District (AUSD) officials cut the ribbon and introduced the new Jim Leahy Maintenance Yard in a private ceremony on Tuesday September 18. The new yard and accompanying facilities are the concluding projects of Measure 1 "Arcadia Neighborhood Schools Health, Safety and Repair Measure," which spanned over 10 years and poured \$218 million into AUSD school improvements.

The initial school bond measure passed in 2006 and helped update 11 schools with much needed safety and upgraded renovations. Longtime resident and former Citizen of the Year (2015), Jim Leahy, was also honored at the event. Mr. Leahy, who is retired, dedicated much of his life to helping area schools and supervised the Measure 1 project as Executive Director of Facilities. Along with AUSD School Board President Cung Nguyen, and other school board members, Mr. Leahy cut the red ribbon to kick off the celebration which included keynote

speakers, area boy scouts, the Arcadia High School Marching Band, and a beautiful spread of food, drinks and desserts, including a "Happy Retirement" cake for Mr. Leahy.

The new maintenance yard, which will accommodate the Facilities, Maintenance, Transportation, Operations, and Nutritional Services Departments, was not part of Measure 1's initial plan. But due to the hard work of Mr. Leahy, and countless, devoted staff members, upgrades to area schools were completed ahead of schedule and under budget, which gave the district wiggle room to build this facility.

Other projects completed as a result of Measure 1 include a Performance Arts Center, Aquatics Center and Career Technical Education Center at the High School, as well as upgrades to electrical wiring, smoke detectors, roofing and earthquake safety classroom upgrades. The bond was refinanced last year saving Arcadia tax payers \$80 million.

CHOOSING A CONTINUING-CARE RETIREMENT COMMUNITY

Dear Savvy Senior,

Can you give me some tips on picking an all-inclusive residential retirement community that offers independent housing along with assisted living and nursing care? My husband and I are looking to downsize and simplify, but we want our next move to be our last.

Approaching 80

Dear Approaching,

If you want your next move to be your final one, an all-inclusive retirement community – also known as a continuing-care retirement community (or CCRC) – is a great option to consider, but they aren't cheap.

CCRCs are different from other types of senior housing because they provide all levels of housing, services and care in one convenient location.

While they vary greatly in appearance and services, most CCRCs offer apartments or sometimes single-family homes for active independent seniors. In addition, they also offer onsite assisted living for seniors who require help with basic living tasks like bathing, dressing or going to the bathroom, and nursing home care for residents when their health declines.

CCRCs also provide a bevy of resort-style amenities and services that include community dining halls, exercise facilities, housekeeping, and transportation, as well as many social and recreational activities.

But be aware that all these services come at a hefty price. Most communities have entry fees that range from the low to mid-six figures, plus ongoing monthly fees that can range from around \$2,000 to over \$4,000 depending on the facility, services and the contract option you choose.

With more than 2,000 CCRCs in operation throughout the U.S., finding a facility that fits your lifestyle, needs and budget will require some legwork. Here are some steps that can help you proceed.

Make a list: Start by calling the Area Agency on Aging (call 800-677-1116 for contact information) in the area you want to live for a list of CCRCs, or search websites like Caring.com.

Call the facilities: Once you've located a few, call them to find out if they have any vacancies, what they charge and if they provide the types of services



you want or need.

Take a tour: Many CCRCs encourage potential residents to stay overnight and have a few meals in their dining hall. During your visit, notice the upkeep of the facility and talk to the current residents to see how they like living there. Also, check out the assisted living and nursing facilities, and find out how decisions are made to move residents from one level of care to another.

To check-up on a facility, call the state long-term care ombudsman (see LTCombudsman.org) who can tell you if the assisted living and nursing care services within the CCRC have had any complaints or other problems. You can also use Medicare's nursing home compare tool at Medicare.gov/nursinghomecompare.

Review contracts and fees: Most CCRCs offer three types of contracts: Life-care, or Type A contracts, which have the highest entry fee but covers all levels of long-term care as needed; Type B, or modified contracts that have lower entry fees but limits long-term care services in the initial fee; and Type C, or fee-for-service contracts, which offer the lowest entrance fees but requires you to pay extra for long-term care if you need it.

You also need to find out what yearly price increases you can expect? How much of your entry fee is refundable to you if you move or die? And what happens if you outlive your financial resources?

Research the CCRC: Find out who owns the facility and get a copy of their most recently audited financial statement and review it, along with the copy of the contract with your lawyer or financial advisor. Also get their occupancy rate. Unless it's a newer community filling up, occupancy below 85 percent can be a red flag that the facility is having financial or management problems.

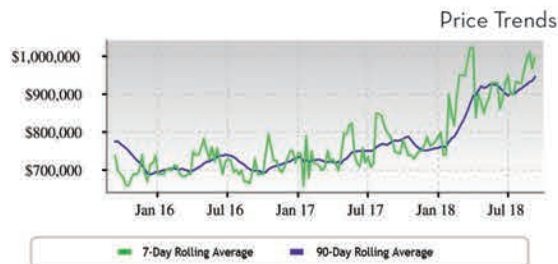

FORGIVENESS, LET'S TAKE THAT WEIGHT OFF!

Every spiritual, religious, and mindfulness practice encourages the practitioners to forgive. There are times in our lives when forgiveness seems difficult, or even impossible, but in my experience, I've found self-forgiveness is the best place to start. Often we are lost in our thoughts. Sometimes we ruminate over the past. If you can't forget what happened, would you consider forgiving the transgression?

Let's compare our brains to a computer, then it's easy to remember that we are dealing with limited storage capacity. We need to clear that hard drive periodically for the device to operate efficiently. When you forgive yourself, you free valuable space in your mind that you can use to create a life that you love and notice the places in your life that you appreciate.

Forgiveness is not something we do just once; it is a mental and emotional cleaning to keep up with our "spiritual hygiene" on a regular basis. As frequently as we brush our teeth or cleanse our body, we must forgive.

"Peter came and said to Him, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me and I forgive him? Up to seven times?"

Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven." Matthew 18:21,22. This New Testament passage reminds us that we need to forgive constantly. Why? Forgiveness is good for our health.

According to research at John Hopkins Medical Center and the Mayo Clinic, the act of forgiveness

can lower the risk of heart attack; improve cholesterol levels and sleep; and reduce pain, blood pressure, and levels of anxiety, depression, and stress. Forgiveness can slow the effects of aging. You will look and feel better. Carrying a grudge weighs you down.

My new doctor introduced me to a Hawaiian forgiveness practice called Ho'oponopono. Get quiet, relax and say aloud the following four phrases:

1. I'm sorry.
2. I forgive you.
3. I thank you.
4. I love you.

Feel free to use these phrases for yourself or another person. You may say the phrases in any order.

Let's consider how we take our bodies for granted. Tell your body that you're sorry for abusing it. Forgive yourself for overeating or drinking. Thank your body for everything that it does for you daily. Tell your body that you love it. If you do this regularly, you may find yourself making healthy choices and feeling better about yourself and your body.

WHAT HAPPENS TO YOUR FACEBOOK ACCOUNT WHEN YOU DIE?

If you're active on social media, Facebook probably plays a prominent role in your life. And now the social media titan can even play a role in your afterlife.

Today, estate planning encompasses not only your tangible assets—bank accounts and real estate—but your digital assets as well, such as cryptocurrency, websites, and social media accounts. Though social media may seem trivial compared to the rest of your personal property, a Facebook account functions as a virtual diary of your daily life, making it a key part of your legacy—and one you'll likely want to protect.

Because social media is so new, there are very few state laws governing how your Facebook account should be handled upon your death. Considering this, Facebook itself is in nearly total control of what happens to your profile after you die. And since roughly 8,000 Facebook users die every day, the company has created a few options for dealing with your account once you're gone:

1. Do nothing

Unless Facebook is notified of your death, it assumes you're still alive, and your profile remains active indefinitely. While this might not seem like a big deal, your profile will continue to be included in Facebook searches, People You May Know suggestions, and birthday reminders.

Your friends and family likely won't want to be constantly reminded of your absence, and even worse, ex-friends and/or trolls will be able to post potentially hurtful messages on your timeline. To shield your loved ones from this kind of thing, consider going with one of the other options.

2. Have the account deleted

You can notify Facebook that you'd like to have your account permanently removed from its servers upon your passing. Alternatively, a friend, family member, or your executor can make the same request after your death. This

will completely delete your profile and all its associated content from Facebook for good.

Additionally, one of these individuals can request that your account's content be downloaded and saved before the profile is deleted. Content that's eligible for download includes wall posts, photos, videos, profile info, events, and your friend list. However, Facebook will not allow any third-party to access or download your personal messages or login information.

3. Memorialize the account

In 2009, Facebook began allowing accounts of the deceased to be "memorialized" at the request of a friend or family member. Once an account has been memorialized, only confirmed friends can see the profile or find it in a search. Your memorialized profile will no longer appear in friend suggestions, nor will anyone receive birthday updates or other account notifications.

When your account is memorialized, the word "Remembering" will be added next to your name on your profile. Depending on your privacy settings, friends and family members can post content and share memories on your timeline. A memorialized account is locked, so its original content cannot be altered or removed, even if an individual has your login info.

In 2015, Facebook created a new policy that allows you to designate a family member or friend as a "legacy contact" to manage your memorialized account. This contact will be allowed to pin a final message to the top of your timeline, announcing your death or providing funeral information. The contact can also respond to new friend requests and update your cover and profile photos. The legacy contact will not be able to log in as you or see any of your private messages.

KAVANAUGH DESERVED BETTER... AND SO DO WE

Judge Brett Kavanaugh was never going to get a fair break during his confirmation hearings before the Senate Judiciary Committee. The fault lies not with obstructionist Democrats, however, but with Republican leadership and members of the committee.

By not turning over all documents in their possession, Republican members of the committee did the judge and the American people a disservice. And dumping hundreds of thousands of selected pages of documents, emails, and other correspondence on Democrats the night before hearings were scheduled to begin wasn't a solution.

Releasing all relevant material would have provided a fuller picture of Kavanaugh's legal philosophy and writings for both the majority and minority. Not doing so only further riled Democrats still fuming over Republican obstruction of Judge Merrick Garland's Supreme Court nomination in the waning days of the Obama administration. It succeeded in provoking confrontation and partisan conflict. Whether or not Judge Kavanaugh escapes the wrath of Democratic committee members, the real losers are the American people.

Questions have arisen based on actions Kavanaugh took during time spent in the George W. Bush White House, including discussions about detainee torture during the early years of the war on terror, as well as a breach of secret Democratic files on judicial nominations. His writings have advocated broad presidential powers that have implications on ongoing investigations into Russian election meddling and questionable actions on the part of the president. Kavanaugh equivocated when asked whether he would uphold long-standing legal precedents, including those related to Roe v. Wade, LGBTQ rights, and affirmative action.

There are indications that Kavanaugh may have perjured himself, not only during his recent confirmation hearings, but during testimony before the Senate committee when he was originally nominated for the federal appellate court in 2006. These charges have been corroborated in emails and other work product that several committee members brought to light against the wishes of the majority.

And now comes the latest bombshell: allegations that Kavanaugh assaulted a young woman during a party while in high school. These are inflammatory charges that must be explored.

What really needs further exploration is the entire process by which the Senate evaluates nominees for lifetime positions on the high court.

Throughout the hearings, many of Kavanaugh's responses to questions posed by committee members were evasive and rife with subterfuge. His discomfort was, at times, palpable. He did an inadequate job in presenting or defending his legal perspectives on issues that will certainly come before the Supreme Court.

To think that members of the judiciary cannot or do not hold personal beliefs, opinions, or philosophies is naive. We all have opinions, ideologies, codes of ethics and moral conduct. Americans have long lived under the rule of law and a system of government that affords us the opportunity to hold them. That said, we have the right to know if appointees at every level of the federal bench can divorce themselves from personal feelings in relation to the law of the land. That they must, to the best of their ability, make rulings that consider established precedent. Kavanaugh's record must be allowed to speak for itself without obstruction or obfuscation.

Republican members of the Judiciary Committee fueled a smoldering fire by hindering the Democrats ability to fully-explore and accurately gauge where Kavanaugh stands on established law and how he might approach his deliberations as a member of the high court. This would have provided an opportunity for senators from both parties to make an educated choice in determining whether Kavanaugh should earn the committee's blessing for confirmation and a subsequent vote by the entire Senate. Instead, their actions do nothing more than pave the way for Democrats to engage in future games of tit-for-tat in times they hold the majority.

The modern judiciary - the last bastion of independent thought and final arbiter of our nation's laws - has become grossly politicized. This is a bipartisan issue, and members of both parties must be held accountable for this deterioration.

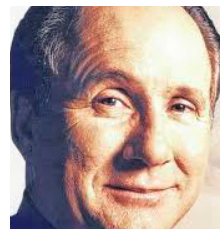
The entire Senate Judiciary Committee treated Kavanaugh unfairly, but we the people are the ultimate victims of its injustice.

MEDIA IGNORES TRUMP'S ECONOMY
