2019-20 BUDGET BALANCED WITH A SURPLUS

Public Hearing Scheduled For June 11, 2019

While several local cities in the San Gabriel Valley are declaring fiscal emergencies, the City of Sierra Madre is proposing a 2019-2020 Fiscal Year budget that is balanced, with a General Fund surplus of more than \$1.8M, which represents nearly 18% of General Fund expenditures. The City was able to reduce its main operating fund by more than 10%, totaling \$1.1M from the previous budget year. "The City Council has made incredibly tough decisions over the past three budget cycles," said City Manager Gabriel Engeland, "but it was these difficult decisions that allowed the City to reduce spending for the third consecutive year, while increasing City services."

The total budget has a surplus of \$2.7M, and represents a reduction of \$1.7M from the 2017-2018 Fiscal Year budget. "When looking at these budget numbers, most would assume that we were decreasing services, which is just the opposite of what has occurred," stated Mayor John Harabedian. "We have successfully continued to operate as an independent, full-service City, with our own full-time Police and Fire Departments and Water and Sewer companies" said Harabedian, "while also investing more in our infrastructure than we have in decades."

As indicated in the staff report:

The 2019-2020 proposed Fiscal Year budget results in Citywide expenditure reductions of more than \$1.1M with a projected surplus of \$2.7M (12.2% of total budget). This is the third consecutive year the budget was reduced from the previous year. In total, the Fiscal

Year 2019-2020 budget calls for expenditures of \$22.39M.

Similarly, the *General Fund* expenditures were reduced from \$11.51M in Fiscal Year 2018-2019 to a proposed \$10.22M in Fiscal Year 2019-2020. This reduction in expenditures is expected to lead to a General Fund surplus of \$1.82M which represents 17.8% of all General Fund expenditures.

The *Water and Sewer Funds* are both balanced, with a projected surplus in each Fund, which represents the second consecutive year all three of the City's primary Funds are balanced. As recently as Fiscal Year 2015-2016 each of these Funds was budgeted for a deficit. The Water Fund surplus is expected to be \$1.65M, with an overall reduction in net position of \$650,000 (discussed below), due to increases in infrastructure spending and depreciation. The Sewer Fund surplus is projected to be \$136,000. Total allocations from the Water and Sewer Funds combined, were reduced from \$1,301,600 in Fiscal Year 2017-2018 to \$691,100 in Fiscal Year 2018-2019 to \$609,000 in the proposed budget.

Personnel The proposed budget includes funding for three new fire-medical positions, which brings the total budgeted number of full-time employees in the Sierra Madre Fire Department to 15. In the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year budget there were four full-time fire employees. General Fund expenditures in Fire are budgeted to increase to more than \$2.4M, which is more than double the General Fund budgeted expenditures in Fiscal Year 2015-2016, which included

\$1.1M in budgeted General Fund expenditures. The proposed budget increases Library staff by 1.27 positions and provides 1.5 new budgeted positions in the Police Department.

Infrastructure The Water Fund is budgeted to invest \$2.3M in infrastructure in the proposed budget. This increase is nearly six times higher than in 2017-2018 (\$419,000). It is also an increase over the current fiscal year's infrastructure investment which is budgeted at \$2,094,000. The rapid increase in investment of water infrastructure will lead to a reduction of net position in the Water Fund of \$655,000. The total surplus in the Water Fund is \$1.6M, which includes increases in depreciation from \$633,500 in the current Fiscal Year to more than \$860,000 in the proposed budget. Staff will begin to monitor the cash balance in this Fund more closely to ensure an appropriate balance between cash reserves, operating reserves, infrastructure investment and capital outlay. Expenditures on debt payments in the Water Fund have been reduced by more than \$100,000 annually due to Council's action to refinance the Water Bonds in 2017.

The Sierra Madre City Council will be holding a public hearing on June 11th at 6:30PM in Sierra Madre Council Chambers to review the 2019/2020 City budget and proposed fee schedule to be effective July 1, 2019.

On May 30th, Los Angeles County Supervisor Kathryn Barger met with the Sierra Madre City Council and City Department heads at a special meeting to discuss a number of items that involve both the city and the county.

The agenda included discussion of the Annual allocations of Los Angeles County Measure A: Safe, Clean Neighborhood Parks and Beaches Protection Measure of 2016. Also discussed were a Funding update for Los Angeles County Measure W: Safe, Clean, Water Measure of 2018 a controversial unfunded mandate and various State Bills Mandating Affordable Housing Production.

COUNCIL TO DISCUSS VOLUNTARY BAN OF THE USE OF GLYPHOSATE ON CITY PROPERTY

The glyphosate-based herbicide Roundup was first developed by Monsanto in the 1970s.

Roundup Cancer Risk. Research shows that anyone who directly uses Roundup or lives in an area where Roundup is used frequently faces a risk of developing Roundup lymphoma, myeloma, or leukemia. For decades, Roundup has been in wide use by home gardeners and landscapers who unconsciously exposed themselves to a risk of developing cancer.

The use of glyphosate, the active ingredient in Roundup, is a widely used herbicide that controls weeds and grasses. It has been registered as a pesticide in the U.S. since 1974. In April of 2019, the United States Environmental Protective Agency (EPA) released the Glyphosate Proposed Interim Decision for public comment. As part of this action, the EPA continues to find there are no risks to public health when glyphosate is used in accordance with its current label and glyphosate is determined to not be a carcinogen.

While the EPA has deemed the use of glyphosate poses no threat to public health, growing concerns over the potential health effects of glyphosate have lead the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors to ban the use of glyphosate until further notice

Sierra Madre City Council will consider a voluntary ban on its use in the city at the June 11th City Council meeting.

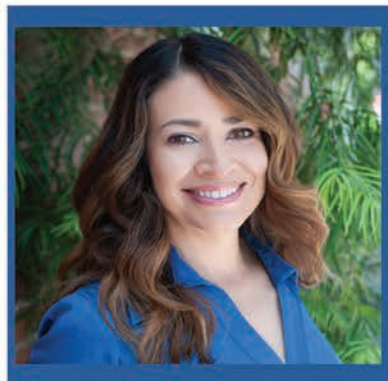

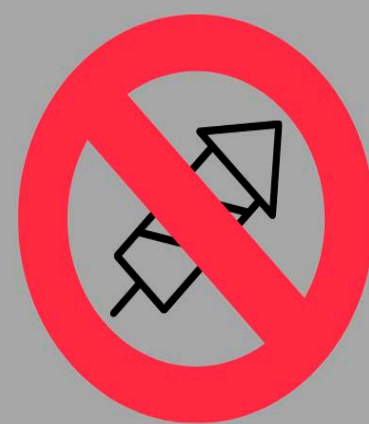

ASSEMBLYMAN HOLDEN HONORS FOOTHILL UNITY CENTER AS THE 41ST DISTRICT NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION OF THE YEAR

Recently Assemblyman Chris Holden chose Foothill Unity Center as the 41st District Non-Profit of the Year. In the above photo collage, in addition to Assemblyman Holden, is Assemblywoman Blanca Rubio; the Center’s Executive Director, Betty McWilliams; President of the Board, Gary Kovacic; and Board Members Lois Gaston and Eric Bell.

I cannot think of any organization who is more deserving of this award. It is mind-boggling, that in 1980, Josephine Anderson asked her Church (Immaculate Conception, Monrovia), how she could share her time, compassion, and energy, and was led to a small closet where items for the needy are kept. Yes, the Foothill Unity Center began as a Food Bank in a church closet!

Today the Center is the primary provider of food, case management/crisis help, and access to health care and resources across eleven San Gabriel Valley Cities in LA County. 79% of their clients are at or below poverty level. The number of the people served by the organization has more than tripled over the last five years.

How does the Center help meet the need? Client Services is made up of three direct service departments, food services, social services and health service.

Food services include weekly and monthly supplies of groceries available, bagged lunches for the homeless three times a week, and homebound deliveries to the sick.

The Center’s goal is to be part of solutions to help end and prevent homelessness. This is done by a network of coordinated housing connections to help their participants secure an affordable place to call home.

Health services are a vital resource for the low-income community. The goal is to make health care services accessible, educate about chronic diseases and preventive practices.

Foothill Unity Center’s annual “BACK TO SCHOOL” event is phenomenal. Last year’s had 1200 attendees. They were given a backpack with supplies, haircuts/manicures available, dental, vision and hearing screening, uniforms and last year’s even had a college area! CHP officers attended and explained auto safety use.

MEASLES EXPOSURE ADVISORY

Case of confirmed measles traveled through LAX

LOS ANGELES – The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) is assessing a non-resident measles case that traveled through Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) while infectious and is also looking to identify others who are at risk for measles and may have been exposed to this person. Public Health urges residents, especially those who travel internationally and those who have not been fully protected against measles, to get the measles immunization in order to better protect their individual health and to prevent the spread of measles to others.

Other people may have been exposed to measles since this person visited public locations while infectious. Potential public exposure locations and times were as follows:

There is no known current risk related to measles that exists at any of these venues at this time.

care provider as soon as possible about a potential exposure if they are pregnant, an infant, have a weakened immune system and/or are unimmunized.

- Monitor themselves for illness with fever and/or an unexplained rash from 7 days to 21 days after their exposure (the time period when symptoms may develop); if symptoms develop, stay at home and call a health care provider immediately.

Public Health is also working with LAX and the airline to contact people who may have been exposed to this case and who are at risk of developing measles, especially those at increased risk of severe outcomes, such as infants, pregnant women, and those with compromised or weak immune systems.

Currently, there are eight measles cases among Los Angeles County residents in 2019, and this makes seven non-resident measles cases that traveled through Los Angeles County. Of the eight measles cases among residents, three are not linked to any of the others, and two of these cases are linked to international travel. The majority of the cases were unvaccinated.

a very effective measure to protect yourself and to prevent the unintentional spread of this potentially serious infection to others.”

About Measles

Measles is considered among the most contagious viruses in the world. About 90% of people who have never been immunized against measles become ill 7-21 days after exposure. Infected people can infect those around them before they have symptoms and know they are infected. Common symptoms of measles include fever, cough, runny nose, conjunctivitis (red eyes) and a rash which usually appears 10 to 21 days after the exposure. The measles virus can be transmitted from one person to another up to 4 days before the onset of rash.

Individuals should contact their healthcare provider by phone before going in if they develop measles symptoms, so measures can be taken to prevent possible spread to others in the provider’s waiting room. They should also tell their doctor or other healthcare provider if they traveled internationally or had international visitors in the last 21 days or had exposure to another person with measles.

Public Health interviews all persons with measles in the county to identify who may have come in contact with them, in order to try to prevent further spread of measles. Public Health communicates with health care providers, health plans, local governments, schools, and elected officials to provide updates on the measles outbreak and actions they can take to help prevent the spread of measles and support the county-wide response.

Measles immunizations are available at healthcare providers, local pharmacy or health clinic. Public Health clinics offer no or low-cost immunizations for individuals who are uninsured or underinsured. 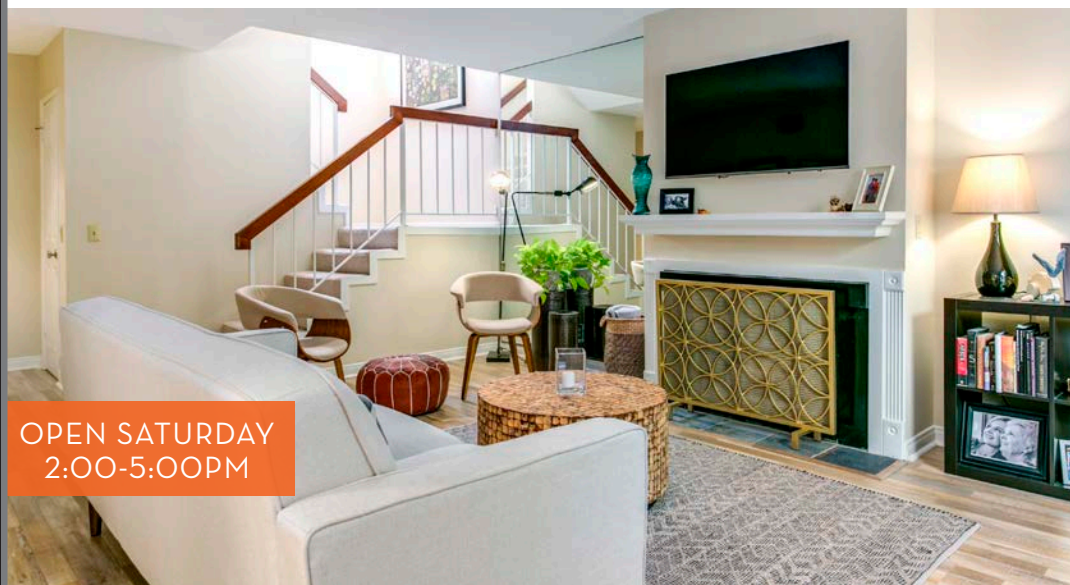

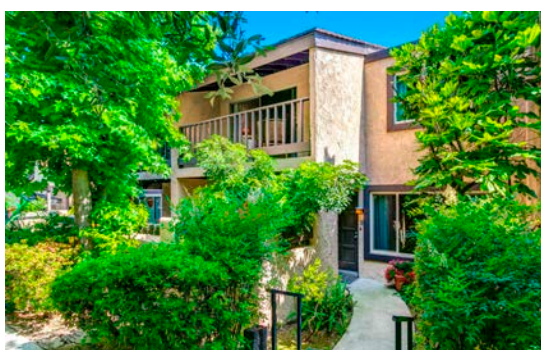

City Releases Cannabis Application Results

City of Pasadena officials announced they have completed the review and scoring of applications received for commercial cannabis retailer permits. The following are the six top-scoring applicants:

Integral Associates Dena, LLC; Tony Fong; The Atrium Group, LLC; Harvest of Pasadena, LLC; SweetFlower Pasadena, LLC and MME Pasadena Retail, LLC

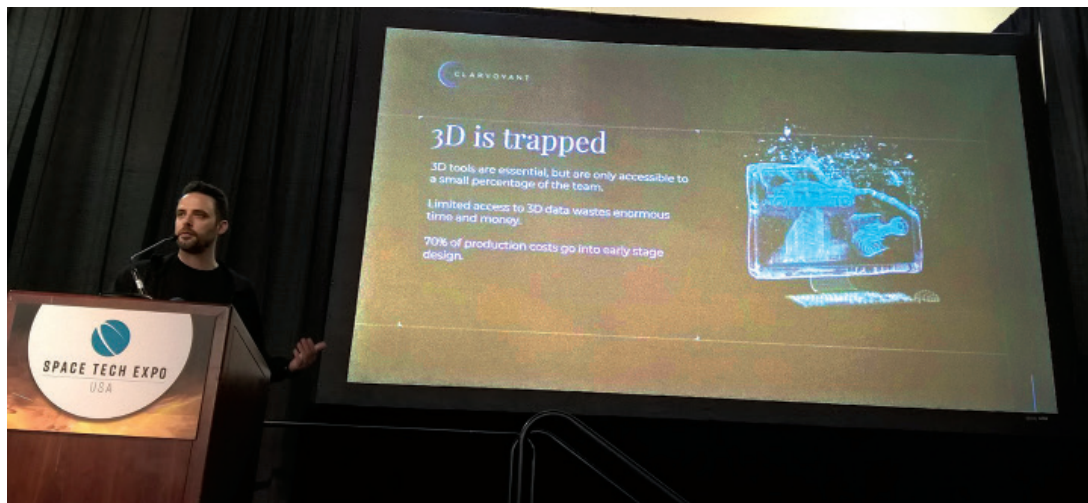
"We would like to recognize and congratulate the six top-scoring applicants who completed a very comprehensive process," states City Manager Steve Mermell. Mr. Mermell added that future retail dispensaries will have appropriate design review and conditions to guard against impacts on surrounding uses and added, "I was pleased with the high-level of sophistication, experience and expertise demonstrated by the top-scoring applicants and look forward to a positive relationship between future permitted dispensaries and our community."

Applications for all three categories of commercial cannabis permits—retailers, testing laboratories and cultivators—were accepted from January 1 until January 31. Of the 128 applications received, 122 applications were for the 'Retailer' category. Applications were thoroughly reviewed by Hinderliter, de Llamas and Associates (HdL), an independent municipal consulting group offering cannabis consulting services. Applications were scored by HdL according to the City of Pasadena Commercial Cannabis Permit Application Review Criteria, which consist of four primary categories with a total of 28 specific sub-criteria. There is a link to the complete list of all retail applicants and their scores, which will be maintained by the City for a period of 12 months and may be used to identify potential future operators.

The adopted marijuana regulations allow up to a maximum of six retail operators. The next steps for the top-scoring retail applicants are to submit a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) application and supplemental commercial cannabis information, including verification of a lease or ownership location that complies with the required distance separation requirements of the City's commercial cannabis ordinance, a security plan and community benefits plan. The CUP applications will be evaluated and reviewed by the Planning Commission. The City continues to proactively deter unpermitted dispensaries through a multi-departmental enforcement effort comprised of the City Attorney/City Prosecutor Office, the Pasadena Police Department, Code Compliance and the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration. To date, the City has closed over 20 dispensaries, 11 in the last year.

"We anticipate concluding the review, scoring and identification of the top-scoring applicants for the categories of 'Testing Laboratories' and 'Cultivators' within the next few weeks."

Space Tech Expo Lands in Pasadena

From virtual and augmented reality to black holes this year's Space Tech Expo at the Pasadena Convention Center showcased space-related technologies and innovations in high tech for civil, military and commercial space applications.

Some of the companies featured technology at the expo, May 18 through May 20, strait from video gaming including Microsoft's new HoloLens 2 developer edition, Oculus Rift S PC-Powered VR Gaming Headset and HTC Vive. But the expo's similarities to video games ended there.

Former longtime Jet Propulsion Laboratory design lead, user interface and user research, in the Ops Lab, Matthew Clausen, founded a new Holographic Prototyping company Clarvoyant in Los Angeles.

"They [JPL] hired me at the very beginning, using the [Microsoft] Kinect, we did a video game that was the Mars Rover Landing," Clausen said. "Based on the 6 minutes of terror. That was one of the first Xbox 360 Kinect games."

Clausen said they founded Clarvoyant based on collaboration tools originally built at NASA / JPL to enable early-stage spacecraft design.

Clausen said the big difference in HoloLens 2 is it has more cameras, sensors and a wider field of view. Both versions of the HoloLens are based on Kinect technology he said.

"This will allow you to also see a hologram below you,"

Clausen said adding that the operating system and controls are improved "This new one, you look at your wrist and there is a little Microsoft logo and you tap that to control things."

Clausen also the HoloLens 2 lets you virtually grab object in the air. He said the new headset is still based on the Windows operating system.

Clausen said that the core idea and future of Clarvoyant is commercializing the work they had started at JPL.

"We want to use it for every industry where they are making a physical object and it starts in 3D," he said. "That's aerospace, that's automotive, its energy, defense , etc. We have focused on aerospace because we know it so well."

He said they give companies the opportunity, though augmented reality AR, to build things faster, cheaper, safer and "reducing risk, by seeing specially what your going to create physically first, that's not physical, that gives people the opportunity to uncover problems that they might run into."

Another company, out of France, NucleusVR uses mixed reality AR and VR for remote collaboration. NucleusVR CEO Alexander Bolton said "We want to make it easier between engineers, astronauts and specialists for the design, evaluation and the activities of human space exploration, including on the International Space Station.

Not really a company but a concept design, local artist

and user experience designer, Suzan Oslin created "Immersive Exoplanet Telescope" using VR and showed it off at the expo.

"I was at the NASA Space Apps Hackathon, we build this project with the NASA data... and because I have a passion for space, I'm able to do development, I took the project and continued working on it," she said.

Her vision is through VR, you visit different star systems, beyond our own, to learn about them, using comparable data, and what makes life on earth possible. Oslin is using the data and virtually mapping exoplanets in the habitable zone.

Outside of Virtual reality, Digicom Electronics, based in Oakland, showcased advanced high-speed customized circuit boards used for the first-ever image of a black hole. General Manager Mo Ohady said the project was a worldwide scientific collaboration.

"These exact boxes collected the data for them," Ohady said pointing to a rack mount computer board displayed in their booth. "They did this for a number of years and finally [May 9] they published their results."

ARCADIA RESIDENTS RAISE TAXES WITH PASSING OF MEASURE A

On Tuesday, Arcadia residents voted to pass Measure A - a sales tax increase of 0.75%. That increase will accomplish two things. First, it will guarantee that the increase sales tax revenue will remain in Arcadia and two, it also brings the city to the state maximum for sales taxes. The measure passed with 64% voter approval. It was also a Vote by Mail election. The figures represent the preliminary count from LA County's Registrar of Voters.

"Anything could happen, but since the margin is so significant, it gives us a lot of comfort," Dominic Lazzaretto, city manager for Arcadia said.

Several cities across L.A. County have opted to push for the last bit of sales tax allowed under the state's limits in order to increase the amount of tax dollars that will remain in their respective jurisdictions. Otherwise, the anticipated LA County tax hike would not have allocated all of the over \$8 million dollar increase in tax revenue to Arcadia. By passing Measure A, the increase in funds will all go to maintaining city services such as police and fire services.

"We're looking forward to keeping the standard of the community high," Lazzaretto said. "Ultimately, (voters) understood that it was a choice between keeping service at the high level it already was — especially public safety — or have to deal with lower (service) levels," he added.

About 62% of the city's budget is dedicated to public safety, Lazzaretto said, a fact that became the crux of measure's pro campaign. But financial stress still affects every aspect of running the city, he added.

"Citizens understood that not increasing this sales tax would strongly jeopardize public safety in our community. Arcadians were not prepared to jeopardize their safety," said Mickey Segal, former mayor of Arcadia and chair of the Arcadia Citizens Financial Advisory Committee.



Local Lawyer Pleads Guilty to Millions in Wire Fraud

A former Pasadena attorney has pleaded guilty to one felony count of wire fraud for falsely representing to his clients that he obtained favorable legal resolutions for them, and then perpetuating the scheme by delivering clients fraudulent documents, some with the forged signatures of judges, and by making disguised telephone calls to them.

Shant Ohanian, 36, of Pasadena, entered his plea on Thursday before United States District Judge John A. Kronstadt, who scheduled a September 12 sentencing hearing. Ohanian faces a statutory maximum sentence of 20 years in federal prison.

According to his plea agreement, Ohanian was a licensed California lawyer from January 2012 until he was disbarred in December 2017. Beginning in May 2012, Ohanian and his co-conspirator engaged in a scheme to defraud Ohanian’s clients by claiming he obtained favorable legal resolutions for them, when in fact the favorable resolutions had never been obtained, and, in many cases, Ohanian had never initiated a legal action, court papers state. In some cases, Ohanian’s deception caused his victim clients to entirely lose their opportunity to obtain significant financial or legal remedies as a result of wrongs suffered by them, according to court documents.

Ohanian admitted in his plea agreement to defrauding multiple victims, including one victim who hired Ohanian in July 2013 to assist in the recovery of a \$500,000 deposit related to a failed commercial real estate transaction for an Ontario shopping center. During the course of that litigation, Ohanian falsely informed the victim that the victim had prevailed in the case and would receive \$1.2 million in damages plus penalties, the plea agreement states.

In February 2016, Ohanian presented the victim with a counterfeit check for \$1,925,477, which a bank later rejected, court papers state. Ohanian denied the check was counterfeit and in March 2016 he presented the victim with a check for \$7,244,211, which also was rejected as counterfeit.

Ohanian also falsely informed the victim that he was representing the victim in a parallel bankruptcy proceeding involving the Ontario shopping center, and he provided the victim phony bankruptcy court pleadings, including orders that contained the forged signature of a United States bankruptcy judge, according to court documents.

Ohanian also admitted to making multiple spoofed telephone calls to the victim in which he claimed to be either bank officials or government officials. Ohanian also falsely informed the victim that he would acquire the Ontario shopping center at a discounted price in lieu of a cash settlement, and that the victim needed to make payments for back taxes and overdue mortgage payments in order to acquire the property, and to make “unpaid court fees” to Ohanian even though no such fees were owed, court documents state. Between March 2016 and September 2017, the victim paid Ohanian \$2,839,875 based on Ohanian’s false representations that the money would be used to acquire the shopping center, according to court documents.

Ohanian admitted to victimizing other clients, including a woman who suffered serious injuries in a fall at South Coast Plaza mall in Orange County, and for whom the statute of limitations had expired in the case before she realized Ohanian had defrauded her. Ohanian admitted to sending the victim a phony settlement agreement from the mall and, after she threatened to report him to the State Bar of California, a check for \$25,000 that turned out to have been cancelled. He also falsely represented to clients seeking immigration relief that he had obtained important legal resolutions related to their ability to live and work in the U.S.

Ohanian’s victims suffered actual losses of more than \$4 million.

Ohanian’s wife, Silva Sevlian Ohanian, has been charged with one count of wire fraud in a related case. She has pleaded not guilty to the charge and is currently scheduled to go to trial on July 16.

172 Citations Issued During Bicycle Safety Program

On Friday, May 31, officers assigned to Pasadena Police Department’s Traffic Section conducted a bicycle and pedestrian safety traffic enforcement program throughout the city. Officers were on the lookout for dangerous driving behaviors hazardous to bicyclists, including speeding, red light violations, right-of-way violations, and other violations that lead to traffic collisions.

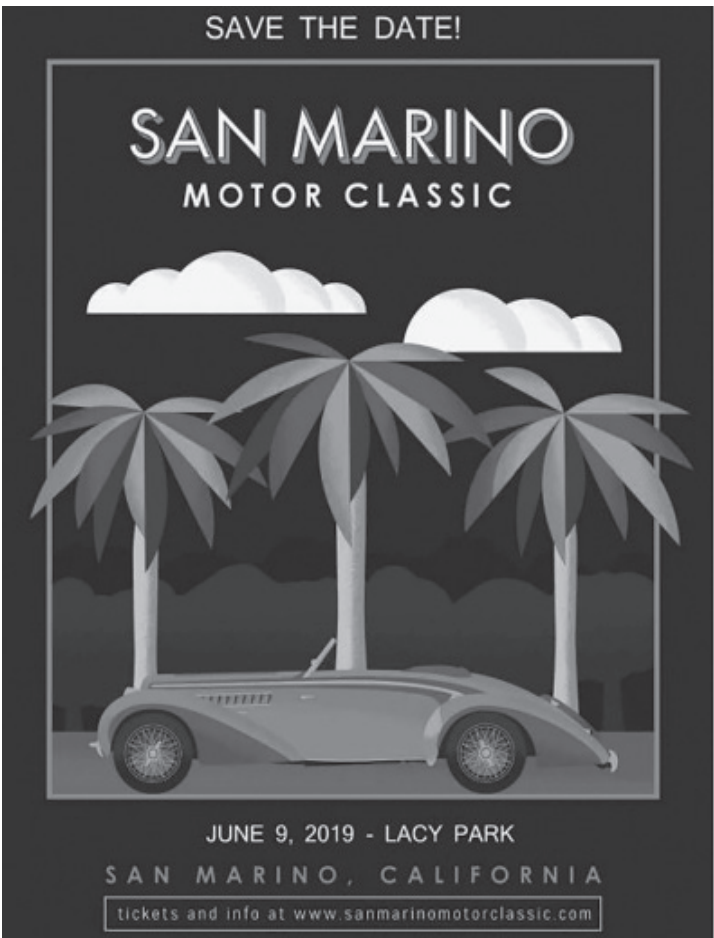
Officers were also on the lookout for bicyclists and pedestrians failing to follow the rules of the road. These behaviors can be very dangerous and contribute to injury collisions every year. The goal of these programs is to enhance public safety through enforcement and education.

Officers conducted enforcement at various

locations during the program, which ran from 6 a.m. to 2 p.m. “Many people in Pasadena walk or use a bicycle as a primary means of transportation. As always, a majority of our enforcement efforts focused on locations suggested to us by community members,” said Traffic Section Lieutenant Mark Goodman. “Input from community members helps us focus on locations where traffic safety is a concern.”

Friday’s program netted a total of 172 citations, 99 of which were for dangerous driving. 54 pedestrians were issued citations along with 19 bicyclists.

Funding for bicycle safety enforcement is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

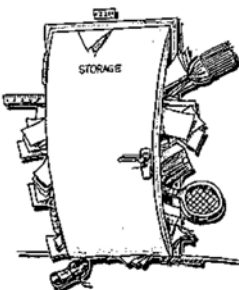

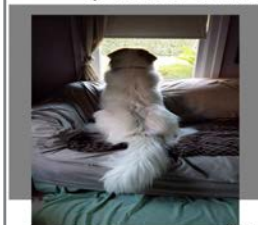

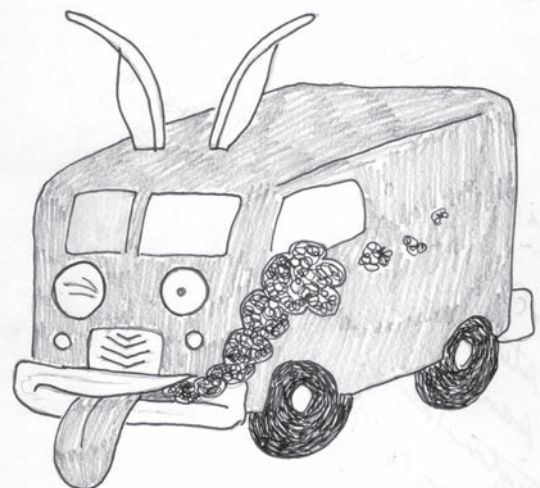

HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM THE SOCIAL SECURITY IMPOSTER SCAM



Dear Savvy Senior:

I recently received a strange call from a Social Security employee. He told me my Social Security number had been suspended because it was involved in a crime, and that I needed to reactivate it and secure my bank funds by withdrawing them and putting them on gift cards. Is this a scam? Worried Rita

Dear Rita:

Yes. It's actually known as the "Social Security imposter scam" and it's becoming a widespread problem in the U.S. The Federal Trade Commission has received more than 76,000 reports about this growing scam in the past 12 months alone. With average losses of \$1,500, this scam is quickly becoming one of fraudsters' favorite tricks.

The Social Security imposter scam usually begins with a consumer receiving a call from someone claiming to be with the Social Security Administration. The caller informs the victim that their Social Security number (SSN) has been suspended because it was stolen or has been involved in a crime.

The phone call may be a robocaller with a message to "press 1" to speak with a fake support representative who then claims to be able to help reactivate the consumer's SSN.

In a variation on this scam, the caller may also reach out to tell a victim that they qualify for an increase in benefits. All they need to do is provide the scammer with some information. Typically, these callers will ask their victims several questions to get personal information that they can then use to steal their identity or drain their bank accounts.

Because of the numerous data breaches, these scammers may have access to accurate personal information – such as your SSN – that they can use to build trust and appear legitimate. Regardless, before concluding the scam, fraudsters will almost always request payment to "unfreeze" the SSN or to process the increase in benefits. The scammer may request that they be paid via an unusual payment method such as by gift card (and giving the fraudster the gift card number), or some form of cryptocurrency like Bitcoin.

While the scam can be devastating, there are several steps you can take to prevent yourself, and your loved ones, from falling victim to this scam:

Don't trust your caller ID: Scammers can make it look as if the Social Security Administration is calling and even use the agency's real number. If you receive an unexpected call from Social Security, don't answer it. Instead, call Social Security's customer service number at 800-772-1213 to see if they were actually trying to contact you.

Remember, Social Security will never suspend your number or call and demand money: If anyone tells you something different, you're being scammed.

Don't give out personal information: Never give out your Social Security number, bank information or other personal details to an unknown caller. If you already did, visit IdentityTheft.gov/SSA to find out what steps you can take to protect your credit and your identity.

Don't trust the caller just because they may know some of your personal information: It's most likely a scam if the person on the other end asks to confirm your information.

Talk about the experience: Those who've been targeted should alert friends and neighbors about the call to spread information and report the scam to the FTC at FTC.gov/complaint.

Shawn Maestretti's 6-Step Solution

Shawn Maestretti, a landscape architect, arborist, and contractor, shares data on climate change in his lecture series, as well as how these changes can affect our landscape. I recently attended his lecture at Eaton Canyon Nature Center.

Though his engaging program focuses on how an individual can be a part of the solution and make a positive effect in their own garden, his presentation begins with the "big picture." We are shown earth from space, and Maestretti explains how the first Earth Day began when we realized that it wasn't a good idea to use our atmosphere as an open sewer for unwanted gases. "Currently, 110 million tons of manmade pollution goes into this thin shell of our atmosphere, our space," he told the audience.

He pointed out that though agriculture is a contributor of CO2 into space, agriculture can also be a solution, through regenerative agriculture. The main source of CO2 in space is the burning of fossil fuels.

To put this in historical perspective, he points out that there has always been a contraction and expansion of CO2 in the environment, over long periods of time, but it has never gone over 300 ppm annually. "We did that as of 2013," he explains.

"We must make dramatic changes during the next 40 years," says Maestretti. "If the increase of CO2 emissions continues to steadily increase, it will be hard to be outside."

Maestretti explains that we have solutions, but we need to choose to implement them. He says that we need to have zero waste, reduce CO2 emissions, and look to nature for solutions.

He lays out a six-part program of regenerative practices that anyone can practice in their own yard. Here is the bare-bones overview of Maestretti's six points which he expands upon in his programs.

1. NURTURING THE LIVING SOIL

Maestretti explains that all life starts with the soil, and we have to work harder to regenerate the soil. Tilling destroys topsoil where the organic matter resides, and releases carbon into the atmosphere. He spends significant time describing the makeup of soil, and how everything should be done to avoid erosion, and the destruction of such life forms as the fungi in the soil which help to increase soil fertility. Unfortunately, modern agricultural and urbanization practices are turning the land into deserts. By poor agricultural practices, about a third of arable land on earth has been lost in the last 30 years.

"It's not drought that causes bare ground," says Maestretti, quoting Allan Savory. "It's bare ground that causes drought." Thus, he's a proponent of protecting the topsoil through mulching and other methods.

2. OPTIMIZING WATER USE

In the urban setting, most people are able to capture rain water into drums or cisterns, by capturing it off their roofs. That water should be used in the yard, and not sent to the ocean down the storm drains. Water should also be optimized by planting appropriate natives which don't require as much water.

3. LAND FORMS/ HUGELKULTUR

Maestretti recommends that people build berms and swales so the water that does flow through your land actually stays there and soaks in. This is the principle behind the settling ponds that you see in the Arroyo Seco, for example, which allows the water to soak into the local water table rather than quickly flowing to the ocean.

So many things wrong with that idea that I do not know where to start. However, I do know where to stop. That would be, stop having vacations. That would solve that problem.

I have noticed that whenever you solve one problem another problem that you did not expect pops up.

I made the mistake of expressing my thoughts audibly, while the Gracious Mistress of the Parsonage was present. I thought I was just thinking to myself, but it turned out my lips were moving. Oh, how I hate it when my lips move like that.

"What do you mean," my wife said rather seriously, "stop having vacations?"

See what I mean. You solve one problem and another problem, were dangerous in the first problem, pops up. How do I answer that question?

After all, my wife lives for vacations. As soon as one vacation is over, she has the next vacation already planned. If it was not for her and her meticulous planning, I would never see a vacation. So, it is to her credit that I actually go on any vacation.

"Stop having vacations," is something that I have had to retract at least audibly. So I had to explain to her, "My dear, I didn't say stop having vacations, I meant to say stop hating vacations." Then I flashed a smile in her direction.

"That is much better," she said with an infectious giggle. "You know how much I really love these vacations."

One thing I have learned as a veteran husband is that if you love what your wife loves your life will be wonderful. I really do not have to love what she loves, but if I love her, it does not matter what she loves.

Driving back from our vacation, which my wife did all the driving, I said one thing that made the drive worth driving. "Don't we have wonderful grandchildren?"

She is still smiling over that one. So am I.

In the silence of our drive home, I began to think of what our Lord said. "But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you" (Matthew 5:44).

Love is a very important thing, from Jesus' perspective. You can tell a lot about a person by what and how they love. I'm going to take Jesus' advice and just love whatever is in front of me.

without the trees and plants, there would be much more evaporation of water, compaction of the soil, and run-off. In both farming and backyard landscaping, he encourages both green and brown mulch. Brown mulch is temporary, such things as wood chips and ground compost which keeps moisture in the soil. Green mulch refers to growing such plants as clover and other groundcovers, which impact the small water cycle by slowing evaporation and continually enriching the soil.

"Remember," exclaims Maestretti, "that plants allow us to eat sunlight." There was a bit of silence in the room as the audience pondered this fact.

6. PLANTING FOR BIODIVERSITY AND HABITAT

In the complex web of life, insects are the link between plants and all higher creatures in the food chain, and we should keep that in mind when we plan and implement our gardens. We need not focus on killing off all insects. Diversity builds strength into the garden.

Maestretti's goal is to encourage everyone to play a role in being the solution the global change we're experiencing. This can be done somewhat painlessly, by the way we work with the land under our control. His vision is that any average lot can be a solution with wild and cultivated plants, where all the rain that falls there is captured, where all the prunings and wood from the plants there are returned to that land's soil. Not only does he conduct workshops to show homeowners how to accomplish these regenerative tasks, but he also practices what he preaches in his own yard.

"Besides all the obvious benefits of a garden, remember that such a garden cools the environment. In fact," added Maestretti, "plants actually cool our cities."

AVOID THIS COMMON CAUSE FOR DISPUTES OVER YOUR ESTATE PLAN

No matter how well you think you know your loved ones, it's impossible to predict exactly how they'll behave when you die or if you become incapacitated. Of course, no one wants to believe their family would ever end up battling one another in court over inheritance issues or a loved one's life-saving medical treatment, but the fact is, we see it all the time.

Family dynamics are extremely complicated and prone to conflict during even the best of times. And when tragedy strikes a key member of the household, even minor tensions and disagreements can explode into bitter conflict. When access to money is on the line, the potential for discord is exponentially increased.

The good news is you can drastically reduce the odds of such conflict through estate planning with the support of a lawyer who understands and can anticipate these dynamics. Poor fiduciary selection

Whether it's as your power of attorney agent, executor, or trustee, these roles can entail a variety of different duties, some of which can last for years.

The individual you select, known as a fiduciary, is legally required to execute those duties and act in the best interests of the beneficiaries named in your plan. The failure to do either of those things is referred to as a breach of fiduciary duty.

The breach can be the result of the person's deliberate action, or it could be something he or she does unintentionally, by mistake. Either way, a breach—or even the perception of one—can cause serious conflict among your loved ones. Moreover, it's vital that your planning documents contain clear terms spelling out a fiduciary's responsibilities and duties, so the individual understands exactly what's expected of him or her. And should things go awry, you can add terms to your plan that allow beneficiaries to remove and replace a fiduciary without going to court.

Find an attorney who's focus is on assisting you with selecting the most qualified fiduciaries; drafting the most precise, explicit, and understandable terms in all of your planning documents; as well as ensuring that your family understands your choices, so they do not end up in conflict when it's too late. In this way, the individuals you select to carry out your wishes will have the best chances of doing so successfully—and with as little conflict as possible.

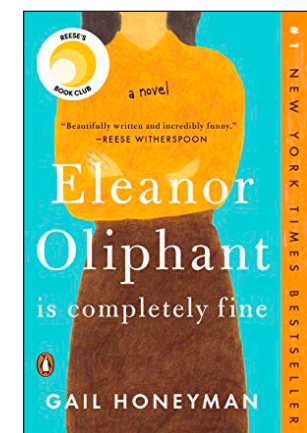
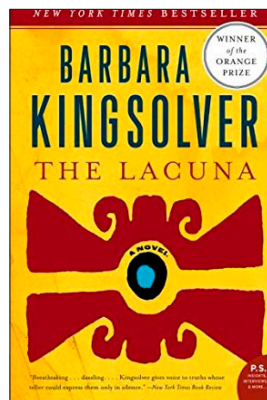

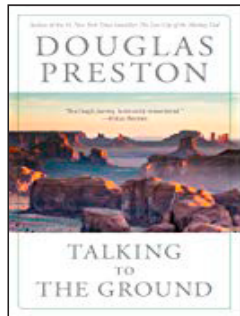

HOW COSTCO RUINED BUYING A NEW CAR

It's not just Costco. There's plenty of blame to share. Consumer Reports, Sam's Club, BJ's and every other organization that promises to guarantee participants the lowest price possible on a new car are all co-conspirators.

This may seem hard to believe but until the 1990s it was almost impossible for consumers to find accurate car price information. A sheep... excuse me... customer entering a car dealership was presented with a situation where the dealer had all the cars and all the price information.

Even worse, dealers would not discuss price over the phone. Buyers had to go to each individual dealership and be waterboarded by a different 'sales team.'

The sales process was akin to the procedure the KGB used to force the condemned to sign confessions. The customer sat in an uncomfortable chair while a team of 'good salesman' and 'bad salesman' badgered you with false promises and assurances that if you'd just sign the sales agreement they'd let you go to the bathroom.

Asking to see the invoice on a car was greeted with laughter or outright hostility, much like the response one gets today after asking a hospital administrator what a hernia operation will cost.

If a customer had a couple of weeks to visit every dealer within a reasonable radius of home and a high tolerance for psychological pressure, there was a chance he could negotiate an excellent price.

Consumer Reports ended that agonizing process by first providing accurate cost information and second, by urging customers to negotiate over the phone instead of submitting to the time-consuming process of in-person visits for every dealer.

That put customers and dealers on a level playing field. Even with information, many car buyers still hated the negotiation process. Edmunds found 33 percent of the car-buying population would rather do taxes, go to the DMV, sit in the middle seat of an airplane or watch Beto live-stream a root canal than negotiate car prices.

Costco, CR and other like-minded marketers responded with a car-buying service for their customers. Some charge for the service and others just direct you to a dealership where the price has already been negotiated. All of the services promise to eliminate negotiation.

Which is the problem. Today's consumer can't seem to figure out the "No Haggle - No Hassel" pricing has a flip side, which is "Take It or Leave It."

As dealer Brent Emon commented on the Three Thrifty Guys site, "I can say that there is ALWAYS someone who will buy our car at our price. It's not like that poor Corolla is going to rot away on the lot because you walked away, it just means we sell it tomorrow instead of today."

So Costco et al did eliminate negotiation, most because the dealers stopped.

I have yet to buy or lease a car from a Costco dealer, even after getting the Costco price, because they won't budge from that number. And many other CR or TrueCar dealers are doing the same.

I blame the buying and price quote services. Consumers are so sheep-like they would rather take a price set by a third party - secure in the knowledge if the price is high they aren't the only people paying it - than use that price as a starting point to negotiate their own deal.

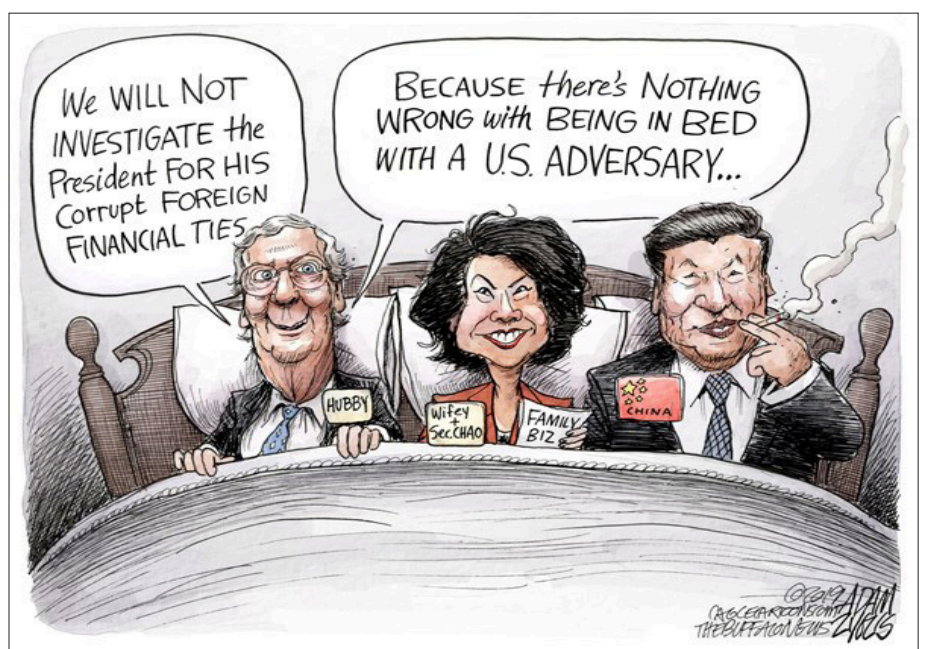
Dealers like Emon conclude if cars are going off the lot at the "No Haggle - No Hassel" then why waste time trying to seal the deal with a penny-pincher like me? There's always some relieved Millennial to take my place.

The last two times I've leased a car only one dealer of the five or six I contacted had a salesman ready to negotiate a deal, instead of order-takers who wait for a customer to buy at the set price.

I once had a Mercedes finance manager tell me that on some days a customer would come into the dealership, see the list price of a car on the window sticker and write him a check for the full amount. And he didn't feel the least bit guilty for making a premium on that car, because on other days people like me would come into the dealership.

Don't passively put dealers that won't negotiate in the driver's seat again. Make them talk or take a walk.

SHE REMEMBERS A TIME WHEN ABORTION WAS ILLEGAL

HARRISBURG, Pa. - Jessica Marquez-Gates is old enough to remember an America before Roe v. Wade.

It was an America where women "douched with

caustic chemicals" and used coat hangers to end unwanted pregnancies. She remembers desperate women dying because of botched attempts.

With her 70th birthday closing in next month, state governments approving abortion bans, and the five-decade-old landmark U.S. Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion under historic siege, Marquez-Gates is ready for a fight.

"This is an issue that transcends Democrats, that transcends Republicans," Marquez-Gates said last week during a national day of action. "These are our daughters', our granddaughters' bodies we're talking about. We cannot go back."

So far, at least three states have passed legislation banning abortion after the sixth week of pregnancy. Alabama Republican Gov. Kay Ivey recently signed a near total ban on abortion that would punish violators with a felony and take a torch to traditional exceptions for rape and incest. Missouri Gov. Mike Parson signed an eight-week ban.

Pennsylvania's Republican-controlled House of Representatives recently passed a bill banning abortion based on an in-utero diagnosis of Down syndrome. Similar legislation has been introduced in the Republican-controlled state Senate. A freshman Republican in the state House is also seeking co-sponsors for a six-week ban, which is before most women even know they're pregnant.

Pennsylvania Gov. Tom Wolf, a Democrat and former Planned Parenthood escort, has vowed to veto the bills if they reach his desk. Meanwhile, reproductive rights advocates expect the bills in other states to immediately run into court challenges. But that's the idea.

Evangelicals who held their noses and elected a boorish president with authoritarian tendencies contented themselves with the knowledge that, in return, they'd get an abortion-hostile Supreme Court that would move to overturn or substantially water down Roe v. Wade.

The cruel irony, of course, is that there's nothing particularly "pro-life" or "pro-family" about any of these bills.

The small government conservatives who cry foul over government intervention into every other area of public life are perfectly willing to crowd into the examining room

and make proxy rulings over the most deeply personal decision a woman can ever make.

What it boils down to is a matter of "bodily autonomy," said activist Amber Blaylock, who spoke at the rally.

Women, not GOP lawmakers who tend to lose interest in what happens to a fetus after birth, should have the final - and only - say, she said.

That happens even as Republicans refuse to pass bills that help new and expectant mothers or gut the social safety net that low-income women depend on to help make ends meet while they work and try to raise their families.

The attacks on abortion access also come as the Trump administration has moved to impose new restrictions on federal family planning money, a move that most see as a barely disguised effort to defund Planned Parenthood.

In April, a federal judge granted an injunction, sought by 21 state attorneys general that temporarily blocks the rule from taking effect.

Not only are governors and lawmakers in states across the country seeking to legislate abortion out of existence, the White House is trying to get rid of money for programs that would help women avoid getting pregnant in the first place.

The end result, of course, is that abortions only increase in such a scenario.

And in a world where Roe is overturned and control over abortion is kicked back to the states, a yawning health care gap opens up between the wealthiest Americans - who can use their money and privilege to seek an abortion in a state where it's legal - and poor women, rural women, and women of color who are trapped by income and circumstances, and cannot access the same standard of care.

"Criminalizing abortion will not stop it," Tara Murtha, of the Philadelphia-based Women's Law Project, told the crowd of about 100 rally-goers. "The only question is who gets access to safe abortion care. Women suffer and die when abortion is criminalized. That's a feature, not a bug, of what happens when abortion is criminalized. It's an attack on all of us."

It's also a world that Jessica Marquez-Gates thought she left behind a long time ago.

"It makes me so mad that these people think they have the right to make decisions about our bodies, our daughters' bodies, our granddaughters' bodies," she said, her voice rising. "We can't go back to a time when women were dying."

She paused.

"We're not going back."

GREAT AMERICAN STORIES NEVER TOLD

Earlier this week I traveled to central Illinois to speak at a memorial service at Eureka College, my dad's alma mater, on the 15th anniversary of his death.

As I flew halfway across the country and talked to many of the good people in the heart of America, it struck me how testy or peeved off everyone is about politics.

It seems like everyone's got a chip on their shoulder.

You can't just sit down at a table or a bar and have a simple conversation with a friend or a stranger because you're afraid of what might happen if you say the wrong thing.

If you say you're a Democrat, some Republican gets mad at you.

If you say you're a Republican who doesn't think Trump should be jailed immediately, someone else gets mad at you.

It's always a shame when Americans become so divided by partisan politics that they can't find anything uplifting or positive to say about their great country, but it was especially disappointing to me this week.

This was a week when all Americans should have been united in celebrating two of our historic victories in World War II and the brave young soldiers and sailors who made them possible.

Instead of bickering over partisan politics, we all should have been celebrating the Battle of Midway, the decisive naval battle we won against the Japanese between June 4 and June 7, 1942, that turned the tide of the war in the Pacific.

We also should have been celebrating - as President Trump did on his trip to France this week - the heroism of the Greatest Generation on D-Day, June 6, 1944, when our troops stormed the beaches at Normandy and turned the tide of war in Europe.

America had thousands of great heroes in the Pacific and in Europe during World War II, but we've done a terrible job of celebrating success stories like D-Day. We've also done a lousy job of teaching our kids the extraordinary things we did to defeat the twin evils of fascism and communism.

I don't ever want to run into another 28-year-old American man - as I once did - who didn't know why there is a cemetery filled with thousands of American sol-

diers on the coast of France.

I also don't ever want to talk to another young American standing where the Berlin Wall once was and have him tell me that the United States put up the wall to keep the Communists out of their sector.

It's not just the history of World War II and the Cold War that young people aren't being properly taught about, though.

The success stories of many famous Americans are rarely celebrated for what they say about the values of our country and the opportunities that are open to everyone rich or poor.

For example, when I spoke at the memorial for my father at Eureka College, I said - as my father often pointed out - that he was proof that in America anyone can rise to the top.

He didn't go to Harvard, Yale or Stanford. He went to Eureka, a postage-stamp of a Christian college near Peoria, on a poor boy's scholarship because his family had no money.

Yet Ronald Reagan rose to be president of the U.S. - and lots of graduates from elite schools like Harvard, Yale and Stanford had to look to the poor kid from Eureka College for affirmation.

My father's life showed that if you put your nose to the grindstone, anything is possible in America.

His success - like that of millions of other Americans - was proof of the basic greatness and goodness of our country.

Along with D-Day and Midway, his life was one of the many uplifting American life stories we could have been celebrating on TV this week.

Instead, what we saw was mostly a lot of arguing about whether to impeach the president or put him in prison.

On May 28, 2019, the City Council introduced for second reading Ordinance 1413 recommending adoption of Municipal Code Text Amendment 19-03 regarding lighting regulations in Title 17 “Zoning” of the SMMC in residential zones. The affected zones are: R-1 (One Family Residential), R-2 (Two Family Residential), R-3 (Medium/High Density), R-C (Residential Canyon), and HMZ (Hillside Management) Zones, respectively.

This summary is published pursuant to Government Code Section 36933(c)(1) and a full and complete certified copy of the text of Ordinance 1413 is available at the Sierra Madre City Manager’s Office located at City of Sierra Madre City Hall, 232 W. Sierra Madre Blvd., Sierra Madre, CA. Ordinance 1413 will become effective on July 1, 2019.

The purpose of Municipal Code Text Amendment 19-03 is to include language establishing lighting regulations for properties in residential zoning districts. Currently, the R-3 Zone (Medium/High Residential) includes language for lighting regulations. However, there is no language for such regulations in the other residential zones. This ordinance would modify the existing R-3 language and add it to the R-1 (One Family Residential), R-2 (Two Family Residential), R-C (Residential Canyon), and HMZ (Hillside Management) Zones, respectively.

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The adoption of this ordinance qualifies for an exemption from the California Environmental Quality Act review pursuant to Title 14, Section 15061(b)(3) of the California Code of Regulations as it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility the adoption of this Ordinance may have a significant effect on the environment.

APPEAL: If in the future anyone wishes to challenge the decision of the City Council in court, one may be limited to raising the issues that were raised or presented in written correspondence delivered to the City Council at, or before, the scheduled public hearing.
