## MAMA BEAR, BABY BEAR, DOG AND DOG OWNER SURVIVE ENCOUNTER WITHOUT CATASTROPHE

The City of Sierra Madre is a Wildlife Sanctuary and as such any incident involving the clashing of cultures between humans, and in this case domesticated animals, concerns just about the entire town.

Early last week, a black bear and her cub came down from the hillsides and encountered a dog who apparently did not care for the visitors in the dogs backyard. Numerous accounts say the dog was particularly interested in why the cub was in the tree and that did not sit well with Mama Bear who decided to protect her cub. In turn, the homeowner came out to save his dog, and he too was 'addressed' by Mama bear. That is the lighter version of the incident. Both the man and his dog escaped serious injury and Mama Bear and her cub eventually were released back into the hillsides.

The incident captured the attention of many residents who were fearful that the adult bear would be euthanized. That did not happen. There was further concern that the mother and her cub would be separated. That didn't happen either.

However, what did happen was a reminder of the challenges we face in this area 'living with wildlife'.

Here is a portion of the official version of events from the California Department of Fish and Wildlife:

*The adult black bear that scratched a man on his Sierra Madre property on June 10 was protecting her cub and not acting abnormally aggressive, a California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) investigation has concluded. CDFW is in the process of releasing both the bear and cub back to suitable habitat near the location where they were captured. As the paper went to press we received confirmation that the bear family was indeed released together back into the forest.*

The sow strayed onto the man's proper-

*ty, where the adult bear was challenged by the man's dog. The sow had a cub nearby. The dog reportedly engaged in a physical confrontation with the sow prompting the man to run into the fray to save his dog. He kicked the sow, which prompted it to scratch him. CDFW biologists concluded the bear acted in defense of itself and its cub, which constitutes normal behavior. The man successfully saved the dog and called 911. The injuries to the man and his dog were not serious and both are expected to fully recover.*

*A wildlife officer responded to the scene and tranquilized both bears after the man identified them as the ones involved in the incident. Officers collected DNA evidence samples from the man and the sow and sent them to the CDFW Wildlife Forensics Laboratory in Sacramento for analysis. Forensics scientists compared the DNA profile of the captured adult bear to those of evidence taken from the man to conclude with a very high level of confidence that the captured bear was the one involved in the incident.*

*Forensics scientists also compared the bear's DNA to the DNA evidence collected from a bear attack reported on April 25, also in Sierra Madre. The evidence showed that it was not the same bear.*

*CDFW reminds Californians that much of the state is bear country, even Los Angeles County, one of the most populated counties in the United States. CDFW encourages the citizens of Sierra Madre and anyone living in and around bear habitat to review tips on how to better coexist with bears and other wildlife at*

*KeepMeWild.org. CDFW also recently published seven things to know about California bear activity right now.*

(1) Has there been an increase in the number of bears entering residential areas?

There is a definite uptick in bear activity, which occurs every year around this time, all across the state. In most instances, we're witnessing the dispersal of young male black bears. Young bears typically spend about two years with their mother, after which the mother chases off her young male offspring in the spring to fend for themselves. The behavior itself is not unusual for the time of year.

Nature provides these youngsters with the best chance of survival as they are turned out on their own at a time of year when food and water resources on the landscape are the most available and plentiful.

California's black bears of all ages are waking up hungry from their winter downtime and are out actively searching for food. Adult bears may also be out searching for mates. There is more bear activity across the state this time of year and sometimes the adults end up in the wrong place, too.

2. Even when bears are spotted in populated and residential communities, the bears will typically and happily find their way back to wild habitat on their own without any kind of assistance. Only when a bear becomes stuck in a situation where it can't escape or is in danger of harming itself or others will CDFW typically intervene to remove the bear and safely return it to wild habitat.

(3) In some unfortunate cases throughout the state, black bears are being struck and hit by vehicles on the roadways. Drivers need to be particularly alert this time of year as wildlife of all kinds – bears, bobcats, deer, coyotes, foxes, among them – are on the move, out and about, and more active and visible than usual.

(4) Are these bears a public safety threat or a threat to my pets? Black bears very rarely pose any kind of public safety threat and are not often a threat to domestic dogs and cats. For the most part, they do their very best to stay as far away from people as possible.

(5) What kind of bears are these? California is home only to one species of bear – the black bear. Black bears, however, come in a variety of colors, including black, brown, blond and cinnamon.

(6) How can I help the bears? Bears have a highly specialized sense of smell. The public can help bears stay out of human settlements and stick to their natural diet by properly disposing of leftover food and garbage and securing other attractants such as pet food so these dispersing bears don't become acclimated to urban environments. CDFW's Keep Me Wild: Black Bear webpage offers a number of other useful tips to keep the bears wild and safe.

(7) Who should I call to report a bear?

A black bear spotted while out hiking, camping or recreating in wild habitat is not necessarily a cause for alarm. Bears spotted in residential, suburban or ur-

"I've said it before, but it's absolutely true: My mother gave me my drive, but my father gave me my dreams. Thanks to him I could see a future." Liza Minnelli

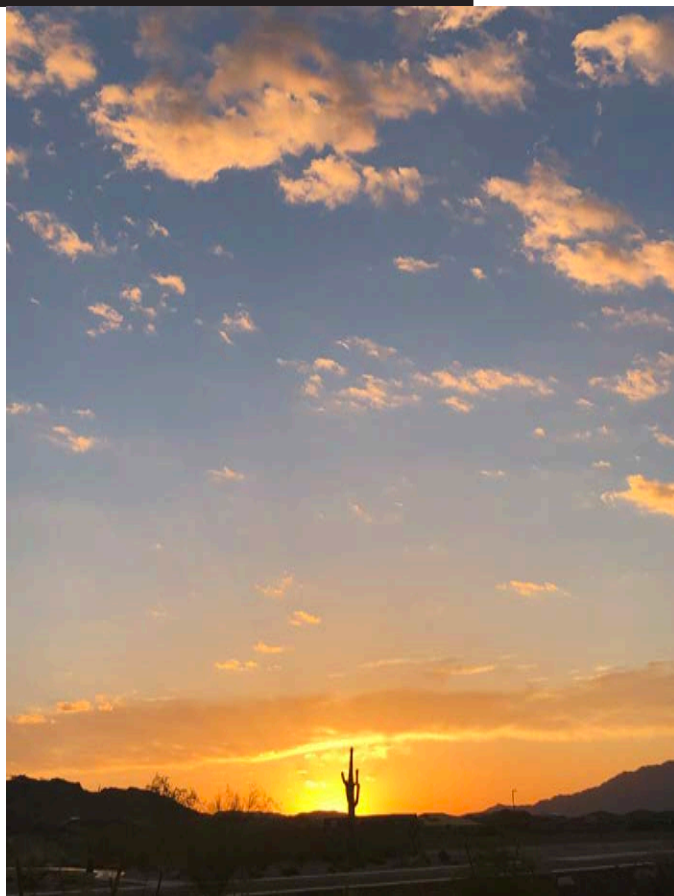

The scammer is hoping you'll call back, because it's really an international toll number and will appear as a charge on your phone bill — with most of the money going to the scammer. Well, the scam is back with a vengeance, and the FCC just issued a new advisory about it. Read the FCC's advisory for more detail, but the advice from both agencies remains the same if you get one of these calls:

- Don't call back
- Report the robocall to the FTC at [www.donotcall.gov](http://www.donotcall.gov) and to the FCC at [www.fcc.gov/complaints](http://www.fcc.gov/complaints)
- Always check your phone bill for suspicious or unusual charges

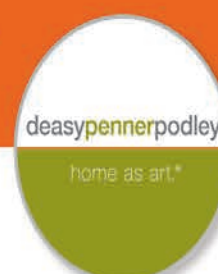

## All Fireworks Are Illegal in Pasadena

*Police and firefighters team up for special enforcement patrols*

The City of Pasadena amended its municipal code last year to hold property owners and tenants responsible for permitting the possession, sale, usage or discharge of fireworks on their property. The code allows for the prosecution of fireworks-related offenses and for the demand of payment for all costs associated with the safe disposal of confiscated fireworks. The City maintains a zero tolerance enforcement policy for fireworks and Pasadena's police and firefighters are teaming up for special fireworks enforcement patrols before, during and after the Fourth of July holiday. Violators are subject to arrest; having their vehicles impounded; and serving up to one year in jail with fines up to \$50,000.

Statistics show that fireworks are among the most dangerous of all consumer products. Even hand-held sparklers, which many consider safe, are dangerous and can reach 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit, causing serious burns or fires. National Fire Protection Association statistics reveal that 90 percent of all fireworks-related injuries are caused by so-called "safe and sane" fireworks which are illegal in Pasadena.

The City of Pasadena invites you to celebrate the Fourth of July responsibly and join us for the 93rd annual "Americafest," one of the best family-friendly celebrations and professional fireworks shows in Southern California at the Rose Bowl Stadium. For ticket and event information, please visit [www.rosebowlstadium.com](http://www.rosebowlstadium.com).

Due to the potential for fire hazards and injuries, Pasadena police and fire personnel will staff checkpoints around the stadium to search for and seize any fireworks. Parking enforcement officers will ensure that vehicles illegally parked in Pasadena's hillside areas on July 4th are impounded.

The Pasadena Fire Department will be applying Phos-Chek on Tuesday, July 2nd to brush areas around the Arroyo area. The main ingredients of this fire retardant are phosphates and fertilizers to help prevent plants from burning and to re-vegetate burned wildland areas.

Fourth of July reminders: Celebrate responsibly and always designate a driver. Stay hydrated, drink water or other nutritious fluids before becoming thirsty; limit alcohol & sugary drinks.

If outdoors, remember to use sunscreen, wear a brimmed hat and seek shade, if needed. Fight the Bite, use bug spray/repellent to protect against mosquitoes.

Many areas of the City, including outdoor areas, are designated as "No Smoking" zones. Smoking anything in "No Smoking" areas is strictly prohibited. Always make sure that whatever you smoke in an official smoking area is fully extinguished before disposing in an appropriate trash container.

Always have someone tending the barbecue and watching the swimming pool when in use.

## MONROVIA'S CITY COUNCIL ADOPTS RESOLUTION TO CALL FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION TO KEEP MONROVIA REVENUE LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX PROPOSAL ON NOVEMBER 5, 2019

Over the past few months, staff has coordinated more than a dozen outreach meetings to discuss the possibility of calling for a special election in November 2019 for our community to consider a sales tax increase. The genesis of this idea was borne from the propensity of LA County to continue gaining approval for local sales tax rate increases, which have placed Monrovia on the precipice of hitting the State maximum rate of 10.25%. Currently, we only have 0.75% of sales tax capacity remaining, and there are several potential regional sales tax increase proposals being considered.

Throughout all of our outreach efforts, the response from most of the community regarding the possibility of increasing our local sales tax rate to keep Monrovia's revenue local (and away from regional agencies, like LA County) has been generally positive. Given that feedback, on May 7, staff prepared a study session overview for City Council regarding our efforts to date, and also outlined a staff proposed spending plan should the measure be approved. The proposed spending plan was developed based on looming future fiscal threats, and to fund aspirational local priority projects that have been put on hold due to lack of funding.

The key priority funding areas include:

Fund an upgrade to the City's Community Center

Achieve a AAA Rating

Give money back to residents by lowering the monthly municipal services bill

Continue to invest in capital upgrades, including parks, facilities and infrastructure

Set a fixed amount of money aside for community priorities, such as affordable housing, community based organizations, and schools.

These items were discussed in greater detail at the May 29 and June 4 Budget Study Sessions with the City Council. Additional details regarding the proposed spending plan and sales tax initiative can be found online.

Following all of the consideration regarding this matter, the City Council last Tuesday voted to adopt the requisite resolutions needed to call for a special election to allow the community to consider the Keep Monrovia Revenue Local Sales and Use Tax Proposal. The item will be considered by Monrovia voters on Tuesday, November 5, 2019.

During the next several months, staff will continue to reach out to various community groups to gather additional feedback, and as the spending plan continues to develop, staff will continue to keep everyone apprised of any new information.

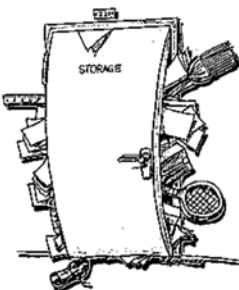

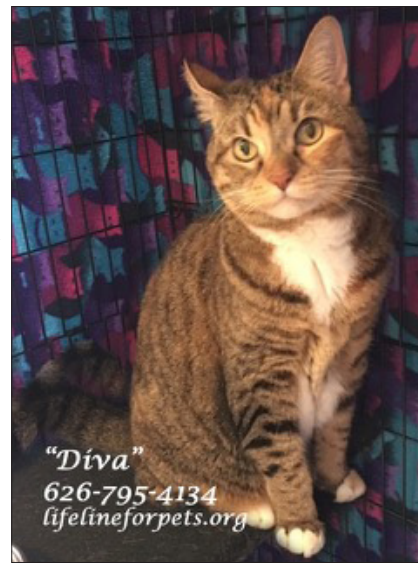

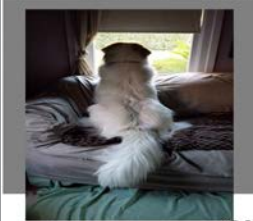

HOW TO CHOOSE AND USE A HOME BLOOD PRESSURE MONITOR

Dear Savvy Senior:  
I just found out I have stage 1 hypertension and my doctor recommended I get a home blood pressure monitor to keep an eye on it. Can you offer me any tips on choosing and using one? Hypertensive Helen



Dear Helen:  
It's a smart idea! Everyone with elevated or high blood pressure – stage 1 (or 130/80) and higher – should consider getting a home blood pressure monitor. Home monitoring can help you keep tabs on your blood pressure in a comfortable setting. Plus, if you're taking medication it will make certain it's working, and alert you to a health problem if it arises.

**Home Monitors**  
The best type of home blood pressure monitors to purchase are electric/battery powered automatic arm monitors, which are more reliable than wrist or fingertip monitors. With an automatic arm monitor, you simply wrap the cuff around your bicep and with the push of one button the cuff inflates and deflates automatically giving you your blood pressure reading on the display window in a matter of seconds.

Many monitors today also come with additional features like irregular heartbeat detection; a risk category indicator that tells you whether your blood pressure is in the high range; a data-averaging function that allows you to take multiple readings and get an overall average; multiple user memory that allows two or more users to save their readings; and downloadable memory that lets you transmit your data to your computer or smartphone.

You can find these monitors at pharmacies, medical supply stores or online, and you don't need a prescription to buy one. Prices typically range between \$40 and \$100.

In most cases, original Medicare will not cover a home blood pressure monitor, but if you have a Medicare Advantage plan or a private health insurance policy it's worth checking into, because some plans may provide coverage.

Some of the best automatic arm monitors as recommended by Consumer Reports are the Omron 10 Series BP786N (\$75); Rite Aid Deluxe Automatic (\$60); Omron Evolv BP7000 (\$70); and A&D Medical UA767F (\$45).

**How to Measure**  
After you buy a monitor, it's a good idea to take it to your doctor's office so they can check its accuracy and make sure you're using it properly. Here are some additional steps to follow to ensure you get accurate readings at home.

- Relax: Don't exercise, smoke or drink caffeinated drinks or alcohol for at least 30 minutes before measuring. Sit quietly for at least five minutes before you take a measurement and remain quiet during the test.
- Sit correctly: Sit with your back straight and supported (on a dining chair, rather than a sofa). Your feet should be flat on the floor and your legs should not be crossed. Your arm should be supported on a flat surface (such as a table) with the upper arm at heart level. Make sure the middle of the cuff is placed directly above the bend of the elbow. Check your monitor's instructions for an illustration.
- Put the cuff directly on your bare skin: Putting it over clothes can raise your systolic (upper) number by up to 40 mmHg.
- Measure at the same time every day: It's important to take the readings at the same time each day, such as morning and evening. It doesn't matter whether you do it before or after taking medication. Just be consistent.
- Go to the bathroom: A full bladder can rise your systolic pressure by 10 to 15 mmHg.
- Take multiple readings and record the results: Each time you measure, take two or three readings one minute apart and record the results by writing them down, or using an online tracker (see CCctracker.com).

AVOID ANOTHER COMMON CAUSES FOR DISPUTE OVER YOUR ESTATE PLAN

one part of your family over another.

In the first part of this series, we discussed one of the most frequent causes for dispute over your estate plan. Here, we'll look at another leading cause for dispute and

offer strategies for its prevention.

Contesting the validity of wills and trusts

The validity of your will and/or trust can be contested in court for a few different reasons. If such a contest is successful, the court declares your will or trust invalid, which effectively means the document(s) never existed in the first place. Obviously, this would likely be disastrous for everyone involved, especially your intended beneficiaries.

However, just because someone disagrees with what he or she received in your will or trust doesn't mean that person can contest it. Whether or not the individual agrees with the terms of your plan is irrelevant; it is your plan after all. Rather, he or she must prove that your plan is invalid (and should be thrown out) based on one or more of the following legal grounds:

- \*The document was improperly executed (signed, witnessed, and/or notarized) as required by state law.
- \* You did not have the necessary mental capacity at the time you created the document to understand what you were doing.
- \*Someone unduly influenced or coerced you into creating or changing the document.
- \*The document was procured by fraud.

Furthermore, only those individuals with "legal standing" can contest your will or trust. Just because someone was intimately involved in your life, even if they're a blood relative, doesn't automatically mean they can legally contest your plan.

Those with the potential for legal standing generally fall into two categories: 1) Family members who would inherit, or inherit more, under state law if you never created the document. 2) Beneficiaries (family, friends, and charities) named or given a larger bequest in a previous version of the document.

Solution: There are times when family members might contest your will and/or trust over legitimate concerns, such as if they believe you were tricked or coerced into changing your plan by an unscrupulous caregiver. However, that's not what I'm addressing here.

Here, we're looking at—and seeking to prevent—contests which are attempts by disgruntled family members and/or would-be beneficiaries seeking to improve the benefit they received through your plan. We're also seeking to prevent contests that are a result of disputes between members of blended families, particularly those that arise between spouses and children from a previous marriage.

First off, working with an experienced lawyer is of paramount importance if you have one or more family members who are unhappy—or who may be unhappy—with how they are treated in your plan. This need is especially critical if you're seeking to disinherit or favor

Some of the leading reasons for such unhappiness include having a plan that benefits some children more than others, as well as when your plan benefits friends, unmarried domestic partners, and/or other individuals instead of, or in addition to, your family. Conflict is also likely when you name a third-party trustee to manage an adult beneficiary's inheritance because he or she is likely to be negatively affected by the sudden windfall of money.

In these cases, it's vital to make sure your plan is properly created and maintained to ensure these individuals will not have any legal ground to contest your will or trust. One way you can do this is to include clear language that you are making the choices laid out in your plan of your own free will, so no one will be able to challenge your wishes by claiming your incapacity or duress.

Beyond having a sound plan in place, it's also crucial that you clearly communicate your intentions to everyone affected by your will or trust while you're still alive, rather than having them learn about it when you're no longer around. Indeed, we often recommend holding a family meeting (which we can help facilitate) to go over everything with all impacted parties.

Outside of contests originated by disgruntled loved ones, the potential for your will or trust to cause dispute is significantly increased if you have a blended family. If you are in a second (or more) marriage, with children from a prior marriage, there's an inherent risk of dispute because your children and spouse often have conflicting interests.

To reduce the likelihood of dispute, it's crucial that your plan contain clear and unambiguous terms spelling out the beneficiaries' exact rights, along with the rights and responsibilities of executors and/or trustees. Such precise terms help ensure all parties know exactly what you intended.

If you have a blended family, it's also essential that you meet with all affected parties while you're still alive (and of sound mind) to clearly explain your wishes in person. Sharing your intentions and hopes for the future with your spouse and children is key to avoiding disagreements over your true wishes for them.

Prevent disputes before they happen

The best way to deal with estate planning disputes is to do everything possible to make sure they never occur in the first place. This means working with a trusted attorney to put planning strategies in place aimed at anticipating and avoiding common sources of conflict. Moreover, it means constantly reviewing and updating your plan to keep pace with your changing circumstances and family dynamics.

### MY REMARKABLY 'UNREMARKABLE' FATHER

My dad turns 86 next month. He never thought he'd live so long - or see as many Father's Days as he has - because his parents both died far too young.

A stroke claimed his mother when she was 69 - the same night Pittsburgh Pirates great Roberto Clemente's hurricane-relief plane went missing. It was the first time I'd ever heard my father sob.

My dad's father was only 34 when he died in 1937. My father, then just 3, lost half of his universe. His dad had a great job as an accountant for the Mellon family. His early death greatly altered my father's future.

My dad's mother had to work full-time to make ends meet, leaving him to fend for himself on city streets. Often unsupervised, he got into some trouble - once, a stone he set on the tracks nearly derailed a trolley car - but sports saved him.

His high school football coach shaped him into a championship running back - while serving as the father figure he ached for. And then, after a baseball game he'd played, my father met my mother. When their eyes met on that afternoon 68 years ago, it was lights out for him.

Their 1950s courtship was not unlike those in the 1970s sitcom "Happy Days." When football scholarship offers rolled in, my father couldn't bear the thought of four long years away from my mother.

Not even Chuck Noll, then captain of the University of Dayton football team - who'd coach the Pittsburgh Steelers to four Super Bowl wins - could persuade my dad to leave her behind.

My dad never desired great fortune or fame. He didn't need to be a corporate executive or public figure. All he wanted was to be with my mother, start a family with her and build a life.

He worked hard for Bell Telephone for nearly 40 years. He and my mother would be blessed with six children, 17 grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren - and counting! - amid the many ups and downs that a long marriage and a large, extended family bring.

He'd tell you his life is unremarkable - that lots of men made the choices he made. But I disagree.

Never a man big on words, his actions always have spoken loudly.

He worked long hours to support us, but never kept more than \$5 a week for himself - to buy a couple of cups of coffee.

He made clear his devotion to our mother, and to us. He and my mother gave us a deep sense of security that he never had as a child.

His five daughters all married men with the same sort of character and integrity that still guide his existence, and their children have embraced these important traits, too.

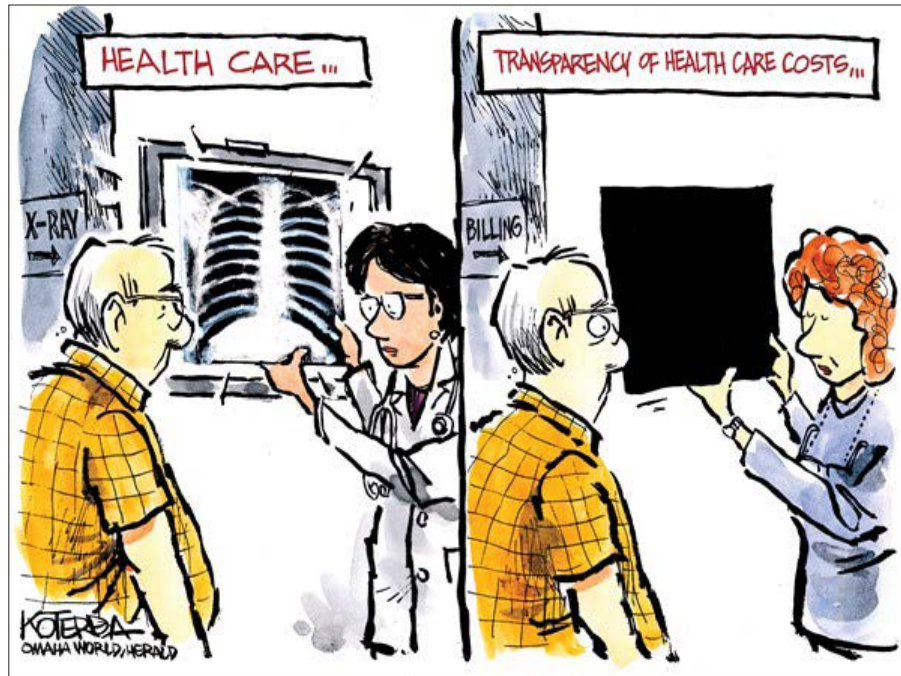
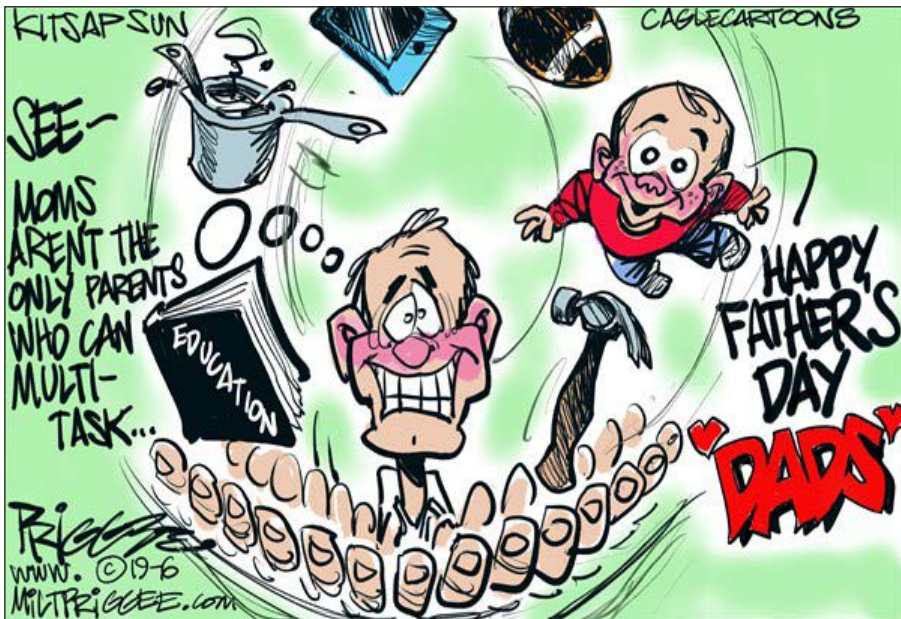
My dad still pays his bills and his taxes on time. He never took a loan he didn't repay. He coached baseball and served his church.

And all along, he desired only his family's love and well-being - and a few ice-cold Pabst Blue Ribbons - as rewards.

Fathers like my father make magnificent contributions to their families and our world. Great civilizations are built on their shoulders.

Yet they see their selfless support, guidance and nurturing of their families as "unremarkable" - which makes them all the more extraordinary.

That's why, this Father's Day, I want my father to know just how remarkably "unremarkable" he is.

H. L. Mencken, the famed crusty commentator, said one century ago: "A politician is an animal which can sit on a fence and yet keep both ears on the ground."

I thought of that quip the other day when former Vice President Joe Biden magically declared that he supports federal Medicaid funding for poor women seeking abortions. Biden had staunchly opposed such funding for decades - and had restated his opposition as recently as last Wednesday. But then, on Thursday, he suddenly announced his support, because, in his words, "circumstances had changed." You bet they had.

Biden is a front-running candidate for president, and even though polls show him beating Donald Trump by margins that exceed those of his Democratic rivals, he still needs to hose down liberals who think he's too much of an old-school moderate. Most urgently, he needed last week to get himself in sync with a party base that supports abortion access for all women regardless of income - especially now, with Roe v. Wade under attack as never before. So, in response, Biden made the decision to speedily flip-flop on federal Medicaid funding. All Democratic presidential nominees since 1992 have supported that funding.

In recent days, liberal activists and pundits long hostile to Biden have been quick to pounce on the guy, painting his policy reversal as a sign of weakness. But all politicians - indeed, often the most successful ones - are wont to be flexible from time to time, recalibrating their views for reasons of political expediency or exigent circumstances.

Some of our biggest flip-flopers are lionized on monuments. Thomas Jefferson hated public debt so much that he called for a constitutional provision that would strip the government of its power to borrow money. Then, as president, he reversed himself. He bought the Louisiana Territory from France with borrowed money, and justified it by saying, "Is it not better that the opposite land of the Mississippi should be settled by our own brethren and children than by strangers of another family?"

Abraham Lincoln campaigned for president, and marked his 1861 inaugural, by promising that the feds would not force

existing slave states to free their chattel. He initially defended "the right of each state to order and control its own domestic institutions according to its own judgment exclusively." We know what happened to that promise.

One of the most notorious flip-flopers was Franklin D. Roosevelt, known back in the day as a chameleon of no particular fixed convictions. He stumped for the White House in 1932 by promising fiscal conservatism and a balanced budget; after he won, he launched the New Deal. He often shifted leftward only when liberal activists (including the First Lady) pressured him to do so. Frances Perkins, one of his Cabinet members, said that FDR was guided by "his feeling that nothing in human judgment is final. One may courageously take the step that seems right today because it can be modified tomorrow."

More recently, Barack Obama reversed himself on same-sex marriage. He had opposed it as a senatorial and presidential candidate, but as president he endorsed it and explained his change of mind: "Attitudes evolve, including mine."

In fact, Obama - the only Democrat since FDR to be elected twice with a majority of the vote - had a string of reversals. He vowed as a candidate to close the Guantanamo Bay prison, but as president he kept it open. He vowed as a candidate that he would not appoint lobbyists to help run his administration, but then he did. He campaigned against extending the Bush tax cuts that favored the rich, but then signed legislation extending the cuts. He said early in his tenure that secret campaign donations were "a threat to democracy," but his 2012 re-election bid was buoyed by Democratic groups that took secret donations.

But John Kenneth Galbraith, the renowned economist who served four presidents, once said that the best chief executives typically made "pragmatic accommodations to whatever needed to be done." Joe Biden's Democratic critics are predictably condemning his reversal on federal abortion funding in a bid to lower his poll standing (much to the Trump team's delight, because they'd love to run against someone else), framing his pragmatism as rank opportunism, but one can easily view this episode as evidence that he's willing to be flexible, that he's responsive to the views of his constituents.

And isn't that what we want from a politician?

## TRUMP THROWS DIRT IN HIS OWN EYE

*What the heck was President Trump doing?*

What was he thinking when he told ABC's journalist George Stephanopoulos on Wednesday that if a foreign adversary offered him dirt on a political opponent he'd take a look at it before calling the FBI.

That was an incredibly stupid thing to say. And all day Thursday in the media we heard a bipartisan chorus of everyone but his wife Melania saying exactly that.

But what was Trump even doing giving a professional Clinton apologist like Stephanopoulos unlimited access to him for two whole days? Has he forgotten that his chief enemy is Fake News, Inc.? Stephanopoulos and his liberal pals in the mainstream media conveniently forgot what Hillary's gang actually did with Russian dirt because they were so busy beating up Trump for what he said he might do if he were offered dirt on an opponent.
