### GET A ONE-RING CALL? DON'T CALL BACK.

A while back, the public was warned you about the "one ring" scam. That's when you get a phone call from a number you don't know, and the call stops after just one ring. The scammer is hoping you'll call back, because it's really an international toll number and will appear as a charge on your phone bill — with most of the money going to the scammer. Well, the scam is back with a vengeance, and the FCC just issued a new advisory about it. Read the FCC's advisory for more detail, but the advice from both agencies remains the same if you get one of these calls:

- Don't call back
- Report the robocall to the FTC at [www.donot-call.gov](http://www.donot-call.gov) and to the FCC at [www.fcc.gov/complaints](http://www.fcc.gov/complaints)
- Always check your phone bill for suspicious or unusual charges

## WALKING SIERRA MADRE - The Social Side by Deanne Davis

### “ONE SMALL STEP FOR MAN, ONE GIANT LEAP FOR MANKIND.”

The immortal words of Neil Armstrong, spoken fifty years ago today. Everybody in the world is writing about Apollo 11 taking us all to the moon...slipping the surly bonds of earth to touch the face of God. That last phrase was taken from a World War II-era sonnet, written by a 19 year old American airman who had volunteered with the Royal Canadian Air Force, John Gillespie Magee, Jr., who was killed in action near Great Britain on December 11, 1941. This phrase was spoken by President Reagan on January 28, 1986, when he used these words to console a grieving nation following the explosion of the space shuttle Challenger.

I don't know if you've ever read the whole sonnet, but it's magnificent, and when you consider that a 19 year old American young man who was already a pilot and flying in the Canadian Air Force wrote it, it kind of boggles the mind. Entitled "High Flight"...

Oh! I have slipped the surly bonds of Earth  
And danced the skies on laughter-silvered wings;  
Sunward I've climbed, and joined the tumbling mirth  
of sun-split clouds,—and done a hundred things  
You have not dreamed of—wheeled and soared and swung  
High in the sunlit silence. Hov'ring there,  
I've chased the shouting wind along, and flung  
My eager craft through footless halls of air. . . .  
Up, up the long, delirious, burning blue  
I've topped the wind-swept heights with easy grace  
Where never lark nor ever eagle flew—  
And, while with silent lifting mind I've trod  
The high untrespassed sanctity of space,  
Put out my hand, and touched the face of God.

Touched the face of God! Unforgettable words. That's not really what I was planning to write about today, but I wanted to share this with you friends. Here's something else I wasn't really planning to write about...what the Apollo 11 guys left behind:

Lots of footprints! Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin's footprints are still there today because there is no weather on the lunar surface.

Also left behind, messages of hope, peace and goodwill from leaders in 73 countries, with words inscribed microscopically on the edge of a silicon disc. It says, "From Planet Earth, July 1969" and lists the names of the members of Congress who signed legislation making Apollo 11 possible and the names of top NASA officials. This disc is about the size of a half dollar coin!

They left a patch from the Apollo 1 mission to honor Gus Grissom, Edward White and Roger Chafee, the astronauts who lost their lives when a fire swept through the Apollo 1 command module during a training exercise at Kennedy Space Center on January 27, 1967. They also left medals honoring Russian cosmonauts Vladimir Komarov and Yuri Gagarin.

An American flag was left behind, not so much to "claim" the moon, but a symbolic gesture. It is theorized that flags left on the moon during the Apollo era have faded to white under the sun's harsh ultraviolet rays.

What was I really going to write about? It was that when men walked on the moon I was a couple of weeks away from giving birth to our youngest daughter, Crissy. I was about the same size and circumference as the moon and lying flat on the floor with my feet up on the couch as my back was killing me. It was an amazing July back there in 1969. Men walked on the moon and I gave birth to a fantastic person. I can't believe it's been fifty years, can you? God is so good!

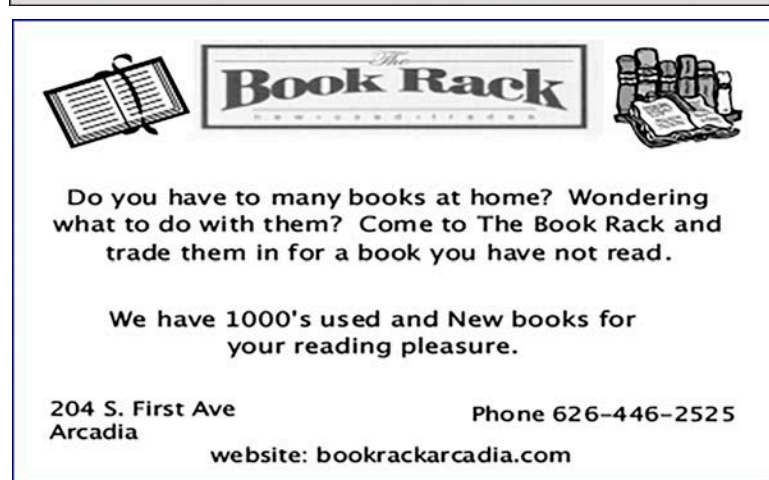

### TEAR-JERKER AT HAMILTON

This was looking to be another perfect week for recycling an old article, except that back in January I vowed not to do that. Lucky for me my Dad's cousin, Phil, came through with another story for me in the nick of time. Phew!

I've written about Phil before. Dos Equis thinks they have dibs on "the most interesting man in the world," but in reality, my Dad's cousin holds that title. Phil can speak on a wide variety of topics, and always shows a deep understanding in all areas touched upon. That, and he's just a riot overall.

This story has to do with his experience at Hamilton Elementary in Pasadena. Back then, Hamilton had a tradition that after summer vacation, students would gather in their previous classroom with their teacher and cohort from the year before. There, they'd wait for the principal to show up and personally walk them to their new classroom. Sounds nice.

## Victim in Parking lot Found Dead Identified

Although Pasadena police were still investigating Friday strange circumstances surrounding the body of a woman found dead in a parking lot near Fair Oaks and Alessandro Place shortly before 3 p.m. Sunday, they did say investigators had new information in the case.

A police detective said Friday the new details could not be made public at the time. She did however identify the woman as Pamela Kay Cross, a female Caucasian, 69 years of age, and a Pasadena resident.

"The investigation into the suspicious death by Pasadena police detectives is ongoing," police said in a written statement. "The cause of death is yet to be determined as we await the autopsy results from the Los Angeles County Coroner's office."

According to detectives, on Sunday, July 14, at about 2:55 p.m., Pasadena Police Department personnel responded to 50 Alessandro Pl. on a report of a woman down, possibly deceased, in the southwest parking lot of the medical center.

According to news reports Pasadena Police Department Lt. Mark Goodman said the injuries to the woman were consistent with an assault. He also said the body may have been in the parking area for hours before discovered.

## A Message from Police

### Federal Immigration Violations

"Pasadena Police Department does not enforce criminal violations related to the immigration status of persons in our community. As guided by Police Department Policy 428, it is the expectation that members of Pasadena Police Department will enforce the law equally and will not engage in law enforcement activities based solely on someone's immigration status."

"Furthermore, Policy 428 states requests by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) or other federal agency for assistance from Pasadena Police Department should be directed to a supervisor. The department may provide ICE or other federal agency with the same, available, ancillary support services, such as traffic control or peacekeeping efforts, to protect the general public as the Department would provide based upon an incident dispatch made on complaint or request of any member of the public or interagency assist. To the maximum extent permitted by law, the department shall not directly assist ICE in investigating, detaining or arresting individuals solely for violations of federal immigration law. The department shall cooperate with ICE to the extent required by law and in efforts to investigate and to apprehend individuals in the United States that present national security concerns involving terrorism or transnational criminal activity, such as human, drug or weapons trafficking."



## City to Review Madison Mixed Use Project

The Pasadena city council is set Monday night to exempt, a 72,000 square-foot, five-story mixed-use project at 127 and 141 N. Madison Avenue, from environmental review something a number of groups in Pasadena are opposed to including Pasadena Heritage, The Pasadena Women's City Club and the Blinn House Foundation among others.

"Pasadena Heritage is requesting that the City Council not approve the requested permits and special concessions for this major mixed-use project until an Environmental Impact Report is done to adequately study the proposal, its potential impacts, alternatives, and mitigation measures," they wrote in an email to their members and residents.

At issue they say is "The project site is located between two National Register Historic Districts, and any new building should be compatible with its historic setting per our General Plan and Design Guidelines for the district. The FAR (floor area ratio) requested far exceeds the allowable FAR in the Zoning Code that already

includes a density bonus. Pasadena Heritage believes that a successful project could be developed here, but it must comply with our General Plan, Zoning Code, and Design Guidelines."

According to the city staff report, the applicant, Mike Balian, submitted an Affordable Housing Concession Permit application to facilitate the construction of a mixed-use project. An existing four-story building (Madison Professional Building) and surface parking lot would be demolished and replaced by the project. The mixed-use project would include:

- 49 dwelling units (45 market rate units for sale, 4 "very low-income" units for rent)
- 5-stories (62 feet tall)
- 72,000 square feet
- 4,210 commercial square feet (office)
- 101 parking spaces (at grade and one level of subterranean parking)

Balian also filed applications to remove four protected trees on private property:

- A 13" diameter-at-breast height (DBH) Brush Cherry tree (Syzygium paniculatum);

- A 21" DBH Silver Dollar Gum tree (Eucalyptus polyanthemos);
- A 27" DBH Ribbon Gum tree (Eucalyptus viminalis); and
- A 23" DBH Silver Dollar Gum tree (Eucalyptus polyanthemos).

The groups say the project will visually and aesthetically tower above the Ford Place National Register Historic District (Fuller campus). And could damage the National Register-listed Blinn House with its vulnerable foundation and fragile leaded art glass windows and fireplace.

Next, you should visit the cabin and the surrounding area so that you are familiar with the cabin. This is not an opportunity to be a looky-loo. It takes time to show the cabin.

Cabin 62 is in the main section of the canyon, in the Fern Lodge area, on the way to Sturtevant Falls. It is across the creek from the trail, not far from the confluence of the East Fork with Big Santa Anita creek. This is a well-maintained cabin. The owner visit once a week, always keeping the interior clean and clear-ing the grounds of leaves and other debris.

### What's Included

The space includes a main living area with rock fireplace, a small kitchen area, and an open bedroom. There is also an out building that sleeps two. The kitchen has a propane stove and propane refrigerator but no sink. Also included is a pit toilet.

A nice feature is the crank-operated telephone that communicates with Adams' Pack Station, Sturtevant Camp, and all other cabins connected to the network. Cell phones usually get reception at nearby Tin Can Point on the trail above Fern Lodge. There is a rudimentary water system among the cluster of cab-ins that draws water by gravity from the East Fork. The current condition of the system is not know to us.

To the best of our knowledge the cabin includes all furniture, appliances, equipment, and tools.

Start your hike at the Chantry Flat trailhead (210 Fwy, off on Santa Anita, drive toward the mountains 5 miles until you dead end at the parking lot). There is a white pipe gate next to the lower restrooms. It protects a paved road. Hike down the paved road until you reach the trail. Take the trail to the right. Hike apx. 1 mile. Right after you pass cabin #67 which is right on the trail, there is a crossing on your right. Go across the the planks. Turn right and walk downstream two cabins..

## CHU REINTRODUCES REUNITING FAMILIES ACT

Congresswoman Judy Chu introduced the Reuniting Families Act Wednesday, which will improve the family reunification process by reducing visa backlogs to provide humane and timely reunifications, providing equality for LGBTQ families, increasing the number of diversity visas, and improving our overall immigration system. Rep. Chu issued the following statement:

“We know that Trump wants to go back to a system that prioritizes white immigrants over everyone else. But instead of basing our immigration system on the color of your skin, we believe it should be based on what is best for our country and our economy. Thanks to family immigration, many new immigrants can rely on their parents to help raise their kids while they hold down a job, or can find financing for their business through their family when a bank says no. That’s true merit to me. And it’s why immigrants rely on less government assistance, start businesses in higher numbers, and own more homes than native born individuals.

“Unfortunately, our immigration system has not been reformed for decades and does not address the current reality of families trying to come to the United States who are caught in our visa backlog. For instance, the average wait time for a U.S. citizen to sponsor a sibling from the Philippines is almost 25 years! In total, more than 4 million people are still waiting for a family immigration visa. The reality is that our family immigration system is not the floodgate that Trump paints it as. It can take decades to reunite just ONE family member. In fact, our system is severely backlogged – which is what this bill is meant to address.”

The text of the Reuniting Families Act can be

found at: [house.gov](https://www.house.gov). Specifically, the bill will:

Recapture unused employment-based and family-sponsored visas from fiscal years 1992-2015. For future years, unused visa numbers will automatically “roll over” to the next fiscal year.

- Reclassify spouses, permanent partners, and children under the age of 21 of lawful permanent residents who are waiting in line to reunite with their families as “immediate relatives,” a category not subject to annual numerical limits.

- Eliminate discrimination facing LGBTQ families throughout immigration laws, including making sure that all children born to U.S. citizen parents have acquired citizenship regardless of a biological relationship..

- Honor the contribution of Filipino World War II veterans by reducing their children’s waiting times for family-based visas

- Increase the number of diversity visas from 50,000 to 80,000 green cards annually.

- Increases the government’s discretion to keep families together and waive grounds of inadmissibility or deportability for humanitarian purposes, family unity, or the public interest. This could be used to prevent deportations and sponsor previously deported family members to come back.



## HOUSE PASSES SCHIFF AMENDMENT TO ADD NAMES OF “THE LOST 74” TO VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL

**Sailors Aboard the U.S.S. Frank E. Evans Died Serving Our Country During Vietnam War**

Washington, DC – Today, Rep. Adam Schiff (D-Burbank) announced that the House of Representatives has passed an amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) instructing the Department of Defense to add the names of 74 sailors who lost their lives on the U.S.S. Frank E. Evans during the Vietnam War to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington D.C.

“The Lost 74 died aboard the U.S.S. Frank E. Evans during the Vietnam War, and today the House took an important step to ensure their sacrifice is not forgotten,” said Rep. Schiff. “These brave Americans deserve to be honored alongside other fallen servicemembers at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial.”

On June 3, 1969, the U.S.S. Frank E. Evans was struck by HMAS Melbourne, an Australian aircraft carrier in the South China Sea – 74 American sailors lost their lives. The two ves-sels were participating in a joint Southeast Asia Treaty Organization exercise called “Sea Spirit” at the time of the collision. Despite operating in Vietnamese waters immediately be-fore deployment to joint exercise Sea Spirit, and a scheduled return to activities support-ing the war effort after the exercise, it was determined that since the incident took place outside the geographical limit for the combat zone the sailors who lost their lives were ineligible for inclusion on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. That conclusion did not acknowledge that at the time of the incident, the U.S.S. Evans was instrumental in advancing American military objectives in Vietnam and the crew had participated in conflict just days before the collision.

Rep. Schiff has pursued including the 74 names on the Memorial for several years since meeting the family of a sailor who died on the ship. In addition to offering multiple amendments to past authorization bills, Rep. Schiff has discussed the issue with successive Defense Secretaries and Secretaries of the Navy, urging them to rectify this injustice.

The House passed the NDAA, including the amendment, on a vote of 220-197.

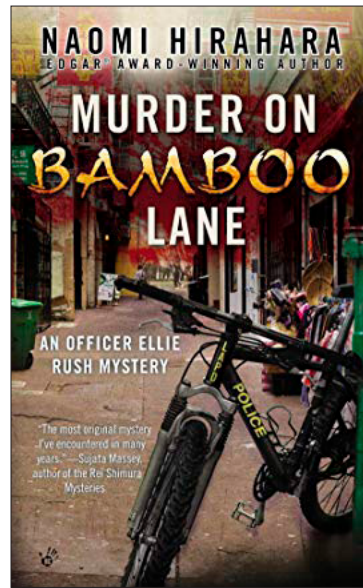

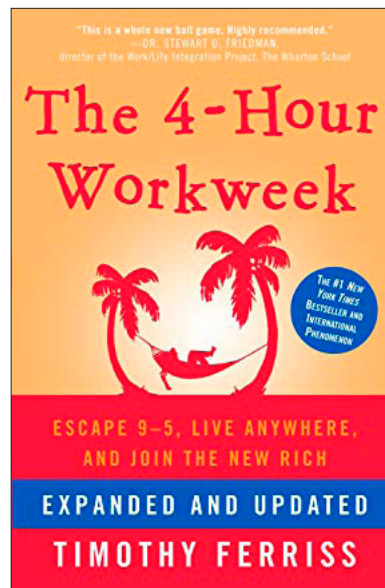

## MEDICARE DOES NOT GIVE OUT DNA KITS

Here’s one that goes to show just how creative scammers can be. The FTC is getting re-ports that callers claiming to be from Medicare are asking people for their Medicare num-bers, Social Security numbers, and other personal information...in exchange for DNA test-ing kits. The callers might say the test is a free way to get early diagnoses for diseases like cancer, or just that it’s a free test, so why not take it? But the truth is, Medicare does not market DNA testing kits to the general public.

This is yet another government imposter scam. In this example, as in others, scammers may give what seems like a believable explanation for needing your information. But be-fore you give any-one your personal information or a swab from your cheek, consider these tips to help you spot and avoid these kinds of scams:

- Government agencies will rarely, if ever, call you. If they do, it will be after they send you a letter – or to return a call you made to them. But anytime the “gov-ern-ment” caller demands information (or payment by wire transfer or gift card), that’s a scam.
- Don’t trust caller ID. Scammers use technology to hide their real number, but show one that seems legit. So if the caller ID shows a 202 area code, or says “gov-ern-ment” or “Washington, DC,” don’t take that at face value. It could be anyone call-ing from anywhere.
- Never give anyone who calls or approaches you out of the blue information like your Medicare, bank account, credit card or Social Security number. Scammers can use your information, steal your identity, get credit in your name and take your money.

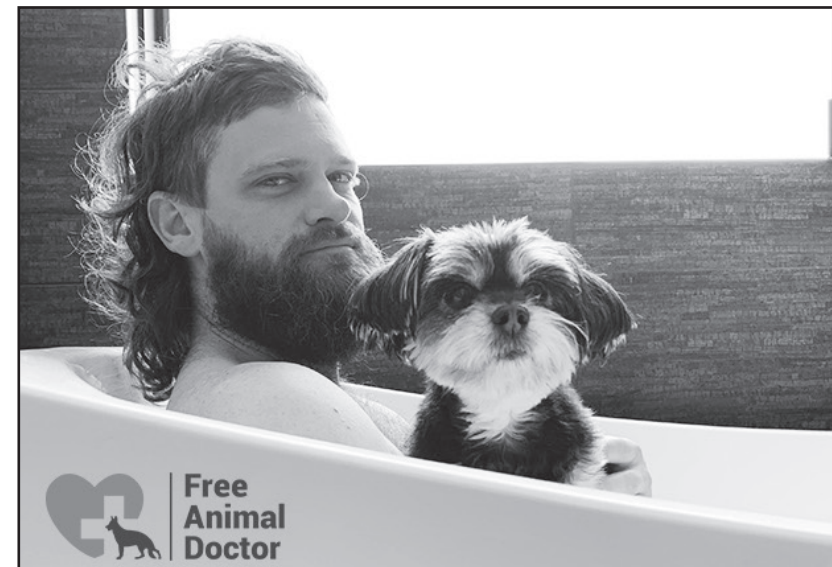

# WANT TO COLONIZE MARS? AEROGEL COULD HELP

Raising crops on Mars is far easier in science fiction than it will be in real life: The Red Planet is an inhospitable world. Among other challenges, subzero temperatures mean water can persist on the surface only as ice, and the planet's atmosphere offers little protection to plants (or people) from the Sun's radiation.

Of course, NASA has plans to eventually put humans on Mars, using lessons it will learn from its Artemis lunar explorations. And those humans will need to eat. Being able to produce food on Mars would help reduce the quantity of supplies consuming valuable space and fuel on crewed missions to the Red Planet. But figuring out how — and where — to produce that food, while also being exceedingly careful not to contaminate Mars with Earth-borne bacteria, are some of the challenges scientists and engineers face.

In a new paper in Nature Astronomy, researchers propose that a material called aerogel might help humans one day build greenhouses and other habitats at Mars' mid-latitudes, where near-surface water ice has been identified. The study was funded by Harvard University's Faculty of Arts and Sciences.

Aerogel is a Styrofoam-like solid that is 99% air, making it extremely light. It's adept at preventing the transfer of heat as well, making it an excellent insulator; in fact, it's been used for that purpose on all of NASA's Mars rovers. Moreover, aerogel is translucent, allowing visible light to pass through while blocking ultraviolet light's harmful radiation. Most aerogel is made from silica, the same material found in glass.

In an experiment conducted by lead author Robin Wordsworth of Harvard, 2-3 centimeters of silica aerogel allowed light from a lamp tuned to simulate Martian sunlight to heat the surface beneath it by up to 150 degrees Fahrenheit (65 degrees Celsius) — enough to raise temperatures on the Martian surface and melt water ice.

"The study was meant as an initial test of aerogel's potential as a Martian building material," said second author Laura Kerber, a geologist at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, California.

Kerber participated in a 2015 NASA workshop to identify the best places on Mars to send astronauts. "The ideal place for a Martian outpost would have plentiful water and moderate temperatures," she said. "Mars is warmer around the equator, but most of the water ice is located at higher latitudes. Building with silica aerogel would allow us to artificially create warm environments where there is already water ice available."

Broadening the regions on Mars where humans could grow things also opens up new areas where they could conduct valuable scientific research, Kerber added.

## 'Dark Spots' on Mars

The aerogel experiment was inspired by the heating process that creates so-called dark spots that dot Mars' carbon dioxide ice caps during the spring. This kind of ice is better known on Earth as dry ice. Like aerogel, carbon dioxide ice is translucent, allowing sunlight to heat the surface below. As the soil warms, carbon dioxide gas accumulates between the ice and the warm surface, eventually causing the ice to rupture. That, in turn, creates a puff of gas that tosses soil beneath the ice onto its surface.

The experiment explored a similar process with aerogel. The paper details how both a solid piece of aerogel as well as chunks of crushed aerogel can be used to heat the surface below. The researchers used varying levels of illumination produced by Martian seasons. The results suggest aerogel could even provide a heating effect in the bitter Martian winter. In the mid-latitudes, winter nighttime temperatures can be as cold as minus 130 degrees Fahrenheit (minus 90 degrees Celsius).

The next step, Wordsworth said, is taking the experiment out of the lab and into Martian analogues like Chile's Atacama Desert or Antarctica's McMurdo Dry Valleys. Like Mars, these environments reach subzero temperatures and are exceptionally dry.

"Our prediction is that aerogel shielding should provide more efficient heating as it scales in size," Wordsworth said. "That would be important to see under field conditions."

## Challenges to Be Overcome

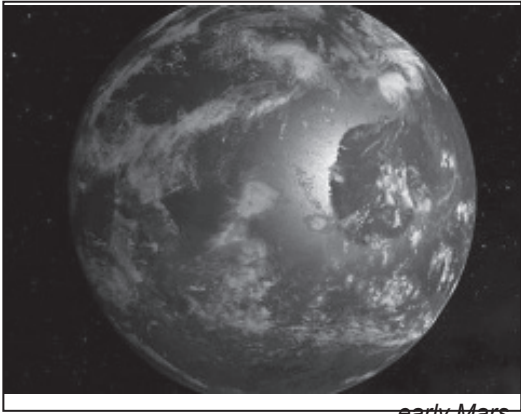
While the experiment was an encouraging proof of concept, Wordsworth acknowledged there are still significant engineering challenges to overcome. Based on a climate model produced along with the experiment, it would take lots of aerogel and at least two Mars years (or four Earth years) of warming to produce a permanent region of liquid water underneath. Although aerogel is several times lighter than air, building structures with roofs made out of the material would require shipping large quantities of it to Mars or somehow manufacturing it there.

Silica aerogel is very fragile and porous; layering it within another translucent material, or combining them with flexible materials, could prevent fracturing. Doing so could increase air pressure under a structure made with an aerogel roof or shield as well, allowing liquid water to pool more easily on the surface instead of vaporizing in the thin Martian atmosphere.

But the study's authors noted that developing small habitability zones on Mars is more plausible than attempting to "terraform" the planet, as science-fiction writers have proposed doing in the past. A NASA study last year dashed the hopes of thickening the Martian atmosphere enough to create an Earth-like greenhouse effect.

"Anything that would help make long-term habitability possible is exciting to consider," Wordsworth said.

From a 16-acre cabernet vineyard on a knoll in northern Yountville, this wine might be the first Single Vineyard I've written about. (Meaning no outside grapes were used in the production of wine from this vineyard) Ghost Block Cabernet wine is dark in its prime fruit quality but not pushed toward frenzied extraction. Instead, it comes across as intense, with smoky scents of black tea in its oak tannins and a bright, plummy fruit. I recommend you decant this one to enjoy with a great steak. That is exactly how I discovered this superior wine, at Houston's in Pasadena for a respectable . ### VINEGAR OF FOUR THIEVES

Some centuries ago during an outbreak of bubonic plague in France, four thieves managed to loot the empty plague-ridden homes without contracting the dreaded plague. Some Middle Ages accounts tell us that during some of the worst plague outbreaks, the dead outnumbered the living, and the dead could not be buried fast enough.

Anyway, these four thieves were arrested by policemen, and were brought before the French judge in Marseilles. Wondering aloud, the judge asked how it was that these four thieves managed to resist the plague, especially since they had been in and out of so many plague-infested homes.

"We drink and wash with this vinegar preparation every few hours," they answered. The judge made a shrewd bargain. The thieves would be given their freedom in exchange for their "anti-plague recipe."

This recipe is recorded in Dian Buchman's Herbal Medicine book. Buchman writes, "this recipe has been used for centuries, but legend has it that it was discovered during a devastating bubonic plague."

Here's the recipe:

### VINEGAR OF FOUR THIEVES

2 quarts (half gallon) apple cider vinegar

2 T lavender

2 T rosemary

2 T sage

2 T wormwood

2 T rue

2 T mint

Combine the herbs and steep in vinegar in the sun for two weeks. Strain. Add 2 T. of garlic buds and steep for several days. Remove. To preserve, add 4 oz. of glycerin.

Karin James, the editor of the Forest Voice, adds that the vinegar recipe can be used for wash-ing floors, walls, windows, and will offset smells in the home. It helps to deter bugs if you rinse your hiking gear in it. She also saves the herbs when she strains them out of the vinegar, and places them where ants come into the kitchen. "It works," she states. "No more ants!"

We posted this recipe on our web site and got many responses from readers. One suggested that it is the vinegar which is the primary reason that this recipe worked. We have used raw apple cider vinegar (in our drinking water, in ratio of about 2 teaspoons per quart) and have found that it keeps the mosquitoes from biting us, and helps reduce heat stress when working out in the sun. Whole books have been written about the health benefits of vinegar. We strongly suggest you always use only the raw apple cider vinegar.

While we certainly hope that we're never going to have to worry about outbreaks of bubonic plague, health authorities point out that the plague has never entirely disappeared. In fact, it is still found in the fleas of squirrels living in the nearby mountains. Conditions of poor hygiene are the breeding ground for rats, and plague. Ubiquitous homeless camps, with no running water, toilets, or hygiene conditions, provide a conducive condition for plague to spread again. While we certainly hope that efforts to assist homeless are more and more successful, it's nevertheless valuable to look to the past for one solution to this problem.

## PUSD SCHOOL LUNCH AND SCHOOL BREAKFAST PROGRAMS

The Pasadena Unified School District announces its policy to serve nutritious meals every school day under the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, and/or Afterschool Snack Program. The program started July and runs through June 30, 2020, children are eligible for free or reduced-price meals if the household income is less than or equal to the federal guidelines.

Households do not need to turn in an application when the household receives a notification letter saying that all children automatically qualify for free meals when any household member receives benefits from CalFresh, CalWORKS, or FDIPIR. Children who meet the definition of foster, homeless, migrant, or runaway, and children enrolled in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals. Contact school officials if any child in the household is not on the notification letter. The household must let school officials know if they do not want to receive free or reduced-price meals.

Applications will be sent to the household with a letter about the free and reduced-price meal program. Households that want to apply for meal benefits must fill out one application for all children in the household and give it to the nutrition office at 740 W Woodbury Rd, Pasadena, CA 91103. For a simple and secure method to apply, use our online application at [www.MySchoolApps.com](http://www.MySchoolApps.com). Contact Grace Aguilar at 626-396-5852 X 89371 for help filling out the application. The Food & Nutrition Services office will let you know if your application is approved or denied for free or reduced-price meals.

Households may turn in an application at any time during the school year. If you are not eligible now, but your household income goes down, household size goes up, or a household member starts receiving CalFresh, CalWORKS, or FDIPIR, you may turn in an application at that time. Information given on the application will be used to determine eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year



by school officials. The last four digits of the Social Security number from any adult household or checking that you do not have a Social Security number is required if you include income on the application.

Households that receive Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) benefits, may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals by filling out an application.

Foster children are eligible for free meals and may be included as a household member if the foster family chooses to also apply for the non-foster children on the same application. Including foster children as a household member may help the non-foster children qualify for free or reduced-price meals. If the non-foster children are not eligible, this does not keep foster children from receiving free meals.

Your child's eligibility status from last school year will continue into the new school year for up to 30 school days or until the school processes your new application, or your child is otherwise certified for free or reduced-price meals. After the 30 school days, your child will have to pay full price for meals, unless the household receives a notification letter for free or reduced-price meals. School officials do not have to send reminder or expired eligibility notices.

If you do not agree with the decision or results of verification, you may discuss it with school officials. You also have the right to a fair hearing, which may be requested by calling or writing the hearing official: Elizabeth Powell, 740 W Woodbury RD, Pasadena, CA 91103, 626-396-5852.

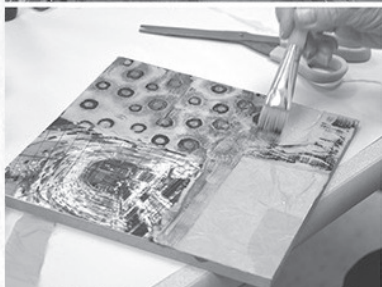

#### Students can earn money, get experience with work-study

One way students can help pay the cost of education after high school is through a work-study program, according to KHEAA. Plus, work-study can provide valuable experience that looks good on a résumé.

Federal Work-Study allows students to earn money to help pay the costs of post-high school education. Rules may vary some by school, but a student must generally:

- Be enrolled in an eligible program.
- Be working toward a certificate or degree.
- Have financial need.
- Be a U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen.

Students must be paid at least the federal minimum wage. Jobs may be on or off campus. Students who submitted the FAFSA will be considered for Federal Work-Study unless they asked not to be.

Many colleges have their own work-study programs. Students interested in a school's program should check with the college's financial aid office.

KHEAA is a public, non-profit agency established in 1966 to improve students' access to college. It provides information about financial aid and financial literacy at no cost to students and parents. KHEAA also helps colleges manage their student loan default rates and verify information submitted on the FAFSA. 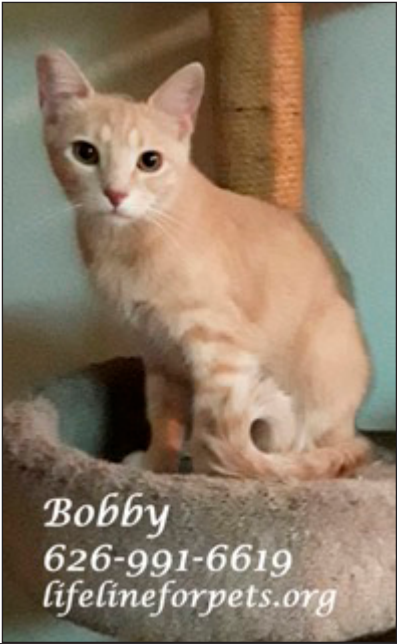

## FINDING AN ALTERNATIVE TO AARP

*Dear Savvy Senior:  
Can you recommend any conservative membership organizations for older adults that offer discounts too? AARP is way too liberal for my liking. Discount Seeking Conservative*

Dear Conservative:

There are actually quite a few senior advocacy organizations out there promoting themselves as conservative alternatives to AARP, and many of them offer membership benefit too. Here's what you should know.

### Anti-AARP

While AARP, with a membership of around 38 million, is by far the biggest and most powerful advocacy group for people age 50 and older, there are millions of older Americans that don't like or agree with their stance on various issues. Many believe AARP leans too far to the left despite its stated nonpartisan nature.

For seniors that disagree with AARP, there are other conservative leaning groups that you can join that may better represent your views. And, many of them offer their members discounts on things like travel, insurance, healthcare and more. Here are several to check into.

**60 Plus:** American Association of Senior Citizens (60plus.org): Established in 1992, this nonprofit group was founded to lobby for issues it holds dear, namely free enterprise, fewer taxes and less Government. Their main priority is to end the federal estate tax and preserve social security. Membership fees run \$12, \$24 or \$48 per year, or \$299 for a lifetime membership. They also offer a bevy of discounts on travel and entertainment, cable, Internet and satellite services, dental, vision and hearing packages, roadside assistance and more.

**American Seniors Association** (AmericanSeniors.org): Founded in 2005 for people age 50 and older, this conservative organization is built on five foundations, which includes rebuilding national values, Social Security reform, Medicare reform, tax code reform and control of government overspending. Fees to join run \$15 for one year, \$25 for two or \$35 for three years, and members receive access to a variety of benefit on travel, home and auto insurance, security services, health and wellness (medical, dental, vision and hearing) and more.

**Association of Mature American Citizens** (AMAC.us): With more than one million members, this organization was started in 2007 for people 50 and older. Their mission is to help seniors fight high taxes, reduce excessive government involvement in our day-to-day lives, and preserve American values. They also offer a host of benefits on home, health and auto insurance, travel, vision and dental care, prescription drugs, retail savings, roadside assistance and more. Membership fees run \$16 per year, or less if you join for multiple years.

**The Seniors Coalition** (Senior.org): Founded in 1990, this conservative public advocacy group claims to have around four million supporters. Their key issues are to protect Social Security benefits, stop Social Security payments to illegal aliens from Mexico, eliminate the death tax, and reform the Social Security COLA system. TSC offers very few membership benefits. Annual fees run \$10 for one person per, or \$13 per couple and you can join at any age.

Some other senior membership organizations to consider that offer discounts include the non-for-profit American Senior Benefits Association (ASBAonline.org), and the conservative leaning National Association of Conservative Seniors (NAOCS.us), and Christian Seniors Association (CSA-benefits.site-ym.com).

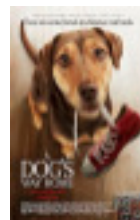

### TRUMP'S RACIST TWEETS: A FORETASTE OF TOXIC 2020

White racism was at the root of Donald Trump's 2016 candidacy, and so it will be again in 2020. Either we decisively reject it at the ballot box, and thus begin to salvage our pluralistic values, or we can acquiesce in the slow death of the American dream.

The only thing that's shocking about his racist tweets - demanding that four congresswomen of color, four U.S. citizens, "go back" to the countries they came from - is that anyone in America still has the capacity to be shocked. This racist has been operating in plain sight ever since he relentlessly lied, year after year, that the first black president wasn't really an American. Ever since the early 1970s, when he was nailed by Richard Nixon's Justice Department for refusing to rent apartments to black people. Heck, he's still refusing to apologize for demanding that five black kids (the so-called "Central Park Five") be executed for raping a white jogger, even though they were exonerated nearly two decades ago.

Trump has drawn a firm line in the sand: Are we racists or are we not? Fundamentally, the 2020 campaign may be our last chance to decide what kind of people we want to be. We already know what Trump's base wants. We already know what the elected Republicans want, as their predictably contemptible silence made clear.

But that leaves the rest of us. Trump, by impulse or design, is daring us to prove that we are better than our most despicable instincts.

His attitude isn't new, of course. Granted, the rant directed at the four congresswomen ("you can't leave fast enough") was perhaps his most virulent; Douglas A. Blackmon, a Pulitzer Prize-winning expert on race says that Trump "is now invoking the white supremacist mentality of the early 1900s, when anyone who looked 'not white' could be labeled as unwelcome in America." But consider this critique of Trump, written on a previous occasion:

"His ascent was fueled at its core by racism that was at worst endorsed, or at minimum tolerated by a plurality of Republican primary voters. They greased his path to power. They share the responsibility for his trashing of our highest values, for the toxic poison he has injected into the body politic."

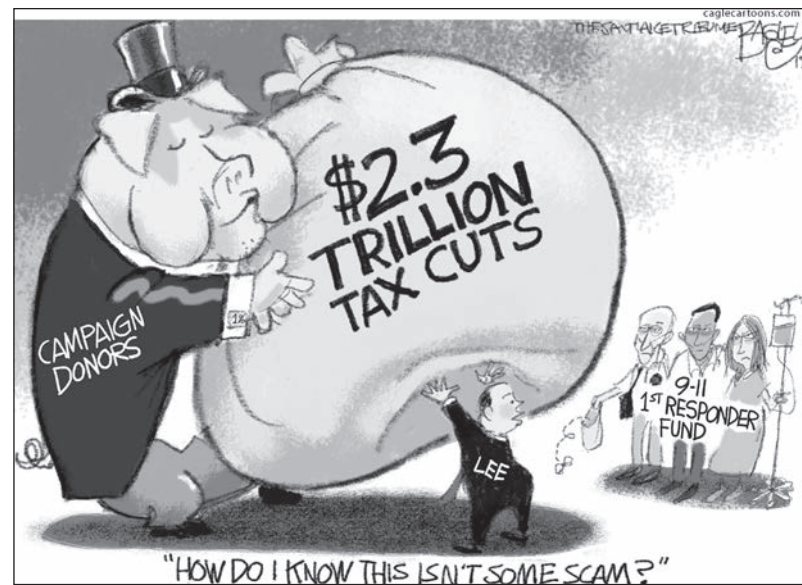
I wrote that - 18 months ago - when Trump trashed immigrants of color by saying, "Why are we having all these people from shithole countries come here?" If you're not too numb, you may remember that. Trump hasn't changed a whit since, except for the worse. Character is destiny, his was forged long ago, and not even the decisive loss of the House in the 2018 midterms has shaken his resolve that bigotry should be big on the ballot in 2020. Are we sufficiently stoked to prove him wrong? Will Democrats be sufficiently enlightened to set aside their usual ideological squabbles and unite to reject racism?

The fundamental challenge we face next year is to live up to this American ideal:

"We lead the world because, unique among nations, we draw our people - our strength - from every country and every corner of the world. And by doing so we continuously renew and enrich our nation ... Thanks to each wave of new arrivals to this land of opportunity, we're a nation forever young, forever bursting with energy and new ideas, and always on the cutting edge, always leading the world to the next frontier... It is bold men and women, yearning for freedom and opportunity, who leave their homelands and come to a new country to start their lives over. They believe in the American dream. And over and over they make it come true for themselves, for their children, and for others."

President Ronald Reagan doesn't resonate anymore within the Trumpist GOP, and any contemporary Republican who'd dare talk that way would probably be trounced in a primary. But for the rest of us, may his words be a lantern in the darkness on the pitted road to 2020.

# LEFT TURN/RIGHT TURN

## REPUBLICANS ARE COMPLICIT IN TRUMP'S RACISM

The next time a Republican tries to tell you that he or she is an heir to the legacy of Abraham Lincoln, remind them that in 2019, when the GOP had a chance to stand up to the worst kind of bigotry and un-American behavior, the self-styled "Party of Lincoln" was conspicuously and shamefully silent.

In the wake of President Donald Trump's despicable and racist tweets telling four minority women members of Congress - all American citizens, all duly elected representatives of hundreds of thousands of American citizens of all races, colors, and creeds - to "go back" to where they came from, Capitol Hill Republicans surrendered whatever tattered remnants of their spines remained and were complicit in the face of the worst kind of anti-American bigotry.

All four of the women targeted by Trump - Reps. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, Rashida Tlaib, Ilhan Omar and Ayanna Pressley - pushed back during a Capitol Hill news conference on Monday night, according to the Washington Post.

"I encourage the American people and all of us - in this room and beyond - to not take the bait," Pressley said. "This is a disruptive distraction from the issues of care, concern and consequence to the American people that we were sent here with a decisive mandate from our constituents to work on."

But some Republicans not only took the bait - they swallowed it: hook, line, and sinker.

House Minority Leader Kevin McCarthy told the Washington Post that Trump "is not a racist," and instead was speaking out of "frustration." Asked if he believed that Omar, who is a naturalized American citizen, should return to Somalia, where she was born, McCarthy said, "No, they're Americans. Nobody believes somebody should leave the country. They have a right to give their opinion."

Actually, Mr. Minority Leader, that is precisely what the president believes: "IF YOU ARE NOT HAPPY HERE, YOU CAN LEAVE! It is your choice, and your choice alone. This is about love for America. Certain people HATE our Country," Trump tweeted again Monday in a hateful tirade.

Like McCarthy, Rep. Mark Meadows, chair of the hyper-conservative Freedom Caucus (irony intentional?), nearly tore a rotator cuff trying to explain away Trump's remarks.

Trump's comments "were not based on any religious preference, on any skin color," but rather on frustration over "having a crisis at the border and having a whole lot of people weigh in and yet not really putting action to those words," he said.

Meadows is half right at least. Trump was clearly trying to change the subject away from the massive ICE raids that never materialized over the weekend, and away from disturbing footage of the inhumane conditions in detention camps at the southern border. But he's dead wrong otherwise.

Taking to Twitter, Pennsylvania Rep. Scott Perry wrote that he was disappointed to find "that many in the media are just awakening to the anti-American and anti-Semitic comments uttered consistently by some socialist leaders. I invite everyone to join me as we continue strengthening our Country and communities."

Perry is a veteran, sworn to uphold the Constitution and the values it represents. Those values include every American's constitutionally protected right to criticize the government, as well as Congress' constitutionally authorized duty and responsibility to act as a check on the executive branch.

Maybe he forgot that. Maybe someone should remind him.

Other Republicans, such as Pennsylvania Sen. Pat Toomey, tried to split the difference, criticizing Trump even as they took a swipe at the four Democratic lawmakers. Toomey said in a statement that Trump was "wrong to suggest that four left-wing congresswomen should go back to where they came from."

But Toomey also said that he "couldn't disagree more with these congresswomen's views on immigration, socialism, national security, and virtually every policy issue. But they are entitled to their opinions, however misguided they may be. We should defeat their ideas on the merits, not on the basis of their ancestry."

How hard is it to say, without qualification, that something is wrong? How hard is it to say that the president's comments are racist, misogynist, and not consonant with the values we hold dear as a country? It shouldn't be difficult at all.

And yet, hardly any Republican member of Congress could accomplish that simple task.

One of America's greatest Republican presidents, Theodore Roosevelt, famously argued that it's "not only unpatriotic and servile, but is morally treasonable to the American public" to say that the president cannot be criticized.

In the case of not only The Squad, but again and again throughout Trump's bankrupt presidency, Republicans have failed this basic test. It's now on the voters to remind Trump - and his toadies in Congress - of this failure at the ballot box in 2020.

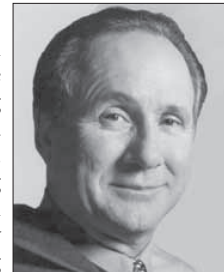

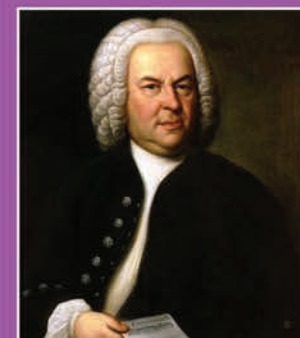
