SIERRA MADRE TO VOTE ON MEASURE S NOVEMBER 5TH

Ballots have arrived for the special Sierra Madre City election on November 5, 2019. This Citizens Initiative was circulated by dedicated volunteers to allow a sales tax raise of .75% to enhance the services of Sierra Madre.

Those who vote at the polls, check your sample ballot for the polling place near you and be sure to mark your calendar for November 5th to vote. Those who vote by mail, get your ballot in now so you won't forget to vote.

Your YES votes will enable the City of Sierra Madre to keep the sales tax money in our village. As such, the City will be able to increase their services for parks, streets, public safety, library, sidewalks and other services.

Why do we need your YES vote?
The State of California has imposed a Sales Tax limit of 10.25% by cities, counties and other districts. Sierra Madre's sales tax is currently 9.50%, thus the citizens proposal is to close the gap between the two, or 0.75%.

If we don't close that gap, it is extremely likely that another district such as LA County, or an agency that you might not agree with, will impose a Sales Tax at that limit that will not have a direct benefit on the city of Sierra Madre.

Should the citizens pass Measure S, we will close the gap for our benefit.

Closing that gap means our City will receive all of those funds and they will go directly into our General Fund to pay for the services we enjoy from our City.

Why a special election and why now?
If we had waited, we would have run the risk of there being competing Sales Tax measures on the general election ballot in 2020. Those Tax measures would be voted on County wide, and statistics has shown that past tax measures have overwhelmingly passed when they are on the General Ballot.

By closing the gap on November 5th, that 0.75% cannot be taken by any entity that passes a tax raise in 2020. It's really a win-win for us. It means that there will be an additional \$200,000 to \$225,000 added to our City's treasury per year.

The Citizens Committee urges you to vote YES on Measure S to keep sales tax in Sierra Madre.

COUNCILWOMAN AND FORMER MAYOR DENISE DELMAR SAYS GOODBYE

The City of Sierra Madre is announcing the resignation of Council Member Denise Delmar.

At the October 8th Council meeting, Delmar announced her resignation for personal reasons related to the care of her family.

"It has been a privilege to serve the residents of Sierra Madre, work with the amazing City staff, and serve with my esteemed colleagues on the Council. Sierra Madre will always have a special place in my heart," Council Member Delmar said.

A reception will be held for Council Member Delmar on October 22, 2019 at 6:30PM during the City Council meeting.

"Denise has been a special part of the Sierra Madre community since she arrived 13 years ago, first as the Chair of the General Plan Committee and then as a Councilmember and Mayor," Mayor John Harabedian said. "We are sad to see her go, and will miss her perspective, but wish her and her family the best."

Delmar was first elected to the council in 2014 and re-elected in 2018. She served as Mayor from April 2018 until April, 2019. Currently she represents the city on the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG). Most Sierra Madreans were introduced to her prior to running for council, when she served as the Chair for the Sierra Madre General Plan Update Steering Committee.



FATE OF SIERRA MADRE MIDDLE SCHOOL STILL UNDECIDED

PUSD Board of Education to Host Community Forum on Secondary School Consolidation Options

On Thursday, the chambers of the Pasadena School Board Room was filled with parents and students expressing their concerns over the potential closing of numerous Middle and High Schools in the district due to budget constraints.

The meeting was presided over by Board President Larry Torres, who represents Sierra Madre, and marked the return of PUSD Superintendent aBrian McDonald from a medical leave of absence after battling cancer.

The Board of Education is considering options to consolidate middle and high schools next year as the District adjusts to demographic changes and the resulting economic impact on public school funding.

Although PUSD, like most other public school districts across the country is facing financial challenges, declining enrollment and competition with Charter Schools. The solutions recommended have caused a great deal of anxiety in communities around the district. PUSD covers the city and unincorporated areas of Pasadena, including Altadena and the city of Sierra Madre. The board recently choose to close three elementary schools.

Among those in attendance were supporters of all ages of Sierra Madre Middle School. Their presence supported the approximately 282 on a 'Save Our School' petition that had been submitted.

One brave student, nervously, but courageously told the Board how important the school was to her personally and to the community. Unfortunately, the P.A. system was not clear enough to hear her name. Supporter Pam Wood read a letter from Councilwoman and Former Mayor Rachelle Arizmendi that also articulated the community's concern and its support for keeping SMMS.

SMMS is the top performing Middle School in PUSD and excels in its academic curriculum and is a Dual Language Immersion School.

Similar responses were heard from parents and students from Wilson Middle School and Blair.

As a result of the community outcry, PUSD Board of Education will hold a community forum to hear from stakeholders about middle and high school consolidations on Thursday, October 17, 2019.

Supporters of SMMS are encouraged to attend.

The community forum will be from 5:00 - 7:00 p.m. in the auditorium at Pasadena High School, located at 2925 E. Sierra Madre Blvd., Pasadena and will be moderated by the League of Women Voters - Pasadena Area. Spanish and American Sign Language translation services will be provided. The Sierra Madre Kiwanis Club will be hosting the Sierra Madre City Clerk's Office and a representative for the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters to explain how the new system will work. The county is modernizing the voting experience with the upcoming Statewide Presidential Primary election in March 2020.

Much of the current process — ballots, polling locations, vote tallying, and more — will change under a new L.A. County program called Voting Solutions for All People (VSAP). With changing from the traditional polling locations, Vote Centers will allow voters to cast their ballot at any Vote Center across the County, up to 10 days prior to election day.

The current voting system used in L.A. County dates back to 1968, and for the past ten years, the County Registrar and its contractors have been evaluating the way people vote to create the design for 31,000 new devices to cast ballots, known as the new Ballot Marking Device.

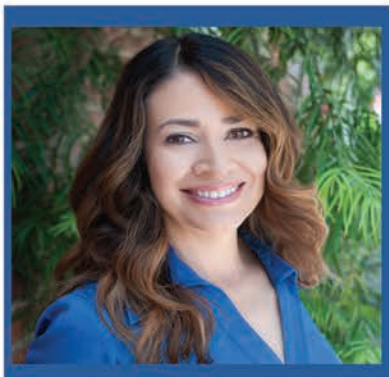

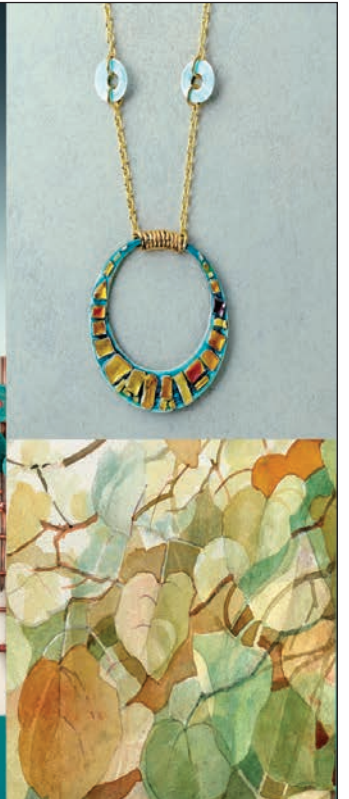
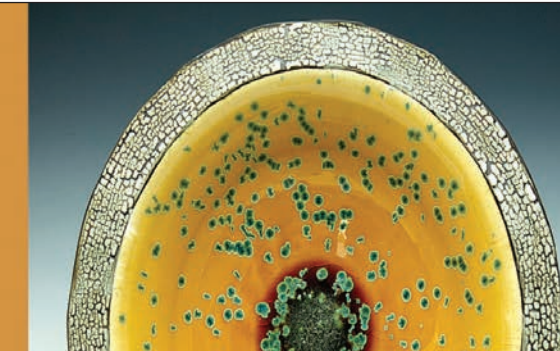

Hit-and-run Pedestrian Identified



Pasadena police have identified a homeless man, killed by a drunk motorist, as he was crossing Colorado Boulevard at around 3:15 a.m. Sunday — the driver was later arrested for hit-and-run and vehicular manslaughter among other violations.

Police said Anthony Miller, 31, a known homeless man was stuck and killed as he crossed Colorado Blvd. between Madison Ave. and El Molino Ave. Miller was pronounced dead at the scene.

Police later arrested Higinio Arceo of Baldwin Park after finding his gray pickup truck parked in an underground structure blocks away. According to police, the Chevrolet Silverado had damage to the front of the vehicle that was consistent with the collision.

Arceo was taken into custody when he later returned to the truck. After being interviewed by police, he was charged with vehicular manslaughter, drunk driving and driving without a valid license.

Colorado Bridge 'Final Concept' Meeting

Pasadena city officials are set to hold the second community outreach meeting October 29, this time to get input on the final concept for suicide mitigation enhancements to the Colorado Street Bridge — most likely full length vertical barriers.

This will be a followup to a September 26 meeting that included public input on the environmental / historical elements, vertical barrier mitigation strategies and aesthetics of the iconic bridge spanning the Arroyo built in 1912.

Although enhanced vertical barriers were the direction the city wanted to go according to the contractor Donald MacDonald Architects, many residents at the meeting wanted to still see other options such as planters or nets or electronic devices used instead. Ironically, after the meeting city staff said they had reviewed every possible option including turning the bridge into a park, completely closing it to vehicle traffic.

Some of the ideas, including using a transparency such



a glass were unpopular. The architects said the problem was that transparency do not stay transparent over time, through graffiti or yellowing. The only 100 percent solution would be a very unpopular complete cage around the bridge they said.

Sue Mossman, Executive Director of Pasadena Heritage took issue with the idea removing the alcoves saying that they should preserve the experience of walking on the bridge. City staff said there was no plan to remove them although one of the question asked was “how important is it to keep the alcoves accessible for pedestrians if it requires a four foot or more taller barrier?”

The alcoves have been a main complaint after they were fenced off in 2017.

The next steps for final project

include a discussion and review with the Public Safety Commission Nov. 18, than another discussion and review with the Historic Preservation Commission Nov. 19, than the project is set to go before the Design Commission, as an informational item, Nov. 26. Although city officials said there was no date for the final concept presentation before the City Council they expect that to happen by the end of the year. All of the meeting will have public comment.

City staff said the Oct. 29 meeting will also take place from 6:30 to 8 p.m. in Council Chambers 100 N. Garfield Ave. For more information visit: cityofpasadena.net/public-works.

Different types of influenza viruses can spread through the community during flu season. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone ages six months and older get vaccinated annually to protect against the most common types of influenza viruses.

There is a \$5.00 Cover charge for all who enter although the first 20 Queen Contestants to arrive get in free.

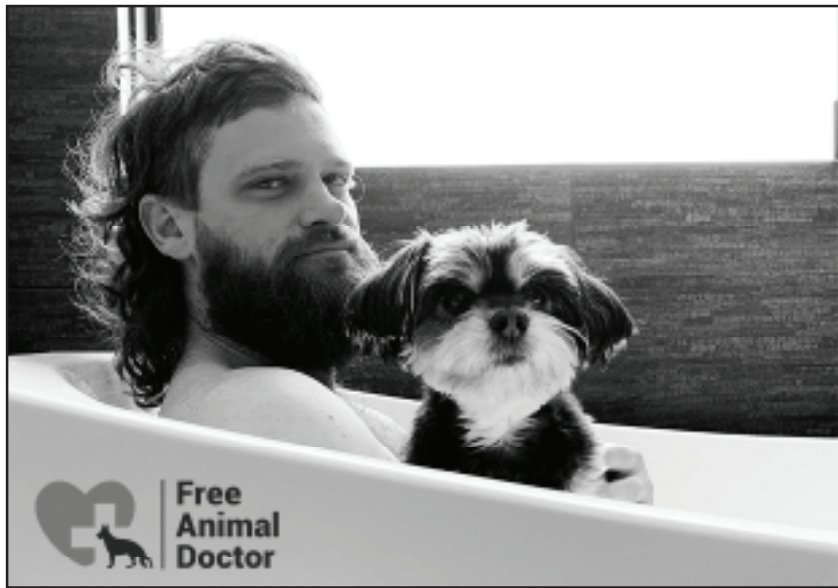
The 42st Occasional Pasadena Doo Dah Parade will be held on Sunday, November 24, stepping off at 11:00am on the streets of East Pasadena.

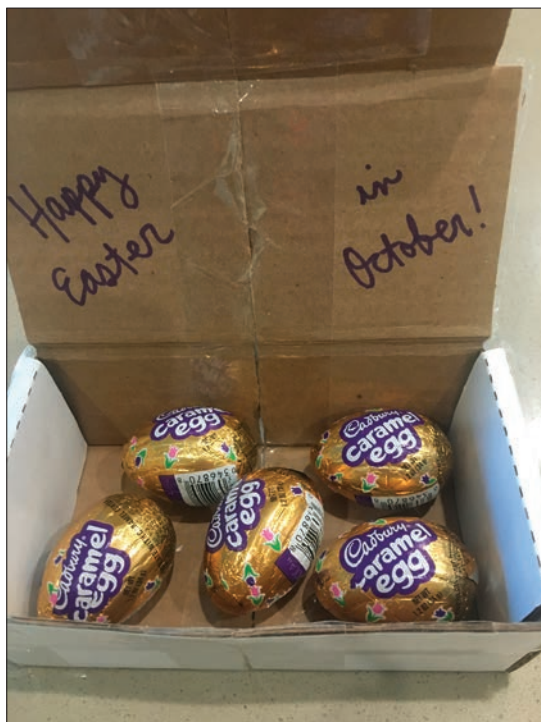

ZELO PULLS OFF PIZZA WITH REAL ZEAL

If you have been around the Pasadena area long enough, you might remember The Pasadena Pizza Cook-off, it was an event that I was involved with for many years. In the beginning, it was a contest to see who had the best pizza in the area. After a few years we softened the rules and tried to give everyone an award. Many restaurants wouldn't compete if they didn't win. (Unfortunately, many restaurants decided to not participate because not everyone was eligible to win an award; we softened the rules and decided everyone gets some type of award.) Imagine that, I got so caught up in Pizza that I dubbed by car the Pizzar and even subscribed to Pizza Today Magazine.

Yes, I love Pizza, and some of my local favorites are Tarnatinos, Domenicos and Avanti Café (Shoot me a letter if I failed to mention yours). However, there is this restaurant on Foothill Blouvard in the City of Arcadia that might just be a contender as well. The restaurant Zelo, meaning 'Zeal' is a definite go to. Owner, Mike Freeman hails from Northern California and has brought his recipe for the pizza pie down here to share with us Angelinos.



For those new to my style, I try to give you four or five dishes at each stop that I enjoyed and hopefully you'll try as well. (My favorite type of restaurant discovery is when you drive by a local establishment hundreds of times telling yourself "I need to try that place one of these days.") I love those restaurant discoveries that you and I drive by hundreds of times and you tell yourself I have to check that place out one of these days. Well, Zelo is that place!

What do you get when you cross one part cornmeal and four parts flour? I have the answer, it is the crust, the heart and soul of the Zelo Pizza. All of the pizza is deep dish meaning there is no way to not enjoy a bite of their heavenly crust. On any given day Mike will put together 12 different pizza specials. These specials include, a half a pizza (three slices for \$13) or a whole pizza (six slices for \$25). Try and compare that to a medium size that your kids order at...gulp...Dominos. That's right, \$21 for a medium Pizza, but there is plenty of toppings and fillings to get you full real quick. (Is this the right price? Above says different)

On to my recommendations! First, on the menu, I love the four-cheese mozzarella, fontina, provolone and parmesan. One of my favorite rotating specials is had the Sicilian Pizza. This pizza is loaded with pepperoni, tomatoes, and three different cheeses; the Pizzas are truly unique here. Now, not to be overshadowed, are the salads. Two in particular are the beet salad (\$7.50 and number one seller) and their asparagus salad (\$7.50) with leaf lettuce topped with stalks of asparagus, balsamic vinaigrette, and asparagus creamy dressing. Personally, I would return just for the salads because of how tasty they really are. The menu at Zelo is just a guide, try out a special or even go for a pasta option! A few of my favorite pastas at Zelo are calzone, and plenty of vegetarian dishes highlighted by a Lasagna (\$11). Of course, to pair off the delicious meal a nice beer or wine is available or bring your own bottle with a small corkage fee (\$8).

What you need to know: Zelo is very laid back with large appeal, patio seating, and is very busy on weekend nights. All pizzas are deep dish, parking can be limited (street parking only), and most interesting, you can order the pizza half baked to finish at home. They are open Tuesday through Sunday, and on the weekends (Friday and Saturdays) open till 10 PM.

A LESSON FOR ALL PARENTS: WHO WILL BE EMANI'S LEGAL GUARDIAN?

In the aftermath of rapper Nipsey Hussle's murder this March, his family and ex-girlfriend have been locked in a bitter battle for custody of one of his young children. And as this ugly drama plays out in the courtroom and tabloids, it highlights the single-most costly estate-planning mistake a parent can make.

Hussle, 34, was gunned down outside his South Los Angeles clothing store in March. The young rapper's death was tragic on many levels. But perhaps most tragic is what's happening to Hussle's kids. Because Hussle never named legal guardians, the decision of who will raise his two children—daughter Emani, 10, and son Kross, 2—is now up to the courts. And this mistake is already having unfortunate consequences.

In addition to not naming guardians for his kids, Hussle also failed to create a will, which makes their guardianship even more contentious. Hussle's estate is estimated to be worth \$2 million, and under California law, in the absence of a will, that money is to be split equally between his two kids.

Given that both children are minors, however, they're ineligible to access their inheritance until they reach the age of majority. This means that whomever ultimately wins guardianship of the children will likely gain control over their money as well.

Caught in the middle
Guardianship of Hussle's son Kross, while still undecided, is currently not a source of conflict. Who will be awarded guardianship of Hussle's daughter Emani, however, is very much in contention.

Since the day of the shooting, Hussle's sister, Samantha Smith, has been caring for Emani. Following Hussle's shooting, Smith petitioned the court to obtain Emani's guardianship. But Emani's mother, Tanisha Foster, an old girlfriend of Hussle's, is also seeking guardianship.

The competing parties have filed court documents alleging criminal conduct and making other terrible accusations against each other. This war is taking its toll on the whole family with poor Emani caught in the middle.

Don't leave your child's life in a judge's hands
As Hussle's case so dramatically demonstrates, if you're the parent of minor children, it's imperative that you select and legally document long-term guardians for your kids. In fact, as a parent, naming guardians for your children should be your number-one planning priority.

The fact that Hussle didn't create a will is obviously another terrible mistake. But when it comes to your children's well-being, all the money in the world is meaningless in comparison. For this reason, I'm going to focus solely on the consequences resulting from Hussle's failure

to name legal guardians, and how easily this whole ugly mess could have been avoided.

As we're seeing with Hussle, leaving it up to the court to name guardians for your kids can lead to conflict, as otherwise well-meaning family members fight one another over custody. This process is not only costly, but it can be terribly traumatizing for everyone involved, especially your kids.

Hussle's case also shows how agonizingly slow this process often is. There have already been numerous court hearings related to Emani's custody since her father's death in March, and the saga remains ongoing. Indeed, these custody battles often drag on for years, making the lawyers wealthy, while your kids are stuck in the middle.

But the most tragic consequence of Hussle's failure to name legal guardians is that a judge will be the one who decides who's best suited to care for his kids.

Though we can't be sure exactly who Hussle would have wanted to raise Emani, it's almost certain he wouldn't have wanted a total stranger to make that decision for him. Yet, because he didn't take the time to document legal guardians, that's exactly what's going to happen.

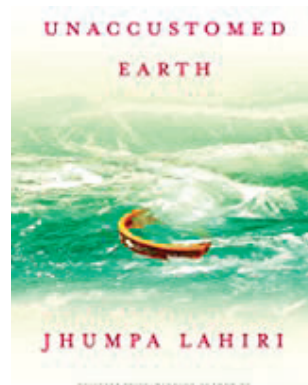

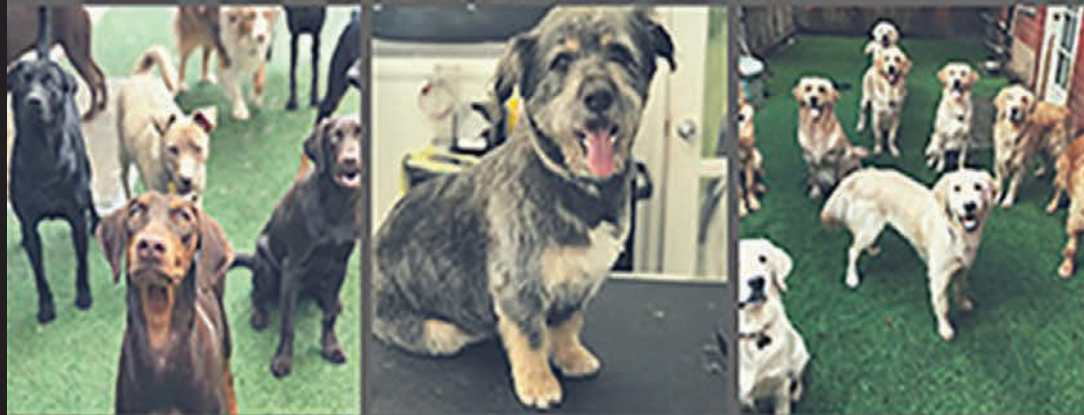

PLANTS OF THE WEEK:
THE GARLIC AND ONION FAMILY

If you already enjoy garlic, onions, and other members of this family, you should also know that garlic is good for your health too.

The consumption of garlic and onions is believed to be a contributory factor in helping hypertension. In a variety of tests, garlics and onions (and members of that family) have been shown to reduce cholesterol, reduce high blood pressure, and reduce the incidence of flu.

For example, Dr. Alan Tsai, PhD with the Michigan School of Health, has tested rats and humans for the effects of garlic on cholesterol levels. He fed test groups high cholesterol diets, with one group receiving garlic. Those who included garlic had cholesterol levels that rose about four percent, as opposed to those without garlic whose cholesterol levels rose 23%. Dr. Tsai noted that the incidence of cardiovascular and other diseases is lower in countries whose populations consume large amounts of garlic, though he was reluctant to attribute this effect solely to garlic.

Various studies reported in the Indian Journal of Nutrition and Dietetics concluded that both onions and garlic in the diet lowered blood cholesterol levels. Studies in Germany and in the U.S. have produced similar results. Cholesterol builds up in fatty plaques on the artery walls, and so it is believed to be a major factor in the onset of heart disease. Anything that reduces high cholesterol levels helps to keep the heart healthy.

Dr. Truswell, professor at the Queen Elizabeth College of London University conducted research by feeding human subjects high fat meals with and without onions. He found that blood platelets stuck together faster after the high fat, no onion meal, whereas the effect was neutralized when onions were included. Platelets are a compound in the blood which are an important aid in coagulation, but when they "malfunction," they form clots which can lead to thromboses in the arteries to the heart and brain, which can result in strokes and heart attacks. Dr. Truswell believes that by simply including onions in the diet, the chances of having a stroke or heart attack are reduced.

Though there are countless studies pertaining to the effects of garlic and onions on the human body, it may still be sometime before doctors make conclusive statements such as eating garlic will prevent high blood pressure. Again, this is due to the complexity of "high blood pressure," its various causes, and the fact that no two people are alike.

Still, we eat garlic just about every day, and we also put it in our pets' food. Russian folk healers and herbalists the world over have been suggesting that garlic be used to reduce high blood pressure, and a host of ailments, for centuries.

We do know that garlic contains small amounts of selenium and germanium. Selenium is believed to prevent abnormal blood clotting, to normalize blood pressure, and to prevent infections. Germanium is being investigated for its reputed ability to retard or prevent the growth of some cancers. Garlic also contains a number of biochemical compounds, such as allicin (considered to have anti-fungal and antibiotic properties), alliinase, allyls, allithiamine (this makes vitamin B1 more effective), and alliin (this makes proteins easier to digest). Allicin, left alone, turns into a substance that some researchers have called "ajoene," believed to be responsible for garlic's ability to inhibit blood clotting effectively as aspirin.

Enough books and research papers have been written about garlic, onions, shallots, leeks, and that entire Allium genus to fill a small library.

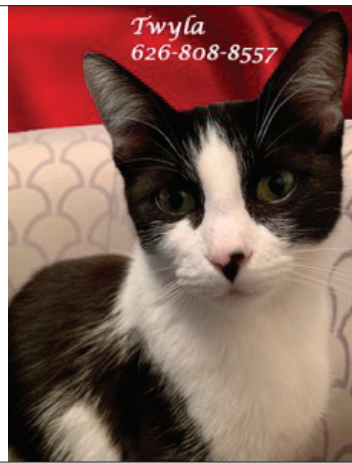

HOW SENIORS CAN GET HELP WITH CREDIT CARD AND MORTGAGE DEBT



Dear Savvy Senior:

*My husband and I, who are both 66 years old, have fallen behind on our mortgage payments and have accumulated quite a bit of credit card debt over the past few years. Where can we get help?
Drowning in Debt*

Dear Drowning:

Unfortunately, credit card and mortgage debt have become a growing problem for many older Americans who often face medical-related expenses on top of their mortgage and other growing costs. Here are some tips and services that can help.

Credit Card Counseling

To help you get a handle on your credit card debt, a good place to turn is an accredited credit counseling agency. These are nonprofit agencies that offer free financial information and advice on how to handle financial problems.

Depending on the significance of your credit card debt, they can help you sort out your finances and set you up in a debt management plan (DMP), which allows a counselor to negotiate with your creditors to lower your interest rates and eliminate any late fees and other penalties.

The agency will then act as a consolidator, grouping your debts together into one payment that you would make, and distributes those funds to your creditors. Typically, the first counseling session is free, but a DMP comes with monthly fees of roughly \$20 to \$75 a month, depending on the state.

To locate a credible agency in your area, use the National Foundation for Credit Counseling website at NFCC.org (800-388-2227), or the or the Financial Counseling Association of America FCAA.org (800-450-1794).

But make sure that you don't use a debt settlement company that claims to settle all your debt or cut it in half for a fee without counseling. Most of these companies use deceptive practices and will only leave you more in debt then you already are.

Mortgage Counseling

If you have fallen behind on your mortgage payments, or if you have already received a letter or phone call about missed payments, you should contact your lender immediately to explain your situation and see if you can work out a payment plan. Be prepared to provide your financial information, such as your monthly income and expenses.

You can also get help from a foreclosure prevention counselor. These are HUD-approved, trained counselors that will work with you, examine your financial situation, and offer guidance on how best to avoid default or foreclosure. They can also represent you in negotiations with your lender if you need them to.

To find a government-approved housing counseling agency in your area, use the National Foundation for Credit Counseling or Financial Counseling Association of America websites or phone numbers previously listed. Or, for a larger selection of housing counseling options see the Department of Housing and Urban Development website at HUD.gov – click on "Resources" at the top of the page, then on "Foreclosure Avoidance Counseling," or call 800-569-4287.

Financial Assistance

You also need to make sure you're not missing out on any financial assistance programs. The National Council on Aging's website (BenefitsCheckUp.org) contains a database of more than 2,500 federal, state and local programs that can help seniors with prescription drug costs, health care, food, utilities, and other basic needs. The site will help you locate programs that you may be eligible for and will show you how to apply.

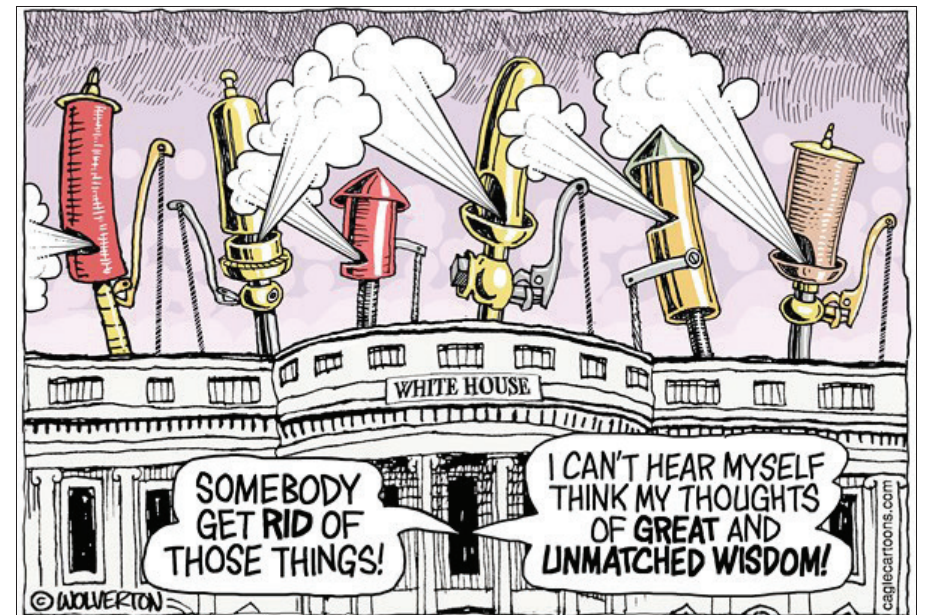

While savoring the pastry, I looked up Cocos on the internet and learned that Cocos, Carrows, and Marie Calendar (all places basically in my price range) were closing or had closed!

All right, much as I hate change, I adapted. A few days later I ordered a coffee latte and after finishing, asked the server to refill my cup with regular coffee just as I had been doing for years. The server, someone who had been serving me for years, apologetically informed that I would have to pay an additional charge as if I was ordering another cup of coffee. I was incensed; I asked to speak to the manager who, after a brief but brittle conversation, allowed me "just this one time" to have the refill without paying an additional charge.

Yes, I survived but I wondered what was going on in the world to cause such drastic changes. 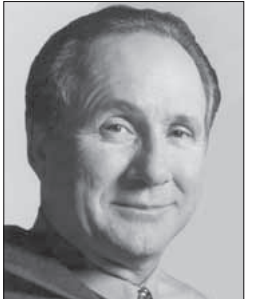

RAISING OUR KIDS TO HATE



A Jeb Bush tweet this week got me thinking about some of the ways our nasty partisan politics has been hurting our kids.

Paraphrasing Jeb, he asked, "How can parents teach their children that using bad language is wrong when we have a president and members of Congress who constantly use profanity to talk about each other?"

Jeb's tweet also reminded me of something a wise Sunday school teacher of mine said once: "There are more things 'caught' than 'taught.'"

I often quote that line when I'm invited to speak to parents, and I thought about it again on Wednesday when I took some kids on a tour of my dad's library in Simi Valley.

It was nice to go to the Reagan Library and be reminded of the positive attitude my father had about politics, his political opponents and people in general.

On my father's tomb, for example, is the message, "I know in my heart that man is good, that what is right will always eventually triumph and there is purpose and worth to each and every life."

I don't know how many of the kids I was with the other day were equipped to catch that optimistic message.

It's really sad that they're growing up in such a hateful political and cultural environment that has so little room for tolerance or civil debate.

Even a beloved liberal comedian like Ellen DeGeneres can get blasted by the Hollywood left just for sitting with her friend George W. Bush at a football game.

What happened to DeGeneres is a sign of how stupid and low our nasty partisan politics are.

Liberal or conservative, Democrat or Republican, you can't be seen in public with someone from the other political tribe without catching hell or hate from your own tribe.

Those kids I was with at the library were too young to know it, but there was a time before Twitter, Facebook and 1,000 cable TV channels when the most powerful people in politics could disagree vehemently yet still be civil to each other.

One of the most famous examples of that political civility and mutual respect was the relationship my father had with the

Democrat Speaker of the House, Tip O'Neill.

Not as well-known was the time my father was asked in 1985 to give a fund-raising speech for the John F. Kennedy Library.

In 1960 my father had campaigned hard against JFK. But when he was President and he was asked by John and Caroline Kennedy to help them kick off an endowment drive for the JFK Library, he did it graciously and enthusiastically.

Praising JFK for being, among many other things, "a patriot" who had "a good hard, un-illusioned understanding of man and his political choices," my father admitted he had not supported Kennedy for president.

"But you know," he said, "it's true: when the battle's over and the ground is cooled, well, it's then that you see the opposing general's valor."

That kind of civility being shown to a political opponent could never happen today in Washington, where Democrats and Republicans hate each other, call each other bad names and refuse to cooperate or compromise.

As for our kids today, they're being taught by the bad example of adults to hate the political tribe they don't belong to. It's reinforced 24/7 on TV, in social media and college campuses.

If we're not careful we're going to end up like Israel, where the Palestinian kids and the Israeli kids don't play with each other and are raised from infancy to hate each other.

Maybe there's still time for our children to turn to their parents and tell them it's time for them to grow up and stop hating.
