Residents and visitors of the Downtown Kersting Court area will notice new trash receptacles have been installed during the week of October 14th. The new receptacles are manufactured by a company named Big Belly and include the latest solar-powered compacting feature. The receptacles also are designed to alert the Public Works Department when they are nearing capacity, or if there are other issues that need to be addressed.

The Big Belly's accept both standard trash and recyclable items, which will be sorted at a material recovery center maintained by Athens Services. The compaction feature reduces refuse from spill-ing over between collections, improving both the environmental and aesthetic quality of the down-town area. 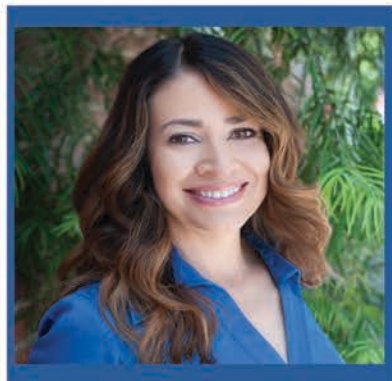

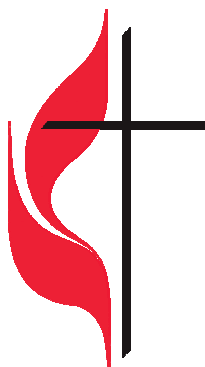

Police asking for Help Finding 4-year-old's Killer



Sheriff's Homicide Bureau investigators are asking for the public help find those responsible for the 2016 shooting death of Four-year-old Salvador Esparza III in Altadena.

According to investigators, the shooting occurred July 5, 2016 as Salvador stood in the doorway of a residence on the 300 block of Figueroa Drive, Altadena. An unknown suspect fired numerous rounds in the direction of the dwelling, fatally striking little Salvador in the head and injuring a 27-year-old male. The suspect was on foot and fled the scene southbound on Olive Avenue; he got into a black vehicle, which continued the flight southbound on Olive Avenue.

The victims were transported to a local hospital, where Salvador was pronounced dead and the second victim was treated for his injury.

Although investigation led detectives to believe the shooting was gang-related, Salvador was the intended target. The shooting suspect was described only as a Black male.

You could recive the \$20,000 reward offered by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible for this tragic murder.

Please help bring peace to his family, and do the right thing.

Rose Parade Gets Trio as Grand Marshals



Spanning three Latina generations, Rita Moreno, Gina Torres and Laurie Hernandez were named Monday morning as the Tournament of Roses 2020 Grand Marshals — the trio then danced up a storm led by Moreno (pictured above right to left).

The announcement was made by President Laura Farber.

Moreno credits span more than six decades, beginning on Broadway at age 13. She has received an Academy Award,

a Tony Award, two Emmy Awards, and a GRAMMY among many others.

Torres well-known for her roles on Suits, Alias, Firefly and Westworld, has also won a list of awards including National Hispanic Media Coalition's Award for Outstanding Performance in a Television Series and the Visionary Award from the LA Femme Film Festival.

Hernandez earned Olympic Gold and Silver medals as a member of the 2016 U.S.

Olympic Women's Gymnastics Team. Her grandparents are Puerto Rican, making her the first U.S. born Latina to make the U.S. Olympic team since 1984.

The three will ride in the 131st Rose Parade themed "The Power of Hope" and join in the pre-game celebration of the 106th Rose Bowl Game, both are held on January 1, 2020.

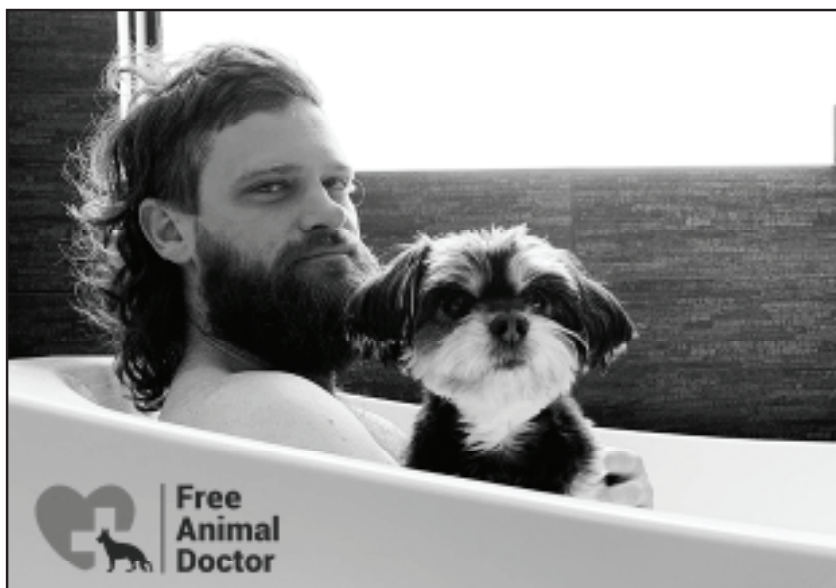

YOU SAY ORGANIC I SAY YUM

In my quest to keep you, my loyal reader educated, we will discuss Organic and Natural Wines. Last week I visited the Urban Plates Restaurant on South Lake and the lunch crowd was dense and there was a buzz in the air. The line for your food is similar to Chipotle or a cafeteria setting, but that's all you can compare. The task I had while visiting Urban Plates was to taste the food and see what kind of wines pair perfectly with their “protein” focused menu. Some of the food I tasted was the free-range chicken, California line caught albacore, and a turkey meatloaf that my grandmother would have been proud of. I scouted the menu and have a few other entrees I would like to try on my next visit; some of them are the sautéed brussels sprouts and organic potatoes. I don't know about you, but I cannot seem to tell a difference between organic non-organic potatoes. However, our generation is keen on natural, fresh, farm-to-table food where everyone seems to be a “foodie” and knows what is good or not. The menu at Urban Plates has many different healthy options, there is also the not so healthier option to choose from as well. One of the not so healthy options that caught my eye was the pork ribs and macaroni and cheese, which pairs great with a Stone Pale Ale or the pride of San Diego, the Mission Blonde Ale. Each entrée comes with a delicious, perfectly char-grilled focaccia bread!



As if the food doesn't sound good enough... the price is just as good. All entrées are in the ten to sixteen-dollar range and wine ranges from eight dollars and up per glass. The wine list is quite small, about eleven or so wines by the glass that are offered but the management informed me that when they receive a request for additional wines, they will expand. I spend a lot of time in Santa Barbara and feel I am very familiar with the brand, Seaglass Unoaked Chardonnay. It is offered at Urban Plates (\$7.50) and will pair great with the chicken or albacore. The Pork Ribs will pair nicely with the Predator Cabernet (\$10). All in all, great food and a nice wine list!

What exactly is an Organic Wine? Well, the word “organic” has the same meaning as when applied to other products of our everyday consumption (i.e. organic poultry or organic produce). Organic wine makers use only natural fertilizers and never use pesticides on their vineyards. It is simply a pure and natural method of growing grapes and making wine! Personally, I find that there is no difference in taste when comparing organic and non-organic wine. However, there is a difference in prices, so if you feel up for spending a few extra pennies, give it a taste yourself. Lastly, if you are really into the health craze, I stop at my local grocery store each morning for a nice bottle of kombucha; Urban Plates has kombucha on tap! Swing by next time you have a chance and try Urban Plates out yourself!

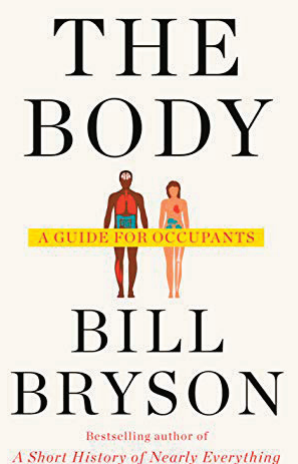

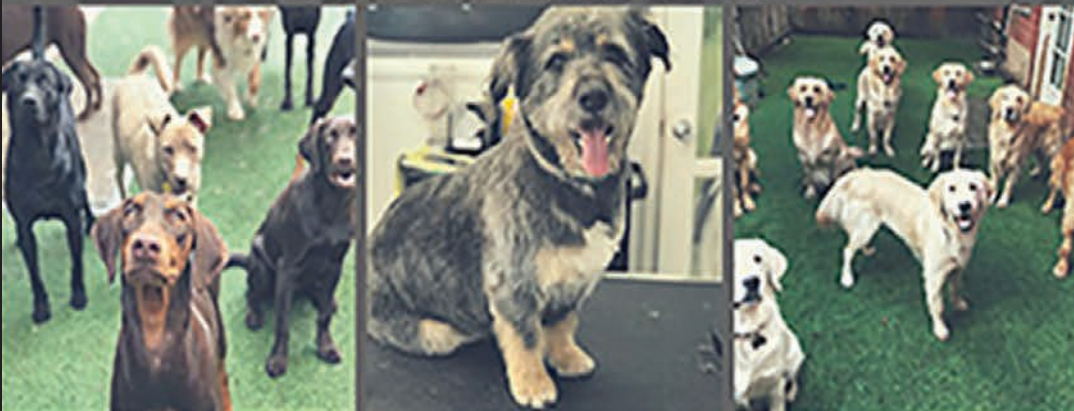

Pasadena's first Earth Day Festival held in the Arroyo Seco in 1991 was billed as "the First Ever Solar Powered Concert."

In part, this was due to the presence of Jon Sherman, whose unique sound filled the air that day, powered by his solar panel array. His "earth music" consisted of his own compositions, played on his double keyboard, along with some recorded loops, so that his one-man show could perform anywhere from the solar-powered batteries.

It was enchanting, uplifting, and singable. My family wore out many of the cassettes back in those days of cassettes. Sherman has come a long way from those days.

A self-proclaimed "climate activist" since 1987, he was Descanso Gardens' (of La Canada) resident musicians from 1987 through 2001, performing on the round outdoor stage that he built on-site. He sang about endangered species, climate change, and the beauty of the natural sites around Southern California.

In 2014, Sabine Kurz, met Sherman at a flute

circle. Kurz, who holds a PhD in biology, took flute lessons from Jon, studying flutes and music. Their relationship blossomed and they married in November of 2015. Today they work together as the musical performing team of "Dryad."

In their recent performance at the Eaton Canyon Nature Center, the musical duo of Jon and Sabine Sherman presented an original theatrical show titled "Dryad - An Eco Folk Musical In One Magical Act! It was an educational musical dialogue, where Jon meets the spirit of the oak tree (Sabine). Jon is the ordinary man, on the quest to know how to live lightly on the land, how to do the right thing in a world with so many ecological challenges. He talks to the Dryad, the spirit of the oak, who gives him sage advice.

The performance is a light-hearted teaching between the enchanting tree spirit and the comically confused human, yet it touches on some very serious subjects, including the climate crisis, endangered species, and factory farming. The dialogue between the two is masterfully woven between nine songs in the hour-long performance, consisting of two-part vocal harmony between the dryad (Sabine) and the man (Jon), with guitar and branch flute accompaniment.

The flutes that Sabine plays in the show were



actually made by Jon, who's been making flutes from tree branches for over 13 years. The show begins with "January's June" - a song about climate change, and then continues. Each song is interspersed with the dryad and the ordinary man having a conversation for our benefit. Their show had something for everyone, with the children captured by the performance and the adults listening to each nuance of the environmental lesson.

Jon and Sabine Sherman are working on their first CD, entitled "Dryad" which should be available in time for the 2019 Winter Solstice. Their musical performances occur at many venues; for more information, and to learn where they are performing, go to Dryad ~ We sing for the trees!

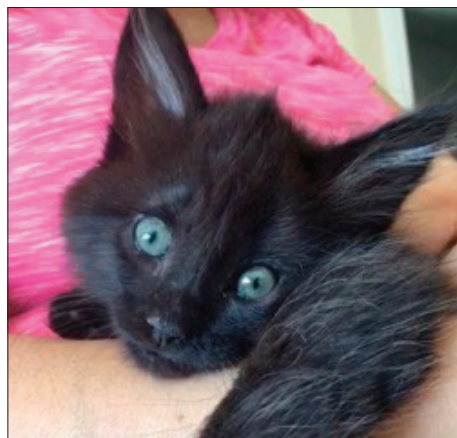

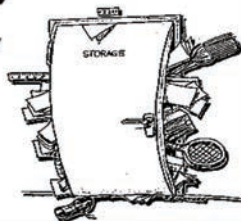

GETTING AROUND WHEN YOU NO LONGER DRIVE

Dear Savvy Senior:
Where can I find out about alternative transportation services for my 80-year-old mother? It's time that she gives up driving, but before she does, we need to figure out how she'll get around. Inquiring Son



Dear Inquiring:

Alternative transportation options for seniors who no longer drive vary widely by community, so what's available to your mom will depend on where she lives. Here's what you should know.

While most urban areas offer seniors a variety of alternative transportation services, the options may be few to none for those living in the suburbs, small towns and rural areas. Depending on where your mom lives, here's a rundown of possible solutions that can help her get around, along with some resources to help you locate them.

Family and friends: This is the most often used and favorite option among seniors. So, make a list of all possible candidates your mom can call on, along with their availability and contact information.

Volunteer transportation programs: These are usually run by local nonprofits or religious organizations and provide elderly seniors transportation to doctor's appointments, shopping, and more. These services may charge a small fee or accept donations and often operate with a network of volunteer drivers.

Some examples of local transportation programs include Envoy America (EnvoyAmerica.com) that provides senior transportation in 78 cities in Arizona, Texas, Washington, Illinois, New Mexico, Georgia and Pennsylvania. The Independent Transportation Network (ITNAmerica.org) that serves 14 communities across 12 states. And SilverRide (SilverRide.com), which serves the San Francisco bay area and Kansas City. To search for volunteer driving programs in your area visit NationalVolunteerTransportationCenter.org – click on “Map of Volunteer Driver Programs.”

Demand response services: Often referred to as “dial-a-ride” or “elderly and disabled transportation service,” these are usually government-funded programs that provide door-to-door transportation services by appointment and usually charge a small fee or donation on a per ride basis. Many use vans and offer accessible services for riders with special needs.

Taxis and rideshare services: While taxis are a viable transportation option in many communities, rideshare services like Uber (Uber.com) and Lyft (Lyft.com), which are widely available, have become more popular among seniors who don't drive.

To get a ride, your mom could simply use the Uber or Lyft smartphone app, a computer, or she can call a ride-hailing service like Go Go Grandparent (GoGoGrandparent.com). Or, you can make arrangements for her on your smartphone.

Cost will vary depending on your mom's location, distance traveled and peak travel time, but rideshare services are usually cheaper than taxis. Uber and Lyft also offer carpooling services that would allow your mom to save money by splitting the tab with other consumers riding the same route. And for seniors with mobility problems, both Uber and Lyft have accessible vehicles that you can request in certain locations.

Hire someone: Consider hiring someone to drive your mom like a neighbor, retiree, high school or college student that has a flexible schedule and wouldn't mind making a few extra bucks. You can also hire a senior driving companion through nonmedical home-care agencies, or you can find someone on your own at websites like Care.com or CareLinx.com.

Private business transportation services: Some hospitals, health clinics, senior centers, adult day centers, malls or other businesses may offer transportation for program participants or customers.

Mass transit: Public transportation (buses, trains, subways, etc.) where available, can also be an affordable option and may offer senior reduced rates.

Where to Look

To find out what transportation services are available in your mom's area contact Rides in Sight (RidesInSight.org, 855-607-4337), and the Eldercare Locator (800-677-1116), which will direct you to her area agency on aging for assistance. You should also contact local senior centers, places of worship and retirement communities for other possible options.

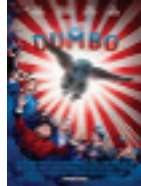

IT WAS ONE OF THOSE WEEKS!

At my stage in life, I have experienced a gazillion weeks. I thought about actually counting how many weeks I have lived, but I don't have that many fingers or toes. It doesn't matter how many weeks it is. I have lived enough weeks to know, when you think you have experienced everything there is to experience, then another week shows itself. No matter how bad a week can be another week can always be worse. On the other side, no matter how good a week can be, another week can be better. I do have one complaint this week. Who was that knucklehead that invented the telephone? I would like to call him and give him a piece of my mind if I have any pieces left. (Does anybody write letters anymore?) Imagine how quiet my life would be if nobody could call me? The telephone was one thing, now we have these sophisticated gadgets called cell phones. I know why they're called “cell” phones. 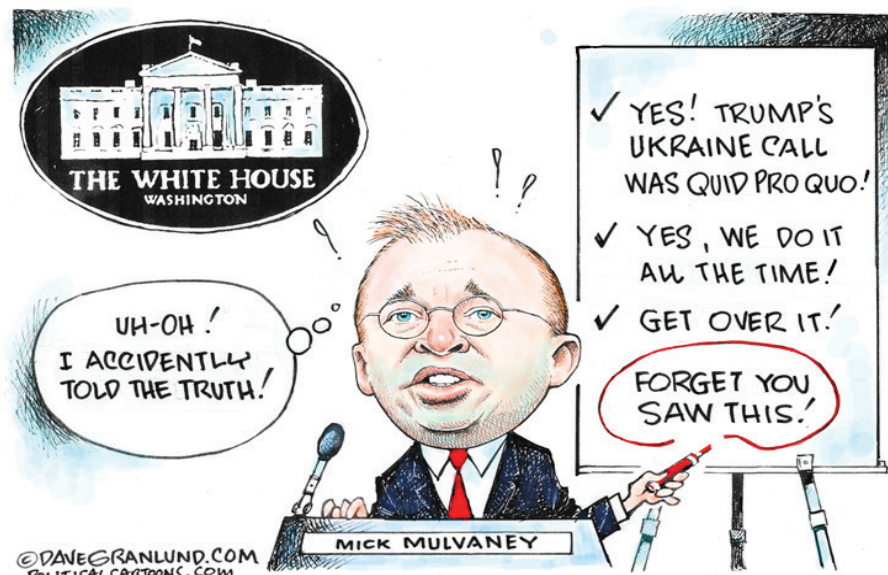
Okay if it's that simple and if people really have the power to heal and correct past historical mistakes and replace the bad stuff with good stuff let us all unite to issue the following:

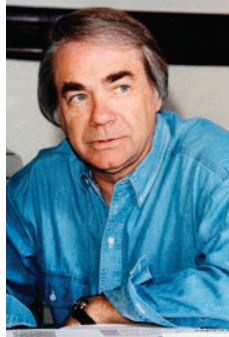

"NEWSPAPER EDITORS ARE MEN WHO SEPARATE THE WHEAT FROM THE CHAFF AND THEN PRINT THE CHAFF." WHOSE WORDS?

President Trump? Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders? California Sen. Kamala Harris? Massachusetts Sen. Elizabeth Warren? No... It was uttered by Democratic presidential candidate Adlai E. Stevenson in 1952.

Using the media as a whipping boy is, of course, nothing new. Trump may have raised it to an art form – "fake news... enemy of the people" etc. – but criticism of the media has been as

much a part of campaigning as lawn signs, posters, straw hats and balloons.

More history? Presidents Eisenhower and Kennedy both were critical of the media and, in the late 1960s and early 1970s, Vice President Spiro Agnew spent most of his time and energy berating the media with colorful alliterative phrases like these: "Nattering nabobs of negativism... effete corps of impudent snobs," etc.

Lest there be any doubt, the atmosphere today is immeasurably more poison-ous. Past criticisms seem almost quaint and gentlemanly.

In earlier decades, the power and influence of the print media was supreme, considering newspapers were virtually the only trusted source of news. It controlled the field, and attacks on it could be shrugged off or ignored altogether. Attacking the New York Times, for instance, was likened to throwing spitballs at a battleship.

The revolution in communications technology shattered those norms, loosening the grip of the print media on the public discourse. The vacuum was filled by an unfettered, undisciplined, unregulated amalgam of groups and individuals who drove political debate at a dizzying, nearly incomprehensible pace.

"I read it on the internet" became the default position in promoting or disputing a point of view. In-depth analyses of complex policy issues were replaced by Twitter, Instagram, 60 seconds on YouTube. Success is now measured by the number of one's Twitter followers. There's no need to appear insightful or un-understanding – just keep those thumbs working on a handheld keyboard.

No one has mastered this environment better than the president. He unleashes a daily barrage of Twitter messages – half truths, untruths, distorted historical allusions, conspiracy theories and exaggerations.

He has framed the public debate, forced the media to follow his lead, chase down his latest tirade, defend itself, and attempt to provide context and meaning to rapidly moving events.

In the process, too many have fallen into the trap of engaging Trump directly and personally, an understandable impulse but one which plays directly into the president's hands.

As tempting as it is to respond in kind, it is a mistake for reporters to give in to it. Trump enjoys home field advantage and swapping insults with him is a losing game. There is no upside for the media to gamble its reputation simply because it desires the temporary inner satisfaction of getting the better of an exchange with the president.

The media's responsibility is to cover him, report what he says and does, point out the flaws and the foibles, explain the impact of his actions and their meaning to the American people. In other words, do what reporters have always done.

Competitive pressures – the demand to get it first has erased the need to get it right – has undermined public confidence in the media. News judgment and the inherent skepticism which led to more intense questioning of sources have been overlooked. Errors are magnified, mistakes admitted, and stories retracted, all feeding Trump's obsession with heaping humiliation on the offenders as evidence of a media to delegitimize his election.

It is Trump, though, who has demonstrated his nimbleness in navigating the media landscape while compiling political points with his base. A handful of candidates for the Democratic presidential nomination – most notably Sanders – have discovered there is advantage to be gained and attention attracted by turning their wrath on the media.

The media has been dragged into what is arguably the most highly charged political environment in recent memory, subjected to accusations of sloppy and biased coverage, focusing on the trivial, taking the path of least resistance and ignoring issues.

Candidates routinely grumble and grouse about media coverage but it's degenerated into public shouting matches and allegations of the most vicious personal sort. As unseemly as it is, it's likely here to stay and worsen.

There's no incentive to behave otherwise.

It almost makes one pine for the good old days – separating the wheat from the chaff while listening to the nattering nabobs of negativism and the effete corps of impudent snobs.
