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## ARCADIA MARIJUANA CULTIVATION BUST

From Arcadia PD

On Thursday January 16, 2020, at approximately 7:00 AM, the Arcadia Police Department's S.W.A.T. Team served a search warrant at a house in the 300 block of Walnut Avenue. Two suspects were initially detained at the house, and one suspect ran from the location. Detectives determined the occupants were in possession of Ketamine for sales, stealing electricity, illegally cultivating marijuana, and they delayed the police officers. The two detained suspects were arrested for suspicion of violating Health and Safety Code 11379.2 – possession of Ketamine for sales, Penal Code 498(d) – theft of utilities over \$950, Health and Safety Code 11358(c) – cultivation of cannabis, and Penal Code 148(a)(1) – willfully delaying a peace officer. Later in the day, Officers arrested the third suspect at the Arcadia Police Department for violations of Health and Safety Code 11379.2 – possession of Ketamine for sales and Penal Code 498(d) – theft of utilities over \$950.

The two initial arrestees are identified as Ms. Xiaoshen Zhang, who is 57-years-old, and Mr. Te Zhang, who is 26-years-old. The third arrestee is identified as Mr. Peng Song, who is 34-years-old. All three suspects are residents of Arcadia, and they were booked at the Arcadia Police Department's jail. Ms. Xiaoshen Zhang and Mr. Te Zhang were each released with a \$30,000 bail. Mr. Song is still in custody at the Arcadia Police Department's jail with a \$30,000 bail.

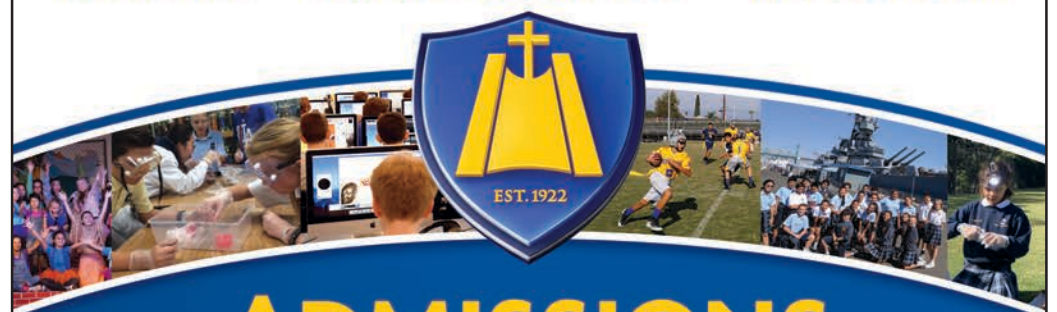

## Local Area News Briefs

### *Pasadena Set to Celebrate the Cheeseburger*

During Cheeseburger Week from January 26th to January 31st, Pasadena honors Lionel Sternberger's genius in being the first to put cheese on a hamburger and serve it at the Rite Spot in Pasadena in 1924. Forty of Pasadena's restaurants, lounges and burger joints offer their signature burgers, some special creations and great deals during Pasadena Cheeseburger Week.

In 1924, as legend has it, teenaged Lionel Sternberger burned one side of a hamburger patty at The Rite Spot, his father's roadside stand along Colorado Boulevard (then Colorado Street) in west Pasadena. Rather than throw away the spoiled burger, he masked his mistake with a piece of cheese and served it to a very appreciative customer. Word soon spread and customers flocked to The Rite Spot for The Aristocratic Burger, A Hamburger with Cheese. Sternberger's achievement is the first verified instance of someone serving a hamburger with cheese to a customer.

Over the years, Sternberger perfected his Aristocratic Burger, much to the delight of customers at The Rite Spot. Sternberger's culinary achievement has been documented by Hamburger America, the Los Angeles Times and even Time magazine in its obituary of Sternberger.

To celebrate Sternberger's culinary masterpiece, Pasadena restaurants are offering specials, unique creations and the tried and true. Patrons can experience the Zacatecas Burger from El Portal and Yahaira's, the K-POP from Dog Haus and Dog Haus Biergarten, the Impossible Burger at Umami or the traditional, and nationally recognized, cheeseburger at Pie 'n Burger.

## Bakery Fined \$80k for Wage Violations

A joint investigation including staff from Pasadena's Planning & Community Development Department and the California Department of Industrial Relations - Bureau of Field Enforcement (BOFE) has resulted in a combined assessment of more than \$80,000 in back wages, damages, premiums and interest for minimum wage violations and various California labor code violations at Chapala Bakery located at 265 E. Orange Grove Boulevard.

Responding to an employee-generated complaint, City staff interviewed several bakery employees and determined that violations of Pasadena's minimum wage ordinance and California Labor Code had occurred. City representatives held several meetings with the business owner in an effort to resolve the matter locally however, the proprietor was intransigent and uncooperative leading the City to collaborate with the Department of Industrial Relations' BOFE investigators and auditors.

As a result, fines, penalties and liquidated damages assessed to the employer for the minimum wage violations and various labor code violations were nearly \$81,000. This

total includes minimum wage violations, overtime and split shift pay, meal and rest period pay, and liquidated damages due employees. BOFE investigators determined that the business operators must compensate the three employees who joined the complaint \$62,987.78 and must pay the State \$17,950 in civil penalties for a total of \$80,937.78. Staff from the DIR Judgement Enforcement Unit continue to investigate the proprietor's various assets in an effort to recover funds for the payment of unpaid wages, penalties and damages.

Enacted by the Pasadena City Council in 2016, the City's minimum wage will reach \$15.00 per hour starting July 1, 2020 for employers with 26 or more employees, and July 1, 2021 for employers with 25 or fewer employees.

Pasadena's City Council is committed to the investigation and resolution of minimum wage and wage-theft complaints, as well as providing local outreach, education and training to low wage earners, members of the immigrant community and business owners and operators. The City values its effective partnership with the Department of Industrial Relations in investigating multi-faceted complaints of

wage and hour violations and will continue to jointly enforce wage and hour violations that are breaches of law and may result in the recovery of wages and the imposition of fines and penalties.

## Pasadena Senior Center to Celebrate 60th Anniversary



Senior Center 1960

The 60th anniversary of the Pasadena Senior Center will be celebrated with a series of special events and activities throughout 2020.

Founded in 1960, the center is an independent, donor-supported nonprofit organization that offers recreational, educational, wellness and social services to people ages 50 and older, as well as specialized services for frail, low-income and homebound seniors. It receives no funding from local, county, state or federal governments.

The idea for a senior center that would serve the needs of Pasadena residents was sparked in 1953. Four years later the Pasadena-Altadena Committee for Senior Citizens was formed to outline a plan. The city of Pasadena provided a site at the south end of Memorial Park, and a bond issue was passed by voters to fund construction. With additional funding from the Junior League of Pasadena, an executive director was hired who would work with a board of directors and the city of Pasadena to achieve the long-held goal of providing recreational and social services to senior citizens.

The doors of the organization opened in 1960, and it was the first independent, nonprofit senior center in Southern California and one of the first in the nation. (Unlike the Pasadena Senior Center, most U.S. senior centers are funded and operated by municipal recreation departments). Pasadena Junior League members contributed thousands of

hours to staff the new facility the first 10 years.

An extensive expansion in 1998 tripled the size of the center, making many more programs and services possible to enrich the lives of members. The following year, it became the first in California to receive accreditation by the National Council on Aging's National Institute of Senior Centers.

"It is fitting that 60th anniversaries are associated with diamonds because they symbolize commitment, strength and endurance," said Akila Gibbs, executive director of the Pasadena Senior Center. "This organization continues to shine after 60 years, and the people we serve sparkle like diamonds."

Sixtieth anniversary commemorations will kick off in spring 2020 with events and activities at the center and throughout Pasadena, continue with the popular #AgeWell Day in October and culminate with an evening celebration later in the year that will feature a look back at the Pasadena Senior Center's history and a look forward to the future. Fritz Coleman, KNBC-TV weathercaster and comedian and a long-time supporter of the center, will be the honoree at the evening celebration.

"We look forward to celebrating 60 years of innovative programs and services," Gibbs added. "The Pasadena Senior Center operates successfully because of our board, staff and volunteers, our community partners and because people donate to this vital community asset."

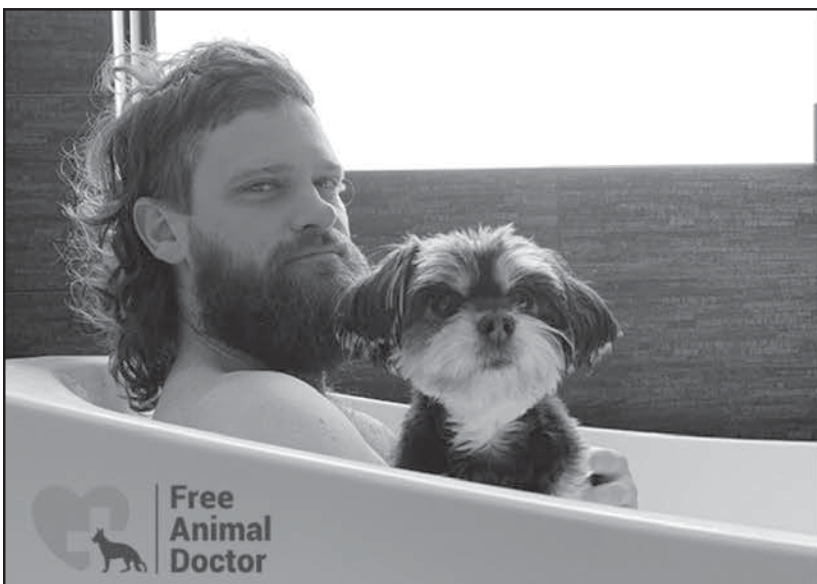

## 1630 AM EMERGENCY RADIO & Free on-air publicity for local events

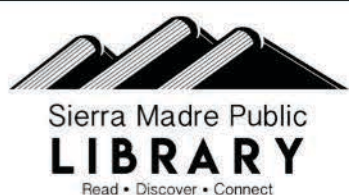

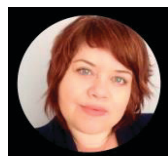

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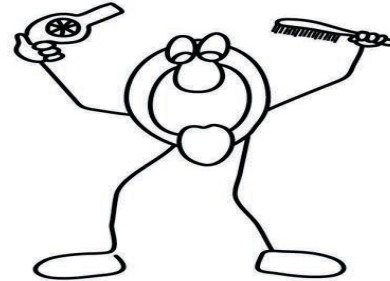
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## KATIE Tse....*This and That*



### THE WISDOM OF GERRY BROOKS

As promised, I finally whipped up a new article for you. This one's about a beloved YouTube gem, Gerry Brooks.

Maybe you've heard of him. Maybe you haven't. I hadn't

until I attended a professional development workshop a few months ago. To keep us awake and lucid, the presenter interspersed her content with occasional videos featuring Gerry, a retired principal from Tennessee.

Gerry's perfected a kind of drawing hick persona. I can't do his accent justice except to say that "educator" becomes "erjucator," etc. Gerry typically films these flicks in his car with a dash cam. Nothing says class in education like a setup like that.

So, what kind of stuff does Gerry post? The kind of thing educators find relatable and amusing. One I saw at the training was about Google Teacher Translate for parent teacher conferences and report cards. Helps with finding creative ways of saying, "Your kid keeps licking other kids at recess, and that's weird" without coming off as offensive. A more positive spin on that might be, "Your child has a unique way of initiating social interactions with peers." You get the idea.

Another dealt with how to get through the dreaded evaluation observations. Gerry suggested filling a large capacity weekly pill box with chocolate pudding and dipping in regularly. Or keeping little plastic shooters of an "adult grape beverage" handy. If both those methods fail, Gerry has a surefire solution --a box with a puppy inside. Can't top that for stress relief.

I casually shared these with my mom, and before I knew it she was off to the Gerry Brooks races. Every day she sends me a video or two. Or three.

Other great ones have Gerry peddling t-shirts. Except these are tuck-in surprise t-shirts you can un-tuck to reveal hidden messages. For example, the top might say, "My principal is the best!" but the bottom adds "... at making dumb decisions."

Thank God I have a great principal, but still the joke's funny. Similar messages are "I love my principal," with a snarky chaser of "Not really, but I ain't got tenure yet." Gerry's got other school personnel covered, too. A shirt for nurses says, "School nurses can't fix stupid." So relatable.

There's one of Gerry wearing a fluffy Grinch outfit pretending to be a morning car line attendant. He tells one woman to stop brushing her kid's hair while holding up the rest of the line. Instead, she can park in the vacant "beauty parlor" spot.

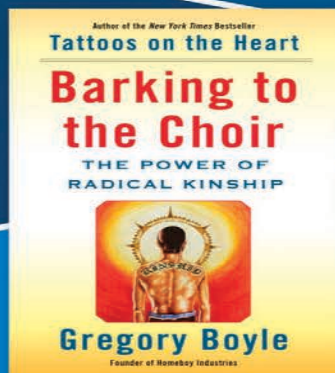
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ARCADIA POLICE BLOTTER

San Marino Hazardous & E-Waste Disposal

As the holiday season comes to an end and decorations are packed away for another year, many people find this time to be an ideal opportunity to clean house and throw away household items that are no longer of use. Most items you may be able to identify as trash or recyclable, but what about that old paint, used batteries, or partially filled containers of kerosene and other flammables? You recently purchased a new television, now what should you do with the old one? The San Marino Fire Department is frequently asked, what do we do with these items?



The Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County sponsor weekly Household Hazardous and Electronic Waste (HHW) disposal events all around Los Angeles County. These one-day collection events provide all Los Angeles County residents a legal and cost-free way to dispose of unwanted household items and chemicals that cannot be disposed of in the regular trash, no appointment is needed.


Eligible items for disposal at a HHW event include: motor oil, oil filters, brake fluid, used antifreeze, paint, paint thinner, aerosol cans, turpentine, cleaners with acid or lye, pesticides or herbicides, household batteries or car batteries, computers, televisions, cell phones, miscellaneous electronics, mercury thermometers or thermostats, fluorescent light bulbs, used needles or sharps (in a sharps container or sturdy box labeled "SHARPS"), and unwanted or expired prescriptions.

A collection event will be held in the City of Rosemead on February 1, and in the City of San Gabriel on March 7. A list of all upcoming collection events, as well as a full list of items that can and cannot be brought to the event can be found at the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County website: [lacsd.org/services/solidwaste/hhw\\_e\\_waste](http://lacsd.org/services/solidwaste/hhw_e_waste).

Additionally, LA Sanitation has 7 permanent S.A.F.E. (Solvents / Automotive / Flammables / Electronics) collection centers, open Saturdays and Sundays from 9:00 am – 3:00 pm. The Los Angeles-Glendale S.A.F.E. Center is located at 4600 Colorado Boulevard, Los Angeles, CA 90039.

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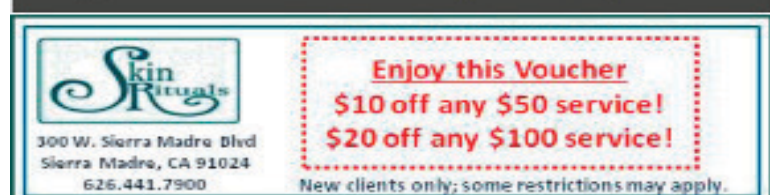
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## SCHIFF STATEMENT ON BEING NAMED LEAD HOUSE IMPEACHMENT MANAGER



Washington, D.C. — Today, Rep. Adam Schiff (D-CA), the Chairman of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, released the following statement after Speaker Nancy Pelosi announced the House Managers for the Senate impeachment trial of President Donald J. Trump:

"I am humbled by the responsibility of serving as the lead House Manager in the Senate impeachment trial of President Donald J. Trump, and thank Speaker Pelosi for the trust she has place in me and our team. It is a solemn responsibility and one that I will undertake with the seriousness that the task requires.

"The House of Representatives was compelled by our duty to Constitution and country to hold President Trump accountable for his wrongdoing. President Trump abused the power of his office by pressing a foreign government to interfere in our elections, while withholding a highly sought-after White House meeting and vital military aid to an ally at war with Russia. When he was caught, President Trump obstructed – in an unprecedented and sweeping fashion – the House impeachment inquiry.

"The overwhelming evidence and testimony presented against the President led to his impeachment last month, and since that time, more documents have come to light, and witnesses have come forward willing to testify.

"Americans overwhelmingly want a fair trial in the Senate, fair to the President and fair to the people. Senators must demand to see and hear the full evidence, including the documents and witnesses the President has blocked. Only then can they faithfully discharge their own Constitutional duties to be fair and impartial jurors.

"Trump's abuse of power is a clear and present danger to our democracy and national security interests. The House upheld our Constitutional duty. Now it's up to the Senate to do the same.

"In this next phase, I look forward to working closely with my fellow Managers on behalf of the American people and in defense of our Constitution."

### THE SECURE ACT'S IMPACT ON ESTATE AND RETIREMENT PLANNING

On January 1, 2020, the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act (SECURE Act) went into effect, and it could have big implications for both your retirement and estate planning strategies—and not all of them are positive.

Last week, I gave you a general overview of the SECURE Act's most impactful provisions. Under the new law, your heirs could end up paying far more in income taxes than necessary when they inherit the assets in your retirement account. Moreover, the assets your heirs inherit could also end up at risk from creditors, lawsuits, or divorce. And this is true even for retirement assets held in certain protective trusts designed to shield those assets from such threats and maximize tax savings.

Here, we'll cover the SECURE Act's impact on your financial planning for retirement, offering strategies for maximizing your retirement account's potential for growth, while minimizing tax liabilities and other risks that could arise in light of the legislation's legal changes.

Tax-advantaged retirement planning  
If your retirement account assets are held in a traditional IRA, you received a tax deduction when you put funds into that account, and now the investments in that account grow tax free as long as they remain in the account. When you eventually withdraw funds from the account, you'll pay income taxes on that money based on your tax rate at the time.

If you withdraw those funds during retirement, your tax rate will likely (but not always) be lower than it is now. The combination of the upfront tax deduction on your initial investment with the likely lower tax rate on your withdrawal is what makes traditional IRAs such an attractive option for retirement planning.

Thanks to the SECURE Act, these retirement vehicles now come with even more benefits. Previously, you were required to start taking distributions from retirement accounts at age 70 ½. But under the SECURE Act, you are not required to start taking distributions until you reach 72, giving you an additional year-and-a-half to grow your retirement savings tax free.

The SECURE Act also eliminated the age restriction on contributions to traditional IRAs. Under prior law, those who continued working could not contribute to a traditional IRA once they reached 70 ½. Now you can continue making contributions to your IRA for as long as you and/or your spouse are still working.

From a financial-planning perspective, you'll want to consider the effect these new rules could have on the goal for your retirement account assets. For example, will you need the assets you've been accumulating in your retirement account for your own use during retirement, or do you plan to pass those assets to your heirs? From there, you'll want to consider the potential income-tax consequences of each scenario.

Your retirement account assets are extremely valuable, and you'll want to ensure those assets are well managed both for yourself and future generations, so you should discuss these issues with your financial advisor as soon as possible. If you don't already have a financial advisor, we'll be happy to recommend a few we trust most.

And if you meet with us for a Family Estate Planning Session (or for a review of your existing plan) to discuss your options from a legal perspective, we can integrate your financial advisor into our meeting. Together, we can look at the specific goals you're trying to achieve and determine the best ways to use your retirement-account assets to benefit yourself and your heirs.

Here are some things we would consider with you and your financial advisor:

#### Converting to a ROTH IRA

In light of the SECURE Act's changes, you may want to consider converting your traditional IRA to a ROTH IRA. ROTH IRAs come with a potentially large tax bill up front, when you initially transition the account, but all earnings and future distributions from the account are tax free.

#### Life insurance trust options

Given the new distribution requirements for inherited IRAs, we can also look at whether it makes sense to withdraw the funds from your retirement account now, pay the resulting tax, and invest the remainder in life insurance. From there, you can set up a life insurance trust to hold the policy's balance for your heirs.

By directing the death benefits of that insurance into a trust, you can avoid burdening your beneficiaries with the SECURE Act's new tax requirements for withdrawals of inherited retirement assets as well as provide extended asset protection for the funds held in trust.

#### Charitable trust options

If you have charitable inclinations, we can consider using a charitable remainder trust (CRT). By naming the CRT as the beneficiary of your retirement account, when you pass away, the CRT would make monthly, quarterly, semi-annual, or annual distributions to your beneficiaries over their lifetime. Then, when the beneficiaries pass away, the remaining assets would be distributed to a charity of your choice.

The decision of whether to transition your traditional IRA into a ROTH IRA now, or cash out and buy insurance, or use a CRT to provide for your beneficiaries is a solvable "math problem." Using the specific facts of your life goals as the elements that go into solving the problem, we can team up with your financial advisor to help you do the math and solve the equation.

#### Adjusting your plan

While the SECURE Act has significantly altered the tax implications for retirement planning and estate planning, as you can see, there are still plenty of tax-saving options available for managing your retirement account assets. But these options are only available if you plan for them.

If you don't revise your plan to accommodate the SECURE Act's new requirements, your family will pay the maximum amount of income taxes and lose valuable opportunities for asset-protection and wealth-creation as well. You've worked too hard for these assets to see them lost, squandered, or not pass to your heirs in the way you choose, so put this planning at the top of your new year's resolution list.

CSArts-SGV’s annual all-school musical is celebrated as a massive cross-conservatory collaboration for both students and staff. “In the Heights” features a cast of ninth through 12th graders from the school’s acting, creative writing, integrated arts, musical theater and vocal arts conservatories. The school of dance staff is developing choreography and instrumental music students and staff are performing in the pit orchestra. Additionally, visual arts students are designing the theater’s lobby, while production & design students are handling props, staging and lighting.

“‘In the Heights’ provides a wonderful platform for each of the conservatories to get involved in the unique cultural experience of the story. I think the musical allows for growth because of its demands of specificity in each aspect of execution, whether it be choreography, instrumentation or singing,” said Jud Williford, CSArts-SGV’s Chair of Theatre.

Jonathan Muñoz-Proulx, the show’s director and a member of the Latinx Theatre Commons’ National Advisory Committee, said while the look and feel of this production will be deeply rooted in reality like its original interpretation, CSArts-SGV’s rendition will be showcased through a more poetic lens using magical realism; however, the show’s specific themes and messages will remain the same.

He said “In the Heights” dives deep into motifs that easily resonate with CSArts-SGV students. Similar to Washington Heights, high school campuses are always growing and changing. Their identities are always in flux, Muñoz-Proulx said.

“This play is a microcosm, a poetic examination, of the joys and fears of transitions. I find this particularly exciting because many of these students are embarking on their own moment of transition as they consider colleges, applications, interviews and auditions,” he said.

Additionally, Muñoz-Proulx said he hopes this show encourages the audience to think more deeply about the important moments of their own lives as they relate to the story.

“‘In the Heights’ invites us to consider where we



came from, whether we should return, what it took for us to arrive where we are, who’s shoulders we stand on, who our ancestors are and what legacies reverberate through our bones,” he said.

My high school days were spent engrossed in the study of mycology, botany, and herbalism. Through the ancient knowledge of the use of wild plants, I saw the very salvation of the world that everyone else seemed to have forgotten and left behind.

I was still young, and not caught up in making money as the primary purpose and goal of my life. I truly thought that the problem with modern society was that there was something that “we” were all missing, or ignoring.

I moved to my grandfather’s farm in rural Ohio, since I believed that perhaps the methods built into farm-living somehow imparted the simplicity and natural self-reliance I was seeking. But – in general – I found that farm people were just like everyone else in wanting the latest gadgets and technological devices as the main means to improve life. I saw some hope and solace in observing the rites of the Amish, who eschewed electricity, and insisted on a life full of manual labor and community involvement. It did not hurt their goals to have large farms and large open spaces where they lived. Still, I was an outsider to the Amish. I wondered if their methods were possible to apply if I did not have a large farmstead, and a large group of like-minded neighbors.

When I returned to California, I was introduced to Richard White, who had recently founded a non-profit specifically to teach city dwellers how to live their daily lives more ecologically. The raison d’être of his organization was to learn, study, live, and share techniques of wilderness survival, urban survival, economic survival, political survival, physical survival, and spiritual survival. He was a pioneer in this broad approach to life, and he took more than his share of criticism. I became his student, joined his organization, and let his influence dominate my thinking about the ways I could live more frugally, and get more for less.

Along the way, I learned many abiding principles which I’ve more or less followed life-long.

For example, as a part of my involvement with White’s non-profit, I was introduced to another pioneer, Marshall Greenwood, about whom an article had been written in the Los Angeles Times. Greenwood was described as “America’s Greatest Poor Man,” and he wrote a book describing his lifestyle and how he managed to live on \$99 a month in his San Diego apartment. In the writings of Greenwood, I found a like-minded person who described the folly of so many of the products of modern life which so many people believe they cannot live without. Greenwood lived a good life without having to pay for all the stuff he considered nonessential. In fact, he discovered – in much the way that Thoreau discovered, as I have discovered – that so many of the trappings of modern life keep us very busy being very busy, but keep us too distracted to live life fully and too often keep us from living our life to its fullest potential. We mistake acquiring a lot of stuff for a truly meaningful and successful life.

At this time, I was living with my parents, practiced organic gardening in the side yard, and bicycled most of the time. I was a student of botany, mycology, and journalism at the local college. Soon, I worked more with White’s new non-profit, and taught inner-city youth such skills as fence building, framing small structures, gardening, and landscaping. In that capacity, I became aware of an empty house on a one acre lot in that neighborhood. I occupied that house, fixed it up, and squatted there for a year and a half. As a result of that unique situation, I used the opportunity to practice low-impact self-reliant living. I grew some of my food, and raised some animals. I practiced composting, and used a small wood stove for some of my cooking. I learned to make usable furniture from discarded wood, and I collected and used rain water. All these things I did because I wanted to practice living lightly on the land. I worked all the time, though since I only maintained a few part-time jobs for money, all my practices were very much “low-budget.” In fact, more accurately, they were “no-budget.”

That was over 40 years ago, and a lot has happened since then as I have continued to seek and find ways to live a low-cost ecological lifestyle. It has never been my intent to do these things in order to coerce others to change their lifestyles. I was concerned about my own personal choices, and the impact of my choices upon the environment. If others found some value in what I did, I always found that to be a good thing. However, I mostly heard (usually third-hand) the negative comments. These included “What he does is very impractical,” or “He wouldn’t need to do those things if he just got a job,” and even “He’s a bum.” Yes, I understand such feelings.

As I understood from the descendants of the peers of Thoreau, he was by no means admired during his lifetime. Rather, he was regarded as somewhat lazy, a bum, and someone who would not, or could not, hold a job. Thoreau was seen as someone who would rather hang out in the woods with the Indians rather than working at some job in town. Only today is Thoreau’s simplicity valued by school teachers and intellectuals who wish to capture those lessons of self-reliance for a modern generation.

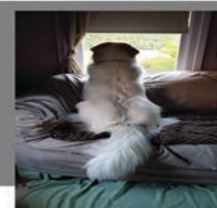

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## HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT HOSPITAL FOR YOU

Dear Savvy Senior:

*I need to get a hip replacement, and want to find a good, safe hospital to have it done in. What resources can you recommend for evaluating hospitals? I don't currently have a doctor.*  
Shopping Around

Dear Shopping:

Most people spend more time shopping for a kitchen appliance or flat-screen TV than choosing a hospital. But selecting the right one can be as important as the doctor you choose. Here are some tips and resources to help you research the hospitals in your area.

Hospital Shopping

While you may not always have the opportunity to choose your hospital, especially in the case of an emergency, having a planned procedure can offer you a variety of choices.

When shopping for a hospital, the most important criteria is to choose one that has a strong department in treating your area of need. A facility that excels in coronary bypass surgery, for example, may not be the best choice for a hip replacement. Research shows that patients tend to have better results when they're treated in hospitals that have extensive experience with their specific condition.

In order to choose a hospital that's best for you, it is important to discuss your concerns and alternatives with the doctor who is treating you. Some doctors may be affiliated with several hospitals from which you can choose. Or, if you've yet to select a doctor, finding a top hospital that has expertise with your condition can help you determine which physician to actually choose. Another important reason to do some research is the all too frequent occurrence of hospital infections, which kill around 75,000 people in the U.S. each year. So, checking your hospital's infection rates and cleanliness procedures is also a smart move.

Free Researching Tools

There are a number of free online resources that can help you evaluate and compare hospitals in your area, including:

Medicare's Hospital Compare (Medicare.gov/HospitalCompare): Operated by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, this tool has data on more than 4,000 U.S. hospitals.  
Why Not The Best (WhyNotTheBest.org): Created by the Commonwealth Fund, this is a private foundation that provides performance data on all U.S. hospitals.  
The Leapfrog Group (LeapfrogGroup.org): This national, not-for-profit organization grades more than 2,000 U.S. hospitals on quality and safety.

These websites use publicly available data to rate hospitals on various measures of performance like death rates from serious conditions such as heart failure and pneumonia, frequency of hospital-acquired infections, patient satisfaction and more.

On these websites, you plug in your location to find hospitals in your area. You can then check to see how well or poorly each hospital manages patients in various conditions.

Two other good sites that can help you choose a good facility include U.S. News & World Report (USNews.com/best-hospitals) and Healthgrades (Healthgrades.com).

U.S. News & World Report is an online publication that publishes a hospital ranking in 17 medical specialties like cancer, orthopedics and urology, and rates common procedures and conditions, such as heart bypass surgery, hip and knee replacement and COPD. They also rank hospitals regionally within states and major metro areas.

And Healthgrades, which is a private for-profit organization, provides free hospital ratings on patient safety and medical procedures, and scores hospitals using a 5-star scale. They also provide comprehensive information on most U.S. doctors including their education and training, hospital affiliations, board certification, awards and recognitions, professional misconduct, disciplinary action and malpractice records, office locations and insurance plans.

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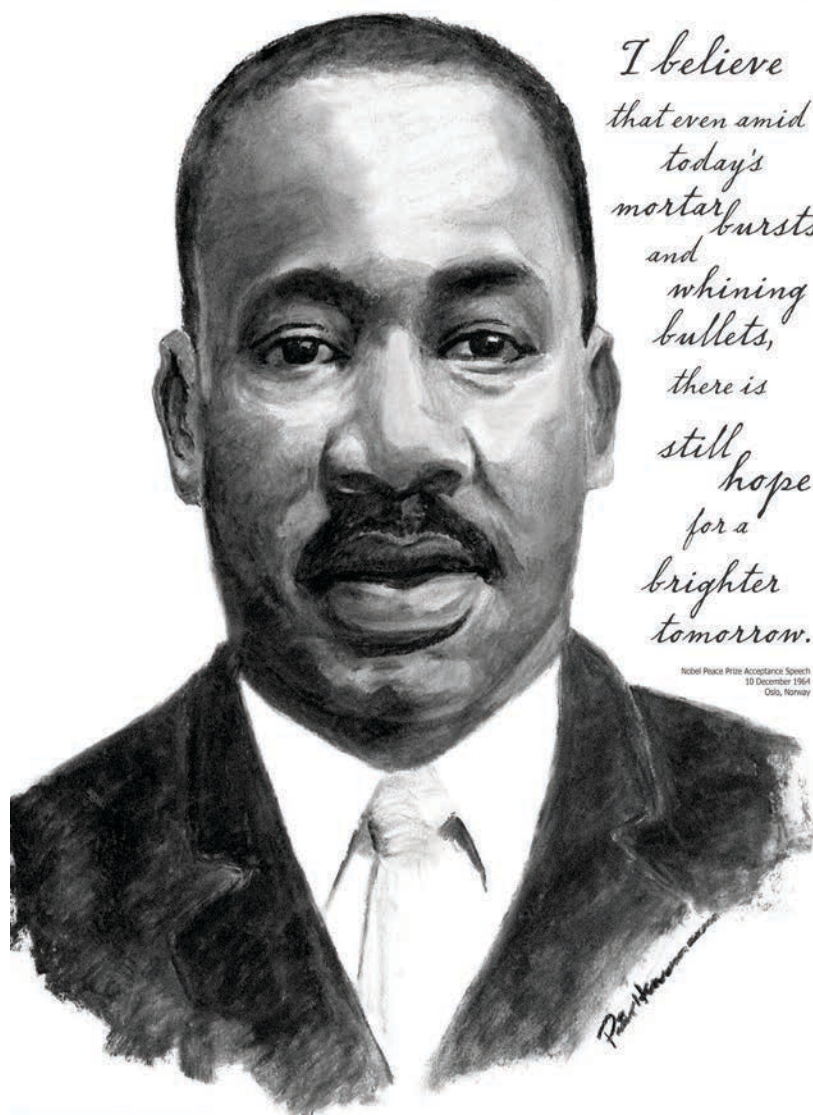

TALKING TO MY DAUGHTER ABOUT WAR & 'MEGAFIRES'



long before she's driving herself. I treasure these moments.

"So," I asked her. "How was school today?"

Her response stopped me cold, but I guess I shouldn't have been surprised.

With the dogs of war straining at the leash, the missiles flying in Iran, and our bellicose and unstable commander-in-chief lurching from one scarcely believable justification to the next, the prospect of another American forever war on the other side of the globe didn't seem all that far-fetched.

First up, I disabused her of the notion that any of her classmates might be drafted, reassuring her that there was no such movement afoot on Capitol Hill. Nor would there likely ever be one. The American military remains an all-volunteer force comprised not of the nation's elite, but of the sons and daughters of Main Street America. Trump's voters. Some of my daughter's classmates – if they ever heed the call to serve – may well be among them.

She seemed relieved at that news. Talking to her about the threat of climate change was another matter entirely.

It seemed to me there were decades remaining before the Earth might ever be rendered uninhabitable because of climate change, I offered. Which didn't mean that we shouldn't do all we can right now, I added.

"But Australia is burning," she countered, her brown eyes wide with alarm, anger creeping into the edges of her voice.

She had me there. I'd seen the photos of scorched koalas and dead kangaroos. The endless walls of flame. It's difficult to find the words to describe the scale, and the scope, of the ecological and human catastrophe that's unfolding on the other side of the world.

As of this writing, NPR was reporting that a hellish "megafire" comprising an unfath-

omable 1.5 million acres, an area three times larger than any known brush fire in California, had taken shape in New South Wales and Victoria, the country's most populous states.

That's on top of the 135 bushfires in south-eastern Australia that have left at least 26 people dead, killed more than 1 billion animals and damaged or destroyed nearly 3,000 homes.

Writing in the New York Times, columnist Paul Krugman observed that, in a more rational time, the fires, which have been partially a result of climate change, "would have represented a turning point."

"After all, it's exactly the kind of catastrophe climate scientists long warned us to expect if we didn't take action to limit greenhouse gas emissions," he wrote. "In fact, a 2008 report commissioned by the Australian government predicted that global warming would cause the nation's fire seasons to begin earlier, end later, and be more intense – starting around 2020."

And all this got me to thinking about the world that we're bequeathing to my daughter and her classmates.

While much is better about the planet, there's still much to be concerned about. And the threat of an uninhabitable globe should lead us to a united search for solutions, not juvenile taunts hurled at a teenager by one of the most powerful people on Earth. Even one dead child in an elementary school classroom should motivate us to find ways to reduce violence, not watch hopelessly as more bodies pile up.

I'm still firm in my belief that it's not too late for us to shrug off all that divides us, and to work together to fight these existential threats.

But that means having a nation that engages with the global community not denigrates it; one that rejects the false choice that less gun violence somehow means fewer rights; and one that doesn't stare each over the trenches, each irrevocably convinced that its way is the only way.

My daughter – and all our children – deserve far better answers than the ones we've been giving them.

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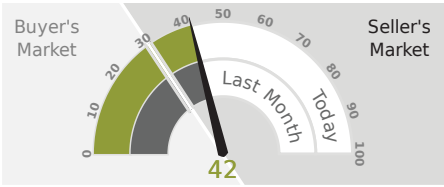

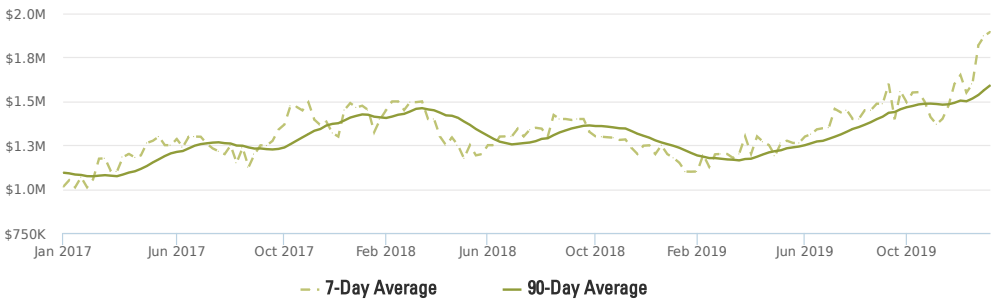
MARKET ACTION INDEX

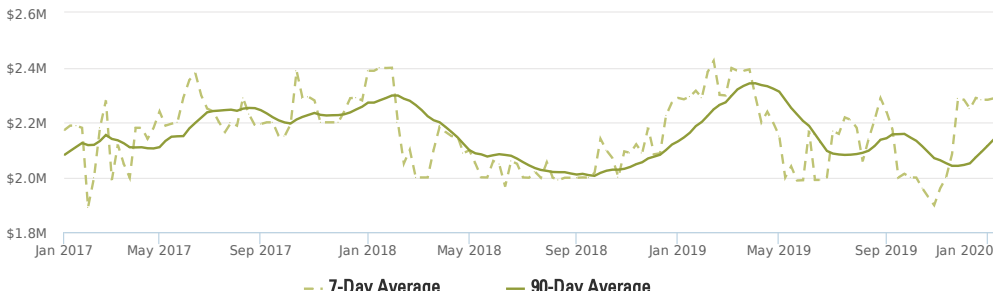
MARKET ACTION INDEX
