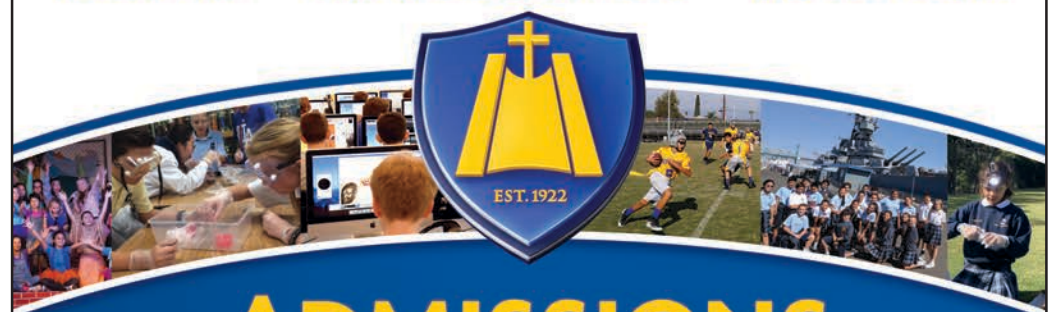

Department Appoints First Female Deputy Chief



Pasadena Police Department announced Tuesday that Chief of Police John Perez has appointed Cheryl Moody to the rank of Deputy Chief. The Deputy Chief will begin in her new role on Feb. 17. Deputy Chief Moody is the first woman in the police department's more than 130-year history to serve as deputy chief.

Deputy Chief Moody was hired as a police officer with Pasadena Police Department in 1992 after serving three years in the United States Air Force and working four years with the Long Beach Police Department. Deputy Chief Moody possesses nearly three decades of policing experience, leading many high-performing teams over the years, including the Special Enforcement Section. She has served on Pasadena Police Department's Executive Command Staff for five years and has held executive board positions with local and national chapters of The National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE). Deputy Chief Moody is currently serving as the president of the Los Angeles County Chapter of Women Leaders in Law Enforcement (WLLE).

Deputy Chief Moody will oversee all of Pasadena Police Department's daily operations, as well as the department's special projects, while continuing the department's reorganization efforts.

State of the City 2020 Looks Bright

Braking from past tradition, Pasadena Mayor Terry Tornek, last week, spent most of his annual State of the City on non-budgetary issues including the Arroyo Seco, 710 Freeway Gap, cannabis retail stores and homelessness among others. Tornek devoted the first 10 minutes to finances.

The first non budget issue he discussed was the "demise," through state legislation, of the connection between the 710 and the 210 freeways.

"we can... begin to address in earnest the future of the terrible ditch inflicted on our city..." he said. "This is a legacy land use planning effort with all kinds of legal, design and planning issues. But it will result in recapturing approximately 50 acres in the heart of our city for productive uses."

He also said Metro had allocated \$250 million to build a grade separation of the Gold Line and California Blvd, "This is a big, complicated project. It will require much public discussion, careful planning, and sensitive design."

Tornek said the grade separation would improved access to Huntington Memorial Hospital.

The second non budget issue was the Arroyo.

The County of Los Angeles has agreed to provide \$2.5 million to the Army Corps of

Engineers to restart a large scale habitat restoration study for the Arroyo, Tornek said.

"This, like the discussion of the recapture of the 710 right of way, is a long term project, he said. "However, the Arroyo Advisory Group has evolved into the non-profit One Arroyo Foundation which has begun to raise funds to implement the recommended demonstration trails project."

Tornek said last year's homeless count was down 20 percent, but there are still over 300 people sleeping on Pasadena's streets every night. This year's homeless count for 2020 took place Tuesday night.

He also said the application and selection process for legal cannabis sales is underway and the city hopes that some retail stores will be operational this year.

On finances, Tornek said "new development and rising property values will continue to be our primary source of revenue and revenue gains."

His proposal is a combination of building reserves and investing in capital improvements. "This is the strategy that we adopted with the \$11million surplus generated by Measure I this year."

When asked during a question and answer about new development "pricing" residents out of the city, he said, "what we have attempted to do is chance our policies... Pasadena

has an inclusionary housing ordinance... any new residential housing development has to have at least 20 percent of the units devoted to affordable housing, we just bumped that up from 15 percent."

Tornek said overall General Fund Revenues were approximately \$275 million, up from \$245 million last year.

"The four biggest individual sources which account for more than half of that Revenue remain:

Property Tax = \$69.7 million-up \$5M from last year; Sales Tax = \$55.8 million - way up from \$35.0 million last year largely due to Measure I; Utility Users Tax = \$27.5million and Transient Occ. Tax [hotels] = \$18.3 million-up from \$17.5 million, he said. "Everything else, charges, fees, unpredictable intergovernmental transfers = \$103.6 million."

Tornek said there were several things that could have a large positive impact on city revenue, like "additional hotels, significant tax revenue from on-line sales, and restored Federal or State funding."

He also said that the city's contribution to the employee retirement system, CalPERS, has received a lot of attention and is projected to top out in FY 2024 at 14.3 percent of the General Fund Budget.

Robert Miller President of 2021 Tournament of Roses

As students visualize their future, education becomes the bridge to accomplish their aspirations and transform lives for generations to come."

Miller has been a volunteer member of the Pasadena Tournament of Roses Association since 1984. He was appointed a Tournament Chair in 2002 and a Tournament Director in 2007. Throughout his extensive Tournament career, Miller has served on and chaired various committees including Float Construction, Float Entries, Post Parade and University Entertainment.

Professionally, Miller has been a Community College educator, administrator and consultant for more than 40 years and recently retired to provide fulltime service to the Tournament of Roses. In 2016, Miller was appointed to the position of Vice Chancellor for Finance and Resource Development for the Los Angeles Community College District, the largest community college district in the country serving 245,000 students annually through nine colleges. Miller provided oversight for the District's fiscal services, business services, government relations, institutional advancement, career and technical education, adult education and information technology units.

Prior to the Los Angeles Community College District, Miller came from the Pasadena Area Community College District



(Pasadena City College) where he served in several positions including Interim Superintendent/President of Pasadena City College (PCC).

His last position with PACCD was as the Assistant Superintendent and Senior Vice President of Business and College Services responsible for the college's fiscal services, business services, human resources, information technology, facilities and construction management, police and safety services, institutional research and auxiliary services units. Miller's association with PCC began in 1975, when he produced an Emmy nominated telecourse for the college. Over two terms of service spanning a combined 22 years, Miller held a variety of positions at Pasadena City College including adjunct faculty member, Production Manager of Instructional Television Services, Manager of Media Services, Associate Dean, Learning Resources, Academic Services Dean, Vice President, Educational Services, Assistant Superintendent and Senior Vice President, Business and College Services and Interim Superintendent/President.

From 1990 to 2005, Miller held vice president level positions in development and marketing with INTELECOM, a national leader in the production of educational television and distance learning courses owned by 38 California Community Colleges. Miller holds an associate degree in telecommunications from Pasadena City College, a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of La Verne, a master's degree in Public Administration from California State University, Northridge and a doctorate in Public Administration from the University of La Verne.

Miller and his wife, Barbara, have lived in the Pasadena area since 1969.

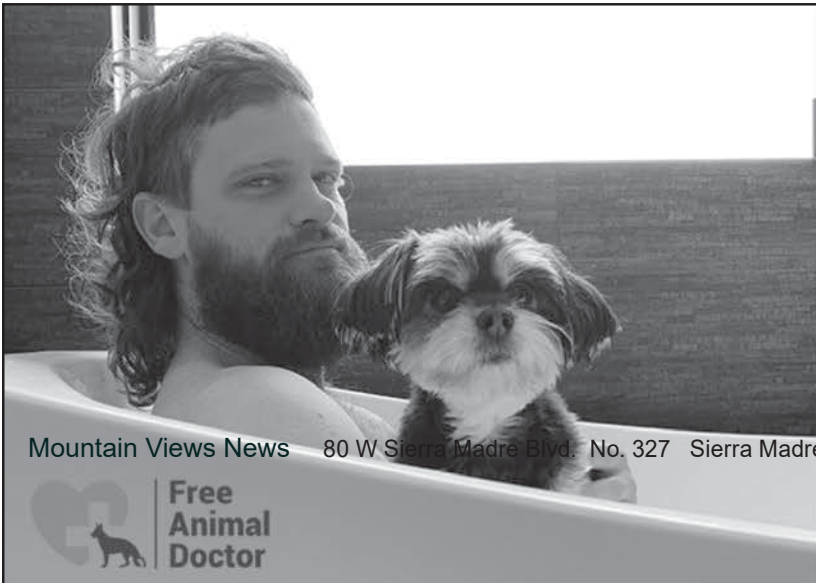

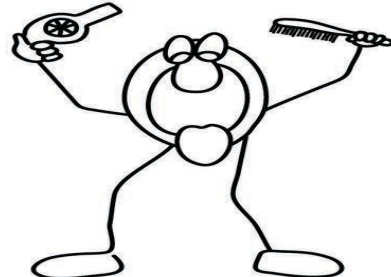



Stopped by Craft, on the north side of Sierra Madre Blvd., across from Tropical Nail Salon, to see what was going on as their usual display of colorful yarns of different textures and types was not happening in the front window. Well, here's something I didn't know and maybe you didn't either, they rent out their entire facility for parties, a great one had just happened, and the talented Craft folks, Mike and Arianna, were regrouping and gearing up for the classes scheduled for the coming week. They've even got a class for vulgar embroidery (giggle..) in addition to water colors, crochet, macramé, knitting and all sorts of other craft things to try. You can have a private lesson or take a class and plan to have a good time. Lots of kid's things, too. If you haven't been in there, take a look! When you say "diner", one thinks of those train-like Airstream coach dive restaurants from 60's New Jersey fame, so when I was told to check out the food at Cindy's in Eagle Rock... well, you can understand my reluctance. My readers are a creative and demanding lot, and the thought of disappointing you lurked in the back of my mind. I have driven past Cindy's at least a hundred times to reach one of my favorite restaurants, Colombo's, just down the street, without even a glance at this place, but today that all changed.



My first impression was a good one. It wasn't a dive. And everyone was working in rhythm as they tended to the packed house. I could see immediately that this was a homestyle environment made for the eclectic new Eagle Rock residents. My party of two decided to sit at the counter, being this truly is a diner. Within seconds, we were greeted and served water with a huge side of good attitude. Then, there was the menu. And all the choices! I focused on something new and different called Crab Hash, and my partner in food crime chose the Eggs Benedict topped with Pesto. Pesto for breakfast? You bet!

You'd maybe think that a packed house at 10:30am on a Sunday would bring so-so food, but no - our food came out hot, and in a very acceptable time frame. The Crab Hash was terrific. There was nothing stingy about the amount of crab or potatoes in the hash, and I was pleasantly surprised with the quantity and quality! My dining partner elected to go green and have the Green Goddess omelet, with the homestyle potatoes that were a little crispy. The plating was pleasant and the portion quite large. He went crazy for the homemade pesto that put this dish on his "have again" list, and said that the amount was perfect for making you want more. I also ordered the homemade chocolate cake and coconut lime pie to go (review on that to follow!).

ARCADIA POLICE BLOTTER

The review period for the General Plan and Downtown Specific Plan has been extended to Feb. 12 in order to give the community additional time to review and share input on the plan.

"We are looking forward to feedback from our residents that will guide the development of our General Plan and Downtown Specific Plan," said City Manager Stephanie DeWolfe. "These documents will strategically plan for community needs and desires for years to come."

As part of the General Plan and Downtown Specific Plan review process, the City will host two additional community meetings to provide an overview of how the plans will guide future land use and resource decisions, review changes to the draft plans and gather community feedback.

In addition, residents are invited to attend the regularly scheduled Planning Commission meetings between now and May 2020 to participate in an open forum regarding specific sections of the plan documents and provide additional feedback. The Planning Commission meetings take place on the second Tuesday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers (1414 Mission Street, South Pasadena).

All cities and counties in California are required to have and update a general plan to set forth each city's long-range policies and reflect the community's goals and values. The City of South Pasadena last updated its General Plan in 1998. The City's 2020 General Plan Update will guide key decisions over the next 20 years.

The draft documents were developed from extensive public input (workshops, focus groups, interviews, etc.) that was gathered over the course of 22 months. The public review period for the draft documents has been underway since early November 2019. During that time, the City has hosted three meetings to gain feedback from the public and will continue to engage the community during key milestones to ensure the final plans accurately reflect the community's vision for the future.

Senior Center Women's Basketball League Celebrates 10th Anniversary



The Pasadena Senior Center Women's Basketball League celebrated its 10th anniversary Jan. 12 at an outdoor gathering.

A decade ago, Pasadena resident Louise Jones, then 65 years old, had the idea of starting a basketball league of women 50 and older. After gathering other passionate hopefuls and proposing the idea to Pasadena Senior Center staff, the league was formed.

"All we wanted to do was play ball," said Jones, now an experienced post player in the half-court, 3-on-3 games. "How could you not want to do this? Meeting people and the games are so fun."

Through the years, curious rookies have been joined by former high school and college players, excited to uncork their competitive juices again and share their knowledge of the game. Guided by an infectious camaraderie, the group has remained true to its roots, ensuring that all skill levels feel welcome and safe.

Today the league offers three weekly open gyms, and many of the players also compete in the annual Pasadena Senior Games, sponsored by the Pasadena Senior Center. The games are a precursor every other year to the biennial National Senior Games.

More than 30 current players attended the Jan. 12 gathering to thank the founders and celebrate the joy – and sometimes therapeutic outlet – found on the hardwood court.

"Look at us," said Judy Marcelline, 58, a veteran of three National Senior Games. "We are all ballers in our hearts."

The league has also inspired onlookers and changed their perspectives of the intensity and abilities of older athletes. The thrill of a perfect backdoor pass or a three-point buzzer beater knows no age limit.

"It's the best part of turning 50," said one newly tournament-eligible player after reaching the mid-century mark. The 2021 National Senior Games (nsga.com) will be in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, and to be sure members of the Pasadena basketball league are already dreaming of victory.

Growing out of a tourist reputation founded on perfect winter weather, Pasadena has proved fertile ground for excellence in arts, culture, science and architecture. The winter term of The Masters Series, which embraces and promotes lifelong learning, will provide seven weeks of presentations and discussions that will explore interesting and surprising aspects of this small but complex city.

Individual talks are \$15 each for the general public. Members of the Pasadena Senior Center register for the full seven-week term for \$90.

Jan. 28: Building a Rose Parade Float – Tim Estes, president of Fiesta Parade Floats, will discuss the many facets of the float business, from design and oversight of construction to completed flower-festooned conveyances. Fiesta Parade Floats has received the highest number of awards in Rose Parade history.

Feb. 4: Pasadena and the Tournament of Roses Parade – Members of the Tournament of Roses Parade Committee will host a presentation about the past, present and future of this iconic, world-famous annual event created in 1890 as a way to show off the bounty of wintertime flowers in Pasadena.

Feb. 11: Designing Compelling Transportation for an Unpredictable World – Geoff Wardle, executive

director of the Transportation Systems and Design Department at Art Center College of Design, will explain design solutions for reshaping how people and goods will move from place to place in the future, and how ArtCenter is educating designers to lead the way.

Feb. 18: Pasadena Museum of History's Current Exhibition "Starting Anew: Transforming Pasadena, 1890-1930" – Brad Macneil, director of education at the Pasadena Museum of History and curator of the current exhibition, will share insights into the museum's exploration of a dynamic time in Pasadena's history when the population grew from fewer than 5,000 to more than 76,000 in the course of four decades, and the ways many of the characteristics now associated with Pasadena came to be during that period.

4 THINGS TRUSTS CAN DO THAT WILL'S CAN'T

Both wills and trusts are estate planning documents that can be used to pass your wealth and property to your loved ones upon your death. However, trusts come with some distinct advantages over wills that you should consider when creating your plan.

That said, when comparing the two planning tools, you won't necessarily be choosing between one or the other—most plans include both. Indeed, a will is a foundational part of every person's estate plan, but you may want to combine your will with a living trust to avoid the blind spots inherent in plans that rely solely on a will.

Here are four reasons you might want to consider adding a trust to your estate plan:

1. Avoidance of probate
One of the primary advantages a living trust has over a will is that a living trust does not have to go through probate. Probate is the court process through which assets left in your will are distributed to your heirs upon your death.

During probate, the court oversees your will's administration, ensuring your property is distributed according to your wishes, with automatic supervision to handle any disputes. Probate proceedings can drag out for months or even years, and your family will likely have to hire an attorney to represent them, which can result in costly legal fees that can drain your estate.

Bottom line: If your estate plan consists of a will alone, you are guaranteeing your family will have to go to court if you become incapacitated or when you die.

However, if your assets are titled properly in the name of your living trust, your family could avoid court altogether. In fact, assets held in a trust pass directly to your loved ones upon your death, without the need for any court intervention whatsoever. This can save your loved ones major time, money, and stress while dealing with the aftermath of your death.

2. Privacy
Probate is not only costly and time consuming, it's also public. Once in probate, your will becomes part of the public record. This means anyone who's interested can see the contents of your estate, who your beneficiaries are, as well as what and how much your loved ones inherit, making them tempting targets for frauds and scammers.

Using a living trust, the distribution of your assets can happen in the privacy of our office, so the contents and terms of your trust will remain completely private. The only instance in which your trust would become open to the public is if someone challenges the document in court.

3. A plan for incapacity
A will only governs the distribution of your assets upon your death. It offers zero protection if you become incapacitated and are unable to make decisions about your own medical, financial, and legal needs. If you become incapacitated with only a will in place, your family will have to petition the court to appoint a guardian to handle your affairs.

Like probate, guardianship proceedings can be extremely costly, time consuming, and emotional for your loved ones. And there's always the possibility that the court could appoint a family member you'd never want making such

critical decisions on your behalf. Or the court might even select a professional guardian, putting a total stranger in control of just about every aspect of your life.

With a living trust, however, you can include provisions that appoint someone of your choosing—not the court's—to handle your assets if you're unable to do so. Combined with a well-drafted medical power of attorney and living will, a trust can keep your family out of court and conflict in the event of your incapacity.

4. Enhanced control over asset distribution
Another advantage a trust has over just having a will is the level of control they offer you when it comes to distributing assets to your heirs. By using a trust, you can specify when and how your heirs will receive your assets after your death.


For example, you could stipulate in the trust's terms that the assets can only be distributed upon certain life events, such as the completion of college or purchase of a home. Or you might spread out distribution of assets over your beneficiary's lifetime, releasing a percentage of the assets at different ages or life stages.

In this way, you can help prevent your beneficiaries from blowing through their inheritance all at once and offer incentives for them to demonstrate responsible behavior. Plus, if the assets are held in trust, they're protected from the beneficiaries' creditors, lawsuits, and divorce, which is something else wills don't provide.

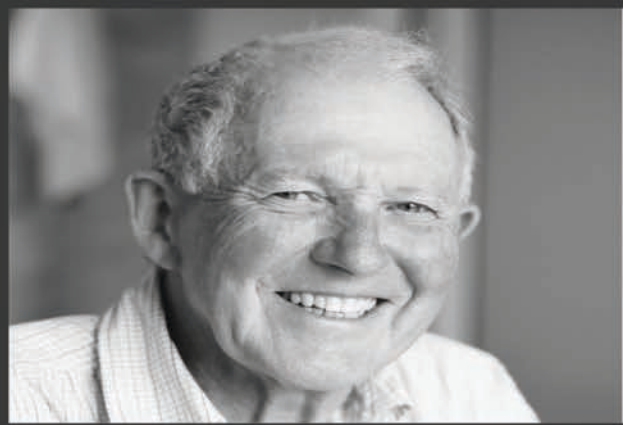
If, for some reason, you do not want a living trust, you can use a testamentary trust to establish trusts in your will. A testamentary trust will not keep your family out of court, but it can allow you to control how and when your heirs receive your assets after your death.

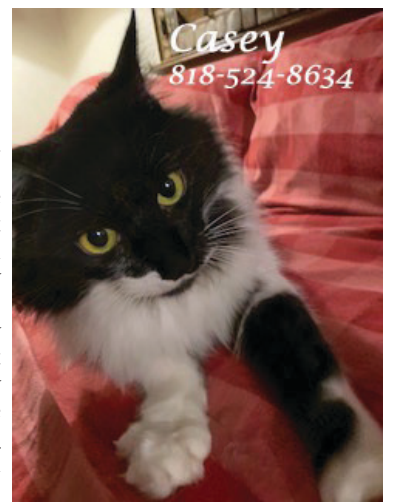

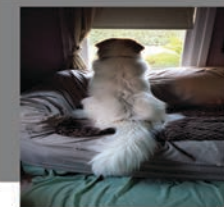

DO I HAVE TO FILE TAXES?

Dear Savvy Senior:

What are the IRS income tax filing requirements for seniors this year? I didn't file a tax return last year because my 2018 income was below the filing requirements, but I got a part-time job late last year in 2019, so I'm wondering if I need to file this year. Semi-Retired



Dear Semi:

Whether or not you are required to file a federal income tax return this year depends not only on how much you earned last year (in 2019), but also the source of that income, as well as your age and your filing status.

Here's a rundown of this tax season's IRS tax filing requirement thresholds. For most people, this is pretty straightforward. If your 2019 gross income – which includes all taxable income, not counting your Social Security benefits, unless you are married and filing separately – was below the threshold for your filing status and age, you may not have to file. But if it's over, you will.

- Single: \$12,200 (\$13,850 if you're 65 or older by Jan. 1, 2020).
- Married filing jointly: \$24,400 (\$25,700 if you or your spouse is 65 or older; or \$27,000 if you're both over 65).
- Married filing separately: \$12,200 at any age.
- Head of household: \$18,350 (\$20,000 if age 65 or older).
- Qualifying widow(er) with dependent child: \$24,400 (\$25,700 if age 65 or older).

To get a detailed breakdown on federal filing requirements, along with information on taxable and nontaxable income, call the IRS at 800-829-3676 and ask them to mail you a free copy of the "Tax Guide for Seniors" (publication 554) or see IRS.gov/pub/irs-pdf/p554.pdf.

Check Here Too

There are, however, some other financial situations that can require you to file a tax return, even if your gross income falls below the IRS filing requirements. For example, if you earned more than \$400 from self-employment in 2019, owe any special taxes like an alternative minimum tax, or get premium tax credits because you, your spouse or a dependent is enrolled in a Health Insurance Marketplace (Obamacare) plan, you'll need to file.

You'll also need to file if you're receiving Social Security benefits, and one-half of your benefits plus your other gross income and any tax-exempt interest exceeds \$25,000, or \$32,000 if you're married and filing jointly.

To figure all this out, the IRS offers an interactive tax assistant tool on their website that asks a series of questions that will help you determine if you're required to file, or if you should file because you're due a refund. It takes less than 15 minutes to complete.

You can access this tool at IRS.gov/help/ita – click on "Do I Need to File a Tax Return?" Or, you can get assistance over the phone by calling the IRS helpline at 800-829-1040. You can also get face-to-face help at a Taxpayer Assistance Center. See IRS.gov/localcontacts or call 800-829-1040 to locate a center near you.

Check Your State

Even if you're not required to file a federal tax return this year, don't assume that you're also excused from filing state income taxes. The rules for your state might be very different. Check with your state tax agency before concluding that you're entirely in the clear. For links to state tax agencies see Taxadmin.org/state-tax-agencies.

Tax Preparation Help

If you find that you do need to file a tax return this year, you can get help through the Tax Counseling for the Elderly (or TCE) program. Sponsored by the IRS, TEC provides free tax preparation and counseling to middle and low-income taxpayers, age 60 and older. Call 800-906-9887 or visit IRS.treasury.gov/freetaxprep to locate a service near you.

Also check with AARP, a participant in the TCE program that provides free tax preparation at more than 4,800 sites nationwide. To locate an AARP Tax-Aide site call 888-227-7669 or visit AARP.org/findtaxhelp. You don't have to be an AARP member to use this service.

Everybody in the community knew my grandmother. More than that, my grandmother knew everybody in the community, especially their secrets.

How she got to that place of being the Queen of Gossipers is something I have never put together. All I know is, she was.

According to some conversations I had with her friends, my grandmother knew what was happening two days before it actually happened. For the life of me, I don't know what that means. Nothing happened in the community that escaped my grandmother's attention.

Whether people needed my grandmother's permission to do something or not, I'm not quite sure. Whatever happened, she knew about it long before it happened.

If you wanted a rumor started, just visit my grandmother and whisper a confidential secret to her. Usually, by the time they got home, that secret was all over the community.

Often I have wondered if my grandmother knew that some people were using her. Then I wondered if some people knew how much she was using them.

At times, this was a little touchy. If a couple was getting engaged, everybody knew about it before they actually were engaged. How she managed that I don't know. She read a person like Will Rogers read the newspaper.

For her 90th birthday, some people in the community wanted to give her a surprise birthday party. They knew, however, it would be very difficult to surprise my grandmother.

Several of them met at a restaurant in the next town to work out some details. They came up with many different scenarios, but none seemed workable.

Then, one of the older women in the group came up with a plan that would out-gossip the Queen of Gossipers.

The plan was simply this. On a certain night, a group would meet at the church to develop a plan to fire their pastor. Everybody knew that grandmother loved her pastor to pieces. Anything like this would have gotten her dander up, and you do not want to do that.

The success of the plan depended upon the right person whispering this gossip to my grandmother. Otherwise, she would not really believe it.

The woman who came up with this was my grandmother's closest friend, and so she was chosen. If Grandmother would believe anybody, it would be this woman.

They made plans for the birthday party. How they got it to everybody without my grandmother knowing is in the same category as who killed JFK.

At the right time, this woman went to my grandmother and confidentially whispered the plan to fire her beloved pastor. "Now, don't let this get out to anybody; this is top secret."

Before the night ended, everybody in the community knew of the plan to "fire the pastor." On that night, people came early because it was supposed to be a surprise. It was a wonderful surprise. At the right time, my grandmother marched into that church, slammed open the door, and said as angrily as she had ever been, "How dare you fire my pastor?"

At that moment, everybody, including the pastor, burst into singing, "Happy Birthday to You." It took a few moments for my grandmother to understand what was really happening. When she finally realized what the meeting was really about, she laughed and said, "How did I miss this?"

As I listen to the woman telling me, the story I thought of what David said. "The secret of the Lord is with them that fear him; and he will shew them his covenant" (Psalm 25:14).

Some secrets, like God's love for me, should be spread far and wide and not kept a secret.

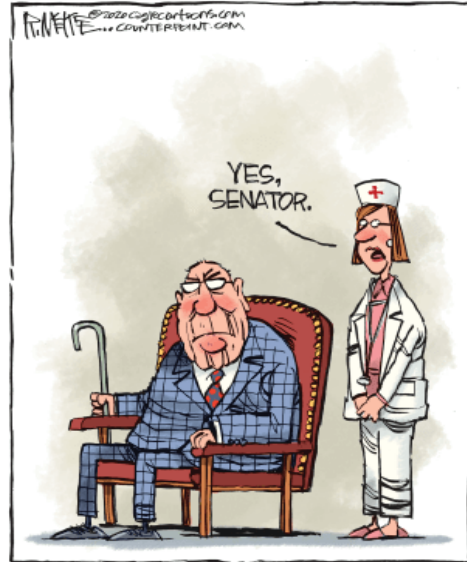
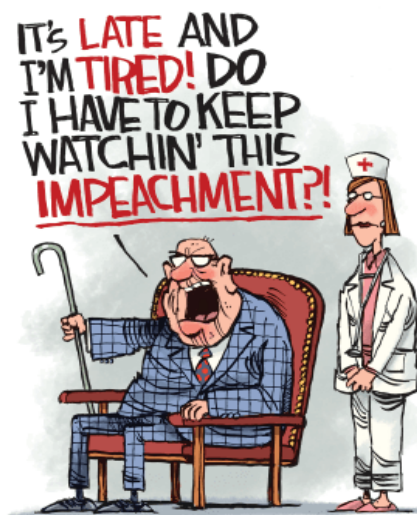

But here's the obvious rebuttal: "(Impeachment) certainly doesn't have to be a crime if you have somebody who completely corrupts the office of president and who abuses trust and poses great danger to our liberty. You don't need a technical crime."

Thank you, Alan Dershowitz! Because that's what he said on TV back in 1998, when he deemed Bill Clinton's extramarital sex to be sufficient grounds for impeachment.

The Founders never specified that impeachment and removal required a crime – because at the time the Constitution was being drafted, there was, as yet, no federal criminal code. Instead, the Founders anticipated that Congress – awarded the sole power of impeachment – would take its cues from Alexander Hamilton, who spoke broadly about "the misconduct of public men...the abuse or violation of some public trust."

Remember, last month, when Republicans were lauding law professor Jonathan Turley, who'd testified at the House hearings that he thought Democrats were moving too fast on impeachment? Well now Turley says that Trump's lawyers are wrong to claim that impeachment requires a crime. That claim "is at odds with history and the purpose of the Constitution...I do not believe that the criminal code is the effective limit or scope of possible impeachable offenses."

The gist of Trump's defense argument – the argument that Senate Republicans are destructively indulging – is that he can do whatever he wants, and that whatever he wants is sanctioned by divine right simply because he wants it. Who is he, King George III? That's the monarchist mindset that the American Revolution's soldiers fought and died to overthrow.

So now we've arrived at the end game. McConnell and his colleagues appear bent on ratifying Trump's power abuses, thereby destroying the checks and balances that are crucial to our constitutional order. The only hope is that Democrats – with the winds of public opinion at their backs – can hold Trump and the Senate Republicans accountable at the ballot box.

I warned in my 2016 pre-election column that a Trumpist future "is down the dark path at the fork in the road. If we take it, we own it." We took it, we own it, and the election 10 months hence is our last best chance to reverse it.

NEW RULES OF IMPEACHMENT

I must have said it a dozen times since the Democrats' impeachment miniseries took over our televisions, but I'll say it again.

The Democrats and their allies in the liberal media think history began this morning when they rolled out of the left side of their beds.

It happened again during the Democrats' opening impeachment tirades in the Senate.

Democrats are still wasting our time – and ignoring their jobs – trying to prove that President Trump should be impeached because he abused the power of his office and because he obstructed Congress by claiming executive privilege.

The obstruction charges against Trump are for refusing to let administration officials testify before the impeachment hearings in the House and for withholding documents the House had requested.

Well, if using or threatening to use executive privilege for those reasons are impeachable crimes, George Washington and every president since JFK, including my father, is guilty – often on multiple counts.

In 1962, for example, JFK used executive privilege to order his military adviser General Maxwell Taylor to refuse to testify before a congressional committee investigating the Bay of Pigs fiasco.

Between 1980 and 2012 it was used 25 times.

President Clinton, the all-time modern leader, asserted executive privilege 14 times to try to keep his staff from appearing before various grand juries and congressional committees.

George W. Bush used it six times, including in 2008 when he told his Attorney General to assert executive privilege in response to a congressional subpoena for documents related to an investigation into who outed Valerie Plame as a CIA operative.

Meanwhile, President Obama employed executive privilege so many times that even the liberal media of the day questioned the legitimacy of invoking it.

The prime example was the infamous "Fast and Furious" case in 2012, when Attorney General Eric Holder used executive privilege to shield documents from Congress that were related to the Obama administration's program to let illegally

purchased guns flow across the Mexican border.

Congress obviously didn't rush out and impeach those pre-Trump presidents for obstructing Congress or for posing an existential threat to the U.S. Constitution.

They let the legitimacy of invoking executive privilege in each case be decided in the courts, where it belonged. That's why we have three branches of government.

But now, thanks to the Democrats' blind hatred of President Trump, the bar has been lowered to where if a president doesn't immediately roll over and give Congress whatever people or documents it wants, he'll get impeached.

It's been frustrating having to watch the first three ridiculously long, tedious days of the Senate impeachment hearings, which Democrats are cynically using as a weapon to stain Trump ahead of the 2020 election and hurt some Republican senators who face tight races in the fall.

Everyone has known for months what the outcome of the House Democrats' impeachment show trial will be – the Republican Senate will never find Trump guilty.

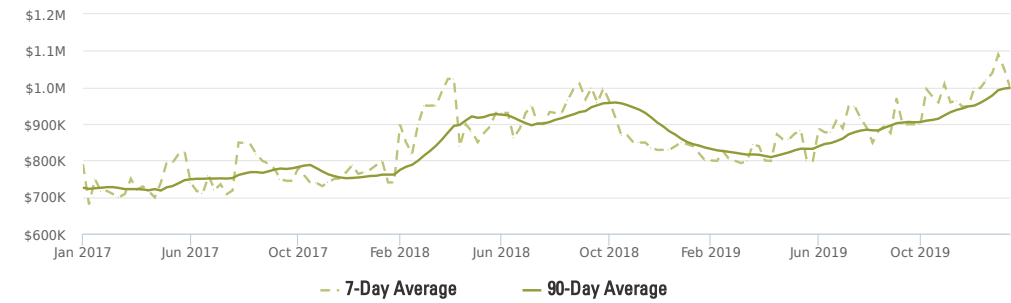

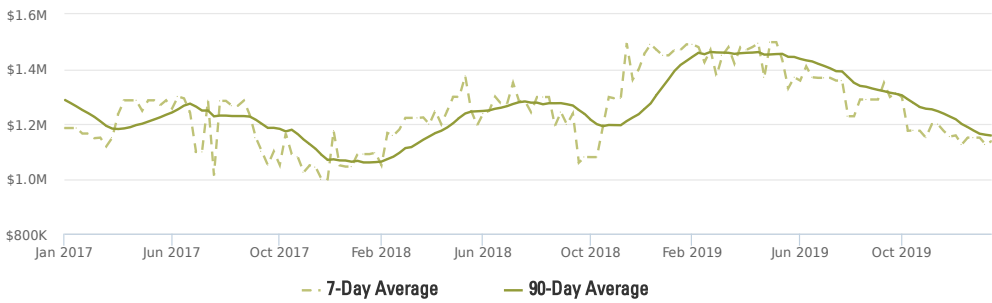
