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## CITY OF SIERRA MADRE DECLARES STATE OF EMERGENCY



On Tuesday, March 17, 2020, an special meeting of the Sierra Madre City Council took place to address the issue of declaring a local state of emergency in response to the COVID-19 Virus. At the recommendation of staff, the council unanimously voted to declare such an emergency. A summary of the action is listed below: (From staff report)

On March 16, 2020, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health ordered:

### SUMMARY OF THE COUNTY ORDER: (From Staff Report)

During a State of Emergency, California law empowers the County of Los Angeles Health Officer (Health Officer) to take measures necessary to protect the public from the spread of the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) within the County of Los Angeles. In accordance with the Centers for Disease Control's (CDC) Interim Guidance for Large Events and Mass Gatherings (March 15, 2020); the California Department of Public Health's Mass Gathering Guidance (March 11, 2020); and Governor Newsom's Guidance Regarding Bars and Restaurants (March 15, 2020), the Health Officer is ordering significant protective measures to stem or slow the spread of COVID-19 within the greater Los Angeles community. Because of the rapid spread of COVID-19 and the need to protect the most vulnerable members of our community, this Order prohibits all indoor public and private gatherings

and all outdoor public and private events within a confined space, where at least 50 people are expected to be in attendance at the same time. This Order applies within the County of Los Angeles Public Health Jurisdiction, beginning March 16, 2020 and continues through March 31, 2020, subject to the terms and conditions more particularly set forth below.

For all gatherings that are not prohibited, the Health Officer orders the event and gathering holders and venues to implement the following infection control precautions: (1) enforce social distancing within the confined space by requiring attendees to be separated by six (6) feet; (2) provide access to hand washing facilities with soap and water or hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol; (3) post a sign in a conspicuous place at the public entry to the venue instructing members of the public to not attend if they are experiencing symptoms of respiratory illness, including fever or cough; and (4) adhere to communicable disease control recommendations provided by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health.

Further, this Health Officer Order, requires all permanent food facilities to limit their services to only preparing and offering food to customers via delivery service, via pick up for take-out dining only, or via drive thru. This Order immediately requires closing the following types of businesses:

- (1) Bars and Nightclubs that do not serve food.
- (2) Gyms and Fitness Centers.
- (3) Movie Theaters, Live Performance Theaters, Bowling Alleys, and Arcades

The County Health Officer will continue to monitor CO VID-19 disease spread, State and CDC recommendations, and the impact of the required measures, and as needed, may revisit, extend, expand, or otherwise modify this Order to protect the public's health. (cont. page 3)

## COMMUNITY OUTRAGE OVER FIRING OF POPULAR PRINCIPAL

### Parents, Teachers, Students and Friends Keep Their Social Distance While Voicing Their Concerns

Just when parents at schools across the country thought things could not get any worse with the uncertainty of the Corona Virus, for those who attend, teach and support St Rita School in Sierra Madre, things definitely did. On Monday, March 16, Father Tom Baker, Pastor of St Rita Church, abruptly ended Principal JoAnne Harabedian's 30 year career at the school to the anger, consternation and dismay of many parents, teachers, parishioners and students. Approximately 100 supporters protested around the school after Father Tom Baker demonstrated what many parents have called, "An Attempt To Lead By Force", when he

word leaked out of Baker's intention not to renew the principal's contract, teachers and staff and students displayed support for Mrs. Harabedian by posting banners and red ribbons at the school. Such demonstrations were said to have been met with disdain by Fr. Baker, and according to one staff member, Baker refused to meet with them regarding their concerns. It has also been said by numerous sources that he accused Harabedian of orchestrating the activities. There are currently two websites online in support of dismissed principal.

Mrs. Harabedian, in a brief interview with the paper on Friday, indicated when asked that she had "absolutely nothing"

As the termination of any employee is confidential matter, given Mrs. Harabedian's history with the school and ties to the community, supporters are livid at her termination and in the way it was handled.

## RODRICK ARMALIN APPOINTED SIERRA MADRE'S POLICE CHIEF

*Henry Amos promoted to Captain*

Rodrick Armalin has been selected to serve as the next Chief of Police for the City of Sierra Madre. Chief Armalin comes to Sierra Madre with over 30 years experience in law enforcement with the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department. Armalin's extensive background is in community oriented policing, emergency management and preparedness, mass trauma event response, and homelessness.

City Manager Gabriel Engeland stated "we are very excited for Chief Armalin to join our team. He brings incredible experience to the City, is community focused, and is committed to developing the members of the Police Department."

Armalin's most current position with Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department was as Unit Commander of the College Bureau where he managed 176 personnel who provided all law enforcement services to nine community colleges that make up the largest community college district in the nation. After serving in the United States Air Force, Armalin joined the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and graduated top of his police academy class, receiving the Department's prestigious Honor Recruit Award.

From a small town in Louisiana, and primarily reared in Los Angeles, when asked why he chose law enforcement as a career, he shared his experiences as an impressionable young man and his admiration for the police officers in his LA neighborhood.

He is an advocate of 'open dialogue and is looking forward to serving the residents of Sierra Madre. Chief Armalin said, "I am extremely excited about working with the men and women of Sierra Madre Police Department, and eagerly anticipating meeting and becoming a member of this wonderful community!"

Armalin is filling the position left vacant by Interim Police Chief Jim Hunt, who has been in place since April 2019.

In addition to the appointment of Police Chief, the City has also promoted Sergeant Henry Amos to the rank of Police Captain. Amos' career with the agency began as a Reserve Officer. In 2002 he was hired as a full-time police officer and promoted to Sergeant in 2017. Since Amos joined Sierra Madre Police Department he has worked as a Field Training Officer, Police Detective, and Acting Lieutenant. Captain Amos' promotion is immediate. City Manager Engeland said "Captain Amos has done exceptional work for the City and Sierra Madre Police Department

and his promotion is well-earned."

Captain Amos said "I accept my new position with great pride and dedication to the residents and businesses of Sierra Madre. I look forward to working with Chief Armalin in further developing the department and working closely with the community."

Both Armalin and Amos are making history as the first African Americans to hold their respective positions in Sierra Madre.

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## EMERGENCY (continued)

Violation of or failure to comply with this Order is a crime punishable by fine, imprisonment, or both. (California Health and Safety Code §120295; Los Angeles County Code§ 11.02.080.)

In response to the orders issued by State and County agencies, the City activated its Emergency Operating Center (EOC) on Friday, March 13, 2020. The EOC continues to remain active and there is no immediate plan to close the EOC.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIERRA MADRE, CALIFORNIA, PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY DUE TO THE OUTBREAK OF COVID-19

WHEREAS, in December 2019, a novel coronavirus known as SARS-CoV-2 was first detected in Wuhan, Hubei Province, People's Republic of China, causing outbreaks of the coronavirus disease COVID-19 that has now spread globally;

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency in response to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency to exist in California as a result of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, the Chair of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors and the Los Angeles County Health Officer declared a local emergency and a local health emergency, respectively, as a result of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom's signed Executive Order N- 25-20 giving state and local public health officials the authority to issue guidance limiting or recommending limitations upon attendance at public assemblies, conferences or other mass events;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, President Donald Trump declared a national emergency as a result of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom called for the closure of all bars, pubs, and wineries in the State and restrictions on restaurants;

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, the Los Angeles County Health Officer issued Health

Officer Order for the Control of COVID-19, which seeks to limit residents' exposure by ordering the closure of certain private facilities;

WHEREAS, despite sustained efforts, COVID-19 remains a threat, and further efforts to control the spread of the virus to reduce and minimize the risk of infection are needed; and

WHEREAS, the spread of COVID-19 and its consequences are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the City of Sierra Madre;

WHEREAS, the mobilization of local resources, the ability to coordinate interagency response, accelerate procurement of vital supplies, use mutual aid, and allow for future reimbursement by the state and federal governments will be critical to successfully respond to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, these conditions warrant and necessitate that the City proclaim the existence of a local emergency.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIERRA MADRE, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Recitals. The City Council finds that all of the preceding recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated and adopted as findings and determinations by the City Council as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2. Proclamation. Pursuant to Government Code section 8630,

subdivision (a), the City Council proclaims a local emergency due to the outbreak of COVID-19.

SECTION 3. Regulation of Public Gatherings. Commencing immediately, all City departments are directed to postpone or cancel all non-essential public community events or group activities in City-owned properties that require close contact and involve ten or more participants.

SECTION 4. Regulation of Public Facilities. Commencing immediately, all City departments are directed to close all non-essential City-owned facilities that require close contact of vulnerable individuals, including those over 60 years old or with compromised immune systems.

SECTION 5. Emergency

Authority. Pursuant to Government Code section 8634, the City Council authorizes the City Manager to take any measures necessary to protect and preserve public health and safety, including activation of the Emergency Operations Center.

SECTION 6. Public Health Officials. The City Council authorizes the City Manager to implement any guidance, recommendations, or requirements imposed by state and local public health officials.

SECTION 7. Termination. Pursuant to Government Code section 8630,

subdivision (d), the City Council will proclaim the termination of the emergency at the earliest possible date that conditions warrant.

SECTION 8. Review. Pursuant to Government Code section 8630, subdivision (c), the City Council will review the need for continuing the local emergency at each City Council meeting following this Resolution, but in no event later than 60 days from the previous declaration or review, until the City Council terminates the local emergency.

SECTION 9. Cost Accounting. City staff will begin accounting for their time and expenses related to addressing the local emergency caused by COVID-19.

SECTION 10. Cost Recovery. The City will seek recovery for the cost of responding to COVID-19, as this proclamation is made within 10 days of the Governor's Executive Order N- 25-20 and the President's declaration of a national emergency, qualifying the City for assistance under the California Disaster Assistance Act and for reimbursement from the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

SECTION 11. Submissions. The City Clerk will transmit a copy of this Resolution at the earliest opportunity to the Los Angeles County Operational Area and the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services.

SECTION 12. Certification. The City Clerk will certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and its approval by the City Council and shall cause the same to be listed in the records of the City.

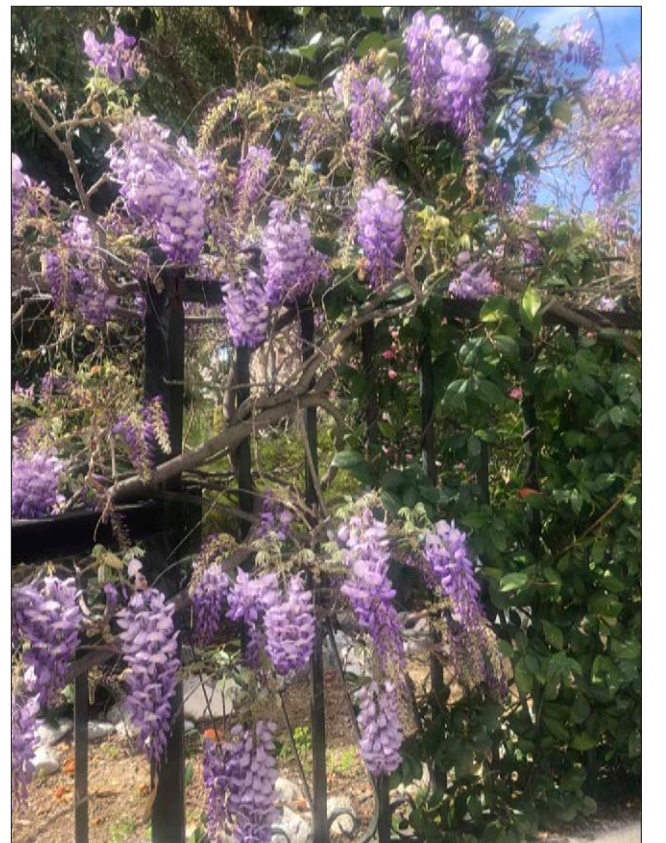

attempted to address some of the concerns expressed by parents and staff on March 17th. However his attempts to explain his actions appeared to have inspired even more anger ([www.keeppmrsh.com](http://www.keeppmrsh.com)). Attempts to reach Father Baker for an interview were unsuccessful.

Without a doubt, Joanne Harabedian is a well respected and much admired Principal and Sierra Madre community member. She began her relationship with St Rita School in 1981. She has been described as an 'innovative teacher and administrator' and became Principal in 2007. She has been credited with establishing "a respectful, collaborative culture of growth to ensure the existence of a vibrant Catholic school for present and future generations", says one website of supporters. It is a fact that her accomplishments during her tenure with the school have been many. St Rita School was named to the top 10% of Catholic schools within the Archdiocese of Los Angeles on the last published report on school rankings. Since she became principal enrollment has climbed steadily, increasing 6% from 2006-2020 while other private school enrollment in Los Angeles County is down 33.3% per the Sacramento Bee in 2018.

Under Mrs. Harabedian, educational achievement has also improved. According to the Archdiocese

of Los Angeles Department of Catholic School Standards, St Rita students exceed the overall benchmark for students (currently 50% statewide) achieving well above the ADLA standard: 62% of St Rita students are above the standard in Reading

87% of our students are above the standard in Math

Supporters say she is reminds parents and staff "every day that we are here for the kids." So their question is, "why the termination and why did you handle it in such a humiliating manner at such a stressful time for all?"

Coincidentally perhaps, the termination was made on the same day that Archbishop Gomez announced the Suspension of Masses for the Church amid the COVID-19 Pandemic and after Mrs. Harabedian informed parents of the schools closure on the 16<sup>th</sup> and that the newly developed plan for Home Study would begin on March 17<sup>th</sup>. Supporters as well as those who don't have a particular interest at all are asking, 'Why now?'

Joanne Harabedian was honored as the San Gabriel Valley Woman of Distinction in 2018 among many other honors over the years. She is an alumni of Alverno Heights Academy and also mother of former Sierra Madre Mayor John Harabedian, a St Rita School alumni.

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## Second COVID-19 Case in Pasadena

The City of Pasadena Public Health Department (PPHD) has confirmed Monday a second case of novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19) in a Pasadena resident. The details of the case were still under investigation Friday.

## Mayor Makes Plea to the Community

*City Council Approves COVID-19 Relief Measures*

Pasadena Mayor Terry Tornek (pictured left) made his first appearance Thursday night after traveling back from a trip to Pasadena’s sister city, Dakar-Plateau, Senegal in Africa. Tornek called the new “Safer at Home Order,” (see story right) disruptive, onerous, draconian but necessary.

“I ask for everyone’s cooperation and I ask everyone’s good will,” he said. “Once again, I would emphasize that if you can think about your neighbor, if you have a senior that you think may have difficulty with shopping, ask them if you can get them anything when you go to the market... Let’s reinstate the since of community we have in California, make sure we lookout for each other and I’m confident that with everyone pulling in the same direction that we can beat this thing.”

Tornek spoke during a COVID-19 press conference for Los Angeles County that included Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti, Long Beach Mayor Robert Garcia (pictured right) and L.A. County Supervisor Kathryn Barger. The event was covered nationwide.

In Related News. The Pasadena city council held a special meeting, Tuesday, to receive an update on the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic from Pasadena Public Health Director, Dr. Ying-Ying Goh, ratify the recent Local State of Emergency Declaration, and consider relief measures to reduce the economic impacts on residents and businesses.

Council approved the following actions during the meeting:

1. Suspension of any new late fees and penalties for City-provided services, including water, power and garbage pickup.
2. Suspension of any new all utility shut-offs for non-



payment;  
3. Modification of various parking policies to reduce the financial burden on residents and support local businesses, including:

- Temporary suspension of metered parking enforcement to facilitate delivery and curbside pickup zones for food from restaurants.
- Temporary suspension of non-critical vehicle impounds; and
- Temporary suspension of impounds of vehicles with five (5) or more past-due parking citations or expired registrations.

4. Approval of \$150,000 to provide meals to for seniors, as well as disabled and other vulnerable citizens.

5. Enactment of a moratorium on eviction for non-payment of rent if a residential or commercial tenant has been impacted by COVID-19 and, therefore, unable to pay.

During her comments, Dr. Goh stated it’s likely that more cases of COVID-19 exist in the community, and she stressed the vital need for residents to follow social distancing guidelines (keeping

a safe distance of at least six feet between one another when possible) to reduce community transmission and avoid hospitals from becoming overwhelmed with new COVID-19 cases.

Our “Shelter Shop” for retail pet supplies will be closed to the public. Pet Boarding will not be accepting any new appointments at this time.

## Pasadena Officials Issues 'Safer at Home' Order

In concert with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, Pasadena Health Officer Dr. Ying-Ying Goh Thursday issued a new proclamation regarding the COVID-19 outbreak. The purpose of this order is to prohibit public and private events or gatherings of 10 or more people, and require the closure of malls, shopping centers, children’s playgrounds, and non-essential retail businesses in an effort to stem or slow the spread of COVID-19 within the Pasadena community. View full text of Safer at Home Order.

For all gatherings that are not prohibited, the health officer orders those persons attending an event or gathering and the venues holding the event or gathering implement the following infection control precautions:

- (1) Practice social distancing within the confined space by requiring attendees to be separated by six (6) feet;
- (2) Provide access to hand-washing facilities with soap and water or hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol;
- (3) Post a sign in a conspicuous place at the public entry to the venue instructing members of the public to not attend if they are experiencing symptoms of respiratory illness, including fever or cough; and
- (4) Adhere to communicable disease control recommendations provided by the Pasadena Public Health Department.

As a point of clarity, this order does not prohibit any individual or family from outdoor activities such as hiking, walking, and shopping

at essential businesses—including grocery stores and restaurants—so long as all persons practice social distancing to the extent practicable.

Because of the rapid spread of COVID-19 and the need to protect everyone, including the most vulnerable members of our community, this order prohibits all indoor public and private gatherings and all outdoor public and private events within a confined space, where at least 10 people are expected to be in attendance at the same time. This order applies through April 19, subject to the terms and conditions more particularly set forth below.

The Pasadena Public Health Department will continue to monitor the rate of COVID-19 disease spread, state and CDC recommendations, and the impact of the required measures, and the health officer may revisit, extend, expand, or otherwise modify this order as needed to protect the public’s health.

“The health and safety of our community remains our top concern,” said City Manager Steve Mermell. “Given the rapid spread of COVID-19, having people stay at home and avoid non-essential activities is the most effective way to prevent more infections. This order is necessary if we’re going to save lives and keep hospitals from being overwhelmed with new cases.”

Violation of or failure to comply with this order is a crime punishable by fine, imprisonment, or both. (California Health and Safety Code § 120295; Los Angeles County Code § 11.02.080.)
