Friday, June 16, 2021 was a sad day for many in Sierra Madre. It was the day that popular employee retention by finding ways of making City Manager Gabriel 'Gabe' Engeland turned in his keys. He resigned his position with the city and has been appointed City Manager of Los Altos, California, a town that is about three times larger than Sierra Madre.

During his tenure in our town, he has accomplished a great deal. Since his arrival in 2017 the city has (partial listing):

Hired a great new Fire Chief, Brent Bartlett; Hired a great new Police Chief, Rodrick Armalin;

Transitioned the SM Fire Department from a volunteer department to a fully paid department;

Managed the certification of the SM Fire Department as a part of the Verdugo Mutual Aid group, something that the city had aspired to be for more than a decade;

Sierra Madre's Water Department has reduced it's water losses, made Investments in the city's Water Infrastructure Funding and improved the City's Water Department Credit Rating under his watch.

He encouraged promotions from within where possible; and he implemented a Pension Stablization Plan to protect their futures.

As for his fiscal prowess, he managed to keep a balanced budget. In fact, he is leaving the city with a \$2 million dollar surplus.

Gabe also was a master at handling the unique character of the town as residents and business owners alike, while they may not have always agreed with him, respected his efforts at transparency and his professional demeaner. t

SIERRA MADRE CITY COUNCIL APPOINTS **UTILITIES DIRECTOR JOSE REYNOSO TO** SERVE AS INTERIM CITY MANAGER



At their July 13, 2021 meeting the Sierra Madre City Council voted unanimously to appoint the City's Director of Utilities, Jose Reynoso to serve as Interim City Manager.

Mr. Reynoso will take over for City Manager Gabe Engeland who's final day in Sierra Madre will be July 16, 2021. Mr. Engeland announced his resignation in a City Council closed session on June 15, 2021 after serving 4.5 years at Sierra Madre's helm.

Mayor Arizmendi said, "The City Council is proud to appoint Jose Reynoso to serve as Sierra Madre's Interim City Manager. As the Director of Utilities, his leadership and ability to manage the department has proved to be exceptional over the years. Because of his high level of understanding of local government, his strong relationships with external stakeholders, and the respect he garners from the staff - he is well poised to take on this role."

Mr. Reynoso has served 25 years in public service with various cities, including the cities of El Monte, Alhambra, Monterey Park and Sierra Madre, Mr. Reynoso joined Park and Sierra Madre. Mr. Reynoso joined Sierra Madre in 2010.

'Jose Reynoso is an excellent choice to lead Sierra Madre as the Interim City Manager," said departing City Manager Gabriel Engeland. "He has established himself as a leader in the organization and on the City's Executive Team."

Director Reynoso holds a Bachelor's Degree in Business from the University of La Verne and is pursuing his Master's Degree in Management from the University of Illinois. He currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Raymond Basin Management Board, as well as being the City's Liaison Representative on the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District. Mr. Reynoso has been married to his high-school sweetheart Lourdes for 28 years. They have three adult children.

WITH DROUGHT **CONDITIONS INCREASING SIERRA** MADRE PLANS AHEAD

The City of Sierra Madre is expected to implement an Urban Water Management Plan (UWMP) and Water Shortage Contingency Plan (WSCP) as California, once again, is faced with drought conditions and hot temperatures in the midst the 2021 summer season.

The law, signed in 1987, requires cities that have 3,000 or more water source connections to have a UWMP in place and to present an updated plan every five years, which will then be sent off to the California Department of Water Resources.

City Council was back in session at their City Hall Chambers to consider two resolutions allowing for the filing and implementation of both proposed plans from 2020, but the consultant on the matter was unable to attend and so the vote was pushed back to Tuesday, July 27. Miles Prince, San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District Director and Jose Reynoso, Director of Utilities, did give a presentation at the public hearing on Tuesday, July 13.

The UWMP describes the current and historical status for water supplies in the city and provides statistics on supply and demand. It also looks toward the future and the long-term goals to make sure adequate water supplies will be available and looks at opportunities to expand water sources. The WSCP explains how and when conservation measures will be taken and provides a path for establishing regulations to limit water usage. You can see the full final UWMP report on the city website at cityofsierramadre.com in the July 13 staff reports listed as item #10.

Sierra Madre has become more self-reliant over the past five years, measurably reducing its dependency on imported water supplies. The city has also made strides in infrastructure repairs which it plans to continue into 2022 at least. Those repairs included an upgrade to one of the city's water wells and the replacement of water mains. The goal is to replace two-miles of pipes over the next fiscal year as the water loss through leakage is at 14%. The city repairs approximately 400 leaks per year on average.

Local rainfall in the San Gabriel was 35% below normal for 2020-21. Right now, Governor Gavin Newsom is calling for a 15% voluntary reduction in water use. There are no mandatory restrictions in place at this time.

Overall, the Sierra Madre water supply situation is in good shape. In fact, the city made a deal earlier year to enter into a purchase agreement with the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District in the amount of \$2,376,592. In addition, the cities of Arcadia and Sierra Madre are expecting the completion of a joint well this year. Sierra Madre currently depends highly on the Raymond Basin and the main San Gabriel Valley Basins for a good portion of their water supply. Once the new joint well is up and running, it's expected to pump 1,000 gallons per minute.

Sierra Madre currently supplies water to 10,731 residents, a number that is expected to be on the rise in years to come. Though the city is not expected to be in any danger with their water supply over the next five years, residents are expected to do their part to conserve water whenever possible.



HISTORIC WORLD SERIES RUNS UNDERWAY FOR BOTH SIERRA MADRE BASEBALL AND SOFTBALL

July 16, 2021 – This is a story of sweet vindication for two special groups of local kids. Back in March 2020, the COVID shutdowns prematurely halted their spring seasons, just as they were getting started. As pandemic conditions improved with time, Sierra Madre's baseball and softball leagues did an outstanding job of implementing safety plans to get the kids back on the fields for limited outdoor play, but there still could be no playoffs, no All Stars tournaments, and no hope of that magic run to the world series.

Now in the summer of 2021, life is getting back to normal for these kids. Sierra Madre Girls Softball's 10U "Madre Mayhem" All Stars team (aged 10 or younger) (right) has qualified to play in the USA Softball Junior Olympics tournament in Santee, CA. They got this far by placing 2nd in the C Districts tournament in Beaumont, CA in June and finishing in the top tier of teams at the C States tournament over the 4th of July weekend in Lancaster, CA. Mayhem is powered by talented pitchers, Havana Pagan and Carly Polanco; fierce catchers Saija Baldrica, Emily Cash and Layla Loya; and a strong and fast offense driven by Mary Kalea Buchan, Aria Davis, Maya Dixon, Kiley Liang, Emily Lencioni, Camila Reyes-Chacon and Mikayla West. In both tournaments, the girls battled in back-to-back games in triple digit desert heat, playing with heart, grit and deep skills. For the past decade, SMGSA teams have made a name for Sierra Madre on a national level, and Madre Mayhem continues this tradition.





On the boys' side, (left) the story could not be more special and promising for the Sierra Madre Pony 13 year-olds. These are the boys whose final little league season (as 12 year-olds) was stolen away by the COVID pandemic shutdown. Their special talent is finally on full display.

Last week, these "Madre 13U" Pony All Stars crushed all competition in the Southern California "Super Region" tournament, and have now proceeded into the Western US "Zone" tournament now in progress at the West Hills baseball complex at 7001 Valley Circle Boulevard.

Sierra Madre's first game was a 14-4 thrashing of Long Beach, who was allowed to advance from the super region tournament as one of that event's top teams. Madre broke in inning, he returned to the plate again and hit an almost identical, mammoth shot – this

ahead with 9 runs in the first, highlighted by a majestic lead-off home run by Bradley Loiacono. Later in that same inning, he returned to the plate again and hit an almost identical, mammoth shot – this was a bases-loaded grand slam. Talented catcher Quinn Imasaki added a deep bomb to center field later in the game, while Dylan Hoang, Andrew Klien, and Tyler Charvat have also been batting leaders in a lineup that continues to pound the ball throughout this post-season run.

But this Madre 13U team is not only blessed by great offense – they also pack an unusually deep collection of pitching talent. Aiden Mahoney, Bradley Loiacono, and Dylan Hoang have anchored the staff as starters. Thus far they have held opponents down in dominant fashion, which has allowed the Coaching Staff to quickly transfer these responsibilities over to the very competent relievers, including Zeke Rodriguez, Josh Morales, Tyler Charvat and Andrew Klien. Manager Anthony Loiacono shared, "For good reason, pitch-counts are heavily regulated to limit stress on each of the boys' growing arms. If you throw more than 20 pitches, you can't pitch the next day. More than 35, and you are pretty much done for the tournament. It is a great advantage that we've been able to keep all arms fresh while maintaining comfortable leads."

To support the All Stars in this special year, a few local businesses stepped up to help cover tournament and family travel costs, without hesitation. Among them were the Pevsner family of Splinter Medical Group, and Sandy Duvall of Sierra Fitness and the Shabby Dog, Ixora Flora Design, Andy Bencosme Century 21 Realtors, and more to come. TRAFFIC MISHAP ON SIERRA MADRE BLVD.



Breaking News:

At approximately 10:52 this morning a solo-vehicle accident occurred at 110 W. Sierra Madre Blvd. A sedan traveling eastbound on West Sierra Madre Blvd. collided with the safety bollards protecting the outdoor dining area of The Only Place In Town Restaurant. The safety bollards worked as expected, preventing any damage to the dining area or to any diners.

Paramedics were called out to an incident nearby and were able to respond immediately to the incident. The driver of the vehicle was treated at the scene but not transported to any hospital. SMPD was dispatched to the incident; the cause of the incident remains under investigation.

As a result of the collision, Public Works removed 6 bollards for the most western section of the dining area. Concurrently, Public Works crews worked to measure and identify K-rail barriers to temporarily replace the bollards that were removed. This quick thinking by Director Cimino and the Public Works crews allowed for very minimal financial impact to the affected restaurant.

The owner of the restaurant and explained that diners could not be seated in the outdoor patio until the temporary barriers could be installed. Mr. Kefalas was very understanding and grateful of the City's quick response.

Traffic control was done by SMPD Officers Ascano and Jaramillo.



To the dismay of the businesses who rely on this parking lot for their customers, and residents and visitors who have observed this scene as they were out walking or driving by, it was/ is quite upsetting. The photo above, left, was submitted to the Mountain Views News a week ago Saturday.. It is a picture of the trash bin located in the parking lot of 370 W Sierra Madre Blvd. Needless to say, such a sight is uncharacteristic of Sierra Madre.

By the middle of the week, the trash bin had been emptied but the trash that did not fit in the container was left. The second photo (right) was taken by the Mountain Views News after the

owners who utilize the parking lot, however, each of those businesses have leases which include trash collection and all that we spoke to were current on their rent.

Upon further investigation, it was

discovered that one of the reasons for the unsanitary situation was that the company contracted by the city for waste management, Athens Services, had discontinued trash collection to the address due to non-payment. "Stop service orders are only issued after chronic delinquency", said Ed Chen, Director of Governmental Affairs. "Once we received the

payment, we immediately restored service collection".

We reached out to the property owner, Tiara Commercial, LLC of Newport Beach, and spoke with the managing member. While acknowledging the delinquency that had, as of last week been cured, they too were concerned about the excess trash that was left. "They [Athens] charge for overages, so why didn't they pick up the trash and bill me for the overages like they always do". That question, when posed to Athens, went unanswered.

It should be noted that from all appearances, the excess trash is not the result of the businesses but rather the result of unauthorized persons 'dumping' at the location. Sierra Madre Police do monitor the lot on a regular basis in an attempt to prevent unauthorized persons from using the parking lot for illegal activities. Dumping is illegal and not unique to that address. The issued was covered in the February 27, 2021 edition

PROJECT SUMMARY: The City is updating the Housing Element of the General Plan for the 2021-2029 planning period. The Housing Element is one of the seven required elements of the General Plan per the California Government Code, beginning at Section 655583. Generally, State law mandates updates to the Housing Element every eight years. The Housing Element serves as a policy guide to address the comprehensive housing needs of the City of Sierra Madre. The primary focus of the Housing element is to ensure decent, safe, sanitary and affordable housing for current and future residents of the City including those with special needs. The City is required to ensure the availability of residential sites, at adequate densities and appropriate development standards, adopt land use plans and regulatory systems that provide opportunities for, and do not unduly constrain housing production in the City to accommodate its fair share of the regional housing need, also known as the Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) allocation.





Tournament Lawsuit Against City Dismissed



A federal judge on Monday dismissed the Pasadena Tournament of Roses lawsuit against the city of Pasadena, noting that the city's acknowledgment that the Tournament owns the Rose Bowl Game trademark rendered much of the lawsuit

According to a statement by the Tournament, the court left undecided a disagreement over contract language governing the right of the Tournament of Roses to relocate the game in an emergency, a provision known as "force majeure." The court noted that with no current plans to move the game, there was no reason to rule on the disagreement

Through the confirmation of the Tournament's trademark rights and the preservation of its force majeure rights, "the suit's main goals were achieved," Tournament of Roses CEO David Eads said.

According to Tournament officials they felt compelled to file the suit after city officials contended that the emergency move of the 2021 Rose Bowl Game had violated the Tournament's contractual obligations. In addition, the city had been wrongly insisting that it co-owns the trademark to the Rose Bowl

In their our statement, the city of Pasadena called the lawsuit's claims that the city misused or misappropriated the Tournament's trademarks related to the Rose Bowl Game "frivolous

"This lawsuit should have never been filed in the first place," said Gordo. "The City of Pasadena has been a tremendous partner to the Tournament, and it is appalling that the Tournament took such a significant step over nothing. We are pleased that the judge wasted little time in dismissing the claims made entirely."

The city will now seek to recover the taxpayer dollars the City was forced to needlessly, albeit successfully, spend on defending itself in this litigation. The City expects to request an award that the Tournament of Roses Association reimburse the City's taxpayers for the hundreds of thousands of dollars incurred in having to defend against these frivolous claims, the statement reads.

"Despite all of the legal wrangling, it is my sincere hope that now we can collectively return our focus to New Year's Day, with an iconic parade and a game that puts Pasadena in the world's spotlight once again," said Gordo. "The Rose Bowl Game is a part of the fabric of Pasadena. As Judge Birotte Jr. recognized in his judgment: "The Court agrees with [the City] that [the Tournament] cannot reasonably dispute that, separate and apart from intellectual property ownership, the heart and soul of the Rose Bowl Game belongs to the people of Pasadena."

The Pasadena Public Health Department (PPHD) has received the first confirmed reports Wednesday of the COVID-19 Delta variant infection in six Pasadena residents. The Delta variant was identified in laboratory specimens from these residents through genomic sequence testing. The households infected in Pasadena included a mix of vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals. Through contact tracing, PPHD has linked all of the cases to household exposures. This SARS-CoV-2 virus variant was first identified in India, spreads more easily and quickly than other variants, and likely causes more severe disease based on hospitalizations and case fatality rates. In the state of California, 1,085 cases of the Delta variant have been reported, and as of June 2021, 42.9% percent of all sequenced variant of concern cases are Delta. To protect the privacy of the individuals, no further

information will be released. "Now is the time for anyone who is not yet vaccinated to get fully vaccinated. Help connect friends and family who are not yet vaccinated to a vaccine opportunity as soon as possible. Current vaccines are effective in protecting against the Delta variant that spreads much more easily than prior variants and is more likely to cause serious disease," said Dr. Ying-Ying Goh, health officer

and director of the Pasadena Public Health Department. COVID-19 vaccines are proven to be highly effective at preventing hospitalizations and death from COVID-19, and people who are fully vaccinated are also much less likely to be contagious or transmit the virus to someone else. The longer you wait to get vaccinated, the greater the risk of contracting ČOVID-19 and infecting a friend, loved one, or coworker.

COVID-19 vaccines are available through the Pasadena Public Health Department at no cost. People age 12 years and over are eligible to receive the vaccine. NASA Solar Sail Asteroid Mission Readies for Launch



Sailing on sunlight, NEA Scout will capture images of an asteroid for scientific study.

NASA's Near-Earth Asteroid Scout is tucked away safely inside the agency's powerful Space Launch System (SLS) rocket at NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida. The solar sailing CubeSat is one of several secondary payloads hitching a ride on Artemis I, the first integrated flight of the agency's SLS and the Orion spacecraft.



In 1930, two lots on the corner of First Avenue and Diamond Street were purchased from Anita Baldwin. In early 1931, architectural plans were approved and C.P. Cassady selected as the contractor. Groundbreaking took place on May 4, 1931 and construction took less than 75 days. The newly constructed Arcadia Woman's Club Clubhouse was dedicated on July 30, 1931. MESSAGE FROM SUPERINTENDENT BRIAN MCDONALD

Dear Pasadena Unified School District Staff and Families,

You may have seen news stories this week about the state's new guidance for schools regarding COVID-19 and the 2021-22 school year. Our school district will be sending more information as we get closer to the start of school.

Meanwhile, here is a quick update:

Back to School: School begins in PUSD on Thursday, August 12. Classes will be full-time and inperson, five days a week. Learning will take place on campus. According to the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), in-person instruction can occur safely when prevention strategies are implemented. PUSD has a robust set of safety measures already in place and will comply with the State's public health requirements for schools. We continue to work closely with the Pasadena Public Health Department (PPHD).

Masks: All students and staff are required to wear masks at all times when indoors, unless exempted. At this time, masks are optional outdoors when physical distancing is possible. Schools will provide masks for students who don't have them.

Vaccines: For the health and safety of all members of our school communities, we encourage everyone to be vaccinated. The vaccine is now available to everyone 12 years and older. PUSD Health Programs staff are continuing to work with the Pasadena Public Health Department and LA County Department of Public Health to provide COVID-19 vaccinations to PUSD students and staff. School Start Times: In an early adoption of new state law, PUSD middle and high schools will start the school day later. Middle schools will start at 8:15 a.m. and high schools at 8:30 a.m. Elementary schools will return to pre-pandemic schedules of 7:50 or 8:45 a.m., depending on the school: 2021-2022 School Schedules

Independent Study Option

State guidance is still in development about independent study policies and options. In anticipation of final guidance, we're working on a virtual independent study option for students who may prefer to remain at home in the fall. We will share more information with you as soon as possible.

New State Law AB 104

On July 1, Governor Newsom signed Assembly Bill (AB) 104 requiring school districts to implement policies that give students opportunities to counteract the negative impact of the pandemic on academic achievement and graduation credits.

The new state law, which is effective immediately, includes options that include changing low grades to a pass or no pass option, taking an extra year of high school, and waiving local district graduation requirements that exceed the state credit and course minimums for students who were juniors or seniors in the 2020-21 school year. PUSD will provide many options for accelerating learning, tutoring, and individual support. Under the new law, families may also formally request their school to allow their child to repeat the grade. We will send you specific information in the next few weeks.

a squatter for a year and a half, I asked a tree pruner to dump his load of wood chips in my yard. He did so gladly, since it saved him a trip to the local dump and it saved him money. I took a rake and spread the chips throughout the southern end of the house, what I considered my garden area. This was soil that was hardpacked and probably had cars parked on it at one time. I would water these chips and the ground soon became a productive garden. I planted yellow and blue corn, amaranth, beans, tomatoes, chard, fennel and other vegetables. I also saved soup cans and milk containers and used them to plant my potted plants which I then tried to sell for income but more often gave away. Eventually, I was given some ducks

which I kept in the inner yard that was fenced. Animals are a responsibility, and they tie you to your place. That can be a good thing, or not. But they were a gift, and I said yes. I needed to purchase some bags of duck food for them, and eventually I discovered an amazing thing about ducks.

My postage stamp-sized garden grew out of my wood chip patch where I grew corn and other foods. To water, I would simply place the hose down, turn it on, and let the water soak in to the wood chip-mulched garden. Once, after I turned on the water, the ducks rushed over and began to feast on something in the chips. Apparently, the water brought out the bugs from the soil and the ducks would methodically work the wet soil with great relish, making a low quacking sound as they went which seemed to say that they were very happy. After that, I learned that I could feed them less, and let them feed themselves from the garden after I

turned on the hose. My garden never seemed highly productive but I had a few of the tall red amaranth plants, some squash, a corn patch, some greens, and wild foods. I had wanted to try the so-called Three Sisters of the native Southwest, of corn, beans, and squash. In the arid soil of the Southwest, the corn was planted first, and once it arose, beans were planted at the base of the each corn.

after I | The beans' roots fix nitrogen and this acts as a fertilizer to the corn. Squash was then planted as a sprawling ground cover to retain the valuable scant moisture of the desert.

I planted my corn in my wood chip patch, three seeds per hole about two feet apart. Corn came up, and then I planted bean seeds. Not many beans came up -- maybe the ducks ate them. I planted squash too. Not a desert squash but ordinary zucchini which did a good job as a ground cover and food producer. I loved the little garden. During the day, little birds would flock to the corn patch and eat bugs. I enjoyed the fact that this little garden that I created with my simple efforts was now teeming with wildlife. It felt good just to look at it. It provided food for my body, food for wildlife, and food for my soul.

Not long after I started this patch – it was near Thanksgiving – David Ashley came by for a visit. David had already moved into the neighborhood from wherever else he'd been living. He came up to the top of the hill where I was an illegal squatter. My housing status didn't cause David to lower his regard

I took David out into my garden, and we stood there talking about life. I pulled off a ripe ear of corn and handed it to him and picked one for myself.
"What's this?" asked David.
"To eat," I responded as I began to peel

off the leaves and hairs on my average size ear of corn. It took a bite of the sweet kernels.

"I didn't know you could eat corn raw,"

said David in a surprised voice. "Yep, you can," I told him as I chewed on my sweet cob. David began to peel

his and take some bites.
"Wow, that's really good!" said David, chewing on more kernels. We stood there for a few moments, eating our corn, looking at the outside world through the stalks of corn that were taller than us. It was a quiet, special moment.

Eventually, David left, and over the ensuing months, I would occasionally hear David telling someone about his surreal experience eating raw corn.

WHY YOU SHOULD CREATE A "MY SOCIAL SECURITY **ACCOUNT**"

Dear Savvy Senior:

I'm 58 years old and working on a plan for my retirement. I've read that I need to check my Social Security statement every year to validate its accuracy. How do I go about doing this? Planning Ahead



Dear Planning: Checking your official Social Security statement every year is smart move to make sure your posted earnings are correct, which will ensure you get the benefits you're entitled to. But most Americans don't do it. In fact, most U.S workers have never even created a digital "my Social Security account" so they can access their statement information. Here's what you should know.

Online Statements

In 2017, as a cost cutting measure, the Social Security Administration stopped mailing paper Social Security statements to everyone under age 60.

The only people who still get statements in the mail are those over age 60 who aren't yet getting benefits and who haven't set up an online account. (Paper statements, however, are still available to anyone on request by submitting form SSA-7004.)

If you haven't done so, you should create a "my Social Security account" which will give you instant access to your personal Social Security statement so you can check your earning record and get estimates of your future retirement benefits at full retirement age, as well as at age 62 and age 70. Your statement will also let you know how much you would qualify for if you become disabled, and how much your family members will receive in survivors benefits if you die.

How to Create an Account?

To create a "my Social Security account," go to SSA.gov/myaccount. When you open the account, you'll be asked to enter your Social Security number and birth date, and you'll also be prompted to answer a series of multiple-choice questions that might include inquiries about financial products you own and previous addresses to confirm your identity. Then you'll receive a code by either email or text, which you will enter online to complete the process.

If you have a problem creating an online account, call 800-772-1213. After you establish an account, you'll get an annual email reminder to log on and review your statement.

If you have a security freeze on your credit report to help ward off fraud, you must lift it temporarily to set up your online Social Security account. Specifically, you'll need to thaw the freeze at Equifax, the company the administration currently uses to help verify users' identities.

Creating an online account is also a good idea to prevent someone else from fraudulently creating one first and using it to steal benefit payments in the future. Given the number of security breaches in recent years, it's possible someone may be able to illegally obtain your sensitive personal information, like your Social Security number, and use it to set up an account in your name.

Once you get access to your statement, compare the earnings listed on your statement with your own tax records or W-2 statements. You have to correct errors within 3 years, 3 months and 15 days following the year of the mistake. If you happen to spot a discrepancy within that time limit, call 800-772-1213 to report the error. Some corrections can be made over the phone, or you may need to schedule an appointment and go in with copies of your W-2 forms or tax returns to prove the mistake, or you can mail it in.

CONSERVATORSHIP UNDERSCORES THE VITAL IMPORTANCE OF INCAPACITY **PLANNING**

with her debut single, "... Hit Me Baby One More Time," Britney Spears has

full control over her own life.

As most familiar with pop culture know by now, Britney has been living under a conservatorship for the past 13 years. Also known as "adult guardianship," a conservatorship is a legal structure in which the court granted Britney's father, Jaime Spears, and other individuals nearly complete control over her legal, financial, and personal decisions. The conservatorship was initially established in February 2008 after Britney suffered a mental breakdown, which resulted in her being briefly hospitalized.

A Total Loss of Control

The court appointed Britney's father and attorney Andrew Wallet as her co-conservators, deeming Britney mentally unfit to care for herself. The arrangement was only meant to be temporary, but in October of that year, the conservatorship was made long-term, and her father has remained in nearly complete control of Britney's life

Under the conservatorship, Britney's father has the power to restrict her visitors; he oversees arranging and approving her visits with her own children; he has the authority to make her medical decisions; and he has the final say in all her business deals, including when she works, and complete authority over all of her financial

As it stands now, Britney's current mental-health status remains unclear, and we can't be sure whether or not she still requires someone to help her manage her financial and business affairs. But what is abundantly clear is that given the chance, Britney would have undoubtedly preferred to have some say in not only who should be in charge of making decisions on her behalf during her incapacity, but also how those decisions should be

Yet because Britney did not create legal documents indicating who should make decisions for her if she could not make decisions for herself, a judge decided for her-and this has resulted in immense trauma for Britney and destroyed her relationship with her father.

Let Britney's Story Be a Lesson

Although Britney's story is certainly tragic and we don't know how it will ultimately play out, her case has at least shined a spotlight on the potential for abuse that exists within the conservatorship and guardianship system.

Whether it's mental illness, age-related dementia, or a serious accident, we are all powerless to prevent the potential for incapacity. However, with the proper estate planning, you can at least have control over how your life, healthcare, and assets will be managed if something does happen. Moreover, such planning can also prevent your family from enduring the bitter conflict and

Planning For Incapacity: Where to Start

When planning for your potential incapacity, the been one of the world's most famous pop stars. Yet despite her massive fame and fortune, Britney, who is now 39, has never truly had make decisions on my behalf?" Specifically, you'll be selecting the person, or persons, you want to make your healthcare, financial, and legal decisions for you until you either recover or pass away.

The most important thing to remember is that you must choose someone. Like we've seen with Britney, if you don't legally name someone to make these decisions during your incapacity, the court will choose someone for you. And this is where things can get extremely difficult for you and your loved ones.

A Comprehensive Incapacity Plan

Fortunately, such turmoil can be easily avoided through proper estate planning. Determining which estate planning strategies you should use to grant and guide this decision-making authority depends entirely on your personal circumstances. There are several options available but choosing what's best for you is something you should ultimately decide after consulting with an experienced lawyer because there are many considerations beyond simply whether to "pull the plug", including how to handle such matters in the event of a pregnancy, whether to keep providing hydration and nutrition (and, if so, what kind), and even how to determine incapacity in the first place. These, and other factors, are not typically addressed in a standard advance health care directive.

Timing Is Everything

Keep in mind that your incapacity plan must be created well before you become incapacitated. You must be able to clearly express your wishes and consent for your planning documents to be valid, and even slight levels of mental illness or dementia could get them thrown out

Plus, as mentioned earlier, an unforeseen accident or illness could strike at any time no matter your age, so don't wait to get your incapacity plan started.

Finally, it's vital that you regularly review and update your plan to keep pace with changes to your life, family dynamics, and the law. If any of the individuals you've named becomes unable or unwilling to serve for whatever reason, you'll need to revise your plan





BOARD APPROVES BARGER MOTION IN SUPPORT OF SB 219 TO WAIVE PROPERTY TAX PENALTIES RESULTING FROM COVID-19 ECONOMIC HARDSHIPS

LOS ANGELES COUNTY —The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors unanimously ap-proved a motion authored by Supervisor Kathryn Barger and co-authored by Supervisor Hilda Solis to support SB 219 (McGuire) which would enable the local auditor or tax collector to can-cel any penalties or costs resulting from property tax delinquency due to a documented hard-ship arising from the COVID-19 "Safer-at-Home

"The Safer-at-Home orders impacted every single resident and business throughout Los An-geles County, and it is imperative for the County to partner with the State to support our tax-payers who suffered financially," said Supervisor Kathryn Barger. "SB 219 is one opportunity to provide much-needed relief and assistance for those negatively affected by the COVID-19 pandemic."

"Support for SB 219 aligns with the County's approach to ensuring an equitable recovery for all, especially among our hardest hit residents who are still reeling from the economic, social and psychological impacts of the pandemic," shared Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors Chair, Hilda L. Solis. "The economic recovery of our residents is dependent on how well we support them, which is why I authored a motion last year with Supervisor Barger directing the Treasurer and Tax Collector to consider the impact of COVID-19 on delinquent property own-ers and cancel any late penalty. SB 219 reinforces our authority and empowers counties statewide to provide the same support to their residents who may face economic hardships brought on by COVID-19."

If passed by the State Legislature, SB 219 would codify the County tax collector's ability to can-cel tax delinquent penalties when failure to make the payment is due to a documented finan-cial hardship arising from a shelter-in-place order, and if the principal amount of tax due is paid no later than June 30 of the fiscal year in which the payment first became delinquent. This bill would change the enforcement of late payment penalties to individuals who have been impacted through no fault of their own. SB 219 is supported by the California State As-sociation of Counties, the Urban Counties of California, and the Rural County Representatives of California as a much-needed tool for County tax collectors that can maintain predictability of critical revenue support for local agencies. A copy of their support letter can be found here.

As a result of today's board action, Los Angeles County legislative advocates will actively support SB 219 for

It is considered impolite to start eating before everyone is seated and served,


including your host. Only the meal settings and food belong on the table. Do not place your elbows, eyeglasses, notebook, pen or other objects on the table.

Cut no more than two bites of any item at a time. When it comes to bread, tear off one bite at a time and butter it, rather than buttering a whole roll.

Do not season your food until you have tasted it. It is permissible to use a piece of bread to wipe up excess gravy, as long as you use your fork and not your

If you need to leave the table, place your utensils on the edge of your plate so that the tips point to the plate's center, in a V-shape. To signal when you are finished, lay your utensils side by side diagonally on the plate.

L.A. COUNTY COMMUNITY TRANSMISSION OF COVID-19 IN-CREASES FROM MODERATE TO SUBSTANTIAL; REINSTATING MASKING INDOORS FOR EVERYONE

Community transmission of COVID-19 has I tion status, so that we can stop the trends and rapidly increased from Moderate to Substantial, based on the trend in daily new cases of COV-ID-19. The Los Angeles County Health Officer Order will be modified to require masking for everyone while indoors, regardless of vaccination status, as Los Angeles County sees more than a seven-times increase in new cases since the June 15 reopening. Wearing a mask when indoors reduces the risk of both getting and transmitting the virus. This additional layer of protection can help to slow the spread and does not limit business occupancy and operations.

The L.A. County indoor masking requirements for everyone will be effective Saturday, July 17 at 11:59 p.m. Some exceptions will apply, similar to masking requirements that were in place prior to the June 15 reopening. The modified Health Officer Order will be posted online by Friday, July 16 and will become effective at 11:59 p.m. on Saturday, July 17.

On June 15, the day of the full reopening, the County saw 210 new cases and today the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) confirms the highest number of new COVID-19 cases since mid-March with 1,537 new cases. Today's test positivity rate is 3.7%; on June 15, the test positivity rate was around 0.5%

Because of this rapid rise, as well as the increasing presence of the more easily transmitted Delta variant of the virus, and the millions of people potentially at risk of infection, together we must reduce our risk of infection and our risk for potentially infecting others.

Tracking the proliferation of the Delta variant is a priority because the Delta variant is more easily spread between people - more than other variants of concern. And while emerging data affirms that fully vaccinated people are well protected from severe infections with Delta variants, people with only one vaccine are not as well-protected, and there is evidence that a very small number of fully vaccinated individuals can become infected and may be able to infect others. From June 27 to July 3, the number of sequenced Delta variants was 124, 71% of all sequences collected that week. Given that slightly under 4 million residents in L.A. County are not yet vaccinated, the risk of increased spread of this variant within the County remains high.

We share our deepest condolences with those of you who have lost friends, loved ones, and family during this difficult time," said Muntu Davis, MD, MPH, Los Angeles County Health Officer. "We expect to keep masking requirements in place until we begin to see improvements in our community transmission of COVID-19. But waiting for us to be at high community transmission level before making a change would be too late. Masking indoors must again become a normal practice by all, regardless of vaccinalevel of transmission we are currently seeing. We continue to urge all eligible residents to get vaccinated in order to protect themselves and their family and friends. Becoming fully vaccinated against COVID-19 remains the best protective action that people can take if they are eligible for it. Although not at 100%, it significantly reduces the risk of infection and, for the small number of people that get infected, it reduces the risk of hospitalization and death once you are fully vaccinated against COVID-19."

While requiring masks in schools is an excellent way to prevent transmission among children, now is a great time to plan on vaccinating your children who are 12 and older against COVID-19 before the school year starts. The Pfizer vaccine is approved for use in children aged 12 and older. If your child begins their two-dose series for the Pfizer vaccine today, they would be able to get their second dose of the vaccine on August 5 and would be fully vaccinated as of August 19. As a reminder the first and second doses of this vaccine need to be given three weeks apart, and a person is not considered fully vaccinated until two weeks after the second vaccine.

Beginning Friday, July 17 through next Thursday, July 22 at County-run vaccination sites, LA City sites, and St. John's Well Child and Family Center sites, everyone 18 and older coming to get a vaccine will have an opportunity to win one of seven packages of tickets to family fun at the Staples Center, including performances by the Harlem Globetrotters, Disney on Ice, and the Gold Over America tour starring Simone Biles. 



On behalf of the Sierra Madre Community Foundation's Fletcher Trail Maintenance Fund, the Mt. Wilson Trail Race Committee, and the many volunteers who maintain the historic Mount Wilson Trail (located in Sierra Madre), we are reaching out to the public for support.

This is what the Mount Wilson entrance, or "trailhead" looks like now. If you look closely to your left, you will note a trail map, but you might miss it. Otherwise you will go right past it and hope you are on the right trail. Or alternatively, you go up the private road to the right, which its residents do not want to happen.

This is what the entrance to the trail looks like today



The unsightly fence in the photo was installed about 18 months ago as emergency prevention closing the trail for Covid and then for the Bobcat Fire, as the fire consumed part of the trail above Orchard Camp. Fortunately, the fence was unlocked after a few months so that our regular hikers and runners could resume enjoying the trail, along with hundreds and even thousands of others who are coming from other nearby trails that have been closed, including Chantry Flats.

Not much charm here, I think you would agree.

That's where our brainstorming on the trail came in.

Below is what we would like the trailhead to look like. We, Bob and Sue Spears and Pete Siberell, turned to another longtime Sierra Madre resident and fantastic architect, Karen Moran. She is an avid lover of the trail, served on the Mt. Wilson Trail Race committee for many years and runs the race annually.

We asked Karen to design what some call an arch, some a gate, but it's really both!


This structure will be made of high grade steel by the Affordable Fence Company, based in Corona. When it rusts it will look like the old wooden arch originally constructed over the trailhead and shown on the cover of John Robinson's book Old Mount Wilson Trail, right down the to the curious period after the words Mt. Wilson Trail. Arcadia Sign Company will provide the signage portion of the arch.

A related project already completed is the sign board installed just to the right of where the arch will go. It was conceived of and built as an Eagle Scout project by Alex Comer, son of Mike.


The sign board will allow us to consolidate the various signs that were up around the trailhead and remove the clutter from that area. We now will be able to put all the messages to the public in one place, including ones for:

Trail use etiquette
No camping restrictions
Cleaning up after one's dog
Promoting the Mt. Wilson Trail Race
Information on the Fletcher Fund
Promoting other city events

Please be assured that any funds you are able to provide will be used solely towards the installation of a new Mount Wilson Trailhead gate, sign, and wrought iron fencing.

The total cost of the project is \$45,000 and the City of Sierra Madre has already committed half of the money required to complete this design.

The remaining balance of \$22,500 that we need must be raised from Sierra Madre community residents and other donors. The trailhead gate will be made out of steel to ensure that it will stand up to the elements for a long time.

Having a solid and imposing structure will allow the Mount Wilson Trail to be closed to protect the public in the event of an emergency, fire or flood.

The current chain link fencing at the beginning of the Mt. Wilson Trail did little to keep the public off the trail when it had to be closed, first during COVID and then during the Bobcat Fire. It is also quite unsightly and not a structure that Sierra Madre residents can be proud of While protecting public safety, the new gate will also honor its historical significance to the City of Sierra Madre. The gate has been designed by local architect and former Sierra Madre Firefighter, Karen Moran, to match the 1910 picture on the cover of John Robinson's 2001 book, "Sierra Madre's Old Mount Wilson Trail."

The new gateway will become an iconic structure in Sierra Madre to complement Lizzie's Trail Inn and the Richardson Museum.

Please be assured that we will be publicize and recognize all donors to this worthwhile effort to support the protection of this important and valuable Sierra Madre community resource.



BIDEN THREW DOWN THE GAUNTLET IN THE BATTLE OVER VOTING RIGHTS



It was hard to miss the challenge that President Joe Biden posed to Americans as he burned through a fiery speech at the National Constitution Center in Philadelphia this week.

Led by "bullies and peddlers of lies," Republicans in Congress and state legislatures around the country are engaged in an historical assault on the right to

ne most serious threat to "the American experiment the Civil War.

"Hear me clearly, there is an unfolding assault taking place in America today to subvert the right to vote in free and fair elections. An assault on liberty, an assault on who were are," Biden said. "Bullies and peddlers of lies are threatening the very foundation of our country ... We're facing the most significant threat to our democracy since the Civil War. That's not hyperbole. Since the Civil War — the Confederates never breached the Capitol as the insurrectionists did on Jan. 6. I'm not saying this to alarm you, I'm saying it because you should be alarmed."

And in a sentence, Biden nailed it. You should be alarmed. And if you're not, you're either not paying attention, or you've bought the myth. And both are equally destructive.

Egged on by the Florida retiree who is still actively perpetuating the myth of the stolen election, Republicans at the state and national level have engaged in a wholesale rewriting of the events of Jan. 6.

They've downplayed the carnage of that day and have worked feverishly to block a badly needed comprehensive inquiry of the worst violence in the nation's capital since the War of 1812.

At the same time, they've conducted a systematic attack on access to the ballot box, passing laws and pushing legislation — including in Pennsylvania where Biden spoke — that would deny the franchise to millions of Americans, most of them Black and voters of color.

This isn't academic. It's not up for debate. Biden's speech came on the same day that Democrats fled the Texas Capitol to deny Republicans the quorum they needed to push through a voter suppression bill in the Lone Star State. And remember — this can't be said loudly enough — they're doing it in response to an absolute fiction, one that was put to rest by dozens of state and federal judges, and the U.S. Supreme Court not once, but twice.

"In America, you lose, you accept the results, you follow the Constitution, you try again," Biden said, inveighing against his predecessor without ever mentioning him by name. "You don't call facts 'fake' and try to bring down the American experiment just because you're unhappy. That's not statesmanship, that's selfishness. That's not democracy, it's the denial of the right

And that is precisely what is unfolding, in real time.

And the challenge that Biden issued, not only to policymakers and activists, but to all Americans is a real one, and the test of our times: To stand against attacks on voting rights and to work together to rebut the culture of untruths that have sprung up around our what's been billed as the most secure election in history.

Biden called for the passage of two sweeping pieces of voting rights legislation that have hit a brick wall in the narrowly divided U.S. Senate. The consequences of failing to do so are high, he warned, adding that the world was watching.

"Time and again, we've weathered threats to the right to vote, and each time, we've overcome. That's what we must do today," Biden said.


"We have to ask, are you on the side of truth or lies, fact or fiction, just a true injustice, democracy or autocracy?" he asked. "That's what it's coming

This is the challenge of our times. And we cannot fail to meet it.

I rely on the bus and light rail. And have certainly observed the decline in ridership. The concept of MetroMicro may be good in some form (one of these vans can carry 6 or 8 people), and I believe it could work if it was a regularly scheduled service that covered the gap that 268 and 487 left. Friday afternoon I waited two hours for a Micro that I had reserved at the Sierra Madre Villa Station, it never showed up.

How does this work with the ADA? A disability is why I don't drive.I know another local woman, older than I, who rode the 268 to work on lower Michillinda. Last time I saw her she said that she would probably have to walk now. And there are quite a few people who come to work in Sierra Ma-dre, without driving.

I know that making transit more difficult to use won't improve ridership. Public transit should function for the public. And LA is challenging because it is a low density large area. I wrote to our City Council, and I hope they will work on it.
