## COUNCIL CHAMBER FILLS WITH RESIDENTS CONCERNED ABOUT THE MEADOWS AT BAILEY CANYON PROJECT

The Sierra Madre City Council had a full agenda Tuesday evening. The agenda included adoption of the 2020 Urban Water Management Plan, an update on the Sierra Madre Hazard Reduction and Habitat Restoration Project, the Sierra Madre Library's Annual Report, and updates on the 2021 Housing Element and The Meadows at Bailey Canyon (Monastery) Project.

The majority of the public that was in attendance however, were most concerned about 'The Meadows' project status.

Mayor Rachelle Arizmendi, aware of the mounting public concern about the Monastery allowed for most of the 4 hour meeting to be allocated to the presentation concerning the process involved for both the project and the Housing Element as on the surface the two appear to be related. They are not. By law, city must adhere to the process as prescribed before any decision can be made on either.

City Attorney Aleks R. Giragosian, Planning and Development Director Vincent Gonzales, presented thorough presentations explaining the process by which both items would proceed before any decision would be made. A graph of timeline for the Monastery Project can be found on page 2.

On Monday, prior to the meeting, the city placed on its website for public review the complete SPECIFIC PLAN for the project. The plan contains information on the developers intentions regarding land use, infrastructure and design guidelines (partial listing).

In addition, the City has published the Notice of Availability of the Draft Environmental Impact Report (Page 2) for the project.

Several residents however, were more concerned about legislation before the California Senate Bills SB 9 and SB 10 that would in essence, eliminate local authority to zone areas as single family (R1), only.

## MASKS REQUIRED - LA COUNTY ISSUES NEW HEALTH ORDER

With the increase in new COVID-19 cases, the LA County Health Department has reinstated strict mask wearing guidelines.

Your mask should fit snugly over your nose and mouth and be made of at least two layers so that they filter well. If you are in a setting where you are in sustained close contact with other people who may not be fully vaccinated, consider "double masking" (wearing a cloth face mask over surgical mask) or a respirator (e.g., N95 or KN95). These offer a higher level of protection. This is especially important if you are not fully vaccinated and are indoors or in a crowded outdoor place. Masks are now required in all indoor public settings, venues, gatherings, and public and private businesses in Los Angeles County.

EVERYONE\*, regardless of vaccination status, must wear a mask:

- In all indoor public settings, venues, gatherings, and public and private businesses in Los Angeles County
- On planes, trains, buses, ferries, taxis and ride-shares, and all other forms of public transport
- In transportation hubs like airports, bus terminals, train stations, marinas, seaports or other ports, subway stations, or any other area that provides transportation
- Healthcare settings (including long-term care facilities)
- State and local correctional facilities and detention centers.
- Shelters and cooling centers
- Indoors at any youth-serving facility (such as K-12 schools, childcare, day camps, etc.)
- In any outdoor location where it is the policy of the business or venue

### Recommendations

- It is *strongly recommended* that you wear a mask at private indoor social gatherings with people outside your household, unless everyone at the gathering is fully vaccinated.
- It is *strongly recommended* that you wear a mask at large outdoor ticketed events when you are not in your seat. For example, while in line to enter, exit, use the bathroom, or buy food, or drinks.
- If you are not fully vaccinated, it is *strongly recommended* that you wear a mask in crowded outdoor settings.
- If you are in a setting where you are in sustained close contact with other people who may not be fully vaccinated, consider wearing a higher level of protection, such as wearing two masks (double masking) or a respirator (e.g., N95 or KN95). This is especially important if you are not fully vaccinated and are in an indoor or crowded outdoor setting.

Note: You are allowed to take off your mask while you:

- Actively eating or drinking as long as you are sitting or standing in a specific place such as a table or counter.
- Alone in a separate room or office.
- Showering or swimming.
- Performing or receiving personal hygiene or personal care services (like a facial or shave) that cannot be done without removing your mask.

I'll just pass along what she had to say about Kaiser: "I lost my best friend yesterday. I knew from the time we met that he was my dog. After saving him, literally, just hours from being put down at the shelter we enjoyed twelve years of adventures, long runs and always being by my side. He was the best cuddler! I will never forget you, Kaiser. You were the best dog I ever had and you will always be with me."

Heidi sent me a note a couple of weeks later saying, "As life slowly returns to normal, I am reminded daily of all we have to be grateful for, and thank God for these blessings."

She also sent me the following, a wonderful story that will touch your heart and make you remember things like this that have happened in your own life.

"I knew I was going to lose Kaiser. I have been cooking from scratch for him the last ten months, staying with him almost all the time, petting him, massaging him, talking to him. I knew I would lose him, but it didn't make things easier. Kaiser and I had a special bond. I swear we could read each other's thoughts and I used to joke that he and I would live forever as vampires, wandering the world together endlessly. On July 4<sup>th</sup>, I sat by his grave and asked him to give me a sign, something that let me know he was still with me.

On July 5<sup>th</sup>, I went swimming at a friend's house and he was telling how he heard that animal's souls go into butterflies. He had heard it on the news. I told him I had never heard that, and at that very moment the most beautiful, huge, furry brown, white and orange butterfly landed on me staring at me and licking my foot. It even had a white chest. Right there in front of my friend this happened. It was amazing. After a long stare, he flew away. I felt him in my heart, and knew I got the answer I needed. I could feel him then and he is always with me."

I have heard from other friends who have adopted rescue dogs that these animals seem to know that they have been saved from an untimely end and they are grateful.

"I am rescued. You didn't care how I looked or that I wasn't a pedigree. You showed me that I am not disposable and that I am loved. You brought back the sparkle in my eye and the shine of my coat. You restored my spirit so my tail can wag again. You took a chance on me to see what I can become. You gave me a place to call home and a family to call my own."

My granddaughter, Nicole, adopted Pigeon and said this, "She was a candidate for euthanasia because of her "behavior problems." An eleven-month-old puppy. This is why adopting pets matters."

John and I adopted Trinka when we were first married from one of the teachers at Pasadena Christian School who could no longer keep her. Trinka went everywhere with me and when she had to leave us I thought I'd never stop crying. The same with Wolfgang. Leah has never gotten over losing Whitey and Crissy her cat, BJ.

Why do we have pets, knowing they will leave us?

And they love us unconditionally. So does God.

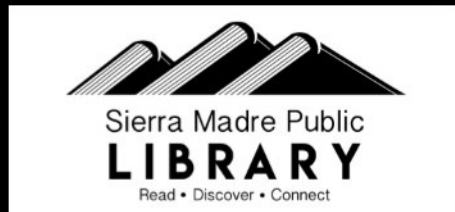

## Royal Court Applications Now Open



Applications for the 2022 Pasadena Tournament of Roses Royal Court are now available on the Tournament of Roses website. The 2022 Royal Court members will each receive a \$7,500 educational scholarship and serve as ambassadors of the Tournament of Roses, the Pasadena community and the greater Los Angeles area.

Officials said all are encouraged to apply and participate in one of the initial interview sessions at Tournament House on Saturday, September 11 or Monday, September 13. Participants are selected based upon a combination of qualities, including public speaking ability, youth leadership, academic achievement, and community and school involvement. Eligibility requirements are on the Tournament of Roses website.

With the cancellation of the 2021 Rose Parade, those who were looking forward to applying for the 2021 Royal Court, are encouraged to apply for the 2022 Royal Court. Eligibility requirements have been extended to include applicants who would have been eligible for the 2021 Royal Court.

Royal Court members experience countless benefits; becoming part of an organization dedicated to hands-on volunteerism, discovering opportunities to connect with and give back to the local community, developing public speaking skills, and growing self-confidence. The Rose Queen and Royal Court are iconic traditions, steeped in the Pasadena Tournament of Roses' history and will continue as a treasured legacy.

All individuals who participate in the initial interview sessions will receive two tickets to attend the Royal Ball, a semi-formal dance hosted by the Tournament of Roses.

Officials said that all Royal Court interview participants, and those who are selected for the Royal Court, are required to be fully vaccinated and provide proof of vaccination during the application process. A person is considered fully vaccinated two weeks after having all doses of a CDC approved COVID-19 vaccine; two doses for Pfizer or Moderna and one dose for Johnson & Johnson.

## Playhouse Village Park Groundbreaking

*Name the park, the city is now accepting recommendations for the park's official name.*

Using the temporary name "Playhouse Village Park" city officials including Pasadena Mayor Victor Gordo broke ground Thursday morning on the site of the newest city park to be located at Union Street and El Molino Ave.

"The 0.67 acre Playhouse Village park will open in Spring 2022," Gordo said.

According to city officials, construction for the park, located at 701 East Union Street, will start next week. The current city parking lot will be closed and work is set to be done weekdays starting at 7 a.m. City officials also said that plans in place will minimize construction traffic, dust and noise.

According to a staff report last year, "The preparation of the project site for construction of the proposed park requires the demolition of the former Banner Bank building and its parking lot. The scope of work for this contract includes demolition of the existing two-story, 5,538-square-foot building and foundations; removal of site

paving, curbs, and vegetation; backfill and rough site grading; as well as disconnecting and capping utilities. No new construction will be part of this contract scope."

The new park will include, a parking lot with 48 spaces, children's play area, gender neutral restroom, a separated dog run, and a community gathering space.

Last year, the city council appropriated \$4.6 million for construction of the park.

Now through August 20, the city is accepting recommendations for the park's official name. From these recommendations, city staff will compile a list of names that meet at least one of the four criteria listed below. From Monday, September 6 through Friday, September 17, a second survey will be posted asking the community to review the names and vote for their preferred choice.

Votes will be tallied and presented to the Recreation and Parks Commission for discussion and, subsequently, a recommendation of the park's official name will be presented to city council for its consideration.

The criteria are as follows:

- Geographical location of the park of facility;
- Cultural or historical significance to the City or surrounding neighborhood;
- Name of an individual who has made a significant contribution to the community, country, state, or field of parks and recreation.

Fare charging resumed on Pasadena Transit and Dial-A-Ride on April 12, 2021. Measures put in place to protect riders and bus operators due to COVID include:

- Disinfecting high touch surfaces on buses daily
- Enhanced nightly disinfecting of every bus surface from floor to ceiling and providing single use masks on the buses for riders. Hand sanitizing dispensers are on every bus.

## Cosmic Cocktail Hour Aug. 18

*Carnegie Observatories' Hale Library and Astronomical Glass Plates Archive.*

The Carnegie Observatories' Astronomical Plate Archive is the second largest in the U.S. and includes some of the most important observations in astronomy in the past 100 years. These images sparked Edwin Hubble's realization of the expanding universe, led George Ellery Hale to discover the sun's magnetic field and provided the basis for theories of how stars and galaxies form.

For the monthly Cosmic Cocktail Hour Wednesday, Aug. 18, at 4 p.m. via Zoom, Kit Whitten, librarian and archivist at the Hale Library, will show and explain images from the library's Astronomical Plate Archive of more than 200,000 photographic glass plate negatives created between 1892 and the early 1990s using telescopes at Mount Wilson, Palomar, Las Campanas and Kenwood observatories. The archives also include a collection of photographic prints of deep space, historical photographs of the Carnegie Observatories, including Las Campanas and Kenwood, and engineering drawings and blueprints of Carnegie Observatory telescopes.

Whitten also will provide an overview of the library's large astronomy collections of books, periodicals, sky charts, films and more.

Presented by the Pasadena Senior Center, the cost for Cosmic Cocktail Hour is only \$7 for members and \$10 for nonmembers 50 and older. Residency in Pasadena is not required.

"The photographic plate collection is intended for scientific research solely by accredited professional astronomers from around the world," said Annie Laskey, director of special events at the Pasadena Senior Center. "This Zoom event will be a very rare opportunity for the public to see some of the images and learn more about them."

## San Marino Housing Element Response

San Marino city officials said they are aware that the San Marino Unified School District sent a message to the community regarding the City's 2021-2029 Housing Element Program and process. Throughout the District's message, the document refers to the Housing Element as setting a "proposal" for rezoning and a plan to increase multi-family affordable housing. The message also states that the City is "recommending" zone changes to specific site, including Carver Elementary and Del Mar Fields. These statements are misleading and inaccurate. The City's draft Housing Element does not mandate any changes or construction of any properties, including Carver Elementary School and Del Mar Fields, both owned by the school district. All such decisions are left solely at the discretion of the property owner; the City is simply setting policies about what would be considered permissible, if the property owner so desired they said.

The City has received communications from concerned residents who are under the impression that the City is somehow requiring the District to build affordable housing on Carver and/or Del Mar Fields. This is incorrect. Even if the draft Housing Element is formally adopted by the City Council in October, the City of San Marino is not – and legally could not – mandate that the District close Carver, sell Carver or Del Mar Fields, and/or develop those properties into housing. Inclusion in the Housing Element simply means that if the District wanted to do any of those things, the City would permit it.

The State of California requires cities to adopt new housing elements every eight years. The State also tells cities how many housing units must be accommodated. Regardless of how we feel about the mandate, the City has no choice but to comply. The City is required to offer a plan for how these units might be achieved – this is the Housing Element. The City engaged a consultant, who is an expert in the field, to guide the process. Many of the findings and recommendations were those of the consultant, based on her years of expertise in these matters.

Prior to the commencing of the 2021-2029 Housing Element Update cycle, staff and the City understood that this Housing Element process was going to be the most challenging one to date. The last Housing Element was adopted by the City Council and certified by the Housing and Community Development (HCD) Agency in 2014. While the 2014 Housing Element included a State-mandated housing allocation of less than 30 units, this cycle (which begins on January 1, 2022) includes a State-mandated housing allocation of 397 units.

This numerical mandate puts the City in a critical and grave situation. Moreover, the City is overwhelmed with many State Housing Laws that will take effect starting on January 1, 2022 (AB 1397, SB 6, AB 1486, AB 725, AB 686, SB 330, SB 35, AB 671, AB 1763, and the No-Net Loss Mandate just to name a few). These laws have the potential for significant change in the physical fabrics of our community. While the San Marino City Council has repeatedly expressed its outrage



and opposition to the State's demands, we all understand that we are obligated to comply with the law regardless of how much we might not want to.

As it relates to the concerns of the School District, the State is requiring cities to provide a site inventory of land that is suitable and available for new housing to accommodate the housing allocation for all income levels, not just for affordable housing. The City is obligated to provide a list of adequate sites. Given that the City does not have any one site large enough to accommodate this density requirement, we have no choice but to identify multiple sites that could get San Marino to our required number. The City is therefore forced to scramble to include any and all sites that might be able to accommodate our required number.

All of that being said, it's important to state that the 2021-2029 Housing Element and the State's housing allocation is NOT a building quota, but rather a planning tool. The intent of the Housing Element is to show objectives and policies within the City to provide as many housing opportunities for the current and future population of the City. Properties that are listed under the inventory are NOT automatically rezoned, changed in ownership, or no longer allowed to be used under their historic nature. The individual property owners will continue to have full jurisdiction over their properties and use them as they see fit regardless of a City program or initiative. The site inventory is a means to satisfy the State mandates and to show that the City has enough properties to potential provide housing in some form. If one of the potential sites is eliminated in the Housing Element, the City may be required to name other properties.

In the case of Carver Elementary, the site was identified as a potential candidate for rezoning under the Housing Overlay program. The Housing Overlay program is a program that would potentially allow housing opportunities for teachers, staff, or their general workforce. A portion of the Huntington Library and Southwestern Academy were also included under this program. It is not uncommon for our institutions to provide workforce housing within the grounds of the operations. The Huntington and Southwestern Academy already provide housing for staff and/or students. That being said, such program is only possible under the full discretion of the property owner. Even with such an initiative or program, the individual property owners have full jurisdiction or rights over initiating development applications.

E-waste items include computers, keyboards, printers, monitors, laptops, docking stations, scanners, shredders, fax machines, computer mice, telephones, televisions, flat screens, VCRs, DVD players, PDAs, cassette players, tape drives, stereos and household

batteries. Many of these products have parts that can be recycled. Public Works is also helping residents prevent identity theft by providing free paper shredding during the event. The public can bring a maximum of three (3) legal-size boxes for shredding. Sensitive documents such as receipts, checks, pre-approved credit applications, credit card statements, outdated tax returns, pre-printed envelopes, return address labels and business cards are items that can be shredded. Event participants will be required to show proof of Pasadena residency and the duration of the event is subject to truck capacity. The event is sponsored by the City's Department of Public Works. ## City Requiring Masks at all Indoor Public Settings

The City of Pasadena health officer issued an updated health order that went into effect Thursday, reinstating the use of masks for everyone in indoor public settings and businesses, regardless of vaccination status. The mandate comes as both Pasadena and Los Angeles County have seen an increase in COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations.

According to city staff, since June 15, when most restrictions from the state were lifted, the average daily incident case rate of COVID-19 in the City of Pasadena has increased by 586% to reach the "Substantial Transmission" level of the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Indicators for Level of Community Transmission. The testing positivity rate in Pasadena has also risen to the "Substantial Transmission" level. In Los Angeles County where a large proportion of the people who work, visit, or patronize businesses in Pasadena reside, the rate of COVID-19 cases has increased to the "High Transmission" level, introducing even greater risk of transmission in Pasadena. Hospitalizations from COVID-19 both locally and throughout Los Angeles County have more than doubled.

In addition, the significantly more transmissible Delta variant of the SARS-CoV-2 virus has become the predominant strain in the U.S. and has been detected in specimens collected from Pasadena residents with laboratory-confirmed COVID-19, from multiple unrelated households.

All individuals, especially

those who are unvaccinated or at higher risk of severe outcomes from COVID-19, should take personal measures to reduce risk in addition to masking. "Everyone who is eligible should get vaccinated as soon as possible. Currently authorized vaccines have proven effective at preventing severe outcomes from the virus causing COVID-19, including the Delta variant. Getting vaccinated is one of the most important ways to help stop COVID-19 spread, especially as we prepare to welcome our school-aged children back to full-time, in-person learning in just a few weeks," said Dr. Ying-Ying Goh, health officer and director of the Pasadena Public Health Department. "The vaccines are safe, effective, and are available at no cost to you."

Private gatherings are not subject to masking requirements and at this time, no capacity restrictions or changes to other business operations are included in the health order. The California Department of Public Health requires indoor masking for all everyone, regardless of vaccination status, in K-12 school settings.

The longer you wait to get vaccinated, the greater the risk of contracting COVID-19, and infecting a friend, loved one, or coworker.

COVID-19 vaccines are available at no cost. People age 12 and older are eligible to receive the vaccine. ## Caltech Y Provided Special Opportunity to Examine Alzheimer's in a New Way

The Caltech Y is a non-profit organization with the mission of enriching the lives of Caltech students and helping them grow into responsible citizens of the world. In support of this mission, we recently provided the community with a powerful and unique online presentation by Caltech Professor and Vice Provost Cindy Weinstein on her upcoming book, "Finding the Right Words: A Story of Literature, Grief, and the Brain". Prof. Cindy Weinstein and Dr. Bruce Miller from the Global Brain Health Institute at UC San Francisco shared their experience writing a memoir that combines literature and neurology to tell the story of Cindy's father's early onset Alzheimer's Disease.

When Cindy Weinstein was studying to become a professor of literature, her father was diagnosed with early-onset Alzheimer's disease. Ironically, her love of words was accompanied by his loss of words and much more. Prof. Weinstein and Dr. Miller shared the emotions and grief that many families experience, while giving attendees knowledge about dementia that they need to care for their loved ones. Over 140 guests had the opportunity to ask questions of Prof. Weinstein and Dr. Miller and learn from each other.

Caltech Y Board Member, Sandhya Ravichandran remarked: "The talk was a brilliantly artful interweaving of science explaining the mysteries of the brain effected by Alzheimer's combined with a poignant recounting of a daughter watching her father slowly losing himself."

Athena Castro, Executive Director of the Caltech Y explained, "The Caltech Y student leaders coordinate over 80 programs annually;

some designed to heighten awareness of ethical, social, and political issues; some to serve the community, and some just to promote fun and relaxation and to provide balance to complement Caltech's renowned academic curriculum. This webinar was a special program for the community to allow the Caltech family and members of the larger community to engage with experts on this devastating illness facing so many families."

Prof. Cindy Weinstein, who enjoyed interacting with the audience, reflected on the evening and stated: "It was an honor to share my work with Bruce to the Caltech Y audience. In telling the story of my father's Alzheimer's disease, we hope to help families understand the diagnosis and the emotions that often come with it. We also hope to chip away at the cruel stigma that accompanies afflicting 6.2 million people in the US and 44 million in the world."

On Thursday, September 9, at 5:00 pm, Prof. Weinstein and Dr. Miller will be featured in the Behind the Book virtual series hosted by Caltech Live! ## MONROVIA HS GRAD: OLYMPIAN CRAVON GILLESPIE



Monrovia's own Cravon Gillespie will be competing in the 4x100 meter relay next week. Mark your calendars and schedule time to watch and cheer on Cravon and Team USA.

Cravon Tommy Gillespie (born July 31, 1996) is an American professional track and field sprinter who specializes in the 100 metres and 200 metres races. He represented the United States at the 2019 World Athletics Championships, earning a gold medal in the 4 × 100 metres re-lay.

On August 6th, 2020, Gillespie won his first race as a professional at the PVAMU Back To The Track Series 3 in Prairie View, Texas.

After a rocky start to his season, Gillespie returned to Mt. San Antonio for the USATF Golden Games, where he would compete against Seattle Seahawks wide receiver DK Metcalf in the 100 metres. He won his heat with ease in 10.11 seconds, then won the final in a season's best of 9.96 seconds; his first sub-10 since NCAA two years prior. He then set his sights on the Olympic Trials, where he finished 6th in 10.00 seconds.

Gillespie set records at the University of Oregon in the 100 meters (9.93) and 200 meters (19.93) in a breakout performance in 2019 after graduating from Monrovia High School and Mt. Sac.

Gillespie turned professional and signed with Nike. He focused on the 100 meters for the rest of the season, finishing 4th at the US Championships and qualifying for the US World Championship 4 × 100 meters relay team. That same year, he was also selected to represent the US at the 2019 Pan American Games, where he finished sixth in the 100 meters and won bronze in the 4 × 100 meters relay.

When I first stepped foot in Pasadena in the early 1970's there were just a handful of restaurants, and fewer steakhouses. If memory serves, there was the Western, Steer and Stein, Monty's, and of course Sizzler on Arroyo Parkway (yes, some considered that a steakhouse). Fast forward to 2021 and my, how times have changed! I sometimes think that Pasadena is the new Mecca for the beloved Cow!! There's not enough space in this article to name all the steakhouses, but some are better than others. I often wonder, as I am sure you do, is the meat coming from the same source, what is the best 2%, and if it's so special how come it's everyone's claim to fame? Grass Fed? Corn fed? Bone in? Boneless? For me, the way to go is dry aged. One of the best steaks I ever made at home was from a supermarket 50% off section.

So, what is the best steak house in Pasadena? Well, it might not be a "traditional" steakhouse that serves clam chowder or gives you a bread basket! Alexander's Steakhouse makes its home at the old McCormick and Schmicks location on North Los Robles – it has the same floor plan (picture a 60's James Bond Movie Geisha set with a Nuevo Art deco feel). Getting to the meat of the matter, a steak can run as much three digits, but before you think I've lost my touch with the everyday working class, I've said time and time again if you enjoy a meal it's worth it. Alexander's is a special occasion restaurant, but I am not just talking anniversaries or birthdays; I am talking about life. You deserve to give it a try.

The menu is divided into six sections starting with "For the table" (appetizers) and ending with Steaks - quite straightforward, I would say. I posted a few pictures on Facebook and a few comments there suggested Japanese Fusion. I've never been to Japan, but if that helps describe the menu let's use that term. Daughter Lauren and I loved the restaurant from start to finish. We started off with Hamachi Shots and dry aged tataki (explaining the ingredients and the menu descriptions would just be confusing, so just enjoy the ride like we did). Like any great restaurant the menu is seasonal (my suggestion is to accept the bread service and put it on some bread, it's quite good). I think the hit of the night was the little gem salad with romaine, let's call it a close cousin of the Caesar with some kick to it. I am coming back just for this salad; it was that good. For you seafood lovers there are a few items again seasonal. However, we are land lovers and that what makes Alexander's stand high above the crowd. I have seen Wagyu steaks on menus at LA restaurants that are US-raised, but at Alexander's they have the real deal. All Wagyu is imported from Japan except for the Imperial Wagyu; Japanese Wagyu is graded A5 - ask your server for the definition. Whether it's chicken, pork, or steak I think the bone gives you the most tenderness, and the 18 oz. T-bone steak is a winner. Grilled in their open kitchen, it was so good I see-sawed about whether to finish it or take it home. My decision came easily since we also tried a variety of pre-main-course suggestions. The sides are traditional in name only; we had the blue lake green beans. The restaurant has a full bar with extensive wine list, and is only open for dinner. If you are a foodie, steak lover, or just want a special night out, I gave it two thumbs up.

What Else You need to Know  
I actually started this review a few months ago just before our second shut down, so some items might have changed.

## COVID-19: REDUCING RISK KEEPING SAFE & PREVENTING SPREAD

### How To Reduce Your Risk, Especially If You Are Not Fu

The COVID-19 virus continues to spread, especially to those who are not fully vaccinated<sup>1</sup>. New variants of the virus that are more infectious are becoming more common in the US, including Los Angeles County.

The following information is to help people understand who is most at risk of getting infected and sick, which situations are riskier, and what steps they can take to stay safe and slow the spread of COVID-19.

#### WHO IS MOST AT RISK?

People who are not vaccinated are at the highest risk of getting infected with COVID-19. This includes people who have not completed their Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine series (i.e., they only got the first dose) as well as children under age 12 who are too young to be vaccinated. Unvaccinated adults who are older or who have certain medical conditions are at highest risk of severe COVID-19 disease. People with severely weakened immune systems who are fully vaccinated might not respond as well to the vaccine so may still be at increased risk of COVID-19. This includes people with certain health conditions or who are taking certain medications (such as treatment for cancer, organ transplants or autoimmune conditions).

#### WHICH SITUATIONS ARE RISKIER?

Understanding how the COVID-19 virus is spread is important. It will help you to assess your risk and take steps to protect yourself in different situations. The virus spreads from person to person mainly through respiratory droplets that are released into the air by a person who has COVID-19. For example, when they speak, sing, cough, shout, sneeze, or breathe heavily. These droplets are then breathed in by other people or land on their eyes, nose, or mouth. A person's risk of getting infected goes up the closer they are to someone with COVID-19. Enclosed places with poor air flow can also increase the risk of getting infected. This is because the droplets that have the virus can concentrate and spread in the air past 6 feet. They can even stay floating in the air after an infected person has left the room. This is why masks are important. They lower the number of respiratory droplets people release into the air AND also the number that they breathe in. It is also possible, but less common, for the virus to spread by touching a surface with droplets on it and then touching your eyes, nose, or mouth.

There are certain places where COVID-19 spreads more easily:

- Closed spaces with poor air flow.
- Crowded places with many people nearby
- Close contact settings especially where people are talking (or breathing heavily) close together<sup>1</sup> You are considered fully vaccinated against COVID-19 two (2) weeks after: the dose of a Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine series, a single dose of Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine or you finished the series of a COVID-19 vaccine that has been listed for emergency use by the World Health Organization. 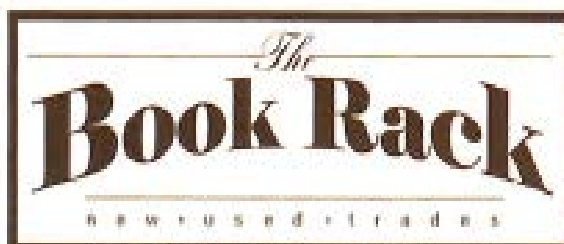

## ANNOUNCEMENT FROM PASADENA USD RE: LEGISLATION TO HELP STUDENTS STRUGGLING AS THE RESULT OF THE COVID-19 SHUTDOWN AND/OR ONLINE LEARNING

Assembly Bill 104 (AB 104) was passed to help mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on student performance during the 2020/21 school year. This legislation temporarily modifies practices regarding student retention, grading, and graduation status for eligible students during the 2020/21 school year ONLY.

The legislation allows for the following:

### Retention

Eligible students, defined as students who received deficient grades (D, F, or No Credit) for at least one-half of their 2020/21 coursework, may request in writing to consult with a school administrator to determine if the student qualifies for a grade level retention. Written requests must be received on or before Tuesday, August 31, 2021. (Eligible students: 2020/21 9th, 10th, 11th graders). The school site will contact you for a consultation and within 10 days of the consultation a written answer will be provided.

### Grading

Eligible students enrolled in high school in the 2020/21 academic year may apply/request to have a D/F letter grade replaced (in any course) with a Credit/No Credit (Pass/No Pass) grade. Written requests must be received during a 15 day window beginning Saturday, July 31, 2021 and ending Sunday, August 15, 2021 (Education code 49066.5 explicitly prohibits a school district from accepting applications after that date). Some post-secondary educational institutions, including those in other states, may not accept Pass or No Pass grades instead of letter grades for admission purposes.

(Eligible students: 2020/21 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th graders). Please note that not all postsecondary institutions may accept pass / no pass grades, in particular private and out-of-state schools. It is advisable that students and families contact schools of interest. Use the PUSD Grade Change Application to make a request and meet with the school counselors and administration.

The CDE has provided the list of known Post-Secondary Schools that will accept pass / no pass grades for admission, per the California Department of Education (CDE). Again, it is advisable that students and families contact schools of interest if they do not appear on this list.

### Graduation Exemptions

Students who are significantly credit deficient and not on track to graduate on time, and were enrolled in their 3rd or 4th year of high school during the 2020/21 school year, will have the opportunity to complete the statewide coursework required for graduation through a 5th year of instruction, credit recovery, or other opportunity to complete the required coursework. Some post-secondary educational Our Children. Learning Today. Leading Tomorrow. institutions, including those in other states, may not accept Pass or No Pass grades instead of letter grades for admission purposes. (Eligible students: 2020/21 11th, 12th graders)

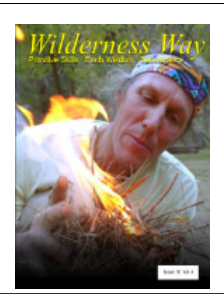

## HOW TO DEAL WITH PUBLIC SPACE

How do we best deal with “public space”?

“Public space” is not simply the public square. Public space is any space that is not privately owned, and which the local jurisdiction can exercise some control. In some cases, what we call “public space” can also be applied to the private space that we see, referring to such cases where billboards on private land can still mar an otherwise beautiful view that you experience while walking or driving on public land. This can also refer to a tall building which blocks your view of the mountains, or a tall building which blocks out your sunlight.

It is worth looking at the Japanese model.

## THE DESIGN CODE

What is loosely called the “design code” in Manazuru, Kanagawa, Japan gradually developed because the residents loved the quality of their city. Because those special qualities attracted ever-more people to want to reside there, business interests were also attracted. The local people created a series of concepts to maintain the character of the city, the character that attracted everyone there in the first place.

The Design Code is similar to the Building and Safety codes of major cities, but rather than strict rules, it is more a series of overall guidelines. Builders would meet with local legislators and other citizens to make sure their project can meet the Design Code. In some cases, the project is disallowed. In some cases, the project will be modified so that the spirit of the Design Code is maintained. Briefly, here are some of the key elements of the Design Code.

## DON'T BLOCK THE VIEW OF THE OCEAN

In many U.S. and other European cities, land rights are regarded as vertical, and land owners are often allowed whatever meets building guidelines and height guidelines. But blocking your neighbor's view is typically not regarded. However, in Manazuru, everyone's view is regarded as important. In planning meetings, the effect of your project on the neighbor's view would be discussed. The view of the ocean is so special to everyone that new buildings and additions must not obscure your neighbors' view.

## PASSAGEWAYS / ALLEYS BETWEEN HOUSES

One of the quaint features of Manazuru and surrounding areas is the alleyways that run between the houses. These are narrow paths, not full streets, and they allow walkers to get around, and often meet their neighbors. Maintaining these walkways is an integral part of the Design Code. It also means that houses will not be built right atop each other, as you see done in parts of San Francisco, and other big cities in the U.S.

## KEEP ALL THE CITRUS TREES

Citrus trees were once widely planted throughout Kanagawa and they are regarded as a local treasure. Thus, residents are urged to not cut any of them down, and even to plant more. They are regarded not just as a source of food for the body, but as a source of food for the soul as well.

## LOCALLY SOURCE BUILDING SUPPLIES

Where possible, the Design Code encourages builders and home owners to use local timber and stone and other local building materials. Not only does this provide somewhat of a consistent appearance, but it is also beneficial in that it seeks to continually support local craftspeople.

## WORK WITH NEIGHBORS TO GET AGREEMENTS

One of the key elements of the Design Code is that it requires builders to not hide what they are planning, but to openly discuss it with those whom the project may affect. This takes time, and is not always easy. However, when both “sides” meet together, face to face, and share their concerns, most of the obstacles and challenges can be resolved equitably.

Of course, the Design Code is not a panacea, and may not be as easy to institute in countries – such as the United States -- that do not have the group ethic that you find in Japan. Still, city planners whose blueprints and ideas shape the feel of public space should seriously study the Design Code.

## SUMMARY

For a public space to be noteworthy and special, the following qualities should all be present:

The space is safe and welcoming to all who live nearby. People should not only want to visit such a place, but they should want to return often.

The local culture and history should be reflected in some way (e.g. Olvera Street in old downtown Los Angeles, or Kersting Court in Sierra Madre).

There are social activities which occur there which invite people to enter (e.g., food, dance, meetings, chess, music, Tai Chi, etc.)

There are architectural or natural features that are appealing and of interest to all ages. The public space must have a good relationship to the surrounding area, whether that is stores, or schools, or park spaces. The best public places are surrounded by diversity, not uniformity.

The space must be well maintained, and kept clean. This may mean hiring a maintenance staff, or organizing volunteers. Good public spaces can be quickly abandoned by most people if they fill with trash and graffiti, and criminal activity.

A great public space should have as many of these qualities as possible. The design-ers of the space (especially where it was designed from the ground up) must also grasp that the space will be entered and used by living, breathing people who live in that area.

A great public space is not a static museum to be looked at, but it is rather a dynamic entity, vitalistic, which (if properly conceived) will take on a life of its own, and will serve to uplift all who go there.

HOW TO REPLACE IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS THAT ARE LOST OR MISSING

Dear Savvy Senior:  
*Can you tell me what I need to do to replace a variety of important documents? Our house burned down a few months ago, and we lost everything including our home property deed, car titles, old tax returns, Social Security, Medicare and Covid vaccine cards, birth certificates, marriage license and passports. Stressed Seniors*



Dear Stressed:  
I'm very sorry for your loss, but you'll be relieved to know that replacing important documents that are destroyed, lost or stolen is pretty easy once you know where to turn. Here are the replacement resources for each document you mentioned.

Birth certificates: If you were born in the United States, contact the vital records office in the state where you were born (see [CDC.gov/nchs/w2w/index.htm](https://www.cdc.gov/nchs/w2w/index.htm) for contact information). This office will give you specific instructions on what you need to do to order a certified copy and what it will cost you – usually between \$10 and \$30.

Car titles: Most states offer replacements through a local department of motor vehicles office. You'll need to complete a replacement title application form and pay the application fee, which varies by state. You'll also need to show ID and proof that you own the car, such as your vehicle registration or your license-plate number and VIN (vehicle identification number). To get an application, go to [DMV.org](https://www.dmv.org), pick your state, and print it or fill it out on the site.

Property deed: To access your house deed, contact your county clerk's office, where deeds are usually recorded – you may be charged a small fee to get a copy.

Marriage certificate: Contact the vital records office of the state you were married in to order a copy (see [CDC.gov/nchs/w2w/index.htm](https://www.cdc.gov/nchs/w2w/index.htm)). You'll need to provide full names for you and your spouse, the date of your wedding, and the city or town where the wedding was performed. Fees range from \$10 to \$30.

Social Security cards: In most states (except in Alabama, Minnesota, Nevada, New Hampshire, Oklahoma and West Virginia), you can request a replacement Social Security card online for free at [SSA.gov/myaccount](https://www.ssa.gov/myaccount).

If you live in a state that the online service is not available, you'll need to fill out form SS-5 (see [SSA.gov/forms/ss-5.pdf](https://www.ssa.gov/forms/ss-5.pdf) to print a copy) and take it in or mail it to your nearby Social Security office along with a number of evidence documents that are listed on this form. For more information or to locate the Social Security office that serves your area, call 800-772-1213 or see [SSA.gov/locator](https://www.ssa.gov/locator).

Medicare cards: If you are enrolled in original Medicare, you can replace a lost or damaged Medicare card by calling Medicare at 800-633-4227, or by logging into your

MyMedicare.gov account. If, however, you get Medicare health or drug benefits from a Medicare Advantage Plan, such as an HMO, PPO, or PDP, you'll need to call your plan to get your card replaced.

COVID-19 vaccination card: Your first step is to go back to your vaccination site and see if they'll give you a replacement. Bring an ID and try to recall the date you were vaccinated. If that's not feasible, contact your state health department immunization information system (see [CDC.gov/vaccines/programs/iis/contacts-locate-records.html](https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/programs/iis/contacts-locate-records.html)) where you should be able to print out a replacement sheet.

Tax returns: To get copies of old tax returns start with your tax preparer, who usually keeps copies of your returns on file. You can also get copies of federal returns directly from the Internal Revenue Service. You'll need to fill out and mail in IRS form 4506. To download this form [IRS.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f4506.pdf](https://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f4506.pdf) or call 800-829-3676 and ask them to mail you a copy. The cost is \$43 for each return requested.

Passports: You can apply for a replacement passport at a Passport Application Acceptance Facility. Many post offices, public libraries and local government offices serve as such facilities. You can search for the nearest authorized facility at [iafdb.travel.state.gov](https://iafdb.travel.state.gov). The fee is \$145.

HOW TO – AND HOW NOT TO – LEAVE A RETIREMENT ACCOUNT TO YOUR MINOR CHILD

Though you are technically allowed to name a minor child as beneficiary of your 401(k), IRA, or other employment-sponsored retirement account, it's never a good idea. Minor children cannot inherit the account until they reach the age of majority—which is

18 in California but can be as old as 21 in some other states.

If a minor is listed as the beneficiary, upon your death your retirement account would be distributed to a court-appointed custodian, who will be in charge of managing the funds (often for a fee) until the age of majority. There's no guarantee the court will appoint your spouse, the child's other parent, or someone else you might have chosen yourself. But even if the court-appointed custodian lines up with your own wishes, that person will have to post a yearly bond and be subject to court oversight. The process is time consuming, expensive, and nonprivate.

Add to that, your minor child will inherit the entire account, with no more oversight, no strings attached, and no protections as soon as he or she reaches the age of majority. Consider the scenario: a child loses one or both parents, and upon their eighteenth birthday inherits a large sum of money with no boundaries, direction, or control on what they do with it.

If you want your child to inherit your retirement account, you should consider setting up a trust to receive those assets instead of simply naming your child as a beneficiary of the account. You can then name a trustee to manage the account until your child is ready – and responsible enough – to manage those assets on his or her own. By doing so, you get to choose not only who would manage your child's money for them, but within the trust's terms, you can stipulate how and when the account's funds should be distributed and used, which can help them from being lost or squandered.

Through a trust, you can also put additional protections in place which would preclude any assets within the trust from being part of a divorce decree, lawsuit judgement, creditor collection, or bankruptcy seizure.

Talk to an experienced estate planning lawyer about creating a trust to hold your 401(k) to ensure that if you don't get the maximum benefit from your retirement savings, they will.

DON'T JUDGE A PERSON BY THEIR COVER-UP



Have you ever had one of those Déjà vu moments? The other week I was in the shopping mall to pick up some items for the Gracious Mistress of the Par-sonage. She shops so much that I have to help her on occasion.

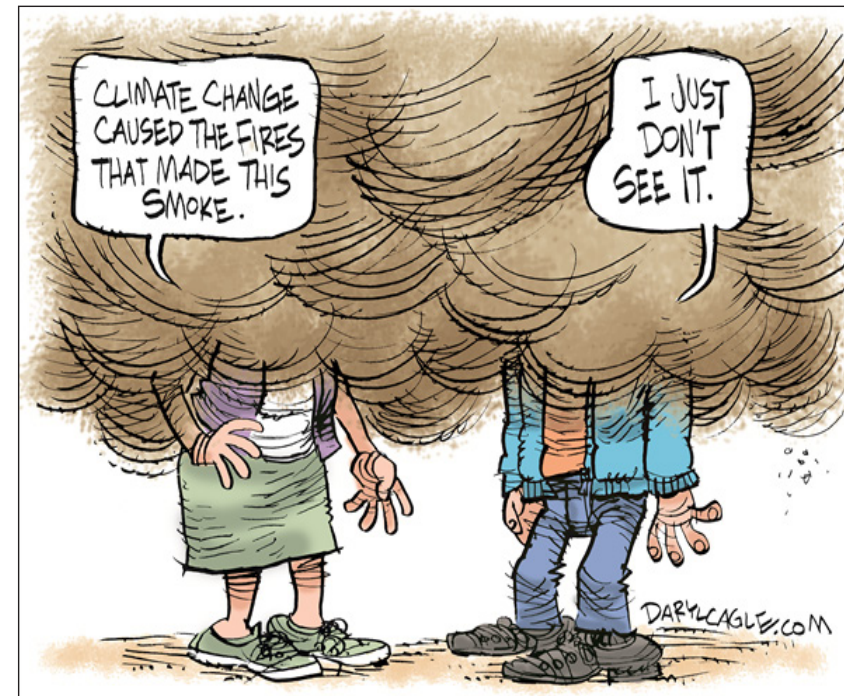

On July 27, 2021 the City Council of the City of Sierra Madre introduced for second reading, recommending adoption of Ordinance 1445, approving Municipal Code Text Amendment 21-03, establishing a Residential Entrepreneur Overlay.

The purpose of the text amendment is to establish a Residential Entrepreneur Overlay, consistent with the Goals and Policies of the General Plan and with General Plan Implementation Measure-39 to amend the Residential Professional Overlay Zone to create a Residential Entrepreneur Overlay. The text amendment also contributes to the consistency between general plan land use and zoning designations by clarifying permitted uses and development standards for properties once zoned Residential Professional, now within Residential Entrepreneur Overlay.

This summary is published pursuant to Government Code Section 36933(c)(1) and a full and complete certified copy of the text of Ordinance is available at the Sierra Madre City Manager's Office located at City of Sierra Madre City Hall, 232 W. The Ordinance amending Title 17 of the Sierra Madre Municipal Code will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment; the ordinance does not involve a “project” as defined by Section 15378; and the ordinance is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects that have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment; Therefore, it may be seen with certainty that there is no possibility this ordinance will have a significant effect on the environment.

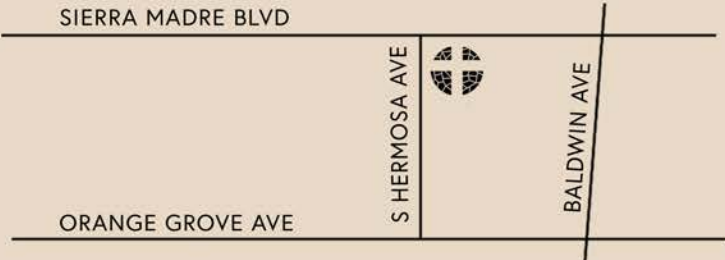
