WILSON TRAIL RACE 2022

This year, the Mt. Wilson Trail Race returns to its regular trail racing schedule during the last weekend in May and will be held on Saturday, May 28, 2022, beginning at 7:00 a.m. in Kersting Court.

Registration for the 2022 Mt. Wilson Trail Race opens on Monday, March 7, 2022, at 8:00 am and can be done online by going to https://apm.activecommunities.com/sierramadre or in person at Sierra Madre's Hart Park House, located in Memorial Park at 222 W. Sierra Madre Blvd. MWTR registration is limited to 350 people.

Those interested in participating in this year's Mt. Wilson Trail Race are encouraged to sign-up as soon as possible, as registration is expected to sell out.

In person registration hours are 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., Monday - Thursday, until such time as the registration limit is reached. Registration costs \$70 for Adults (ages 18 and above) and \$39 for Youth (ages 14 - 17) and can be paid by check or with credit card. All paid entries receive a t-shirt and goodie bag. To register, establish an account with the City of Sierra Madre by visiting the following website: https://apm.activecommunities.com/sierramadre. Race day registration is generally not available.



Race day packet pick-up begins at 6:00 a.m. in Kersting Court. The MWTR course is 8.6 miles in length, starting at Kersting Court, up Baldwin Ave., to Mira Monte Ave., to Orchard Camp and back. The total elevation gain is over 2,160 feet. First run in 1908, the annual Mt. Wilson Trail Race is the one of the oldest trail races in California.

All runners are encouraged to bring their own water supply for use during the race. Emergency support from Sierra Madre Search & Rescue will be stationed at strategic points along the course to provide aid, as necessary. Sierra Madre Cub Scouts Troop 110 will hand out water to the runners at First Water (2.3 miles) and Sierra Madre Boy Scouts Troop 110 will hand out water at Orchard Camp (4.3 miles), the turn-around point.

Registration for the Kids' Fun Run (ages 3 – 13) is FREE and will take place on the morning of the MWTR. All children participating receive a t-shirt and finisher's ribbon. Immediately following the start of the 2022 MWTR, the Kids' Fun Kun will begin in Kersting Court at 7:15 a.m. The start of the Kids' Fun Run is staggered, with children ages 8 – 13 beginning first and then followed by children ages 3 - 7. Kids' Fun Run participants run up Baldwin Ave. and back to Kersting Court. The total distances are 1.0 mile for ages 8 – 13 and .6 miles for ages 3 – 7. Parents may accompany their younger children during the Kids' Fun Run.

RESIDENTS FILL AUDITORIUM FOR JOINT COUNCIL/ PLANNING COMMISSION MEETING ON PROPOSED **MEADOWS HOUSING PROJECT**

On Tuesday, March 1st, the long anticipated joint meeting of the Sierra Madre City Council and the Sierra Madre Planning Commission was held at the Sierra Madre Middle School Auditorium.

The meeting lastED five hours as both proponents and opponents of the 42 house project heard presentations from city staff, representatives from the Mater Dolorosa Monastery and the developers New Urban West.

After the presentations, there was two hours of public comment where 32 speakers expressed their concerns about everything from the overall impact of the project on the community and wildlife to whether or not the project presented a public safety hazard as it relates to wildfires.

In addition to the comments from those present, the city posted 24 emails received about the project.

At one point, however, there were

several comments that were "unnecessarily rude and disrespectful" to the Catholic Church said one attendee who supports the Church, the project and the Church's right to develop on its land.

On the other hand, outside a table was set up by the Protect Sierra Madre: Stop The Monastery Housing Project to gather signatures on a petition that if successful, may put the fate of the project on the ballot for citywide approval.

In a telephone interview with Mayor Gene Goss he noted that he was "very pleased with the turnout, and very pleased with the information that was presented." He noted however, that after the public comment period, many of the attendees left before their questions could be answered.

This meeting was the first one after the Environmental Impact Report was published. There are a series of other public meetings to follow.








Anita Carter, the 1st girl born in Sierra Madre, married the 1st boy born in Sierra

Gregory. The 1st public building erected in Sierra Madre was the school house on Orange Grove and Hermosa in 1878. The first wedding was March 7,1883. The young couple built the original house where the Wisteria vine is on

The 1st store in Sierra Madre was W.H. Robinson's grocery in 1884 in his own home east of Baldwin and south of Central later changed to Sierra Madre blvd. He later rented the corner store in the New Town Hall in 1887. His wife became postmaster with the post office in the rear of the store.

In 1886 C.M.Clark started a hardware store at Lima & Sierra Madre Blvd.

In 1886 Emile Deutsch Came to Sierra Madre and built a house & cigar factory on Baldwin near Laurel.

The 1st religious organization wa Sunday School in 1882 held in the school house.

The 1st church erected in 1886 blew down in 1887 from a windstorm and the town built a new one The Church Of Ascension which today stands at Baldwin and Laurel.

The library is the 4th oldest in L.A.County & the 10th oldest in So. California.It was founded by the original settlers in 1886.In 1888 it had 600 books.

On Nov.1908, Mayor Jones proclaimed the day a holiday so that everyone could get out and clean up the streets. At 5:30 that morning, Henry Homer of Revolutionary stock awaked the townspeople by setting off dynamite. The church & school bells rang to call the people to their tasks.

WE NEED A TOWN HALL MEETING

Members of the Preserve Sierra Madre Steering Committee attended the five hour Joint Meeting of the City Council and Planning Commission held at the Middle School this week. Presentations were made by the developer, New Urban West, Father Higgins of Mater Dolorosa, City Manager Jose Reynoso, Planning Director Vincent Gonzalez, and City lawyer Aleks Giragosian.

According to the agenda, this was a study session to inform our representatives and the residents of what is happening with the Mater Dolorosa property, owned by the Passionist Fathers. Starting a meeting at 5 pm insured that many working residents were unable to make the early weeknight start time, including Planning Commissioner Chairperson, Dr. Pevsner, who arrived closer to 6. Approximately 90 persons out of over 10,000 residents were in attendance and 29 made public comments.

Twenty-four emails were received, but were not read, and will be posted somewhere on the City website. Those of us in attendance were allowed to speak after the presentations, but were limited to three minutes. Several of us were asked by Mayor Goss to remember that there was a three minute rule for ending our talk. The few who spoke in favor of this project were mainly affiliated with the property: staff, fathers and a board member. The rest offered well-thought out, well-researched concerns regarding the cutting down of over 100 trees on the property, as well as the large pine trees in the Bailey Canyon Wilderness Park to al low for the widening of Carter Avenue. Others cited the destruction of the habitat of endangered wildlife, the huge increase in traffic, the nonadherence to the General Plan, and the "net zero" water plan which, in essence, is non-existent.

Following a break, The Planning Commissioners and City Council members asked questions regarding the main issues they heard from the public comments, some of which could be answered, some not. We believe these issues need to be studied further. These include traffic, wildlife, fire protection, landscaping and

A number of residents send in detailed questions ahead of the meeting and asked that they be addressed to the experts. The responses were general and, in many cases, did not address the questions submitted.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I attended the Join City Council/Planning Commission/New Urban West (developers) meeting on Tuesday, March 1 at Sierra Madre Middle School. We spent 45 minutes watching a visual presentation from New Urban West (NUW) on behalf of the Monastery development, referred to as "The Meadows."

It was quite an informative evening which began very early...5 pm, making it difficult for many residents to attend. I have spoken to many neighbors who are uninformed about how this property will be developed. The priests have spread their side of the issue of building 42 large homes, but there is so much more to be learned from the citizens of Sierra Madre.

We need more time for the entire community to KNOW exactly what is happening. Pat Alcorn asked for a Town Hall Meeting, and this request must be honored to clarify these issues and problems.

This is not a small development in our community. It is HUGE, creating a lifetime negative impact on all of us in this charming little close knit town. Yes, I heard rhetoric from people in attendance who support the Monastery, but it was all redundant. They spoke of their long term commitment to the commu-



We asked again for a Town Hall type meeting, where we could actually get our questions answered with a back and forth discussion without the three minute time limit. We pointed out that there is misinformation out there and it would be beneficial for all to get the facts. We would like to see second opinions on many of the residents' concerns, just as the Planning Commission at an earlier meeting asked for a second opinion about the impacts of construction to the Wistaria Vine by the new owner (who immediately sold the property).

Some of those misconceptions are about "The Monastery." The Monastery has been gone for 30 years, after being damaged in the 1991 earthquake, and torn down in 1992. The decision was made not to rebuild. The handwriting has been on the wall for decades as the number of retreat centers is steadily declining in the US. Many have made the decision to close and sell, due to the declining number of new priests coming into the order and the costs of caring for an older population of clergy. The Passionists of Chicago, who hold title to the property, have property rights, as we all do, but none of us can do whatever we want because there are zoning laws in our city that apply fairly to everyone. One man, who struggled up to the podium on crutches, spoke about how difficult it was to get his small remodeling done to make his home more handicapped accessible.

Many concerned residents could not make the meeting, or stay for the entire five hours. We have been asked when and how this meeting will be aired, but have not received an answer from City Hall. As always, we'll keep you posted.

nity, providing retreats, prayers, spiritual guidance, and tranquility. While I respect their commitment to the Passionist Priests, it was interesting how little they acknowledged the overuse of water (referred by NUW as Net Zero), the years of building and the trucks, dirt and dust which will impact the air quality and safety on the streets, and will damage the environment. They have praised living here, but once the construction begins they will not suffer the removal of the trees, which will result in killing endangered animals, who live in the very trees to be removed.

One resident clearly stated that because there will be a large "park" for the residents of Sierra Madre, as well as those of the Meadows, bears, lions, and other animals will still roam the Monastery grounds. How will these animals react to groups of families taking up their space in their habitat?

There were several well informed residents who gave vital statistics about the negative impacts to the environment. All of our citizens must learn these facts. With several Town Hall meetings, residents could become more informed, both pro and con. Our 10,000 residents deserve this. We did this with the General Plan, and it must be the same for this project. This issue cannot be so easily dismissed, which City Council has done for months. Carol Parker, Sierra Madre





Construction to begin in Old Town **Pasadena**

City officials announced that The Pedestrian Safety Enhancement at Colorado Blvd. and Fair Oaks Ave. is set to begin on Monday and expected to be completed May 27 — that is, if "weather permits and without any unforeseen conditions." they

The construction hours are from midnight to 8 a.m. (Monday thru Friday) except for demolition work, removal of sidewalk panels and asphalt concrete, which will be between 6 a.m. to 11 a.m. The proposed improvements

- consist of the following:
 Curb extension at all four corners
- Sidewalk widening at existing bus stops
- · Signal modifications · Asphalt pavement overlay at
- the intersection · Utility adjustments and
- striping

Installation of a new scramble crosswalk with stamped asphalt concrete

The proposed improvements will take place one corner of the intersection at a time. The Contractor, Calpromax Engineering, will start the curb extension work at the northeast corner (in front of Pottery Barn) on March 7. Once that side of the corner is complete, they will move to the southeast corner (in front of former Chef Tony). After those two corners are complete, the contractor will mobilize over to the southwest corner (in front of Cheesecake Factory), and then complete the curb extension work at the northwest side (in front of J Crew).

Business are expected to be open. The contractor will install k-rails, construction traffic control devices, and business open signs to navigate shopping at and around the affected work area. For more information call 626-744-3971.

CaltechLive Continues its Behind the Book series with Fraser MacDonald

CaltechLive! presents a Behind the Book conversation about Fraser MacDonald's work, Escape from Earth: A Secret History of the Space Rocket. On Thursday, March 24, at 5 p.m.. The virtual event is free. Registration is required.

MacDonald (pictured) will discuss his work with Erik Conway, historian of the Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) and Peter Sachs Collopy, Caltech Archivist. There will be a short period at the end of the presentation for audience members to ask questions of all three. This virtual event is free and open to the public, but registration is required to attend.

The book tells the longburied truth about the dawn of the Space Age: lies, spies, communism, and sex magic, in 1930s Pasadena. Everyone knows that rockets are just toys, the stuff of cranks and pulp magazines. Nevertheless, an earnest engineering student named Frank Malina sets out to prove the doubters wrong. With the help of his friend Jack Parsons, a grandiose and occult-obsessed explosives enthusiast, Malina embarks on a journey that takes him from junkyards and desert lots to the heights of the militaryindustrial complex.

Malina designs the first American rocket to reach space and establishes the Jet Propulsion Laboratory. But trouble soon finds him: the FBI suspects Malina of being a communist. And when some classified documents go missing, will his comrades prove as dependable as his engineering?

Drawing on an astonishing array of untapped sources, including FBI documents and private archives, Escape from Earth tells the inspiring true story of Malina's achievements—and political fear that has kept them hidden. At its heart, this is an Icarus tale: a real life fable about the miracle of human ingenuity

Fraser MacDonald is a geographer and historian at the University of Edinburgh, Scotland. His research has ranged across historical geography, geopolitics, and the history of science. He was formerly a senior lecturer in geography at the University of Melbourne, Australia; he has an MA in Geography from the University of Glasgow and an MSc in Environmental Change from Oxford.

In addition to various edited academic books and papers, Fraser's essays and commentary have appeared in The Guardian, The Washington Post, and the London Review of Books. These days, Fraser is returning to geography, working on a book on the landscape of the Scottish Highlands.

Erik M. Conway is the historian at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena. He is the author of several books. He received his PhD from the University of Minnesota in 1998 with a dissertation on the development of aircraft landing

Most of his work since has been at the intersection of science and technology in the later 20th century, and mostly related to aerospace. His most recent book was Exploration and Engineering: The Jet Propulsion Laboratory and the Quest for Mars, published in 2015. He recently received a Guggenheim Fellowship.

In his book, High-Speed Dreams (2005), Conway argues that U.S. government sponsorship of supersonic commercial transportation systems resulted from Cold War concerns about a loss of technological prowess in the modern world. Realizing the Dream of Flight (2006) consists of eleven essays on individuals prepared in honor of the 100th anniversary of the Wright brothers' first powered flight. Conway also wrote Blind Landings (2007) and is a co-author of the secondarylevel education text, Science Exploration Atmospheric Science at NASA was published in 2008.

His 2010 book, Merchants of Doubt, was written with geologist, historian and public speaker Naomi Oreskes, as was his article in the Winter 2013 issue of Daedalus, called "The Collapse of Western Civilization: A View from the Future."



WHEREAS, Healing Connections' efforts have focused on school education programs, crisis center hotlines, education and screening programs that seek to identify at-risk adolescents; and








The Chef Knows By Peter Dills

WHY IS IT TOP SHELF?

My friend, Nials Dalton, says "top shelf" or "third floor" when he wants a good brand-name drink when he is at a bar. Reader Bob Carlson might think I have lost my mind, but friends and readers, we are moving to the high rent district today. It took me a few years to figure out

(and maybe just in time now) that when you are at a supermarket looking for your favorite wine and frustration sets in, you should search by price - the most expensive wines are on the "top shelf" and the bottom shelf is usually where you'll find lowest prices. You'll find me somewhere in the middle. Please let me, just for this one week, introduce you to the top shelf at your local wine department because that is where I found the Oracle by Miner. Yes indeed, the technology of blends and business is all a part of



nology of blends and business is all a part of the Miner story. Miner is a family-run business in the heart of Napa Valley and was founded by Dave and Emily Miner. Dave's uncle is Robert Miner, co-founder of (you guessed it) Oracle Technology.

As we have learned over the last couple of years, I do believe in "blends", and this Oracle is "top shelf". The grapes are sourced from vineyards in the area including cabernet from Stage Coach Vineyard in Napa Valley. I am told that Black Bart used to rob the stagecoach that ran from St. Helena to Monticello. If Bart could have gotten his hands on some Oracle wines, he would have appreciated the fruitiness of the first taste. The tannins are very smooth, and like many blends that include petit verdot (regardless of the price) has a touch of boldness and a bit of spice. This blend is perfectly balanced, and I recommend a pairing it with spare ribs, chicken or steak. No BBQ sauce, though, as that will take away some of the natural flavors from your wine. Price is \$75 - top shelf, indeed, but when it's time to treat yourself, Oracle is a great option.

PUBLIC HEALTH REVISES MASKING GUIDANCE AND RE-MINDS RESIDENTS THAT VACCINES STILL PROVIDE THE MOST POWERFUL PROTECTION

Due to COVID-19 in Los Angeles County

Given that the County is now at the Low Community Risk Level, Public Health has modified the Health Officer Order to update the County's masking guidance. Under the modified order, indoor masking is now strongly recommended, but not required, for vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals in public settings and businesses, except in high-risk settings where federal or state regulations continue to require masking. Masks will be required while indoors at all schools until March 12 when masking indoors for both vaccinated and unvaccinated students, staff, teachers, and visitors, is strongly recommended.

The settings where masking continues to be required also include public transit, transportation hubs, all health care settings (including long term care and adult and senior care facilities), correctional and detention facilities, homeless shelters, heating and cooling centers, and emergency shelters.

At all sites where masking indoors is no longer mandatory, employers will be required to offer, for voluntary use, medical grade masks and respirators to employees working indoors in close contact with other workers, customers and/or members of the public.

Furthermore, residents are encouraged to assess their personal and family risks and may decide that wearing a mask is the right decision for them. In deciding, individuals should consider:

Are there individuals in the household who have underlying health conditions that create elevated risk for severe illness from COVID?

Are there unvaccinated family members in the household including young children not yet eligible for vaccines?

Does anyone in the household work in a setting with vulnerable individuals at elevated risk of severe illness from COVID?

The modified Health Officer Order also updates requirements for pre-entry vaccination or negative test verifications. Vaccine verification in health care and congregate care settings is still required. Pre-entry vaccine verification also remains required for entry to indoor mega events, with a negative test result as a substitute for those not fully vaccinated. Pre-entry vaccine verification, or verification of a negative COVID-19 viral test, is now strongly recommended, but no longer required, at outdoor mega events and indoor portions of bars, nightclubs, and lounges.

Public Health notes that as mandated safety measures decrease at many sites and public spaces, individuals are encouraged to take advantage of the powerful protections offered by the FDA approved COVID vaccines and boosters.

When looking at case rates for residents five years of age and older from February 13-19, unvaccinated residents were almost two and a half times more likely to be infected with COVID-19 when compared to those fully vaccinated, but not boosted, and more than three times more likely to be infected than people who were vaccinated and boosted.

Unvaccinated people were also four times more likely to be hospitalized for COVID-19 when compared to those fully vaccinated, but not boosted, and nine times more likely to be hospitalized than people who were vaccinated and boosted.

The difference is most stark with deaths. For the period of February 6-12, fully vaccinated individuals were 18 times less likely to die from COVID-19 than unvaccinated individuals.

"Our hearts remain with those families experiencing the sorrow of losing those they love to CO-VID-19," said Dr. Barbara Ferrer, PhD, MPH, MEd, Director of Public Health. "With fewer people becoming infected and becoming severely ill with COVID-19, and safety requirements relaxed, it is very tempting to think the pandemic is over and we can return to the way things were before March 2020. And while transmission has slowed and we have powerful tools that help many avoid the worst effects of the virus, there continue to be thousands of people whose lives, families, and work are disrupted each day because they or someone close to them is newly infected, and, for some, their infection will lead to severe illness. With fewer required safety measures, getting vaccinated and boosted provides both individual and community protection that can help safeguard those who remain vulnerable. If you are one of the 1.7 million eligible residents who haven't yet received their first dose of COVID-19 vaccine, or one of the 2.7 million residents eligible for, but not yet boosted, this is a very good time to make an appointment or walk in to one of the hundreds of convenient sites across the County where you can get your vaccine or booster for free."



THE URBAN WILDERNESS LIVING WITH COYOTES

Coyotes are fascinating members of the dog family. Today, there are found in virtually every city in the lower 48 states, and they seem to be able to survive anywhere.

I can recall my first coyote encounters during summer camp and while backpacking in the local Angeles National Forest. At first, I was sure that I was hearing other children and adults howling. The voices had such a chilling human-like quality that I could not believe they were coyotes. But my friends assured me were hearing a pack of coyotes, and we could hear maybe 50 distinct voices.

That human-like voice is the reason so many scary camp-fire tales are told about coyotes, usually involved disappearing children who get raised in the woods by coyotes, and other frightening stories.

Back then, during the naivete of childhood, it was easy to believe in the magical, mysterious, and mystical qualities of the coyote. These nocturnal animals could survive where few others animals could, and so supernatural qualities were often attributed to the coyote in myth and lore.

In fact, an entire branch of American Indian lore pertains to stories about Coyote, a Trickster who usually ends up getting caught in his own machinations. Coyote Trickster tales were akin to the morality stories found in all cultures.

Today, as we humans in the valleys below the mountains ever-expand our range, we encounter coyotes more and more frequently.

As the urban sprawl continues to sprawl, people move into the remote sites in the foothills and mountains and discover that their family cat has disappeared; all too often, it was some indigenous coyote's dinner. These homeowners generally regard the coyote as a menace and an animal to be rid of. They quickly forget that the coyote has been here for perhaps thousands of years, and that it plays an important role in the local ecology.

According to U.S. Forest Service Wildlife Biologist Bill Brown, coyotes are mostly carnivorous. He explains that they are excellent hunters, often working in pairs, who feed primarily on rats, mice, ground squirrels, rabbits, insects, and carrion. (Did you notice that at least half of the animals eaten by coyotes can be carriers of plagues?)

Berries and backyard fruit comprise only a small portion of the coyotes' diet, according to Brown (whom I interviewed for my "Enter the Forest" book). Still, coyotes are regarded as opportunists, and will not hesitate to capture and eat cats, small dogs, poultry, sheep, and other domestic animals as long as they are easier to capture than other wild animals.

All too often, people who move into mountain locations – like much of Sierra Madre -- fail to adequately protect their pets, which become easy prey for a coyote. Brown points out that coyotes do not go after people, and in the very rare instances where this has occurred, it was with unprotected toddlers in the mountain areas. To the coyote, the young child is a "fat hairless dog."

Increased sightings of coyotes can occur for many reasons, such as lack of food in their normal area, or after wildfires when their territory is disrupted. But in general, coyotes – like bears and mountain lions – want nothing to do with people and will usually depart before they are spotted.

The coyote is a very adaptable animal, and its range is by no means restricted to the foothills. Its home range is about 16 square miles, and in some cases, as much as 100 square miles. Coyotes are known to travel through flood control channels, along freeways and city streets, and even sidewalks. The Los Angeles River and the Arroyo Seco are two easy routes for them to get from place to place, as well as the water channels throughout Sierra Madre and the San Gabriel Valley.

It is not unusual to see coyotes running on the streets at night, and rummaging around foothill neighborhoods in Sierra Madre, especially on the night the trash cans are put out. (Make sure to have tight lids on your trash cans).

Wildlife Biologist Brown says we have no accurate idea how many coyotes are living in the Angeles National Forest, but that it could be in the thousands.

SUPER CHEAP SMARTPHONE PLANS FOR **SCRIMPING SENIORS**

Dear Savvy Senior:

Can you direct me to some really cheap wireless smartphone plans for seniors who don't use much data? I use my smartphone primarily for texting and talking but need some data for checking my email and a few other things when I'm away from Wi-Fi. Right now, I pay \$30 per month but am looking for a better deal. Senior Scrimper

Dear Scrimper:

There are several super cheap wirelesses providers I can recommend for older smartphone users who are looking to save money by paring down their cell phone plan. Here are three of the cheapest options available that you can switch to without sacrificing the quality of your service.



Cheapest Wireless Plans

For extremely light smartphone data users, the very cheapest wireless plan available today is through Tello (Tello.com), which lets you build your own plan based on your needs or budget. For as little as \$6 per month you can get unlimited texting, 100 minutes of talk time and 500 megabytes (MB) of high-speed data. Increases in talk time or data can be added in \$1 increments.

Tello uses the T-Mobile network and gives you the option to bring your existing phone or purchase a new device, while keeping your same phone number if you wish. If you want to keep your phone, it must be unlocked. Just enter your phone's ID (press *#06# on your keypad to get it) on Tello's website to make sure that it's compatible with the network.

Another super cheap plan to consider is the annual prepaid plan offered through Boost Mobile (BoostMobile.com). For only \$100 per year (or \$8.33 per month) this plan provides unlimited talk, text and 1 gigabyte (GB) of 5G or 4G data each month. If you need more data, their \$150 annual plan (or \$12.50/month) gets you 5 GB.

Boost Mobile uses the T-Mobile and AT&T networks and lets you use your existing phone (if compatible) or buy a new one.

And a third option to look into is Mint Mobile (MintMobile.com), which is recommended by Consumer Reports and has one of the best values for a cheap plan. Mint offers a \$15 per month plan (plus taxes & fees) that provides unlimited talk and text, and 4 GB of 5G/4G data each month. They too use the T-Mobile network and will let you use your existing phone (if compatible) or buy a new one.

Lifeline Program

If your income is low enough, another option you should check into is the Lifeline Assistance Program. This is a federal program that provides a \$9.25 monthly subsidy that could go towards your phone or internet service.

To qualify, you'll need to show that you're receiving certain types of government benefits such as Medicaid, SNAP (food stamps), SSI, public housing assistance, veterans' pension and survivors' benefit, or live on federally recognized Tribal lands. Or, if your annual household income is at or below 135 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines - \$17,388 for one person, or \$23,517 for two you're also eligible.

To check your eligibility or apply, visit LifelineSupport.org. If you do qualify, contact a wireless provider in your area that participates in the Lifeline program and sign up for service with them. You can also ask your current company to apply your Lifeline benefit to a service you are already getting, if it offers the benefit.

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM YOUR INITIAL MEETING WITH AN ESTATE PLANNING LAWYER

Life, Legacy & Estate Planning



ONE MOUTH TOO MANY WORDS

the average woman speaks 20,000 words a day, and the average man speaks 7,000

words a day. I'm not sure if that's true because I never believe everything I read, particularly on my computer, unless I write it.

If this is true, who came up with it and how did they get to this conclusion?

I can't remember any day in my life when I spoke 7,000 words. At least out loud. I probably thought that many words, but they didn't all touch my tongue.

The Gracious Mistress of the Parsonage is a different story. As long as we have been married, I have never tried to count how many words she spoke on any single day. So keeping up is very difficult for someone like me.



PUT THE LIGHTS ON THE HEROES OF OUR TIME

name is Stuart Tolchin and my father who I knew as Al Tolchin was born in 1910 in what was then Soviet Russia. My father had three older siblings that all lived in a village called Kabany which is about 75 miles Northeast of Kiev and is situated slightly east of the Pripet marshes which are adjacent to the Chernobyl

Russia's bombing of the present largest nuclear power plant in Europe has brought the April 26t h 1986 Chernobyl disaster back into the news. By 1986 I recognized some personal connection to the Ukraine. Up until 1970 I knew very little about the area within which my father lived with his family. I asked him if we were Russian or Ukrainian and he gave me one of those "How can you be so stupid looks" and said that "We are Jewish" implying that that was enough for me to know. I guess it is although, I am completely separate from all Jewish traditions I do take pride and recognize Ukrainian Jews like Irving Berlin who was born in the same place as my father. Irving Berlin actually wrote "White Christmas" and "God Bless America".

Until 1970 I knew very little about the Ukraine. This changed on June 14, 1970 when I was married to Joanne Susan Bodin. Right after the ceremony a man came up behind my father and squeezed his arm, calling him Avram. My father, who had been without vision for about fifteen years, said "Who is there. I have not been called by that name in forty Years". The man was my new wife's Uncle Irving married to her father's sister. Over the years I learned the history of my family from this man. Amazingly it turned out that he had lived in the exact same village as my father and his family. Irving's family had immigrated to America and soon after my own grandfather came to live with them.

I had seen my grandfather only twice. Two separated times when he had walked up the fire escape to our third or fourth floor apartment and attempted to talk through the window to me. I was only about six or seven but I remember the old man asking in Yiddish if I needed more. My father heard him and came into the room and pulled down the window shade. I really never understood much about what was happening but I understood my father did not like his own father.

My first questions to Irving were questions about my grandfather and why my father didn't like him. Briefly Irving explained that in the old country people has arranged marriages. My grandfather was a very intelligent man; (after all his grandchildren are all Doctors and lawyers and Ph.D.'s and ing connections.

Please read this | the grand children are even smarter). The marriage between my grandparents did not work because although everyone could tell my grandfather was intelligent he had been paired up with this woman who simply was not very bright. What was the reason for this arrangement I asked and Irving explained that my grandmother's side of the family was related to the Kaganovich family who were very impressive. In fact later the name of the town was changed to Kaganovich honoring Lazar Kaganovich who was the only Jew in the Soviet hierarchy and was very important.

So, what did this have to do with my family? Irving knew that when my grandmother and her four kids finally arrived in Chicago he was very disapproving of them. He wanted the boys to play violins and they just wanted to run around and ride bicycles. He had even used a belt to discipline the youngest boy, my father and my father still carried scars. Now I understood a little more and I was proud of my connection with Lazar Kaganovich, the Jewish Ukrainian hero. In the early 1970's my wife and I visited the grounds of the Dumbarton Oaks conference which had been meetings between the four allied victors of the war which was committed to the establishment of institutions to bring about a future peaceful world and to protect the rights of individuals. The United Nations and the International Monetary Fund are direct results of this conference and Lazar Kaganovich was there as one of the representatives of the Soviet Union. Hooray for Lazar a representative, I thought of my own non-violent values. Alas, sometime later, probably in the early 1990's I decided to do some research about this hero of mine. I found a book written by STUART (yes that's right) Kahan, his nephew that included amazing assertions. Kahan asserted that Stalin's third wife was Kaganovich's sister which might make her a

distant relative. Alas' I read the book and learned that Lazar Kaganovich was undisputedly a terrible monster. He was known as the "Architect of Fear" terribly anti-Semitic and responsible for the death of millions. So much for my hero. Moving now to our present hero Zelensky, I am very troubled by his requirement that all men between the ages of 18 and 60 be conscripted into the army. I gather these men and women are all provided with guns and instructed to engage the Russian troops in battle. Of course, these Russian troops have been described as teenagers who don't even know where they are or why they are there. The possible future results, arming an entire population and conscripting them into the army can quite possibly lead to horrifying results. There are more than enough guns in the world already.

Let me make one final point. Prior to writing this last draft I spoke with my-ex wife JoAnne Susan who informed me that she had been given the initials J.S. because at that time, in the early 1940's Josef Stalin (initials JS) was the absolute hero of their time Need I say more. Times change and there are amaz-

DICK POLMAN IS AMERICA STRONG ENOUGH TO **ENDURE DOMESTIC SACRIFICE?**



During World War II, Americans put up with rationed gas and car tires, ra-tioned coal and fuel oil, rationed silk and nylon, rationed meat and daily products, rationed jams and jellies, even rationed coffee.

Would today's Americans – some of whom freaked out, during the worst of the pandemic, when they couldn't get their hair done - be willing to endure even a minuscule fraction of the sacrifices that our forebears weathered 80 years ago? I'll answer my own question with a question: Can you imagine what would happen if coffee were rationed, and people could no longer order their favorite cafe lattes?

I pondered all that while watching President Biden deliver his State of the Union speech. He vowed on our behalf, and for the preeminent cause of democracy, to stick it to the murderous Russian thug for as long as it takes. Ukraine is fighting for its life on the front line of freedom, and, as our commander in chief said, we need to show our "resolve."



He stressed that word many

We meet tonight as Americans, "with an unwavering resolve that freedom will always triumph over tyranny." And "American resolve matters." And "(Putin) will never weaken the resolve of the free world." And this: "Now is the hour. Our moment of responsibility. Our test of resolve and con-science, of history itself."

We'll see if his fellow citizens are willing to pass that test, because it would appear that most are not willing to follow his lead. Only 37

percent say he's doing a good job (which seems insanely low, given the 65 percent fullyvaccinated rate and the four percent unemployment rate and the six million new jobs and the signing of his historic infrastructure repair law – but hey, what do I know).

People are "tired, frustrated, and exhausted" (Biden's words) after two years of lockdowns and masks, inflation has spiked, and now they're being asked to hunker down a bit for more sacrifice, on behalf of a country that millions couldn't locate on a map unless their hands were duct-taped to the correct coordinates.

This is especially true among younger Americans - who, by the luck of birth, did not experience the Cold War and barely know what it was. Ac-cording to a new ABC News-Washington Post poll, only 35 percent of those aged 18 to 39 would still support sanctioning Russia if it resulted in higher energy prices at home. Indeed, only half of all Americans would still be on board. It just so happens that in our interconnected world, Rus-sia is the third biggest producer of crude oil. And, politically speaking, woe to any president who makes it more costly to fill the sainted internal combustion engine.

Biden is releasing 30 million barrels from our Strategic Petroleum Reserve to "help blunt gas prices here at home," as permitted under federal law (a 30-million barrel release can be ordered in the event of "a domestic or in-ternational energy supply shortage of significant scope or duration.") And yeah, that could help - maybe for a while. But mostly he tried to mollify Americans by doing his best impression of a kindly doctor who still makes house calls, dropping his voice to a reassuring semi-whisper while telling Americans, "We are going to be okay.



There is indeed a market for high principle, as former Re-publican pollster Matthew Dowd wrote: "In our country and in the world, the forces of autocracy are rising in the most significant way since World War II, and democracies are in danger of suffering tragic harms, if history is any predictor. This is why the fight in Ukraine is important to us all."

True that. For many Americans, particularly those born after the Cold War, the fight for freedom was an abstraction. Putin has made it very real.
