WATER CRISIS AND WHAT ARE WE DOING ABOUT IT THE SIMPLE SOLUTION TO CALIFORNIA’S WATER CRISIS

You can’t pick up a paper or listen to the news without hearing about the drought that has been affecting us for a number of years. Don’t take our word for it. Here’s what’s been reported recently about our water crisis.

The West has been suffering through an acute drought since 2020, part of a mega drought that began in 2000. The last 20 years have been the driest two decades in the last 1,200 years. This year is so far the driest on record in California.

Maintaining “critical levels” at the largest reservoirs in the United States - Lake Mead and Lake Powell — will require large reductions in water deliveries.

Nearly three-quarters of the Western region is in a state of severe to exceptional drought. Meanwhile, states like California have instituted water restrictions, though water consumption has continued to rise.

With water already becoming more scarce, the increasing population in the West — and therefore demand for water — has inflamed the situation.

One of the most far-reaching questions in the United States over the coming decades is whether growth trends will ultimately collide with nature’s ability to sustain such a large influx of people, Daniel Newman, the report’s author, wrote.

Fire and water  
And, unfortunately, doling out water supplies isn’t the only issue residents have to contend with.

Suburban neighbourhoods sprawling out into more rural areas are creating a more substantial wild-urban interface at the same time as the wildfire season creeps earlier and longer.

The current water crisis “underscores the need to prepare communities for wildfire, because when these large emergency incidents occur what we end up having to do is use a ton of water in an already water-scarce environment to suppress wildfires.”

‘We don’t have enough water supplies right now to meet normal demand. The water is not there,’ a Metropolitan Water District spokesperson said. January, February and March of this year were the driest three months in recorded state history in terms of rainfall and snowfall. The Metropolitan Water District said 2020 and 2021 had the least rainfall on record for two consecutive years. In addition, Lake Oroville, the State Water Project’s main reservoir, reached its lowest point last year since being filled in the 1970s.

Record dry conditions have strained the system, lowering reservoir levels, and the State Water Project – which gets its water from the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta – has estimated it will only be able to deliver about 5% of its usual allocation this year. Governor Gavin Newsom has asked people to voluntarily reduce their water consumption by 20%, but so far residents have been slow to meet that goal.

Just because there is an inch of undeveloped land and the possibility of another dollar in the pockets of the city, it doesn’t mean it has to be built on. Too many people, too much traffic, too much pollution, not enough water. Stop building now!

CITIZENS FOR TRUTH

We Sierra Madreans got a letter Saturday that said "As drought conditions worsen, the Governor is calling on all Californians to reduce their water use by 20%." What followed were new water restrictions after Governor Newsom instituted an Emergency Drought Declaration on June 10. KNX "the 24 hour news channel" has daily information about the drought, which is worsening. The headline on the front page of last Saturday's LA Times read Where Money Flows During Drought. A Microeconomy spring forth as state’s residents deal with water restrictions." People desperate for any water are searching for any source, including – a call to Underwood Water Trucks (which supplies water for special effects and fire safety) “...We don’t have water, can you come park your truck here so we can shower?” That is just one of the many calls they are getting. The Wildfire Defense System’s Chief Executive David Torgerson estimates there will be 100 wildfires in California with 10,000 homes threatened this year, up from 52 wild fires last year.

In last Tuesday’s ridiculously long meeting (2 minutes short of 6 1/2 hours), the most important City Council agenda item was beginning at 11:20 pm. Water Superintendent Steven McGee gave the report, with the focus seeming to be whether we need a water moratorium. The City needs 2500 acre feet of water, and we have 3440 acre feet for fiscal year 2022-2023. It would appear that we have enough water for the rest of this year, and to last through the projected drought for the next three years. However - only 940 acre feet of our water supply come from our Raymond basin, and the rest is from State water, and from the Colorado River. We know the Colorado River is at least partially the source of water for several western states and is at an all time low.

Yet, our City lawyer Aleks Giragosian's analysis of the Water Report stated that the City has sufficient water supply, infrastructure and capacity to meet unconstrained and projected water demands. "For the reasons stated above (in the report) the City of Sierra Madre cannot lawfully impose a water moratorium." And yet fiscal year 2022-2023 is projected to be the third year of a five year drought. Mr. Giragosian also explained that because of the SB 330 a moratorium cannot be adopted for a development, and just because we all have brown lawns and dying trees, the lack of water must be a threat to public health. Okay, so no moratorium, at least in the immediate future.

However - Council Member Parkhurst asked City Manager Reynoso if our 2500 acre feet of water is at risk, especially what we obtain from the Colorado River via the San Gabriel Valley Metropolitan Water District, and the City Manager admitted that it is. The water usage at our public parks has already been reduced. We are at Stage 2 reduction, with a likely possibility of going to Stage 3 next year, or possibly greater. Mr. Reynoso commented that education of the public is the most important aspect of water conservation. Public Comment was called for in the nearly deserted chambers at 11:35 pm. We definitely had several questions, that may or may not get answered in the future.

Apparently we, the public, are expected and required to educate ourselves on ways to save water while New Urban West forges ahead with their plans to build 42 oversized houses on miniscule lots, which will take at least 100,000 gallons per house just to build. Add to that the destruction of 101 mature trees. The Specific Plan calls for planting of new trees - which will require large amounts of water just to keep those saplings alive. The Specific Plan also calls for net zero water, with New Urban West claiming that the City does not have to supply and pay for water for these 42 homes for the next 50 years. We were skeptical two years ago, and conditions have greatly worsened since then.

No water moratorium on the horizon, even with our apparently "magical" Raymond basin water, but that is just one reason of why this Meadows project on the Monastery property is so wrong for Sierra Madre.

SIERRA MADRE Neighbors for Fairness

HOW WILL YOU “PROTECT SIERRA MADRE” WITH LIES?

Sierra Madre Neighbors for Fairness is made up of 15+ Sierra Madreans, yet again, we are referred to as the “mouthpiece” of New Urban West. As former Citizens of the Year, Older American of the Year, Volunteer Firefighter, Scout Troop leader, Little League coach, Woman of the Year, Commission and committee members, and volunteers in many Civic Organizations, we take offense at this. Have you ever seen us promote the Meadows project? I doubt it. We support reasonable development, write our own articles, and decide how we will respond to the lies we see that are hurting the Passionists.

Do you get Protect Sierra Madre-STOP Housing Project’s (PSMSHP) emails? Let’s look at the misinformation they spread just this week. Once again, they referred to the old maximum home size of 4,700 sq. ft., despite the developer agreeing to 3,775 sq. ft. over a month ago. They also refer to lot sizes “up to 7,900 sq. ft.” when actually the minimum lot size is 7,800 and goes up to 21,311, with an average is 9,532.

Next they say that New Urban West wants the Planning Commission to “rubber stamp this project”. No, they asked that the Planning Commission make a formal resolution with all the changes they want and to send that to the City Council. That is the Planning Commission’s job, they do not approve or deny the project, the City Council does. Then we have PSMSHP saying the EIR is “extremely flawed” and that it does not capture the negative impacts of the project, despite the City Attorney saying it has what it needs.

Once again, PSMSHP complains about traffic, huge McMansions, building in a Very High Fire Severity Zone, expanding Carter, wildlife displacement, cutting down over 100 trees, and they

say they will “STOP the Destroyed Meadows” without telling anyone that under their initiative to rezone the property to a residential zone that the same things can happen and the Meadow will still be destroyed, but this time with homes up to 6,500 sq. ft. True mansions. They also don’t tell you that under their initiative you will be giving up the three acre public park, 35 acres placed in conservancy, and net-zero water offsets.

PSMSHP loves to talk about how New Urban West invites “out of town supporters to come out,” while they tell their own supporters to “bring neighbors, friends, anyone who cares about Sierra Madre.” How is that different to anyone but a hypocrite? Despite complaining about our ads in the newspaper they don’t even seem to know that we are “Sierra Madre Neighbors for Fairness” and not “Citizens for Fairness.” And like usual, they accuse us of spreading misinformation again without saying what that specifically is.

Do we even know who the bad actors are? We can’t find a single name on the Stop the Housing Project website. With no accountability it is easy to spread lies. We would like to see the credentials of those who keep telling us how uncommitted we are to this city. What we do know is there are three neighbors of the Monastery who created the ballot initiative and have raised tens of thousands of dollars for their cause. What they don’t tell you is that they are not saving the meadow, won’t stop homes from being built, won’t save water, will still displace wildlife, and they won’t save 101 trees... oh, but for all that they are willing to trade away all the Passionist’s religious development rights.

It doesn’t matter what your motivations are, we believe supporting PSMSHP means you are supporting spreading misinformation and violating the religious rights of the Passionists. Dear Editor:

I didn’t intend to get into a back-and-forth on this, but I appreciated how the exchange in last week’s paper regarding the Meadows project focused on the problem of misinformation, and the importance of facts.

Robert Gjerde confronts claims made in flyers from Protect Sierra Madre; their wanting to save the “natural beauty and tranquility of the meadow”, “wildlife and nesting habitats”, “quiet solitude of the neighborhood”, “scenic vista” and “last remaining parcel of land” - and tells us, “That is a lie”. Well - okay, then.

In the column from Neighbors for Fairness (for the record - I’m a neighbor and I support fairness), they complain the initiative targets “a single institutional property . . . that applies to no other institution in the city”. But I know of no other “institution in the city” that’s proposing a development of 42 McMansions on our hillside. True, “The Mater Dolorosa Retreat Center is not a residential development” and “should not be subject to the rules of a residential zone”, but the “residential development” they’re proposing should indeed be subject to those “rules of a residential zone”.

In responding to my letter from the week before, they ask, “Where have we . . . said opposing the Meadows project is religious discrimination?” And then (a couple lines down) they respond to Ms. Beckham’s editorial by accusing her of “effectively engaging in religious discrimination”. No, I don’t want to “control” “someone else’s private property”. That’s the city’s job, and it’s why we have zoning ordinances.

If the initiative were to pass, they’d still be able to build houses and yes, Hillside Management zoning does allow construction up to 6,500 sq ft. (But to be in compliance, a house that size would have to sit on its own full-acre lot.) If the Passionists and New Urban West simply agreed to comply with our Hillside zoning restrictions, there’d be no conflict, no threatened lawsuits; they could still build houses – big ones – and still

Dear Editor:

“Oh, what tangled web we weave. . . .” You know the rest. It seems the Stop the Housing Project (STOP) and Preserve Sierra Madre (PSM) groups are weaving a lot of information into a tangled web that we are all supposed to believe as truth. The truth is, these groups have been fighting development on the Mater Dolorosa property long before a project was even submitted. Now they are trying to circumvent the due process of having a project fairly considered and either approved or disapproved by the City Council.

Here is a little history, the Mountain Views News first published an article in 2013 that disclosed

the plan by Mater Dolorosa Retreat Center to develop “ ‘low-density housing units’ on the lower (southern) portion of the property”.

In 2013, in response that that news, a coalition was formed by the neighbors on the west side of the property and at the top of Sunnyside, called “Stop the Monastery Housing Project”. You can still see those yard signs today and their “Preserve Mater Dolorosa and our quality of life” signs.

Out of eight proposals, in May of 2014, the Passionists chose New Urban West as the developer to come up with a project that would fit into their desire to preserve the solitude of the Retreat Center and still be economically viable.

Within a few months, the city had quickly passed a water meter moratorium that halted any plans. Stop the Monastery Development became Preserve Sierra Madre and there was a lull in opposing a project. In the meantime, the city created a new General Plan which removed the long-standing option to reuse the property for low-density residential. After the moratorium was lifted in February 2020, things picked up again. PSM was neutral on the project until more details became available. The west side neighbors reorganized as STOP and realized they could stop both institutional development and the proposed Meadows project with an initiative to rezone the property to Hillside Residential. This created the crux of the Initiative which is to be on the ballot in November.

make themselves a lot of money. But they’re unwilling to do so.

Instead, they’re spending a lot of money and dragging us through this ordeal just so they won’t have to comply with restrictions that are there for a reason – restrictions that would apply to anyone else. Here’s how the Hillside Management Zone in our Municipal Code begins with its Purpose (for the rest, search “Sierra Madre Chapter 17.52- H”) – and I’m wondering what there is here that New Urban West has a problem with:

- “A. Protect the natural environment of hillside areas from change by preserving and protecting the views to and from hillside areas in the city to maintain the identity, image and environmental quality of the city;
- B. Maintain an environmental equilibrium consistent with the native vegetation, animal life, geology, slopes, and drainage patterns;
- C. Facilitate hillside preservation through the development standards and guidelines set forth in this chapter; to direct and encourage development that is sensitive to the unique characteristics of the hillside areas in the city, which include, but are not limited to, slopes, land forms, vegetation and scenic quality . . .”

It all boils down to the developer’s refusal to proceed under our Hillside zoning restrictions – what the initiative calls for – regardless of the cost to our community. As I see it, they should let us know specifically what it is in these restrictions they can’t accept and why they’re so determined to reject them. Simply insisting they should be exempt from our rules doesn’t help.

They also complain about my having expressed “love about the city without saying what that was”. With the column unsigned, I can’t imagine that anyone who lives here would need an explanation. For those who don’t understand the love we have for Sierra Madre –  
“If you don’t know what it is, don’t mess with it.”

Through a joint Memorandum of Understanding which was requested by the City, the Passionists agreed to give a number of concessions to benefit the city worth many millions of dollars. As a result, a comprehensive project was presented to the city, including an increase in the gross floor area in exchange for the concessions. All of this is at risk now with the initiative, which will not only allow homes to be developed on the southern portion of the property but also where the Retreat Center is. The initiative will monetize and incentivize the entire property for residential development.

So, here we are, with the Passionists facing a forced rezoning that will strip them of their religious institutional development rights, disallowing any future expansion or significant physical alteration or change of use of their existing buildings. Plus the opponents engage in ad hominem attacks by calling the Passionists a “bad neighbor” for following the legal process of a Specific Plan to develop a low-density residential project, an explicit right that they had up until seven years ago.

We agree, that no one should be subjected to misinformation. So, how about telling all of the truth about what is being taken away from the Passionists and the impact on their property. How about not weaving half-truths and misinformation by telling residents they will not lose their wildlife, tranquility of the meadow, less traffic, and no McMansions under the initiative when in reality the entire property can be developed with mansions up to 6,500 sq. ft. in size. If the initiative passes the Passionists will be faced with a choice, either sue the city or sell the entire property to a developer who can build 30+ 6,500 sq. ft. homes with almost no oversight. The citizens of Sierra Madre deserve to know the truth. “Oh what a tangled web we weave, when first we practice to deceive.” –Sir Walter Scott.

Use of a hose to clean patios, driveways and sidewalks is prohibited. Use a broom instead!



No operating ornamental fountains or water features, unless water is part of a recirculated system.



Restaurants, delis, or cafés will serve water upon request only.



All water customers shall repair leaks in a timely manner.



Watering your lawn, landscape or turf in a wasteful manner is prohibited



No vehicle washing at home, unless you have a shut-off nozzle on your hose.



Check and adjust your sprinklers frequently to prevent water runoff onto the sidewalk, house or street.



Outdoor irrigation is prohibited between 6AM - 6PM

## SIERRA MADRE POLICE BLOTTER

The following represents a summary report of some of the major incidents handled by the Sierra Madre Police Department during this period. This list is not intended to be considered exclusive or all-inclusive.

Monday, June 27  
Commercial Burglary

At approximately 7 AM, officers responded to the Sierra Madre Elementary School for reports of a possible burglary. Upon arrival, officers made contact with an administrator, who reported that unknown suspect(s) made unauthorized entry into school property, and vandalized the interior of the school. The incident took place sometime during the evening hours of Sunday, June 26th. There is no suspect information at this time, and the Detectives Bureau is following up on this incident.

Monday, June 27  
Weapons Violation Arrest

At approximately 9 PM, officers responded to the area of Sunnyside Ave and Orange Grove Ave for reports of a suspicious vehicle. 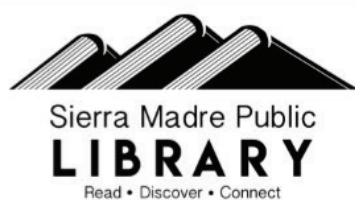

## Local Area News Brief

### Elderly Pasadena Residence Stabbed to Death

Pasadena police are still looking for two of three suspects wanted in connection to a stabbing in North Central Pasadena Wednesday afternoon that left an 82-year-old man dead.

According to a statement, officers from the Pasadena Police responded at about 2:16 p.m. to the 1000 block of North Mentor Avenue regarding an "Assault with a Deadly Weapon" call. Officers located an unresponsive man, identified as 82-year-old Glenn Cavin, inside the residence suffering from multiple stab wounds.

Paramedics from the Pasadena Fire Department attempted life-saving medical aid. However, the victim succumbed to his wounds. Cavin was pronounced deceased at the scene.

Shortly after 3:00 p.m., officers from the Pasadena Police Department arrested one of the suspects in connection with the homicide. The unidentified suspect was arrested in the parking lot of Target store in East Pasadena. Officers evacuated the Target according to reports.

Two additional suspects are still outstanding and actively being sought. The motive is unknown at this time, and the investigation is ongoing. No other information was given.

### PCC and Caltech Put on Lockdown Orders

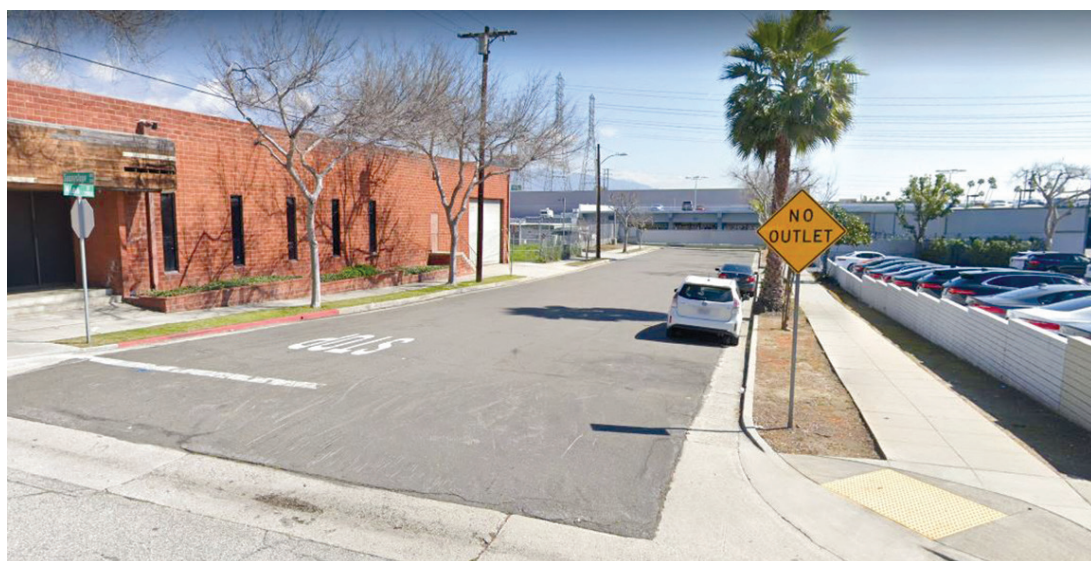
Pasadena police ordered both Pasadena City College and Caltech on lockdown after three wanted grand theft suspects fled from police onto the PCC campus Thursday afternoon.

"Caltech & neighbor PCC have shared lockdown orders at the request of @PasadenaPD as they work to apprehend robbery suspects in the vicinity," Caltech officials tweeted. "If not on campus, do not come to campus. If on campus, please remain in place until you receive a release of the lockdown order."

According to police, the men were initially described as armed. On the suspects was found in a parking structure at PCC. The other two remain at large.

The suspects were wanted in connection to a report around 2 p.m. of a lawnmower stolen out of the back of a pickup truck in Glendora.

Police tracked the suspects down the 210 freeway and into PCC. The two colleges were put on lockdown about 3:45 p.m. and lifted a few hours later.



## City to Likely Vacate East Pasadena Street

The Pasadena city council is set Monday to consider adopting a resolution that would give up part of Nina Street to make way for a proposed Rusnak Porsche development in East Pasadena along Colorado Blvd. The council will also vote to schedule a public hearing for other property owners in the nearby area.

According to City Engineer Kris Markarian the 276 foot long, 60 foot wide, roadway from Sunnyslope Ave. east is in conflict with the proposed Rusnak development.

The application for the street vacation was submitted by Rusnak Daimler Chrysler Center Inc., a Delaware Corporation in conjunction with the proposed Rusnak Porsche development on the east side of Sunnyslope Avenue between

Walnut St. and Colorado Blvd. The proposed construction includes the demolition of existing buildings and the construction of new automobile sales, leasing, services and parts buildings with a paved parking lot Markarian's report reads.

Markarian also said the by relinquishing all rights to the roadway, and 10-foot wide sidewalks on both sides of the street, would relieve the city from future maintenance responsibilities and any liability associated with the vacated area.

He also stated that they have determined that there is no need, present or future, to retain the subject street segment for its intended public purpose, and that its vacation will not cause any negative impacts to the city's transportation system.

If approved, property owners within a 500-foot radius would

be notified, and a public hearing would be set for August 15 according to Markarian.

Although the street provides access to abutting properties, Markarian noted that "the existing straight-angled configuration does not provide sufficient turn-around space for public, emergency and maintenance vehicles, rendering it substandard for motorists."

The Planning Commission will also consider comments on the project's proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration at a July 27 public hearing.

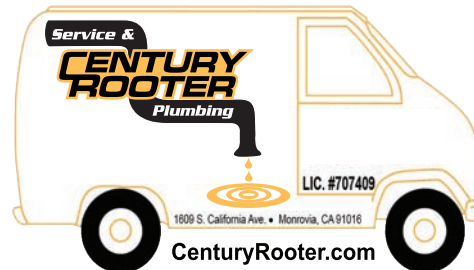

## MONROVIA 2022 ATHENS SERVICES RATE INCREASE

In July 2016, the City of Monrovia entered into an exclusive franchise agreement with Athens Services for solid waste and recycling services. The agreement set forth by the City of Monrovia and Athens Services grants them the ability to request an annual rate adjustment based upon the CPI (Consumer Price Index) for Los Angeles plus 1% increase annually. On June 21, 2022, the Monrovia City Council approved an 8.87% increase for solid waste services effective July 1, 2022.

Rate Adjustments for Residential, Multi-Family and Commercial Customers

For the typical residential customer enrolled in the 90-gallon trash / recycling barrel program), solid waste services will increase by \$3.21 / month, from \$36.47 / month to \$39.68 / month. For the typical commercial customer enrolled in the one 3-yard bin, which is serviced once per week, solid waste services will increase by \$18.85 / month, from \$212.68 / month to \$231.53 / month.

The rate increase takes into account the increase in the CPI between April 2021 and April 2022. During this time, costs have substantially increased. Although the rate increase seems high, the City of Monrovia, in comparison to neighboring cities, fares above average for solid waste rates.

The rates include all the services Athens currently provides us which include bulky item disposal, electronic waste recycling, and brush clearance bins for the City's brush clearance program.

## THE MAD TOWN COUNCIL'S AWESOME "FIRST ANNUAL SUMMER COMMUNITY EVENT"

Two months ago, the Monrovia-Arcadia-Duarte Town Council met with Supervisor Kathryn Barger. Council Member Michelle Wright was angry. For many years, he had been trying to get Suicide Prevention info into the County Guide Book, but it never happened. He spoke with passion, about his "Choose 2 Live Project" and the devastating loss of his only son. The Supervisor listened; was appalled. It was agreed that we must get the word out. How could we do this?

Contact Churches, (Michelle spoke at a Monrovia Ministerial Association Meeting); the Press, ("A Father's Mission: Choose to Live"); and a Town Council Community event. The Supervisor encouraged us, sponsored our event and her Field Deputy Sandra Croxton helped us tremendously, contacting county agencies, and securing a venue. Temple Station Deputy April Nelson had ideas, contacted the County Mediation Team, she has worked with at Homeless Encampments.

The Event surpassed all expectations. Supervisor Barger attended; was very impressed with so many vendors and shared information. She presented the Town Council with a beautiful Proclamation.

Guest Speaker Tracie Andrews, LA County Mental Health Dept. spoke passionately of suicide prevention, educating the public. Nellie Arias, Partners in Suicide Intervention and Roberta Holts, Liaison for Homeless and Veterans, Crisis Prevention & Peer Support echoed Andrew's plea for help.

Our neighbors, Monrovia City Council Member Larry Spicer and Mayor-Elect Becky Shevlin attended. Duarte Council Member Toney Lewis came with his son. Lewis shared he grew up here and spent much time at Pamela Park.

Station #169 (Captain Arvizu, Engineer Covert, Firefighter Salazar), LA COUNTY MET TEAM Deputies Lopez and Hidalgo; LA COUNTY MENTAL EVALUATION TEAM ( Access 24/7 Hotline 800-854-7771) California Highway Patrol (Officers Alexander and Hill,) L.A. ## CALTRANS ANNOUNCES FIVE-DAY CLOSURE OF WESTBOUND I-210 AT SAN GABRIEL RIVER BRIDGE - WEDNESDAY, JULY 20 THROUGH TUESDAY, JULY 26

IRWINDALE - The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has rescheduled a five-day closure of westbound interstate 210 (I-210) at the San Gabriel River Bridge in Irwindale for a bridge upgrade project partially funded by Senate Bill (SB 1). Crews will divert traffic from westbound I-210 to eastbound I-210, which will be converted to three-lanes in both directions between Interstate 605 (I-605) and Irwindale Avenue during the closure.

The following closures will be taking place Wednesday, July 20, at 10 PM through Tuesday, July 26 at 4 PM:

Westbound I-210 from Irwindale Ave to I-605  
Westbound I-210 Irwindale Avenue ramps  
Westbound I-210 to southbound I-605 connector  
I-605 to eastbound I-210 connector  
Eastbound I-210 Mt. Olive on-ramps

A second five-day closure affecting eastbound I-210 will occur on Wednesday, August 10 at 10 PM through Tuesday, August 16 at 4 AM.

Caltrans advises motorists to expect major delays, use I-10 or SR-60 as alternate routes, use public transportation on Metro L Line (Gold) or Metrolink during the closures and if possible, work from home.

The closure schedule is subject to change due to weather, availability of equipment and materials, and construction-related issues. Motorists are encouraged to plan ahead and check the Caltrans QuickMap for up-to-the-minute traffic conditions. More information and updates on this project can be found on the District 7 website or on Twitter.

The work is part of a project to upgrade the San Gabriel River Bridge on I-210 in Irwindale. The \$30 million project - which includes \$1.7 million from SB 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 - will upgrade existing bridge hinges and railings and strengthen bridge decks to improve safety.

SB 1 provides \$5 billion in transportation funding annually split between the state and local agencies. Road projects progress through construction phases more quickly based on the availability of SB 1 funds, including projects that are partially funded by SB 1.

### DILLS' GREEK VACATION PART 2

My Buddy and the pride of Eaton Canyon Sean Lorenzini is off to visit Greece this week and I promised a run-down of my last trip through the Mediterranean. It has been some 50 years that I departed Greek Soil. I recently returned to Greece and am excited to share my experience with you. If it is history that you seek, there is plenty of that to enjoy, if you are looking for relaxation then this is your spot, how about superior cuisine? I will attest that the worst meal of the trip wasn't really all that bad. Yes, Greece has something for everyone.

Getting There: It's a long flight, with choices of airlines and layovers in Toronto, Washington and New York. We traveled on Air Canada and had a layover in Toronto. As a beer drinker, a few Molson's at the airport restaurant helped make the time go by fast. One warning though, if you are using dollars they will give you back Canadian currency, so my suggestion is to use your credit card. Unless you want to have a couple of dollars as a keepsake. Once you make it to Athens, you'll have the choice of a taxi, renting a car, or if you are on a tour like we were then someone will greet you at the terminal. My suggestion is that if this is your first trip a taxi or hotel shuttle would be prudent. However, if you are on the islands, renting a car is safe and easy.

Where to stay: In Athens there is a list of five star, four star and three star hotels. We stayed at the Metropolitan just outside of Athens, and while the hotel was clean and a great view of the port, I wouldn't say it was five star. But I liked that it had a view and was away from downtown Athens that is congested and a bit dirty with graffiti and scooters everywhere. Once in Santorini and Mykonos, the accommodations are very nice, in fact while our hotel in Santorini El Greco, wasn't on the beach it reminded me of staying in a storybook village: very upscale and with four different pools. In Mykonos there are many small/boutique hotels very close to the beach, while our accommodations were close to being cramped, I will call it cozy.

To tour or not: If you have traveled to Athens or any other surrounding Islands before, I don't see any need to sign up for a tour. We did and I am glad we did, but it was the consensus of our group that if any of us were to return, that you could easily do it on your own. We agreed that once if you have seen the ruins and the stadium, that none of us would spend much time in Athens.

Getting Around: Big difference in getting around in Athens and getting around in Greece. First of all it's much hotter in Athens then it is in the islands, and as I mention in when to go July and August have severe heat. My mother to this day reminds me of the 100+ day in July when I was born on a US Army base. The buses in Athens are usually filled with locals and would opt for taking a taxi or even the tram. On the Islands I do recommend the buses, many of them are new, air-conditioned and dependable, a bus ride is about \$1.40 euro. On the islands you can rent a scooter by the day, it looks fun, but I was warned that many a kid has seen the hospital by crashing into the wall on a narrow road. Getting from island to island is done by Ferry, a boat that costs about \$55 euro. There are airplanes that do fly from the Athens Airport to Santorini/Mykonos, and when I return I will take advantage of them, but for your first visit it adds to the fun of the trip. Bring a book or a crossword puzzle. If you aren't on a guided tour tickets can easily be purchased at the port.

When to go: Athens is hot, I mean temperature hot, in fact many workers and vendors take off August to visit friends and families elsewhere. If you are there to relax and get a tan, then by all means July would be OK, however just visiting the Acropolis in June we were overheated and water was our best friend, I couldn't imagine a July tour of Athens. My suggestion is early June or late September.

Dollar v. Euro: Those looking for bargains, we found that even though Greece is in a financial crisis, they haven't put out the distress flag yet, when shopping you can always ask for the best price. I was warned that dinners can easily run \$70 euro, while I did see that price tag, it was very few and in between. I did notice that the restaurants closest to the water were pricier. A tip is to go to supermarkets, not the markets and buy beer, water and fruit and have it in your hotel refrigerator. The fruit there is some of the best I've had. The beer and sodas at the hotel can be twice or three times as much as getting them at the market or a Kiosk.

Dining in Greece: Originally I was going to give a few reviews of the restaurants that I visited, and after collecting business cards of places that I dined, I came up with this conclusion, where ever you go, you really can't go wrong. You want affordable dining? They have it. Want to dine on or near the beach? Yes, fish and chicken are the most popular items that we came across both in Athens and in Santorini and Mykonos. The items on the menus at each restaurant are very similar. You won't find too many steaks or burgers, yes, they are available but there are no beef cattle being raised in Greece. We enjoyed the Greek Salad and the Rocket Salad pretty much with every meal. You'll find that the Greek Salad has no lettuce, and is made up of cucumbers, olives, tomatoes and Feta Cheese. Something I found odd, the extra charges on the bill, first when they ask if you want bread, we always say yes, there is an additional charge of 2 to 3 euro. Plus sit down restaurants have a cover charge, no not the night club admission, this is a sitting charge, this charge gives you the privilege of sitting at your table for as long as you want, I think this was initiated more for the locals that like to sit for hours and conversing over cigarettes and espresso. Note.. everyone smokes, even while they are working. One spot that did stand out in Athens, near our hotel was Restaurant Kalypso. The food was above average and the waiter even assisted us with our Greek language lessons. We returned there while waiting for our flight home.

Tipping: This isn't as big of a deal that it is in the states. Workers are working for what is called a "living wage", don't ask me to explain a living wage, I am restaurant reviewer not workers rights lawyer, however you won't get the typical service that you'd expect from the waiters, it's not bad, it's "are you ready to order" your food is brought and you might not see your server again, at least until you flag them down/ and I did a lot of flagging down. My suggestion is 10 to 12 % tip. Taxi Cab drivers same thing, a couple of euro are sufficient. As with any trip leaving the chambermaid and if you are on a tour, a tip is suggested.

Sightseeing: The first day is full of sight seeing, visit the Acropolis, Zeus Statue, Temple of Poseidon, and the Stadium, an afternoon at the beach in Athens is also a pleasant way to end your day in Athens, a day in Athens? Yes, ! I found Athens to be hot, congested and plain dirty. If you want to see the ruins, I took a boat trip to the Island of Delos. There is a small admission charge once you get there, but you will get a sense of the history of Greece. One of the highlights of the trip was our seven-mile hike on The Santorini; we started at Fira and ended our walk in OIA, beautiful walk looking the cliffs and sights of the Volcano's and the Aegean Sea. Two other musts while we are on Mykonos we took a small boat along the shore and you have your choice of five beaches, a beach for everyone, a party beach, a topless beach, we opted for Elia, plenty of sand and chairs to enjoy a relaxing day sun bathing. Santorini has been voted top ten sunsets in the entire world. We took the Sunset Cruise that was quite relaxing and is a must; another bonus is the boat stop briefly at one of the volcanic hot springs, hot? No, but quite warm.

Is Greece Safe? : Yes!! On our first day on our vacation we stayed just a few miles from downtown, it wasn't till we went to downtown did we see any police presence, you are more likely to be hit by a scooter then witness any crime that goes for the Islands of Santorini and Mykonos as well. In fact on the Islands we noticed no police at all, I mean none. I was surprised by the text messages and facebook postings asking me if I was OK? Just like Los Angeles, some areas are better then others, if you are looking for a demonstration I am sure if you wait long enough you can find one.

Opal!!! Pack your bags save your money and head to the Islands of Greece. The locals are waiting for you with open arms and a glass of Ouzo.

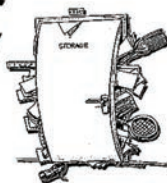

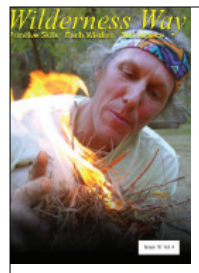

## HOW TO FIND AND CLAIM YOUR FAMILY'S FORGOTTEN ASSETS

Dear Savvy Senior:

*A while back I read an article about some online tools that can help people search for lost or forgotten money left behind by their deceased relatives, but I've misplaced it. Can you help me with this? My mom, who passed away in January, was always bad about keeping up with her money, so I'm wondering if there was anything she left behind. Searching Son*

Dear Searching:

Forgotten or lost money is actually very common in the United States. According to the National Association of Unclaimed Property Administrators, there are literally billions of dollars in unclaimed funds sitting in state treasuries and other agencies just waiting to be found.

These unclaimed funds are from accounts that are inactive or whose owners, or their heirs, cannot be located. Unclaimed funds can include things like lost or forgotten saving or checking accounts, stocks, utility security deposits, tax refunds, life insurance policy proceeds, uncashed dividend checks, matured savings bonds and much more.

This typically happens because of a change of address (the owner moved), a name change (the owner got married or divorced), or the owner dies, and the estate was unaware of the money or the heirs could not be located. By law, companies and financial institutions that can't find the owner or their next of kin within two to five years must turn the property over to the state where it's held indefinitely.

Where to Search

About 10 percent of all Americans have some unclaimed money out there waiting to be found, so it's very possible your mother had some too. To start your search, go to Unclaimed.org, which has links to all state programs that will let you do a state benefits search online for free. Or you can do a multi-state search in 39 states at MissingMoney.com.

Be sure to check every state in which your mother lived, worked or did business. Also, make sure to check under your mom's maiden name, and if she had a frequently misspelled name, search those misspellings too. Using her first initial and her last name is also encouraged



to make sure everything comes up.

Every state can tell you immediately if your mom has some unclaimed money, as well as how to go about collecting it.

Look Here Too

In addition to state treasuries, here are some other resources that can help you look for unclaimed money that may have been overlooked.

Forgotten retirement benefits: To search for lost or forgotten 401(k) funds your mom may have left behind with an old employer, use the National Registry of Unclaimed Retirement Benefits at UnclaimedRetirementBenefits.com. Or to search for lost pension benefits, use the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation trustee plan search tool at PBGC.gov/search-trusteed-plans.

Lost life insurance: To track down a lost or forgotten life insurance policy, the National Association of Insurance Commissioners, an insurance regulatory support organization, offers a free policy locator service at <https://eapps.naic.org/life-policy-locator>.

Unredeemed savings bonds: It's very common for people to lose track of U.S. saving bonds because they are often given to children as gifts, then forgotten before the bonds reach maturity. To find out if your mom had any, the U.S. Department of the Treasury provides an online search tool at TreasuryHunt.gov for finding matured, uncashed savings bonds over 30 years old and no longer earning interest.

Federal tax refunds: Each year thousands of refund checks totaling millions of dollars are returned to the IRS by the post office. To look for lost Federal tax refund checks go to IRS.gov/refunds or call 800-829-1954.

I haven't had time to see my friend Henry for a while but he emailed me this article about the 1972 book entitled "The Limits to Growth" written fifty years ago. The book discusses how computer modeling (primitive as it was in 1972) predicted that rampant pollution and resource extraction was pushing the Earth and its inhabitants to the brink of extinction. The modeling sounds like it could have been done last week as we now experience climate changes, water shortages, and micro-plastics corrupting every corner of the Earth. As I understand it, the book was taken as one of many doomsday prophesies and after some attention it was ignored. In discussing the book today in an interview Carlos Alvarez Pereira, the co-editor of the book, explains that the intent of the book was to make clear that humanity had a choice to make.

He makes a similar point as does Neil Postman the author of the book "Technopoly, the Surrender of Culture to Technology" another book that was given to me by friend Peter to read. The point is that technology is pursued without any thought to its consequences. It is pointed out that the uncontrolled growth of technology has in fact "destroyed the vital sources of our humanity". It creates a culture without a moral foundation. It undermines certain mental processes and social relations that make human life worth living". This is the same emphasis that Alvarez Pereira makes in "The Limits of Growth. Humanity has a choice to be led by technology and suffer the consequences OR choose to recognize the basic values of humanity.

What are these values that create a healthy life? "It is not the consumption and the pursuit of wealth and adventure and diversion. It's the quality of our relationships with other humans, with nature, that makes possible the scenarios in which you can decouple well-being and the growth of consumption. Is it too late or are we headed on the road to inevitable extinction? I don't know. My learned epidemiologist scientist friend Kevin tells me not to worry about it. Extinction is probably a few generations away so while we have this gift of life do your best to enjoy it.

That may well be good advice but for me one of the great pleasures of my life is reading. The introduction to the Technopoly book (remember it was given to me by a friend) begins with a quote from Paul Goodman

Whether or not it draws on new scientific research.

Technology is a branch of moral philosophy

I heard Paul Goodman, the writer, therapist, and social critic who has been called the father figure of the new left speak during my Berkeley days. I remember him emphasizing proudly that he had not attended college and certainly the above quote does not illustrate anything taught by our Colleges. In fact the quote makes a similar point that I just chanced upon in the book "Neanderthal" by John Danton which was a part of my search for possible alternatives to our doomed (as far as I can tell) society. The point is made on page 292 that it is morality, that connection with others, that sets us apart from the beasts of the jungle "that and the certain knowledge of our own deaths." The book discussed the possibility that within primitive tribes there was little concern for the individual as to what was important was the welfare of the entire tribe.

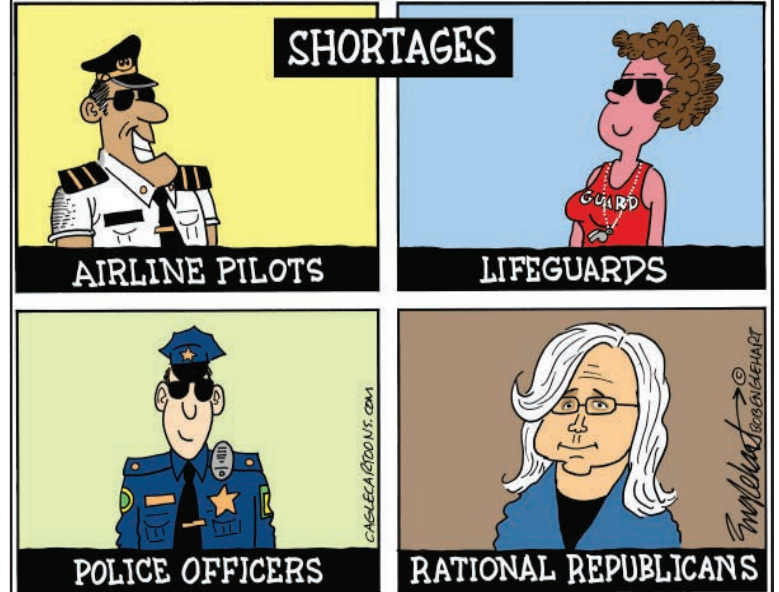
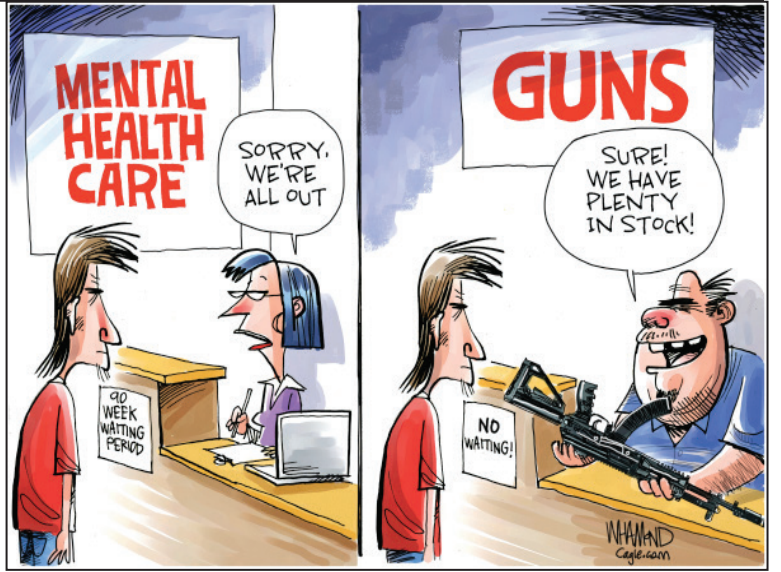

### THE NEED TO VACATE THIS SUMMER



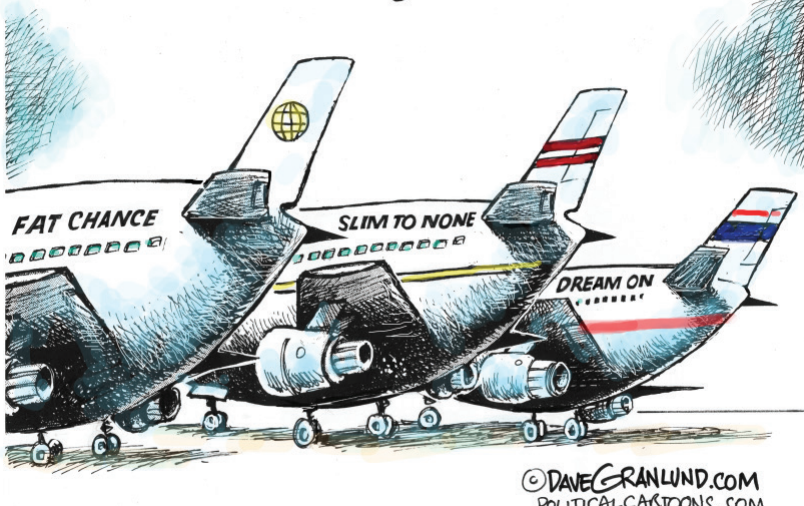
I sure could use a vacation about now — but I have no plans to take one this summer.
