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

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CITY FALLS BEHIND IN ZERO-EMISSION REQUIREMENTS By Kevin McGuire

For Sierra Madre to set an example as a leader in sustainability and innovation, it must first implement a fleet of zero-emission Municipal vehicles to meet California's aggressive goal of improving air quality and reducing greenhouse gas emissions. And so far, the city is lagging a bit behind.

Monrovia

In 2023, California enacted several mandates promoting zero-emission technology for vehicle fleets, including the Advanced Clean Fleets (ACF) regulation, which targets municipal fleets to meet key requirements and milestones, including 50% zero-emission vehicles (ZEV) starting in 2024 and 100% ZEV

Such a Municipal Fleet Electrification Plan would require changes to the city's infrastructure as well, as electric charging stations would be needed at all city facilities. This raises the same question as always—what about the cost?

Eric Lozick, Management Analyst, presented to the City Council on May 13, 2025, high lighting the importance of meeting compliance and discussing options to cover the plan's costs, including seeking grants, rebates, and partnerships to help offset some of the expenditures. Council Member Gene Goss was not in attendance.

In addition to not meeting the 50% EV goals as part of meeting ACF annual requirements, Sierra Madre was also required to send a record-keeping report to the California Air Resources Board (CARB) starting on April 1, 2024, to demonstrate compliance. As of this May 13 City Council meeting, no report had been filed.

What is the penalty for not being compliant? According to Lozick, administrative penalties under the California Health and Safety Code could be as high as \$10,000 per day, though no penalties have been issued to Sierra Madre just yet. Lozick stressed to the City Council the importance of filing this report to meet the ACF's request and working on becoming compliant with the 50% EV fleet requirements.

Lozick even pointed out that the last vehicles purchased by the city included no EVs. "The city recently purchased four new vehicles. Two of those were Ford Rangers, there was a Boom truck related to public service work, and a Ford F-250. Those vehicles—could have been EVs, and they should have been EVs meeting the 50% compliance from CARB and ACF," Lozick stated.

Director of Public Works Arnulfo Yanez defended the purchase of the four non-EVs as needed vehicles bought with American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for use during fires and mudslides. However, Yanez stated that he hopes to implement a five- and 10-year plan to address infrastructure needs and the purchase of required electric vehicles (EVs).

The Future is Now

By achieving these goals sooner rather than later, Sierra Madre can take advantage of new

vehicle offerings, accumulate "early action" credits, and realize long-term savings, as well as lower fuel and maintenance costs, according to a report by Lozick. This also puts the city in a position to lead by example in the quest for sustainability, innovation, and pilot-

The ACF regulations would apply to vehicles with a Gross Vehicle Weight Rating over 8,500 pounds. Emergency vehicles (Fire Engines, Police vehicles, ambulances) are exempt from these requirements, as are school buses, transit buses, and military tactical vehicles. Although not yet available, quality ZEV options for these types of vehicles are likely to be introduced in the future.

ing new technologies.

These ACF regulations only apply to newly purchased vehicles. Sierra Madre will still be able to operate gas-powered vehicles, but when those vehicles are no longer operational, replacement vehicles should be ZEVs.

In addition, California has mandated that all new passenger cars, SUVs, and light pick-up trucks in the state be zero-emission by 2035.

Going Electric

Moving forward with electric vehicles means adding facilities to charge up. The city is looking at options for several charging locations, including the City Yard (Public Works), the Police Department parking area, and possibly City Hall or other sites where municipal vehicles are housed. The city currently has two Level 2 charging stations at the Police Station. City Staff will work with Southern California Edison and other technical consultants to review the necessary components, including new electrical panels, transformers, and dedicated circuits, needed to handle the increased | fund the replacement of any older, high-pol-

Then there are other factors to consider, such as making sure our vehicles are ready during a power outage and having backup power options at hand. Then, of course, zoning codes, building codes, Americans with Disabilities Act requirements, and meeting California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) standards. What was it that a wise man once said? "With great power comes great responsibility."

The Savings Might Shock You

As the City reviews monetary options to set the initial spark for an eco-friendly Sierra Madre, the long-term cost savings could prove significant. Electricity is cheaper by the mile than gas or diesel, and its price is more stable. This could be a factor in more reliable budget planning. According to the report, some municipalities have seen a 60-70% reduction in fuel expenditures after introducing electric vehicles (EVs) into their mix.

Additionally, the maintenance requirements for electric vehicles (EVs) are lower than those of gas-powered vehicles. Other cities have reported a decrease of up to 80% in maintenance and repair costs following the introduction of EVs. Some of the towns already implementing EV programs include South Pasadena, Pasadena, Santa Monica, and Culver City. Notably, South Pasadena made National News headlines after switching its entire police force to electric vehicles by leasing Teslas.

City staff have identified several funding sources and financial assistance programs to help initiate the Municipal Fleet Electrification Plan.

The Hybrid and Zero-Emission Truck and Bus Voucher Incentive Project (HVIP) is a key program for public agencies looking to buy medium- and heavy-duty vehicles. HVIP provides point-of-sale vouchers that directly reduce the purchase price of eligible zeroemission trucks and buses, with incentives typically ranging from around \$7,500 up to \$120,000+ per vehicle, depending on the ve-

The Carl Moyer Program could help luting trucks in our fleet. For instance, if we have a pre-2010 diesel vehicle, we might receive a grant to retire it and replace it with an electric vehicle (EV).

The Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC) runs a Local Government Partnership Program that offers grants to cities for zero-emission vehicles and infrastructure. In recent years, the MSRC program has (Continued on Page 3)

LET'S FIGHT SCAMS TOGETHER By Kellie Strubinski

Scams are everywhere. Avoiding scams is

easier than you think.

Your first line of defense is to say "No" to all requests that you receive asking for money, information or offering you some type of assistance. Usually, these requests are accompanied with a sense of urgency.

If you get a text, email, letter or phone call requesting money/payment or information that you didn't initiate, delete the text, email or hang up. If you get a solicitor at your door, either don't answer it if you don't know them or close your door if they want money or information that seems suspicious. If this makes you feel rude or disrespectful, that's OK. Now is the time to

Letters can be intercepted in the mail and deposit account numbers can be swapped out for fraudulent account numbers. Before sending money to an account in a letter, confirm the account number with the vendor.

If you are unsure of the request, call the establishment directly to verify the request. Don't let Logos fool you into thinking the request is real.

It is good to have a scam protector. Pick some-

one in your family or friend circle that you agree to contact when you are unsure of a request. Often a second opinion will help reveal to you that someone is trying to

Get good at inspecting URLs and email addresses. Often the first characters look legitimate but the last characters do not. That can be the first red flag. Even if the URL and email address pass your tests, it is still wise to contact the vendor/establishment directly if something seems suspicious.

If you get a ransom request or repair request (computer popup window) on your computer, turn your computer off and take a break before turning it back on. Be careful not to click on links that are questionable.

QR Codes: If you can run your fingers over the code and it feels like a sticker, avoid it. Scammers put their own QR Codes over legitimate codes.

Look into getting a RFID wallet to avoid people walking close to your wallet and electronically scanning payment from one of your credit cards. At ATMs, cover your hand when you enter your

access code so that miniature cameras that scammers can place on ATM Kiosks can't record your fingers. Freeze your credit with the Credit Bureaus. It is





In honor of Plant a Lemon Tree Day, the picture this week is one painted by my Dad some years ago of lemons during the Jurassic period. Also, in honor of Plant a Lemon Tree Day, recipe I tried this week that is terrific:

Whole Lemon Blender Bread

Preheat oven to 350, spray a 9 x 5 loaf pan with baking spray. I used the 9 x 5 and also a small pan as I didn't want lemon batter all over my oven.

- 1 very large (or 2 or 3 smaller) lemons
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- ½ cup canola or vegetable oil
- 1/3 cup sour cream (I used a small vanilla yogurt as I didn't have sour cream)
 - 2 large eggs
 - 1 tsp. lemon extract
 - 2 cups all-purpose flour
 - 2-1/2 tsp. baking powder
 - ½ tsp. kosher salt

Gather all ingredients, trim and discard lemon ends, cut into wedges and remove seeds. Place first 6 ingredients in your blender, puree them, then add the rest of the ingredients. Process until a smooth, thick batter is formed. Scrape down sides frequently. Pour into prepared pan and bake 50-55 minutes till that good old toothpick comes out clean. Let it cool in the pan for about 20 minutes then spread a little butter on a slice and enjoy!

funded cities to purchase electric refuse trucks, install charging stations at city yards, and even pilot electric police vehicles.

The California Energy Commission (CEC) also funds charging infrastructure through programs like CALeVIP (California Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Project), which has provided rebates for public charging stations in various regions. In addition to state and federal programs, Sierra Madre can leverage initiatives offered by our community choice energy provider, Clean Power Alliance (CPA). CPA (which supplies electricity to Sierra Madre) has launched an Energized Communities program to help member cities decarbonize their fleets and facilities.

Mayor Robert Parkhurst and the City Council addressed a few concerns, including the fact that the city is over a year behind in filing the necessary report to CARB and not having a plan in place to complete a Municipal Fleet Electrification Plan. Questions arose on whether staffing issues contributed to the report never being filed by the April 1, 2024, deadline.

Lozick said the "silver lining" in all this is that Sierra Madre is not alone in dealing with these issues, and many other cities are in the same boat as they scramble to get into compliance and face the threat of fines. He suggested that an alignment can be made with other cities in the San Gabriel Valley to work together to meet these requirements and capitalize on available resources for funding and discounts.

The City Council decided to continue this item until the next regular meeting to allow time to better understand what is required to complete the CARB report and meet that compliance first, then tackle the EV fleet and infrastructure needs further down the line.

The next meeting is scheduled for May 27. I hope everyone is amped up after the holiday.

If you get a call from an unknown caller trying to get you to chat, give minimal information or just Hang Up. Scammers can regenerate your voice from a 30 second sample.

Avoid overly friendly/charming matches on dating sites especially if they are accompanied with a "hard luck" story that may turn into a request for financial aid.

Check your credit card statements for reoccurring or onetime charges that are unexplainable.

Stay current on scamming techniques by following fraud/ scam prevention sites. AARP, FBI, Los Angeles County are some good sites to start with.

Identity Theft Protection software and programs exist and may be worthwhile. They are outside of the scope of this article, but may be worthy of your research and consideration.

Share what you know with three friends this week and ask them to do the same. Let's teach each other how to avoid getting scammed. Shared knowledge is our best protection.

Police Oversight Commission **Open Seats**

Pasadena city officials announced Wednesday that three seats will be open on the Pasadena Community Police Oversight Commission and they are asking communitybased organizations to nominate individuals to serve as commissioners.

The purpose of the commission is to enhance, develop and strengthen community-police relations and review and make recommendations regarding the ongoing operations of the Pasadena Police Department to the chief of police, city manager and/or City Council.

The CPOC is composed of 11 members, with the mayor and each city council member nominating one (for a total of eight) and three members nominated from communitybased organizations. The term for the three communitybased organization members expires on June 30, at which point the City Council will appoint three members nominated by community-based organizations. The City encourages interested members of the public to apply for the three communitybased organization seats, with those appointed receiving three-year terms set to expire on June 30, 2028.

Applications received by 5:30 p.m. on Friday, June 6, will be forwarded to the City Council for consideration. Please note that individuals applying these communitybased organization seats must have the endorsement of a community-based organization.

No later than 90 days appointment commission, new commissioners participate in a ride-along with the Pasadena Police Department, and receive 30 hours of training in relevant subject matter areas. Further information about the qualifications, training requirements, and duties of commissioners can be found in the Pasadena Municipal Code, Chapter 2.60.

L.A. Supervisors Backs State Crackdown on Copper Theft

The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors today unanimously approved a motion introduced by Board Chair Kathryn Barger in support of Assembly Bill 476 (Gonzalez), legislation aimed at curbing the rising threat of copper and nonferrous metal theft across California.

Supervisor Barger's highlights the motion growing public safety and infrastructure risks posed by thefts that have disabled streetlights, disrupted telecommunications, and impacted critical services regulation of junk dealers like water systems and public transportation—especially in transaction documentation, rural areas of the County.

"Copper theft is far from a petty crime, it's a direct threat to the safety and well-being of our communities," said Supervisor Kathryn Barger. "Supporting this bill reflects our shared commitment to holding perpetrators accountable and supporting stronger enforcement tools that will deter this type of theft. We need clear recordkeeping, tighter restrictions, and to prioritize prosecution better coordination with law of copper theft due to its enforcement to stop these widespread public impact.

CITY ADDRESSES CHARGES AGAINST FORMER ASSISTANT CITY MANAGER

La Cañada Flintridge, CA - Carl Alameda, a former staff member at the City of La Cañada Flintridge, has been charged by the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office for the alleged financial crimes related to his work at the City. The alleged criminal activity involved insurance fraud and embezzlement. The alleged financial crimes committed between 2016 and 2022 were perpetuated using the City of La Cañada Flintridge name and the trust associated with Mr. Alameda's role with the City. \$193,086 in ill-gotten gains have been identified through the investigation.

Carl Alameda left employment with the City of La Cañada Flintridge in early 2023.

The City first learned of these accusations from the Los Angeles County Sheriff Department (LACSD) when they launched an investigation triggered by suspicious checks arriving at the LA County Public Works Office. LACSD eventually contacted the former city manager for the City regarding the investigation. The suspect was placed on leave and subsequently ended employment with the organization. The City has fully cooperated with the investigation.

"This remains an ongoing investigation, so our comments will be limited to respect the legal and criminal investigation. The City has modified our internal controls to address the scenarios that allowed the alleged financial crimes to take place. Importantly, subsequent audits have thoroughly reviewed our strengthened financial controls," noted Dan Jordan, city manager.

For additional information on this matter, the City will defer questions to the LA District Attorney's Office or the LA Sheriff's Department.

PUSD PROVIDES UPDATE ON SOIL TESTING AT SCHOOL SITES: SOME SCHOOLS CLEARED FOR **FULL REOPENING, TESTING CONTINUES AT OTHERS**

PASADENA, Calif. - As part of Pasadena Unified School District's (PUSD) commitment to student and staff safety, the district completed soil testing at its school sites. Working with a State-licensed environmental consulting firm, the testing was conducted following the recent Eaton Fire and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health's (LACDPH) recent findings of impacted soil.

PUSD is pleased to report that several schools have been fully cleared, with no elevated levels of harmful fire-related substances detected in soil samples. The full list of schools can be found here pusd.us/firerelief-safety. These schools are safe for students and employees, and as a result, outdoor playfields and bare dirt areas at those campuses will fully reopen. Normal operations – including recess, PE classes, and athletic team practices – will resume immediately at these locations.

However, in the spirit of full transparency, some school sites did show elevated levels of certain substances in the soil at specific outdoor areas. The district is taking immediate, proactive steps to address them.

Key actions underway include:

- Continued restriction of access to affected outdoor areas until further investigation, and if necessary, remediation is complete.
- Ongoing collaboration with local and state health and environmental agencies, including the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health and the Pasadena Public Health Department, to review test results and, if necessary, develop safe, science-based remediation plans that will protect our students and employees.
- Conduct additional soil testing and remediation where needed to maintain and ensure safety.
- Provide individual school notifications, which will include summaries of findings, maps of affected areas, and clear timelines for resolution.

While the results for heavy metals like lead are in, other results may take longer. Maps will be updated as new data becomes available. Updates will be posted at pusd.us/firereliefsafety as soon as they are ready.

"We want to be abundantly clear: safety is not negotiable," PUSD Superintendent Dr. Elizabeth Blanco said. "That's why we're moving forward with both urgency and care. We are grateful to our school communities for their patience as we work to ensure that every student and employee has a safe environment to learn and grow."

Families will continue to receive regular updates. Individual school maps will be posted on the district website, with the final soil testing reports posted in the coming days. For the latest information and FAQs, please visit pusd.us/firerelief-safety.

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

CONTINUED TEMPORARY HOUS-ING ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

If you received rental assistance from FEMA and require further rental assistance while working toward your permanent housing goals, we encourage you to stay in touch with FEMA. Continued Temporary Housing Assistance (CTHA) may be available for those who qualify.

Rental Assistance is available as an initial temporary two-month grant for homeowners and renters to pay for somewhere to live if their primary residence suffered damage from the Los Angeles County wildfires. If you were displaced and need assistance covering housing costs you should contact FEMA to determine your eligibility for this program. If temporary housing is still needed after the first two months of receiving rental assistance, survivors can apply for CTHA based on three months of their actual monthly costs for rent and utilities or the Fair Market Rent, for up to 18 months from the date the disaster was declared, January 8, 2025, as long as they remain eligible. If you received funds for Additional Living Expenses through your insurance, you may be eligible for initial Rental Assistance once those funds are exhausted.

To be eligible to apply for CTHA, survivors must meet the following conditions:

Be awarded initial Rental Assistance and show they used this money to pay for temporary housing,

Are unable to return to their pre-disaster residence because it is not safe to live in or is no longer available to them, due to the disaster.

Demonstrate a continued disaster-caused financial need.

Show that they have established a permanent housing plan and that they are working toward meeting that goal.

What are eligible expenses:

- CTHA is intended to cover the monthly rent amount (including lot rent, if applicable)
- Essential utilities (gas, propane, electric, water, oil, trash, sewer due to disaster-caused displacement)

This does not include telephone, cable TV, or internet service for the housing unit. If you were initially approved for Rental Assistance, an application for CTHA may be mailed to you 15 days after the grant is approved. If you do not receive one, please contact FEMA by calling 800-621-3362.

Return the form to FEMA by either:

- Uploading it to your FEMA Disaster Assistance account, available online at Disaster Assistance.gov.
- •Mailing the completed form to: FEMA, P.O. Box 10055, Hyattsville, MD 20782-8055.
- •Faxing it to 800-827-8112.

- 1 pound ground chicken
- 1/4 cup finely grated Parmesan, plus more for serving
- 2 tablespoons minced parsley

- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper

Just got a new wine in the shop yesterday – 2020 Bodegas Merayo "Las Tres Filas" Mencia. Mencia is the grape, and it's known as the Pinot Noir of Spain. It shares some similarities with Pinot Noir, yet it also has its own characteristics that are special.



Meravo family has been making wine in Spain decades. They



sustainably farm their vineyards in the Bierzo region of Spain. The 2020 "Las Tres Filas" is sourced from 80–100-year-old vines. Fermentation took place in stainless steel, and it was aged in both American and French oak for 6 months. This wine is unfiltered which makes it a vegan

It is 100% Mencia, a grape that is indigenous to Spain and Portugal. It's bright and has high acid just like Pinot Noir but it also has a beautiful aroma of floral and violet. It reminds me of Pinot Noir and Gamay, but some people also think it can be mistaken for a Northern Rhone Syrah. How cool is that? On the palate, there are notes of dark fruit, tobacco leaf, pepper, and wild herbs. The finish has length and minerality. The alcohol level in this wine is subdued, and the tannins are soft and silky. This wine received 97 Points from Decanter.

Mencia is a fabulous food wine. Pair it with charcuterie, Iberico jamon, Manchego cheese, mushrooms, and Carne Asada.

The 2020 Bodegas Merayo "Las Tres Filas" Mencia Bierzo is available at The Bottle Shop for \$21.99. 

"I moved to Pasadena in 1987 and soon discovered Eaton Canyon... It was wonderful to have a piece of wilderness so close by." Carel Struycken (Environmentalist, Actor, and Altadena resident who lost his home in the fires)

On the evening of January 7, my wife and I had to evacuate from our home as a result of the Eaton Fire. The next day, we were very grateful that our little rental house didn't burn. However, we learned that our beloved Eaton Canyon Nature Center, once essentially our "second home" where my wife and I met, had burned to the

ground. Eaton Canyon Nature Center has been a very special place to me since childhood, so I made a point of going there within the next few days. Of course, everything was blocked off by the National Guard, sheriff deputies, and other agencies, and I was only allowed entry



The Center that housed so much learning was now lost – the unique library, the field notes, the one-of-a-kind herbarium, the awesome auditorium, and, oh no, the animals! (Fortunately, I learned later that the resident tortoises Clementine and Clyde were somewhere else for their hibernation period.) with this Nature Center. I shared with Brian some of my personal experiences with the two Nature Centers that once stood here. Even though the Nature Center was destroyed, it felt

Helen started working at the Park in a trailer under Park Supervisor Mickey Long when the new Nature Center was being rebuilt. She watched the foundation getting poured and the wooden frame raised. She installed the first rolls of toilet paper in the restrooms back in 1998. She followed in the footsteps of Mickey Long and became the park supervisor in 2006. She continued to work at the Nature Center for close to 25 years until she was transferred out by management.

It is through my relationship with Helen, and later sharing a life together, that I learned the meaningfulness, purpose, and immense value of Eaton Canyon Nature Center offered to our community. During her tenure, I watched Helen take joy in supporting the long-time, quintessential, foundational nature educational programs including Docent Training, Student Naturalists Training, school tours, scout outings, various nature walks, and countless natural history programs organized and/or supported by ECNCA. She also took pride in talking about many County programs she was in charge of including Field Trips in Nature and Seasonal Nature Camps. With inspiration from the community members, she pioneered many new programs that served the community's needs. These included Nature in a Box (a teacher's loan program), Nature Detectives (afterschool youth programs), community events including the Earth Day Festival, Nature Music Concert, Summer Book Festival, and Celebration of Oak. She created park conservation volunteer opportunities including Native Plant Gardening Group, Habitat Conservation Work Team, Park Stewards, and Trailside Educators. Helen was dedicated to volunteer involvement, working in synergy with ECNCA Volunteers, Scout groups, business groups, and local chapters of environmental groups. She was responsible for many grants and

To me and many others, Helen Wong/ Mickey Long and the Eaton Canyon Nature Center were synonymous. We recall Helen once saying how "Eaton Canyon was everyone's backyard." Through the understanding of their work, I realized how much the staff and volunteers have provided for the community through this very special Park and Nature Center.

The Nature Center also held regular public presentations from Sierra Club, Native Plant Society, Pasadena Audubon, Southwestern Herpetologists Society, ECNCA and many others.

I myself have attended some of the most impactful presentations there over the years, with topics such as Hummingbirds at the San Gabriel Mission, Permaculture, Native American úses of Medicinal Herbs, Birds of the World, Climate Change, Using Native Seeds to Save the World, and so many more. To top it off, I've met numerous life-long friends there.

I shared much of this with my escort Brian as we walked, and he just nodded, smiling at my reminiscences. It was evident that the Park and Nature Center was not only special to me, but to the community at large. This was the place for people to connect to nature, a place to have quality family time, a place to learn, a place to practice conservation, a place to give back, an important resource for the community. There is and was nothing quite like this place in the Pasadena-Altadena area.

The loss of this Nature Center is a great loss to our entire community. The McCurdy Nature Center served the community for about 30 years. The rebuilt Eaton Canyon Nature Center served the community since 1998, nearly 30 years. I hope it will rise again, to once again become a nexus of Altadena. I look forward to the day when I can go back and serve the dedicated volunteers and public once again.

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SLEEP STUDIES AND SENIORS: WHY QUALITY SLEEP MATTERS

As people age, changes in sleep patterns are common—but they're not always harmless. Many seniors experience difficulty falling asleep, staying asleep, or waking up too early. While some of this is a normal part of aging, frequent sleep disruptions may signal underlying health issues. This is where a sleep study can be especially valuable.

Sleep studies, or polysomnography, are non-invasive overnight tests that monitor brain activity, breathing, heart rate, and body movements. They help diagnose sleep disorders such as sleep apnea, insomnia, and restless leg syndrome, all of which are more common in older adults.

One often overlooked reason for poor sleep in seniors is nocturia, or frequent urination at night. Getting up multiple times disrupts the natural sleep cycle, leaving individuals feeling tired, irritable, and unfocused during the day. While nocturia can result from bladder issues or medications, it's also associated with sleep disorders like sleep apnea. A sleep study can uncover whether disrupted breathing is causing the body to produce more urine at night—something many don't realize.

Lack of quality sleep is more than just frustrating; it's linked to serious health consequences such as memory loss, depression, weakened immune function, and an increased risk of falls. Untreated sleep problems can also worsen chronic conditions like diabetes and high blood pressure.

By identifying the root cause of sleep disturbances, sleep studies enable doctors to recommend effective treatments—whether it's CPAP therapy for sleep apnea, adjusting medications, or improving sleep hygiene.

For seniors and their caregivers, understanding that poor sleep is not just "part of getting older" is essential. With proper diagnosis and care, it's possible to greatly improve nighttime rest and daytime quality of life. A sleep study may be the first step toward better health and energy in later years.

HOW MUCH ADVIL (IBUPROFEN) IS TOO MUCH?

Dear Savvy Senior,

I take Advil pretty regularly for arthritis pain and headaches, but how can I tell if I'm taking more than is safe? Achy Alan

Dear Alan,

Ibuprofen – better known by one of its brand names, Advil – is one of the most

popular medications on the market today for treating all different types of pain, headaches, fevers and cramps.

Given the drug's broad pain-reducing effects, safety record and availability over the counter (OTC), it's no surprise that some people pop the little brownish-red tablets whenever they feel the slightest twinge of discomfort.

But ibuprofen, which is also sold under brand names like Motrin and Nuprin, can pose certain health risks, especially for those with kidney or stomach issues. Here's what you should know.

What's Safe?

For most adults and children ages 12 years and older, the recommended OTC dose of ibuprofen is one (or two, if needed) 200-milligram tablets, caplets or gel caplets every four to six hours while symptoms persist. You shouldn't take more than 1,200 mg (or six pills) in a 24-hour period.

If you haven't consulted a doctor about how much is safe, or if you aren't certain about your risk factors, it's best not to exceed the recommended limit of 1,200 milligrams a day.

If you have chronic pain, or were recently injured or had surgery, your doctor may prescribe ibuprofen for you at a higher dose. Prescription tablets are usually stronger compared to the OTC dose, such as 600 mg and 800 mg. The maximum daily dose for prescription-strength ibuprofen is 3,200 mg in a 24-hour period. But it's important only to take what your provider has prescribed for you.

Also be aware that ibuprofen is sometimes added to certain cold and flu medications, so always read the ingredient list on medications before using them.

Be Cautious!

Ibuprofen belongs to a class of drugs known as nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs, or NSAIDs, which reduce pain and inflammation by blocking the activity of certain enzymes.

But these enzymes also help maintain kidney and liver function and regulate the balance of fluids and electrolytes in your body. So, taking ibuprofen can be dangerous for patients with kidney disease or failure; those with liver damage or cirrhosis; and people with conditions that put strain on their kidneys, like high blood pressure or heart failure. Those at high risk for these conditions – as well as for stomach ulcers, heart attacks, strokes or bleeding problems – should talk with their doctors before taking ibuprofen.

People who take medications such as diuretics, anticoagulants, ACE inhibitors or ARBs (angiotensin receptor blockers) to manage cardiovascular issues should also be careful, because ibuprofen stresses the kidneys and the heart.

To reduce these health risks, don't take the maximum recommended dose for more than a week or two at a time. If you are needing it for more than two weeks, or if you're turning to ibuprofen every day to keep your aches and pains in check, you need to see your doctor.

When taken for long periods, ibuprofen can also increase the risk of stomach ulcers. The drug inhibits enzymes that, among other things, aid in the production of mucus that lines and protects the stomach lining, so without these enzymes, the stomach becomes vulnerable to irritation and damage.

Some alternatives to ibuprofen you should talk to your doctor about include acetaminophen (Tylenol), topical NSAIDs (diclofenac gel) that is not absorbed into the blood to the same extent as oral NSAIDs, nonacetylated salicylates, curcumin (an active ingredient in turmeric) and acupuncture.

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

STUART TOLCHIN **PUT THE LIGHTS ON** THE UNABOMBER AND THE NEW POPE



Last week in my article entitled IS THERE HOPE? I explored the possible current significance of the concerns of Theodore John Kaczynski. The man popularly or more accurately and unpopularly remembered as the Unabomber. The article was not a great success as readers responded that I could not sincerely suggest that there was something positive about the Unabomber. The man who admittedly terrorized the nation

for nearly twenty years, planting bombs that killed three Americans and injured many more before his capture in 1996. It was Kaczynski's ideas made public in his requested publication of his Unabomber manifesto that led to his identification and incarceration ending in 2023 when he was found dead in his cell possibly as the result of suicide.

What were the ideas presented in the manifesto that were so identified by his sister-in-law and brother who alerted the police to his identity? His ideas centered on the belief that industrial society and its reliance on technology were detrimental were detrimental to humanity. His core arguments included the idea that technology has created a society where people are oversocialized, lose their individual autonomy and become reliant on "surrogate activities" to be feel powerful. Kaczynski saw technology as a root cause of many societal problems, including mental health issues, loss of individual freedom and environmental degradation.

I need not say that these identified problems are still concerns today magnified from almost three decades ago. On May 8, 2025 a new Pope was selected within the conclave of Cardinals. Newspapers and newscasts identify him as the first "American" pope, but I heard one of the Cardinals explaining that to the selecting conclave the new Pope was seen as the Pope of the "Americas North and South". The interviewed Cardinal explained that the new Pope was a citizen of Peru who was multilingual who had not lived in the United State during this century.

The distinction between America, meaning the United States, and the Americas meaning the entire western hemisphere is important. It illustrates the competitive need for dominance of one country versus another which as countries and individuals seek to empower themselves. Referring to the ideas of the New Pope and comparing them to the ideas of the Unabomber in relation to the problems of our times is very enlightening. The new pope has chosen the name Leo XIV.

What is the significance of the name Leo XIV combined with the initial pronouncements made by the Pope? We are told that he is not afraid to state his mind and like Pope Leo XIII he has a great commitment to involvement in social issues. Pope Leo XIII was responsible for the beginnings of Catholic involvements in social issues. The new Pope has been a pastoral Priest ministering to the poor. "Hatewatch was unable to find any examples of Miller writing sympathetically or even in neutral tones about any person who is nonwhite or foreign-born." - Southern Poverty Law Center on its examination of emails from presidential advisor Stephen Milleı

In the first Trump Administration, Stephen Miller was the guy behind family separation and "kids in cages" policies – asserting that the greater the suffering inflicted by our government upon families and trauma upon children, the greater the deterrent.

Now in Trump's second term, Miller states they're "actively looking at" suspending habeas corpus - the due process afforded those detained and held by our government. He suggests it's something they would've done already if not for those "radical rogue judges".

Historians still debate Lincoln's suspending habeas corpus during the Civil War. The last time it was suspended was in Hawaii with the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. Our Constitution allows suspension (by Congress, not the president) "when in Cases of Rebellion or Invasion the public Safety may require it". Stephen Miller suggests immigration is a national crisis on a par with the Civil War and Pearl Harbor attack, warranting suspension of our Constitutional rights.

Miller calls our refugee program a "colossal failure". These laws were enacted in retroactive shame over our having turned away Jewish refugees escaping Nazi Germany. Now, those seeking escape from war and famine in Sudan, Burma and the Congo - having waited years, undergone vetting, obtained sponsorships - see their clearances revoked. President Trump cancelled already-approved admission for 10,000 refugees - including those who'd risked their lives helping us through two decades of war in Afghanistan.

But 59 white South Africans saw the process fast-tracked; they're already here receiving government resettlement assistance. Stephen Miller refers to them as "the text book definition of why the refugee program was created". Although refugees usually travel on their own dime, this group arrived via government-chartered flight at taxpayers' expense - personally welcomed by State Department officials in what Miller calls part of a "much larger-scale relocation effort".

Trump told reporters, "It's a genocide that's taking place that you people don't want to write about . . . farmers are being killed. They happen to be white . . . and their land is being confiscated in South Africa". The president surmised the reason behind this lack of coverage is that the victims are white; "If it were the other way around, they'd talk about it. That would be the only story they'd talk about".

The reason it isn't getting coverage is because this "genocide" is about as real as those stories Trump told of Haitians eating dogs and cats in Ohio. South Africa has one of the highest homicide rates in the world, though out of 19,000 homicides in the country last year, according to the BBC, 44 occurred on farms – with eight of those being farmers, of whatever race.

Trump cancelled aid to South Africa (mostly to fight HIV/AIDS) because of South Africa's "confiscating land". The government passed a law last January allowing for land seizures. But while no land has yet been confiscated under that law, South African native Elon Musk calls the situation "openly racist" and "actively promoting white genocide".

South Africa's Ambassador to the U.S. Ebrahim Rasool suggested Trump was trying to "project white victimhood as a dog whistle"; "a response not simply to a supremacist instinct, but to very clear data that shows great demographic shifts in the USA". (As a child, Rasool and his family were evicted from their home in Cape Town when it was declared a white area under Apartheid.)

Asked about white South Africans being welcomed while other refugees remained barred, Deputy Secretary of State Christopher Landau explained that





while Trump's Executive Order halts further admission of refugees, there's an exception for those "who can fully and appropriately assimilate into the United States" - and these refugees from South Africa "could be assimilated easily into our country".

As to discerning a particular attribute (physical characteristic?) making these Dutch-descended Afrikaners more likely to "appropriately assimilate" than others, it might be related to that "supremacist instinct" referred to by Ambassador Rasool. He also mentioned "white victimhood as a dog whistle". Stephen Miller describes the new arrivals as victims of "race-based persecution".

Stephen Miller's name also appeared in a New York Times article on Attorney General Pam Bondi. Although, the Times reports, "Ms. Bondi has been consulted on key decisions", "She does not appear to have played a major role in creating overall strategies". She instead "sees her role as that of a surrogate. . . compelled to cede ground to empowered players in the West Wing." As to who's calling the shots, "It was clear from the start that Mr. Miller, who is not a lawyer, would exercise control inside the department, current and former Trump aides said".

Following the reporting on Miller's emails by the Southern Poverty Law Center referred to above, in 2019 a coalition of Congressional caucuses demanded his resignation, releasing a statement: "It's clearer than ever that Stephen Miller is a far-right white nationalist with a racist and xenophobic worldview".

Mike Walz left his post as Trump's National Security Advisor following that "Signal-gate" affair, discussing war plans in an unsecured chat. Axios reports that a likely candidate to replace him in that position is "ghoulish white nationalist" Stephen Miller.

Eighteen months until the mid-terms.

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

GOT (PLANT) MILK?

Walk down the milk aisle at the grocery store and you'll see more than just cow's milk these days. You'll see cartons labeled almond, oat, soy, coconut, rice, and cashew. All are examples of plant-based milks, and they're growing more popular every year. People are learning that regular dairy milk has some definite downsides.

Plant-based milks are made by blending plants like almonds, oats, soybeans, or rice with water and straining out the solids. The result is a smooth, milk-like liquid that can be poured over cereal, added to smoothies, used in recipes, or just enjoyed as a drink. Many are fortified with vitamins and minerals like calcium and vitamin D.

Plant-based milks are not new. People have been drinking soy milk for hundreds of years in Asia. But in the last 10–15

years, other options have exploded in popularity. Why? Three main reasons:

1. Animal Welfare

Some people are uncomfortable with how cows are treated in large dairy farms. Female cows must keep giving birth in order to produce milk. Their calves are usually taken away shortly after birth, and the cows are often kept indoors for most of their lives. People who are concerned about animal cruelty may choose plant-based milk as a more humane option.

2. Environmental Concerns

Dairy farming uses a lot of natural resources. It takes about 120 gallons of water to produce just one glass of cow's milk. Cows also need a lot of space and food. In addition, they produce methane, a gas that contributes to climate change. While no type of farming is perfect, most plant-based milks have a smaller environmental footprint than dairy milk. Oat and soy milk, in particular, tend to be better for the planet than dairy.

3. Health Reasons

Aside from lactose intolerance, some people avoid dairy because it contains saturated fat, dietary cholesterol, and has also been linked in some studies to increased acne and possible inflammation in the body. Fortunately, plant-based milks are usually low in saturated fat, contain no cholesterol, and are often easier for people to digest.

Here are some of the most popular plant-based milks.

Almond milk is one of the most common plant-based milks. It's made by blending almonds with water and straining out the solids. It has a light, nutty flavor and is usually low in calories. However, it's also low in protein compared to dairy milk.

Oat milk has a creamy texture and naturally sweet taste. It's made by blending oats and water. Oat milk contains more fiber and carbohydrates than most other plant milks and is often fortified with calcium and vitamins like B12 and D. Oats grow in cooler climates and don't need much water, so oat milk is considered one of the best plant milks for the environment.

Soy milk is made from whole soybeans and has been used in parts of Asia for centuries. It's one of the most nutritious plant-based milks and has about 7 grams of protein per cup—close to the amount in cow's milk. Soy milk is often used in cooking and baking because it behaves similarly to dairy milk. For most people, soy milk is safe, healthy, and packed with nutrients.

Coconut Milk

There are two types of coconut milk: the thick kind used in cooking and the drinking kind sold in cartons. The drinking version is made by blending coconut meat with water. It has a smooth, tropical flavor and is often used in coffee or smoothies. Coconut milk is low in protein but has more saturated fat than most plant-based milks. Coconut trees are eco-friendly, growing well in tropical regions without much irrigation

Rice milk is made by blending milled rice with water. It's naturally sweet and has a mild flavor, which some people like. It's one of the best options for people with food allergies, since it's free from nuts and soy. But it's low in protein and often higher in carbohydrates.

Cashew Milk

Cashew milk is creamy and smooth with a light, slightly nutty flavor. It's made just like almond milk—cashews blended with water. It's low in protein but works well in coffee, smoothies, and

There are many others to experiment with as well. From pea milk, hemp milk and flax to macadamia milk and Quinoa.

When trying plant-based milk, check the ingredients and nutrition labels. Some brands add sugar, so look for "unsweetened" versions. Also check if it's fortified with important nutrients like calcium, vitamin D, and B12. Choosing plant-based milk can be a simple step toward better health—for your body, for animals, and for the planet.



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As a transformational coach, I often discuss the power of radical self-truth. Another power that is equally transformative is forgiveness. According to neuroscience, we now know that forgiveness actually benefits our brains. Forgiveness has health benefits, even when it's hard.

Forgiveness and what it's not:

Forgiveness is not forgetting. It's not pretending the pain didn't happen. It's not even about reconciling. Instead, forgiveness is a deliberate choice to stop carrying the emotional weight of a painful experience. It's saying, "I deserve peace," and then doing the work to claim it. Forgiveness is the decision to release, to let go, to put the pain down According to neuroscientist Emiliana Simon-Thomas, three major brain systems are activated when we choose to forgive, and they each support our overall well-being.

1. Empathy and Perspective Taking

This system helps us imagine what someone else may have been feeling or thinking. It doesn't excuse their behavior, but it helps us loosen the grip of resentment. Rather, forgiveness involves imagining the perspective of the harm-doer and actively letting go of the painful association between them and yourself. When we can see that the harmdoer may have been acting from their own pain or fear, we often find a bit more room to breathe. We begin to see the fuller picture, and that perspective allows us to move forward with more compassion for them and for ourselves.

2. Emotional Coping

When we forgive, we engage the parts of the brain responsible for emotional regulation and resilience. This system helps us pause, take a breath, and choose a healthier response. Forgiveness means embracing your feelings of hurt with self-nurturing and compassion. Rumination has been linked to dementia and Alzheimer's disease. Instead of ruminating or spiraling into anger, we can shift our attention toward healing actions, like reaching out to a friend, going for a walk, or engaging in a creative activity. Forgiveness becomes a form of emotional self-care.

3. Social Decision-Making

Forgiveness also taps into the part of the brain that helps us make value-driven choices. When we let go of anger, we're not saying the harm didn't matter—we're choosing to align with who we want to be. We choose peace over punishment. Healing over hostility. And that choice helps us stay connected to our purpose and joy.

The bottom line? Forgiveness isn't just good for the soul—it's good for the brain. And when practiced regularly, it strengthens the mental muscles we need to live with more connection, clarity, and courage.


If you're struggling to forgive, start small. Try writing about the experience with honesty and compassion. Practice empathy—even if it's just a tiny bit. Breathe. And be willing to consider the possibility that your peace is more important than your pain.
