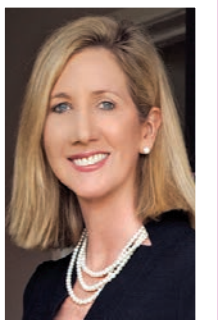

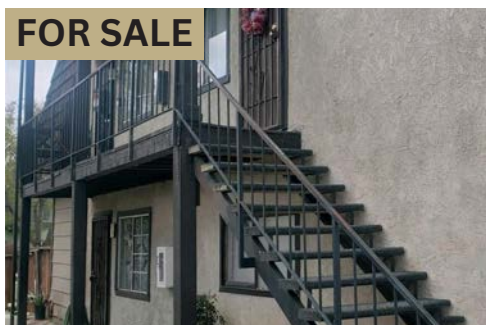

SIERRA MADRE PLAYHOUSE PREPARES FOR ITS CENTENNIAL IN 2024

Congresswoman Judy Chu, Assemblyman Chris Holden and former Sierra Madre Mayor Gene Goss all expressed enthusiastic support for plans to refurbish the Sierra Madre Playhouse in celebration of its centenary in 2024. They did so at a party for the Playhouse’s major supporters at the home of board president David Gordon and his wife Sandy Brooke Gordon on Saturday March 25th.

The Sierra Madre Playhouse opened as a movie theater on February 2, 1924, with the showing of The Virginian.

Refurbishment of the Playhouse has started. The roof was completely redone just in time for the rains. The plumbing has been updated. New wheelchair-friendly doors into the building and auditorium have been installed. The next phase comprises rewiring the building, installing new air conditioning and air handling, and building ADA-compliant bathrooms.

1. On March 28, 2023 the City Council of the City of Sierra Madre conducted a second reading, adopting Ordinance No. 1465, amending Chapter 17.22 (Accessory Dwelling Units) of the Sierra Madre Municipal Code.

The purpose of this ordinance is to update development standards for accessory dwelling units related to California state laws imposed by Assembly Bill 2221 and Senate Bills 897. The ordinance additionally provides information, clarification, and supplemental application review procedure with intent to enhance information available for the general public.

This summary is published pursuant to Government Code Section 36933(c)(1) and a full and complete certified copy of the text of Ordinance No. 1465 is available at the Sierra Madre City Manager's Office located at City of Sierra Madre City Hall, 232 W. Sierra Madre Blvd., Sierra Madre, CA. Ordinance No. 1465 becomes effective on April 27, 2023. On March 28, 2023 the City Council of the City of Sierra Madre conducted a second reading, adopting Ordinance No. 1466, amending Chapter 5.56 (Massage Therapy, Massage Business or Establishments) of Title 5 (Business Licenses and Regulations) of the Sierra Madre Municipal Code; Chapter 7.08 (Pollutant Source Reduction) of Title 7 (Stormwater Pollutant Elimination) of the Sierra Madre Municipal Code; Chapter 12.12 (Obstruction of Streets, Sidewalks and Public Places) of Title 12 (Streets, Sidewalks and Public Places) of the Sierra Madre Municipal Code; Chapter 15.04 (Building Code and Permits), Chapter 15.30 (Green Building Standards Code), Chapter 15.58 (Low Impact Development Plan) of Title 15 (Buildings and Construction) of the Sierra Madre Municipal Code; Chapter 16.04 (General Provisions), Chapter 16.08 (Required Maps), Chapter 16.12 (Preliminary and Tentative Maps Filing and Review Procedures), Chapter 16.20 (Lot Line Adjustments), Chapter 16.24 (Merger of Parcels), Chapter 16.28 (Lot Combinations), Chapter 16.32 (Dedications, Improvements and Requirements), Chapter 16.36 (Condominium Conversions), Chapter 16.40 (Condominium Projects), Chapter 16.44 (Regulations for Dedication of Land for Park and Recreation Land), Chapter 16.52 (Vesting Tentative Maps) and Chapter 16.56 (Enforcement) of Title 16 (Subdivisions) of the Sierra Madre Municipal Code; Chapter 17.08 (Definitions), Chapter 17.20 (R-1 One-Family Residential), Chapter 17.28 (R-3-13 Medium/High Density Residential Zone), Chapter 17.29 (R-3-20 and R-3-30 High Density Residential Zones), Chapter 17.30 (R-C Residential Canyon Zone), Chapter 17.36 (C Commercial Zone), Chapter 17.40 (M Manufacturing Zone), Chapter 17.42 (The British Home Specific Plan Overlay Zone), Chapter 17.48 (Development Standards), Chapter 17.52 (H Hillside Management Zone), Chapter 17.58 (Small Home Lot Development), Chapter 17.59 (Ministerial Design Review Permits), Chapter 17.60 (Variances and Discretionary Permits), Chapter 17.68 (Parking), Chapter 17.72 (Signs), Chapter 17.85 (Home Occupations), Chapter 17.88 (Temporary Use Permits) and Chapter 17.90 (Art in Public Places Program) of Title 17 (Zoning) of the Sierra Madre Municipal Code.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to relieve inconsistency, ambiguity, inadvertent misrepresentation, and illegibility of the Sierra Madre Municipal Code as discovered from time to time by city staff, appointed officials, elected officials and members of the general public.

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Pursuant to Chapter 2.6, Public Resources Code commencing with section 21080.17, the City Council finds that the adoption of Ordinance No. 1465, which implements the provisions of Government Code section 65852.2, does not apply to Division 13 (Environmental Quality) and is thus statutorily exempt for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

Pursuant to Public Resources Code section 15061, subdivision (b)(3), Ordinance No. 1466 is exempt because it is not a "project" for purposes of Public Resources Code section 21065 and section 15378 of title 14 of the California Code of Regulations. This ordinance is a ministerial action to establish conformance with State law and has no direct or indirect physical impact on the environment.

APPEAL: If in the future anyone wishes to challenge the decision of the City Council in court, one may be limited to raising the issues that were raised or presented in written correspondence delivered to the City Council at, or before, the scheduled public hearing. SIERRA MADRE POLICE ISSUES A COMMUNITY ALERT RELATED TO "DISTRACTION BURGLARIES" AND THEFTS

Sierra Madre, CA. – March 28, 2023

On March 28, 2023, at about 9:45 a.m. Sierra Madre Police Officers responded to the 100 block of S. Michillinda Avenue, regarding a male suspect impersonating a utility worker. The suspect knocked on a resident's door seeking access to the rear yard for purposes of checking utility lines, with the intent to distract the homeowner. A second suspect is believed to have been involved.

On occasion, suspects have been known to be aggressive towards victims. The Sierra Madre Police Department recommends not answering the door if you do not recognize the person on the other side. Verify the identity of the person by calling the company they claim to represent and be cautious of anyone trying to coax you out of your home. 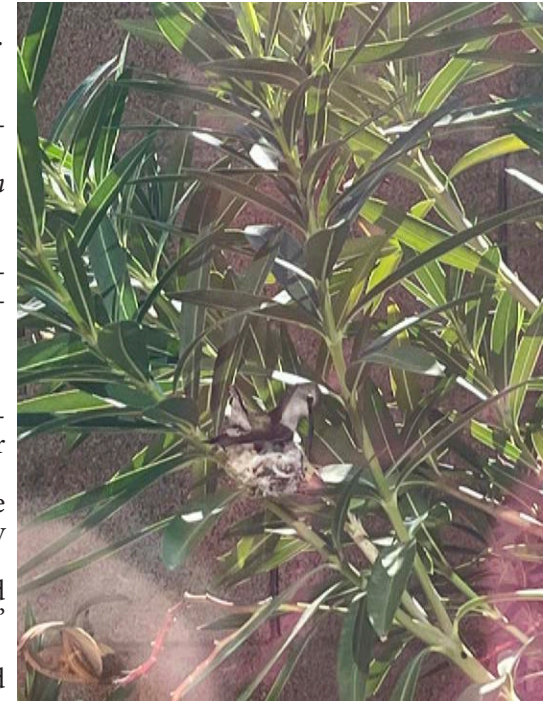
WALKING SIERRA MADRE - The Social Side

THE FALSE CHOICE

The Santa Monica developer for the "Meadows" project, which ironically will obliterate the existing meadow, is threatening to stick Sierra Madre with a worse project if the residents don't agree to their housing tract of 42 McMansions. In other words, if you don't agree to our demands,

we will inflict even further harm on your city. I think there's a name for that: it's called extortion. But it's an empty threat. It's analogous to me trying to add on to my home in violation of the building codes and telling the City: "If you don't agree to my building plans, I'm going to build a 50 story skyscraper on my property". It's preposterous but that's exactly what this developer is doing.

All they've done is submitted an application for a bigger project and are threatening to take away a few perks. But an application doesn't equate with an approval. Anybody can apply for anything. It doesn't mean a thing. But I can hardly blame them. It's a typical developer gambit to take attention away from their existing "Meadows" project that was unfortunately approved by our City Council despite hundreds of residents who are opposed to a project that violates our General Plan, destroys over 100 mature trees, cuts into Bailey Park, destroys the wildlife habitat and creates excessive traffic and congestion on streets that don't have sidewalks. Do we really want to open the flood gates to predatory developers particularly with the Stonehouse land up for sale and Alverno High School closing its doors. It's only a matter of time before our "Village of the Foothills" has parking meters downtown.

If the citizens of Sierra Madre vote No on Measure M, perhaps the developer should listen to the concerns of the residents and re-submit a better project and not threaten the residents with an even worse project. 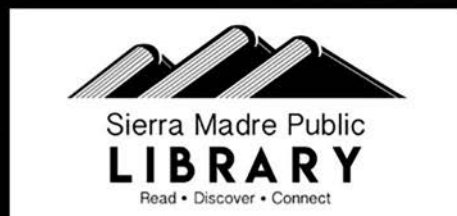

Pasadena Orders COVID-19 Boosters for Healthcare Workers

Masking is also required for all healthcare workers

Interim Health Officer Dr. Eric Handler issued updated health officer orders related to COVID-19 vaccination requirements for healthcare workers and masking requirements in healthcare facilities. The updated orders take effect on Monday, April 3 at 12:01 a.m.

Vaccination: All healthcare workers must be up to date with COVID-19 vaccinations by completing a COVID-19 primary series and receiving the most recent booster dose within 15 days of becoming eligible as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Masking: Health care facility personnel are required to wear a well-fitted mask when providing patient care or working in patient care areas within all indoor healthcare settings such as hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, clinics, and hospice facilities. The Pasadena Public Health Department (PPHD) strongly recommends patients, clients and visitors to health care settings wear a mask. Patients, clients and visitors are required to wear a mask when the health care facility is in outbreak status or there is evidence of high community transmission levels, as defined by the CDC, within Los Angeles County. The PPHD recommends wearing a well-fitting, non-vented N95, KN95 or KF94 respirator.

PPHD is requiring more protective measures in healthcare settings. While the SARS-CoV-2 virus remains a concern for all Pasadena residents, the virus poses a particular risk to the health of medically vulnerable residents and people who might be exposed through necessity based on their circumstances. Pasadena has a higher per capita population residing in long-term care facilities compared to the rest of Los Angeles County. Vaccination and masking requirements are protective measures which have effectively reduced infection rates and protected vulnerable populations from COVID-19 related complications.

PPHD encourages all Pasadena residents to stay up to date on vaccines and boosters, test before gatherings, seek available COVID-19 treatments, and stay home when sick.

City Settles with Sheraton Hotel Operator

City officials announced Thursday that Pasadena has agreed to another \$370,000 in settlement with former Sheraton Pasadena Hotel operator for unpaid hotel tax, bringing total recovery to \$867,000.

This week's settlement is in addition to \$497,000 recovered in August from Urban Commons Cordova A, LLC, one of the hotel operators.

The city's \$867,000 total recovery includes payment for unpaid principal, interest and penalties. "I am pleased that we stood up against the hotel

operators who wrongfully withheld taxpayers' money," said Mayor Victor Gordo.

According to officials, Urban Commons took hundreds of thousands of dollars in transient occupancy tax and tourism business improvement district assessment monies without turning the monies over to the City on a monthly basis, as required by law.

In proceedings unrelated to Pasadena earlier in Urban Commons' bankruptcy case, the bankruptcy judge found two of Urban Commons' former

principals to be "fraudsters."

According to previous reports, the city originally sued Urban Commons for over \$850,000. Urban Commons filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy in early 2021 that also included dozens of hotels across the country owning more than \$500 million in total debt.

The cost for the series is only \$75 for members of the Pasadena Senior Center and \$90 for nonmembers.

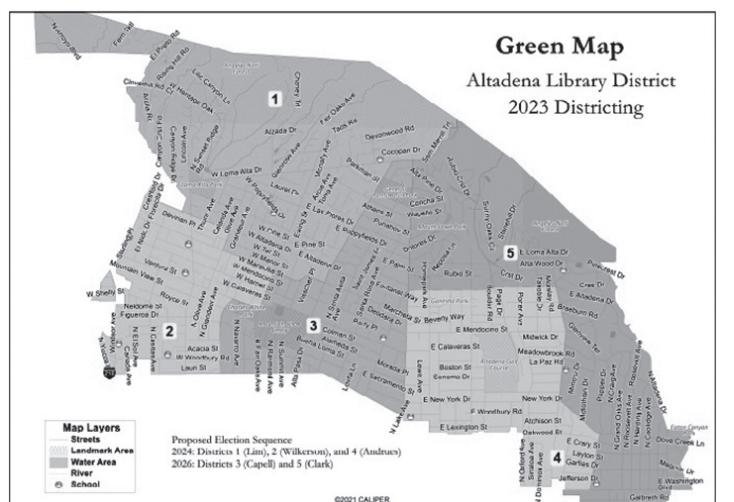

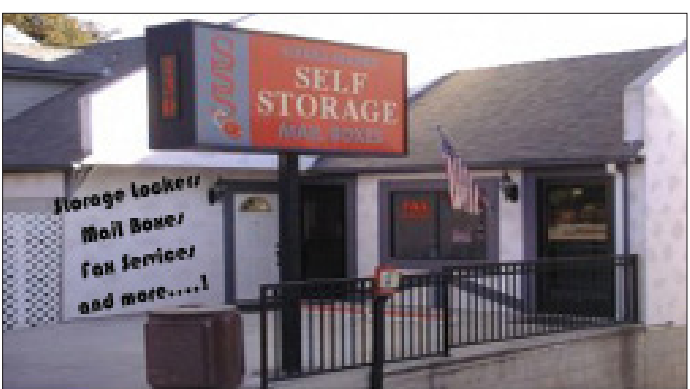

Peter Dills Knows

The pride of Sierra Madre, Ms. Lisa of Lucky Baldwins Pub got to me just in time, asking for suggestions for wine to pair with her annual Easter baked ham. Lisa tells me that she is a traditionalist and that family has been coming to her home for almost twenty years. While everyone one loves her cooking skills, she needed suggestions for wine, and possibly beer for her husband David.

A baked ham that has been glazed with brown sugar is a tricky matter, but I have a couple of suggestions. First, stay clear of bold cabernets; the sugars will collide and make the cab too citric. I suggest one of my all-time favorite blends, Prisoner. Not only will this Napa gem go great with the ham, it also will go well with your sides of yams, rice pudding, and string beans. Sounds like a great menu. What time is the party? This wine has a deep ruby red color and aromas of black cherry and plum. The first taste is powerful, and if you have been following my columns, you know I don't swirl -- I go for a complete taste. There's no need to let this blend sit; it's ready to enjoy with your Easter brunch right after opening. This is an absolute favorite of mine, and one of the best blends that I have tasted at any price. It's available at VONS and wine departments; sale priced around \$49.

For less money and still a phenomenal value is the San Simeon Petite Sirah. As with the Prisoner, the Petite Sirah is an ideal partner for your entrée. This Paso Robles award winner is a 90+ rated wine and is perfect for your guests who want something full bodies. Guests who might be the "occasional" social drinker will think you spent double the amount.

Last but not least, La Fin Du Monde "End of the world" is a Belgium style beer that I first encountered at Vons in Pasadena. It is now one of my favorites.

THURBER'S TAIL: ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS ABOUT YOUR PETS

As a 68-year-old retiree, I'm interested in finding a fun part-time job that can occupy some of my time and generate a little extra income. Can you write a column on low-stress part-time jobs that are popular among retirees?

Part-Time Retiree

Dear Retiree:

Working part-time in retirement can be a terrific way to occupy your time and earn some extra income. The key, however, is finding the right gig that's fun and satisfying for you. While there are literally hundreds of different part-time job opportunities out there for retirees, here are a few possibilities to explore.

Pet Services: If you love animals, consider pet sitting and/or dog walking. Pet sitters, who attend to a pet's needs when their owner is away, can earn \$15 to \$40 per visit. Dog walkers can make \$10 to \$30 for a 30-minute walk.

To find these jobs, advertise your services in veterinarians' offices or online at sites like Craigslist.org or Care.com. Or, if you'd rather work for an organization that offers these services, visit Rover.com.

Teach or Tutor: Depending on your expertise, you could substitute teach or tutor students privately on any number of subjects. Substitute teachers typically make between \$75 and \$125/day, while tutors can earn between \$15 to \$30 per hour.

To look for substitute teaching positions, contact your local school district to see if they are hiring and what qualifications they require. To advertise tutoring services, use websites like Wyzant.com and Tutor.com.

Or, if you have a bachelor, master or doctoral degree, inquire about adjunct teaching at a nearby college or university.

Drive: If you like to drive, you can get paid to drive others around using Uber or Lyft apps, or become a food delivery driver through Instacart or Uber Eats. Drivers make around \$15 per hour.

Babysit: If you like kids, babysitting can be a fun way to put money in your pocket. Hourly rates vary by location ranging anywhere from \$10 to \$40 per hour. To find jobs or advertise your services, use sites like as Care.com and Sittercity.com.

Tour guide: If you live near any historical sites or locations, national parks or museums (anywhere that attracts tourists), inquire about becoming a tour guide. This pays anywhere from \$10 to \$40/hour.

Write or edit: Many media, corporate and nonprofit websites are looking for freelancers to write, edit or design content for \$20 to \$60 per hour. To find these jobs try FreelanceWriting.com, FreelanceWritingGigs.com and Freelancer.com.

Consult: If you have a lot of valuable expertise in a particular area, offer your services as a consultant through a firm or on your own through freelancer sites like Upwork.com, Fiverr.com, Freelancer.com or Guru.com.

Translator or interpreter: If you're fluent in more than one language you can do part-time interpretation over the phone or translate documents or audio files for \$20 to \$40/hour. Try sites like Translate.com, ProZ.com or Gengo.com to locate translation jobs.

Public events: Sporting events, festivals, concerts and shows need ticket takers, security guards, ushers, concession workers and more. The pay is usually \$10 to \$20/hour. Contact nearby venues to apply.

Tax preparer: If you have tax preparation experience or are willing to take a tax prep course you can find seasonal work preparing tax returns at big-box tax firms like H&R Block or Jackson Hewitt for around \$17/hour.

Bookkeeper: If you have a finance or accounting background you can find freelance bookkeeping gigs at sites like Upwork.com and Fiverr.com, or through firms like BelaySolutions.com.

Librarian assistant: If you love books, public libraries hire part-time workers to shelve books, send out overdue notices, help patrons, etc. Contact your local library to see what's available.

If you don't find these options appealing, try FlexJobs.com, which lists thousands of flexible work-at-home jobs from more than 5,700 employers. Membership fees start at \$10.

LIVING WILL VS. LAST WILL:

One estate planning point of confusion seems to be the competing definitions of the terms "last will" and "living will". If you have that question you are not alone. I hear it often. So let me try to clear it up now...

A last will and testament is a legal document which outlines how a person's assets and property will be distributed after their death. It is a way for individuals to ensure their wishes are carried out and their loved ones are taken care of. A last will and testament may also name an executor, who is responsible for carrying out the instructions in the will.

On the other hand, a living will is a legal document which outlines a person's wishes for medical treatment in the event he or she becomes incapacitated and unable to make those decisions for themselves. It is generally a part of, and sometimes also known as, an advance directive or healthcare directive which includes a named agent to manage the healthcare decisions outlined in the living will.

While both documents deal with important end-of-life decisions, they serve very different purposes. A last will and testament deals with the distribution of assets and property after death, while a living will deals with medical treatment decisions while a person is still alive.

It is important to note that a last will and testament and a living will are not interchangeable. They are separate legal documents that serve distinct goals. It is recommended that individuals have both documents in place to ensure that their wishes are carried out both during their lifetime and after their death.

So the next time this question comes up in your presence, you'll be able to jump right in and provide a clear answer. Just remember, a last will and testament and a living will are both important legal documents. While a last will and testament deals with the distribution of assets and property after death, a living will deals with medical treatment decisions while a person is still alive. And of course, it's critical to have both documents in place to ensure all your wishes are carried out according to your instructions.

My whole life I've followed a similar pattern. I'm forever losing things. I get distracted. People who read my articles have told me that they are annoyed when I jump from one subject to another and then try to fight my way back to the beginning. Interpersonally I can be difficult as I have been told that I am insensitive to other people's feelings. A sad example of this behavior is when I said to a good friend's wife, "You used to be so beautiful." Really I meant it is a compliment. She took it as an insult and I have been unwelcome at their house ever since.

I later described the incident to my wife and she was amazed by my insensitivity. Didn't I know that no woman, especially a woman in her late forties or even older, wants to hear that she "used" to be so beautiful. I still don't get it but I never "used" to be beautiful. Maybe that's not a good example but I am just not aware of what other people might describe as antisocial behavior. In restaurants I love talking to the strangers at the next table or asking servers about their tattoos. I now realize this frequently annoys the people I'm with who are not interested in learning about other people even though they have no desire to divulge much information about themselves.

I have been told by people that I am close to, like my wife and daughter, that they do not share details with me because, according to them I have "no boundaries" and may say anything to anyone. I do admit I have trouble keeping things inside. Frequently I experience a general discontent and blame this on the political situation or class inequality. I sometimes feel guilty living the semi-privileged life that I do. I am a home owning retiree with a secure fixed income and no particular responsibilities. I have lots of time to do things but I basically don't do anything but write these weekly articles which the editor/publisher of the newspaper recently reminded me consistently exceed their word limit. This irritated me but at the same time I realized how fortunate I am to have the opportunity to have these articles published. The reminder also had the effect of actually making me notice how great these retiree years have been without having a boss telling me what to do or worrying about clients not paying their bills.

Oops, I have already reached my word limit and have not surprisingly completely deviated from my point. What I have recently learned is that my life-experience is typical of people who can be categorized as exhibiting the symptoms of Borderline Personality Syndrome (BPS). This a condition often involving feelings of worthlessness, instability, and impulsivity, and a fluctuation of feelings. For me, at least and for the time being, this discovery was a relief. I might not be diagnosed as a person with BPS but reading about it gave me some understanding. Perhaps you share similar feelings or other feelings that you don't want the world to know about.

Okay, go ahead and keep your secrets but I think it is best to understand that you cannot keep your secrets from yourself. I think there is great relief in learning about ourselves and recognizing our own patterns.

The result should be that we will have a greater tolerance and control of our own experience and probably of our own behavior.

So do your best and I hope this article will be of help and that's no secret.

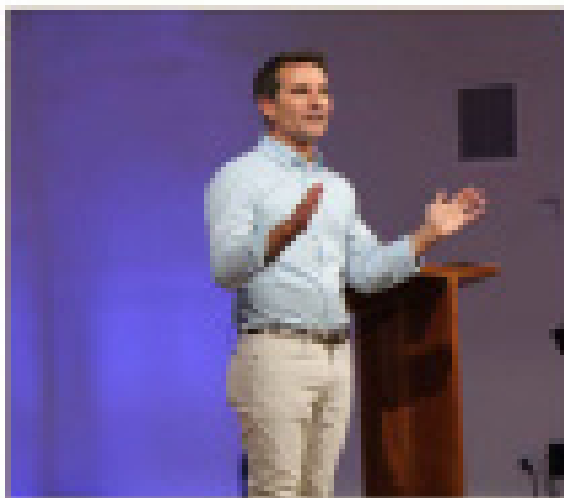

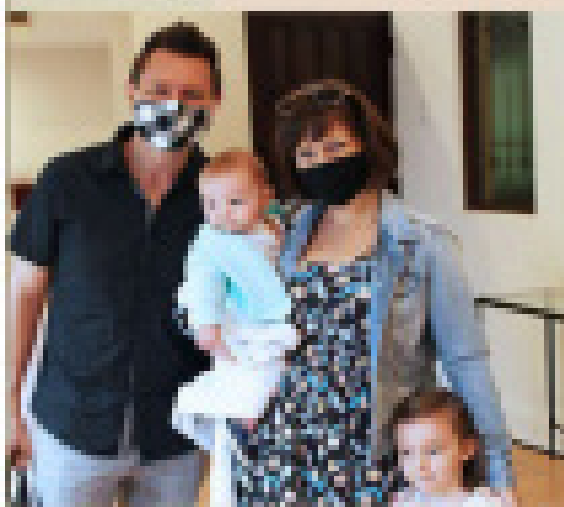

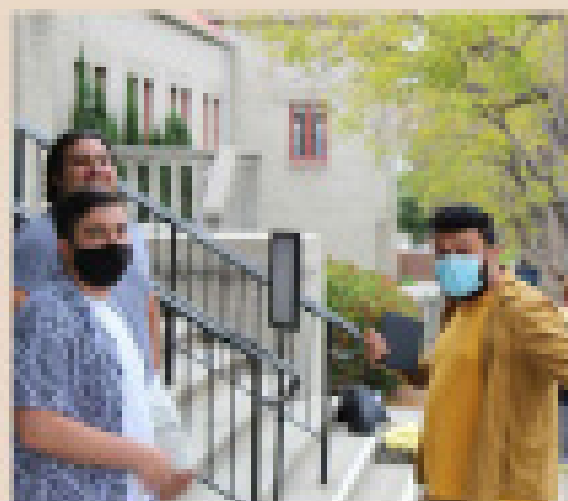
