The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health urges residents to take precautions to avoid

heat-related illness - such as heat exhaustion, heat stroke, and heat cramps - as high temperatures are forecast to impact the region next week.

The National Weather Service (NWS) has issued a Heat Advisory as high temperatures have been fore-casted for the following areas:

Heat Advisory - Issued when hot weather is expected to cause discomfort and may lead to heat-related illness for some people, especially those who are vulnerable to heat, as indicated below.

Public Health recommends the following tips to keep

yourself and others safe during ex-cessive heat: Drink plenty of water and keep hydrated

throughout the day

• If you must go out, plan your day to avoid going out during the hottest hours, and wear sunscreen (SPF 15)

• Wear lightweight, light-colored clothes, and wear a hat or use an umbrella

Cars get very hot inside, even if the windows are 'cracked' or open. Never leave children or pets alone in cars. Call 911 if you see a child or pet in a

Check on those at risk for heat-related illness, like those who are sick or have chronic condi-tions, older adults, pregnant women, children, those who live alone, pets, and outdoor work-ers

If you don't have air conditioning, follow these tips: Stay hydrated and don't wait until you're thirsty to drink water

Take cool showers or baths

Use your stove and oven less to avoid making your home hotter

Visit a library, cooling center, shopping mall, or other air-conditioned space. If you need help finding a cool space, call 211.

Heat-Related Illness

It's important to know how to recognize and help someone who is experiencing a heat-related ill-ness. Call 911 right away if you see these symptoms: high body temperature (103°F or higher), diz-ziness, nausea, passing out, headache, fast &strong pulse, confusion, and hot, red, dry, or damp skin. Watch out for each other. Everyone should take

precautions to prevent heat-related illness, but there are groups more vulnerable to heat. Check on those who are sick or have chronic conditions, older adults, pregnant people, children, those who live alone, pets, and outdoor workers and athletes.

"Heat causes more deaths in the U.S. annually than floods, storms, and lightning combined. Those most likely to get ill during the heat include older adults, young children, outdoor workers, athletes, and individuals with chronic medical conditions," said Muntu Davis, MD, MPH, Los Angeles County Health Officer. If you or someone around you experiences symptoms of heat stroke or heat exhaustion, such as dizziness, nausea, rapid heartbeat, confusion, or passing out, seek medical help immediately.







Pasadena residents and businesses are reminded that City Hall and many City services will be closed on Monday in observance of Labor Day. Specific closures and exceptions are noted

Trash and recycling services will be postponed by one day. Monday pickup will occur on Tuesday; Tuesday pickup on Wednesday; Wednesday pickup on Thursday; Thursday pickup on Friday; and Friday pickup on Saturday. There will be no bulky item pickups on Saturday or Monday.

The City Service Center will be closed Monday and will resume regular hours on Tuesday.

Pasadena residents and experiencing power emergencies should call Pasadena Water and Power (PWP) at (626) 744-4673. For water-related emergencies, call (626) 744-4138. PWP's regular Customer Call Center will be closed for the holiday, but customers can access their accounts and pay bills online at PWPweb.com or by calling (626) 744-4005.

The City's Municipal Services Payment Center and Parking Office will be closed on Labor Day. All parking meters not posted as "No Parking" will be free and time limits will not be

Violations for overnight parking, red curb parking, "No Parking" zones, and blocking fire hydrants will continue to be enforced. Regular enforcement resumes

Tuesday. be closed Monday however, many services will be available via Permit Center Online, where you can obtain subtrade permits and submit plans for new construction, tenant improvements, accessory dwelling units, and additions. The Permit Center will resume

regular hours on Tuesday. Pasadena Transit Route 33 will operate on a Sunday schedule, but all other routes and Dial-A-Ride transportation will not operate on Labor Day. Normal service will resume on Tuesday.

All Pasadena Public Libraries will be closed on Sunday and Monday and will return to regular schedules on Tuesday.

All recreation and community centers operated by the City's Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department will be closed on Labor Day, but all parks will be open for picnics, fun and play. No site reservations are accepted for the holiday.

Altadena Fire Debris Removal Complete

Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors Chair Kathryn Barger announced Friday that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) has completed its final debris removal and recovery work in Altadena and neighboring communities impacted by the Eaton Fire.

Earlier Friday, USACE finalized its sign-off at Eliot Arts Magnet School in Altadena, marking the completion of all physical debris operations conducted in support of Los Angeles County and the cities of Pasadena and Sierra Madre.

The Corps will continue its restoration efforts at the Altadena Golf Course throughout the autumn, with a final handover to the Department of Parks and Recreation expected by the end of this calendar year she said. Barger expressed her gratitude for the Corps' dedication and

emphasized her commitment to the community's ongoing recovery.

"I thank the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for their extraordinary service to the residents of Altadena and our region," said Supervisor Kathryn Barger. "Their dedication and professionalism ensured that recovery efforts moved forward quickly and effectively. OCEAN WATER USE WARNING FOR LOS **ANGELES COUNTY BEACHES**

With temperatures climbing ahead of Labor Day weekend ... forecasters are warning beachgoers to watch out for strong rip currents and powerful surf along LA County beaches. South-facing shores could see waves up to 5 feet today ... building to as high as 6 feet tomorrow.

Thousands are expected to head to the coast to escape the heat.

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health cautions residents who are planning to visit the below Los Angeles County beaches to avoid swimming, surfing, and playing in ocean waters:

- Topanga Canyon Lagoon at Topanga County Beach 100 yards up and down the coast from the lagoon.
- 40th Street extension in Manhattan Beach 100 yards up and down the coast from the 40th Street extension.
- Manhattan Beach Pier in Manhattan Beach 100 yards up and down the coast from the pier.
- Hermosa Beach Pier in Hermosa Beach 100 yards up and down the coast from the pier.
- Redondo Beach Pier in Redondo Beach 100 yards up and down the coast from the pier.
- Redondo Beach at Sapphire St. 100 yards up and down the coast from the storm drain.
- Mothers Beach in Marina Del Rey Entire swim area.
- Santa Monica Pier in Santa Monica 100 yards up and down the coast from the pier.
- Ramirez Creek at Paradise Cove 100 yards up and down the coast from the pier.
- Inner Cabrillo Beach in San Pedro Entire swim area.

These warnings have been issued due to bacterial levels exceeding health standards when last tested.

"PILGRIM MEALS"

Upon researching the Camino de Santiago, several subjects remained foreign including a pilgrim meal. Having no knowledge of this subject, it was difficult to

It is difficult to remember 9 new names. Location of where these pilgrims were from was easier to store in my long-term memory. Many times, referring to pilgrims by their hometown became common

for their names. Some pilgrims referenced me as 'California'. I participated in other pilgrim dinners along 'The Way'. For most part, the experience was the same. 2 courses. Bread. Desert. Aqua. Vino. New and familiar faces at the dinner table. Conversation. Laughter. Enjoying a warm meal.

ARCADIA MAYOR CENSURED

Arcadia's City Council took an unprecedented step Tuesday night, voting 4-1 to formally censure Mayor Sharon Kwan after months of escalating dysfunction. The decision, a first in the city's history, followed a nearly seven-hour special meeting filled with tense exchanges, passionate public testimony, and sharp rebukes from her colleagues.

Kwan, Arcadia's first Asian female mayor, cast the sole dissenting vote. The censure strips her of key responsibilities, including the authority to manage the meetings, represent the city in official functions, and serve on committees. A final resolution codifying the sanctions will be presented at the Sept. 2 council meeting.

Councilmembers were instructed not to make public comments to the press prior to the Aug. 26 special meeting or the upcoming September 2 meeting, making Tuesday night the first time Cheng, Cao, and Wang spoke openly about their reasons for supporting the censure.

A Meeting That Drew a Crowd

More than a hundred residents packed City Hall, holding signs that under-scored the city's divide: "I Stand With Mayor Kwan" on one side, "Censure Kwan" on the other.

Former Mayor April Verlato was the first to speak during public comment, setting the tone for the night. She insisted the censure had nothing to do with harassment allegations among councilmembers and instead traced the dispute back to her and Kwan's opposition to first responder unions. Verlato claimed union members had been "stalking" her online and spreading rumors of an affair with a police captain, a claim that raised eyebrows, since the city has only two police captains.

In her remarks, Verlato inflamed tensions further by calling union members, the city's first responders, "jerks" and "disgusting." Her words drew audible gasps and reactions from the audience and sharpened the partisan split in the chamber.

Councilmember David Fu, who initiated the censure motion, followed with a detailed two-hour presentation. He alleged that Mayor Kwan involved students in delivering remarks ments that some viewed as disparaging to veterans, raised questions about the city's finances that colleagues characterized as misleading, and used council procedures in ways they considered disruptive to staff.

During his presentation, residents could be heard hissing and yelling as April Verlato walked the aisles trying to motivate people to react.

Residents and Veterans React

Public comment stretched over two hours. Some residents expressed frustration that personal disputes had spilled into council chambers. Others, particularly veterans, sharply criticized Kwan's remarks during the Aug. 19 meeting, when she claimed her charitable donations did more for veterans than military service.

"All of us, whether we carried a gun or carried the wounded, are veterans," one speaker declared. Another vet eran said Kwan's comments had "demeaned every man and woman who wore the uniform."

Councilmembers Speak Out

Paul Cheng: Calling for Order and Rule of Law

Councilmember Paul Cheng emphasized that his support for censure was not personal but rooted in the need for legality and order. He said Kwan's habit of steering meetings off agenda violated the Brown Act and prevented the council from conducting the people's business.

"She has a right to her opinion," Cheng said, "but not a right to hijack the meeting outside of agenda items. The public deserves lawful, orderly governance."

Cheng also revealed that he, too, had faced harassment from colleagues, being cursed at, mocked about his mascu-linity, and berated in front of staff and even children. He said he refrained from filing a complaint only because Kwan advised him not to. Despite those experiences, Cheng repeatedly tried to broker peace, even urging Kwan and Fu to meet privately.

"I'm sick and tired of not getting the people's work done," he said bluntly.

Michael Cao: Defending Standards Not Silencing Speech

that appeared scripted, made com- | Councilmember Michael Cao, an Air Force veteran, focused on principle. While he condemned Kwan's remarks that belittled his service, he stressed that the censure was not about punishing speech.

"She's indolent and unprepared for speech. This is not about silencing her role. When contradicted or conher," Cao said. "This is about conduct unbe-coming of a mayor."

> His comments drew applause from veterans in the audience who said Kwan's statements had disrespected those who served.

Eileen Wang: A Call for Professionalism

Mayor Pro Tem Eileen Wang, said the conflict had deeply embarrassed the city. She noted she had never personally experienced harassment or discrimination on the dais, countering Kwan's repeated claims of sexism.

Wang urged her colleagues and the public to focus on restoring professionalism. "This is about maintaining civility and integrity in city government," she said.

Kwan's Response

Kwan defended herself by saying she lashed out only after feeling her daughter was targeted. "I acted as any mother would," she said, while framing the censure as retaliation for her complaints of sexism.

She never apologized for her prior conduct except to say that she sent Michael Cao an apology email. Michael Cao said he accepted her apology.

A Divided City

The meeting revealed deep divisions, not only among councilmembers but also in the community. While some ral-lied to Kwan's defense, many more expressed disappointment in her leadership.

Former mayor Sho Tay, in a statement before the meeting, strongly backed the council's action:

"Establishing this practice is not about conflict between two councilmembers; it is about restoring integrity and civility to the Arcadia City Council and establishing a standard that future mayors and councilmembers should follow."

Looking Ahead

The censure, laid out in Resolution 7649, removes Kwan's mayoral powers for the remainder of her ninemonth term. Resolution 7650, which requires a four-fifths vote, could remove her from the office of mayor altogether while allowing her to remain on the council.

That decision will be debated on Sept. 2. (CNS)

COPPER WIRE THEFT LEADS TO 911 OUTAGE SUSPECT ARRESTED

On August 7, 2025, at approximately 2:30 a.m., the Arcadia Police Department Communications Center experienced a failure that prevented 911 calls from being answered. Redundant measures were immediately implemented to ensure uninterrupted public safety services.

An investigation revealed that unknown suspects had accessed underground communication lines in the 200 block of South Santa Anita Avenue. Approximately 60 feet of copper wiring had been severed and stolen, causing the outage. The estimated cost of the stolen materials and necessary repairs was approximately \$10,000.

Arcadia Police officers and detectives launched a criminal investigation. After several weeks of investigative work, a suspect and vehicle connected to the theft were identified.

On August 27, 2025, plainclothes Arcadia Police officers located the suspect and the associated vehicle in the 1700 block of Olympic Boulevard in Los Angeles. With additional Arcadia officers providing support, a traffic stop was attempted. The suspect initially complied by stopping, but then exited the vehicle and fled on foot. Officers pursued, ultimately detaining and arresting the suspect in the 600 block of Rampart Boule-vard.

The suspect, 44-year-old Jose Gante-Gomez, a resident of Los Angeles, was booked at the Arcadia Police Department. He faces the following charges:

PC 487(a) – Grand Theft

PC 148(a)(1) – Resisting or Obstructing a Peace Officer

GOVERNOR NEWSOM SIGNS NEW LAW TO PROVIDE FAIR INTEREST FOR DISASTER-AFFECTED HOMEOWNERS

Friday, Newsom signed into law legislation to allow homeowners who receive insurance payments for lost or damaged property to receive the interest accrued rather than lenders.

LOS ANGELES — As part of the state's continued efforts to support Los Angeles firestorm survivors, Governor Newsom signed into law Assembly Bill 493 (Harabedian) to ensure homeowners, not lenders, benefit from the interest earned on insurance payouts, particularly those impacted by California's most destructive wildfires.

The legislation signed today corrects an inequity that allows lenders to keep interest accrued on insurance payouts held in escrow after a disaster.

"Homeowners rebuilding after a disaster need all the support they can get, including the interest earned on their insurance funds. I am proud to deliver this commonsense solution to ensure survivors receive every resource available to help them recover and rebuild." Governor Gavin Newsom

After a disaster, insurance payouts are often held in escrow while construction is ongoing, which can take months or even years.

While California law requires lenders to pay homeowners interest on escrowed funds for property taxes and insurance premiums, it previously did not extend this requirement to hazard insurance payouts held in escrow. The new law explicitly requires lenders to pay homeowners the interest earned on post-loss insurance payouts, just as they do for other escrowed property expenses.



``Behind every delayed insurance claim is a family forced to wait in limbo," Victoria Knapp, chair of the Altadena Town Council, said in a statement. ``We're asking the Department of Insurance to stand with Altadena and NOT with insurers to deliver justice for those who've already lost so much."

Members of the Eaton Fire Survivors Network joined state representatives and called on Insurance Commissioner Ricardo Lara to comply with five requests.

They asked the state to amend the California FAIR Plan -- an insurance option often seen as a last resort for homeowners in the state -- to guarantee smoke coverage. Wildfire survivors requested the department enforce laws to ensure families remained housed.

Additionally, survivors called for more transparency in loss estimates, and to make the department's complaint process more transparent.

Lastly, the group urged the department to immediately conduct an investigation into State Farm's handling of claims within 60 days, which have had homeowners frustrated for months, and to focus on com-plaints alleging insurers are limiting people's short-term living coverage.

"We paid our premiums faithfully for decades, trusting insur-ers to protect us. Now they're using illegal delays and denials to profit from our pain. Families are maxing out credit cards, draining savings and living in contaminated homes," Joy Chen, cofounder and CEO of Eaton Fire Survivors Network, said in a statement.

"We call on the California Department of Insurance to stand with survivors, not with the insurers breaking the law," she added.

Assembly members John Harabedian, D-Pasadena, and Jacqui Irwin, D-Thousand Oaks, and Sen. Sasha Renée Pérez, D-Pasadena, re-buked insurance companies. They also highlighted AB 238, authored by Harabedian, that would implement mortgage forbearance for one-year while homeown-ers recover and rebuild. ''Our responsibility is clear: to protect survivors, give them the time and resources to rebuild their home and their lives, and ensure they can do so with security and peace of mind," Harabedian said in a statement.

``That's why I am leading this effort -- calling on the California Department of Insurance to act swiftly and decisively, enforce the law, expedite claims, and provide every protection available -- so families can recover with dignity and hope for the future,"

Los Angeles County Supervisor Kathryn Barger, whose 5th District includes Altadena, thanked Harabedian for introducing the bill, which she said in a statement she supports.

``Too many continue to face undue claim delays, underpayments and denials that compound their hardship and loss," Barger said in a statement. ``Continued vigilance in oversight and enforcement are vital, and new reforms are needed from our state regulators and legislature."

State Farm, California's largest home insurer, is seeking a rate increase of 11%. In May, a judge authorized the company to implement an emergency rate hike of 17%.

In the following month, Lara announced his department would be conducting a market conduct exam of State Farm, citing several complaints about how it handled smoke damage and other claims.

"Our goals align with fire survivors. We want individuals to recover on their own terms. I launched a thorough investigation into State Farm's wildfire claims, but holding up rate filing without a legal basis affects the integrity of our entire market, including wildfire survivors who need access to insurance options," Lara said in a statement Monday.

As of Monday, State Farm has received more than 13,000 claims related to January's wildfires, and paid more than \$4.5 billion to California customers, according to the company's website.

A representative for State Farm did not immediately respond to a request for comment. Bob Devereux, a spokesman for State Farm, told the Los Angeles Times that the company was not mistreating its customers, noting an ``overwhelming majority are satisfied with our service."

"Our goal at State Farm is to work with customers to resolve any of their concerns," Devereux told The Times.

EMERGENCY PROTECTIONS IN PLACE UNTIL OCTOBER 1, 2025 FOR SHORT-TERM RENTALS, HOTELS, AND MOTELS

To support wildfire survivors and ensure access to emergency housing, Executive Order N-28-25 extends tenancy and occupancy protections to October 1, 2025 for people displaced by the wildfires.

The Order allows wildfire evacuees to continue to be considered short-term occupants rather than tenants when they stay beyond 30 days in short-term rentals, hotels and motels.



CLEARMAN'S NORTH WOODS INN - SAN GABRIEL

I know many of you have been to Clearman's North Woods Inn. And if you have, you already know the garlic cheese bread is worth the drive on its own. But for those who haven't, here you go — this is a steakhouse that hasn't changed much in decades, and that's exactly why it still works.

Walking Into the Lodge

From the outside, North Woods Inn looks like Paul Bunyan decided to open a restaurant in San Gabriel: log-cabin walls, fake snow on the roof, and a building that feels more Lake Tahoe than Los Angeles County. Step inside, and it's dark wood beams, stained glass windows, chandeliers, and paintings that haven't budged since Eisenhower. And yes, the peanut shells on the floor are still part of the fun. You can call it dated if you like — I call it classic.

A Bit of History

Back in 1958, John Clearman opened his first North Woods Inn in Monrovia. His idea was sim-ple: good food, big portions, a place where families could gather. When the 210 Freeway came through in '66, the restaurant moved to its current San Gabriel home.

Over the years, the Clearman's name grew to include the Steak 'n' Stein and The Galley (better known as "The Boat," right next door). But it's this North Woods Inn that became the real insti-tution. And here's the smartest thing they ever did: they didn't change much.

On this night, I had Hansalicious with me — my steady dining companion. San Gabriel's Vice Mayor, Eric Chan, was supposed to join us but turned into a no-show. His punishment? No cheese bread. Our other guest, Ronson, was a tad late because he was holding court next door. He's the unoffi-cial "Mayor of The Boat," Clearman's other classic. If you've been to The Boat, you already know he's part of the atmosphere there. Between North Woods and The Boat, the Clearman family has this corner of Rosemead locked

We all started with the jumbo cocktail shrimp. And they mean jumbo — these things were practi-cally lobster tails,

meaty and ice-cold. Hans went with the sirloin burger, piled high and juicy. He gave it his usual one-word review — "delicious" — and he wasn't wrong.

I went classic: the bone-in ribeye. Cooked to perfection, tender and flavorful — exactly

what you want from a steakhouse that prides itself on tradition. We shared all entrées, and Ronson had the honors of the first cut.

And yes, the cheese bread disappeared fast. Hot, buttery, garlicky — it stacks up against any-thing you'll find at the bigger-name steakhouses in town. Same with the salad. Simple, crisp, oversized, and just plain good.

Our server, Rheana, got it right — friendly, professional, and never over the top. Manager Christine was working the room the way managers used to, what my dad called "table touching." Going from table to table, checking in with diners. It's old-school, and it still makes a difference. Christine also tipped me off about the blackened salmon — a smart choice if you're not in the mood for steak. And then there's Dorothy behind the bar. Sharp, personable, and good enough to be getting an award soon. She's proof that the bar here isn't

Steakhouse Royalty

I've written about all the big names: Arroyo Chop House, Taylor's, Edwards (now gone), Fleming's. North Woods Inn belongs in that conversation. Maybe it's not as polished, maybe it doesn't scream "fine dining," but it stacks up in the ways that matter: the food is consistent, the portions are huge, and you leave full. The décor hasn't changed in decades, and the menu hasn't either. That's the smartest move they ever made. Why change something that works?

My Honest Take

Here's the truth: North Woods Inn isn't for everyone. If you're looking for small plates, edible flowers, and servers who describe every microgreen on the plate, this isn't your spot. But if you want a ribeye cooked right, shrimp you actually have to cut with a knife, cheese bread you can't stop eating, and service that still feels personal — then this is the steakhouse for you.

A Toast to North Woods Inn - So here's my toast:

just an afterthought — it's part of the draw.

- To Rheana, for getting the service balance right.
- To Christine, for keeping "table touching" alive. To Dorothy, for making the bar a place you want to linger.
- To Ronson, who may be the mayor of The Boat, but whose presence is part of the North Woods story too.
- And even to Vice Mayor Eric Chan because skipping out here means skipping the cheese bread, and that's a mistake.

North Woods Inn is big, it's loud, it's unapologetically old-fashioned, and yes — you'll leave smelling like garlic bread. But that's the charm. If you've been here before, you already know. And if you haven't? Now you do. Cheers to that.

SENIORS TARGETED BY SPAM CALLS: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Spam calls are more than just annoying — they can be dangerous. Scammers often target seniors with fake phone calls, hoping to steal money or personal information.

Why do scammers focus on older adults? Many seniors are kind, trusting, and polite. Some may not be familiar with the latest technology, and others may live alone and welcome a friendly voice. Sadly, scammers use these things to their advantage.

These scam calls often sound official or urgent. You might get a call from someone claiming to be from:

- Medicare or Social Security
- The IRS or a police department
- A grandchild in trouble
- A lottery or prize company

They may ask for personal details, bank information, or payment by gift cards or wire transfer. But remember: Real organizations will never ask for that over the phone.

To protect yourself:

Don't answer calls from numbers you don't recognize.

- If a caller pressures you, hang up immediately.
- Never give out personal or financial information to someone you don't know.
- Ask a trusted family member to help set up call blocking on your phone.
- Talk about any suspicious calls with family or friends.

If you receive a scam call, report it to one of these trusted places:

- Federal Trade Commission (FTC): 1-877-382-4357 or reportfraud.ftc.gov
- AARP Fraud Watch Network: 1-877-908-3360
- Your phone company they may be able to block numbers
- Local police, especially if you gave out money or personal info

You are not alone. Scammers are tricky, but staying alert and informed can keep you — and others — safe.

HOW TO PREVENT FALLS AT HOME

Dear Savvy Senior,

My 80-year-old father, who lives alone, has fallen several times over the past few months. Are there any tips or precautions you recommend that I can implement to help prevent this? Concerned Son



Dear Concerned,

This is a common concern for millions of elderly seniors and their families. Each year more than 1-in-4 older Americans fall, making it the leading cause of both fatal and nonfatal injuries for those age 65 and older. But many falls can be prevented. Depending on what's causing your dad to fall, here are some tips that can help keep him on his feet.

Get him exercising: Weak leg muscles and poor balance are two of the biggest risk factors that cause seniors to fall. Walking, strength training and tai chi are all good for improving balance and strength, as are a number of simple exercises your dad can do anytime like sit-to-stand exercises (sitting down and standing up from a seat without using his hands for assistance), standing on one foot for 30 seconds then switching to the other foot, and walking heel-to-toe across the room.

Check his meds: Does your dad take any medicine, or combination of medicines, that make him dizzy, sleepy or lightheaded? If so, make a list or gather up all the drugs he takes - prescriptions and over the counter – and contact his doctor or pharmacist for a drug review and adjustment.

Many blood pressure medications, anti-anxiety drugs, antidepressants, anti-seizure drugs, antipsychotic drugs, diuretics, sedatives, tranquilizers, some painkillers and over-the-counter drugs that cause drowsiness are common culprits in medication-related falls.

Get a vision and hearing test: Even small changes in sight and hearing can increase your dad's risk of falling, so get his eyes checked every year to be sure his vison and eyeglasses (if used) are to up to par. Hearing loss can also double the risk of falling, so have your dad's hearing checked too, and if he uses a hearing aid, be sure it fits well, and he wears it.

Fall-proof his home: There are a number of simple household modifications you can do to make your dad's living area safer. Start by helping him arrange or move the furniture so there are clear pathways to walk through and pick-up items on the floor that could cause him to trip like newspapers, shoes, clothes, electrical or phone cords.

If he has throw rugs, remove them or use double-sided tape to secure them.

In the bathroom buy some non-skid rugs for the floors and a rubber suction-grip mat or adhesive nonskid tape for the floor of the tub or shower, and have a carpenter install grab bars in and around the tub/ shower for support.

Also, make sure the lighting throughout the house is good. Purchase some inexpensive plug-in nightlights for the bathrooms and hallways, and if he has stairs, put handrails on both sides.



Choose safe footwear: Going barefoot or wearing slippers or socks at home can also cause falls, as can wearing backless shoes, and shoes with heels or smooth leather soles. The safest option is rubber-sole, low-heel shoes.

Purchase some helpful aids: If your dad needs some help with his balance or walking, get him a cane or walker. Also, to help ensure your dad's safety, and provide you some peace of mind, consider getting him a medical alert system that comes with a wearable emergency help button (some systems are voiceactivated) that would allow him to call for help if he did fall or need assistance.

To help you evaluate your dad's future risk of falling, use the National Council on Aging's "Falls Free Checkup" tool at NCOA.org/tools/falls-free-checkup.

PROFILES OF THE FIRE: ALMADEUS STAR

For the past 16 years, Almadeus Star lived on Alicia Avenue in Altadena with three of his daughters and their families at different times. His home was also "central headquarters" for his art, music, movie and writing projects related to his main project called "365 Days To Save The World". He is known as Zen Archer for the archery training he conducts.

On January 6, 2025, inside his home, there were two art galleries, a movie theater, and an art museum and multiple music instruments and performance gear used for frequent free performances and exhibits. The instruments included five guitars, two pianos, a drum kit, keyboard, hand drums, and more. There were sculptures everywhere, and every wall had a painting or some other two dimensional artwork.

Then came the fires of January 7.

JANUARY 7

On the morning of Tuesday, January 7, Star stepped out into his gardens and began to hand water the trees and vines and cacti. "I had a moment as I had every single morning for years where I acknowledged that I was the most fortunate man in the world and my life was Perfect," explains Star.

He had loaded his Toyota pickup with audio gear and guitars and prepared to go to L.A. in the afternoon to perform music from the new album he was producing. "Sometime later," says Star, unsure of the time, "I got a warning on my phone about a 'possible' evacuation. I was not at all alarmed about it because over the past 16 years, I had experienced 3 other such warnings that never amounted to any anything." But he adds that this time there were intense winds.

He decided that he wanted to get away from the smoke. He decided to go to his son's home in Idyllwild, 100 miles away to the east. Since his pickup was already loaded with instruments and gear that he had intended to use that night in L.A., he didn't want to haul all his gear to Idyllwild. I was still certain that this fire would just be handled as the ones in the past, and so I unloaded the gear into my home, to be safe," says Star. Not long after he finished that task, the warning escalated from "be prepared to evacuate" to "EVACUATE...NOW!"

Immediately thereafter, a large tree blew over and crashed on the roof of Star's home, and he noticed small pieces of smoldering and flaming leaves flying overhead, enough for him to be concerned.

He realized that a large leafy tree now perched on his roof was an invitation for disaster as bits of fire were falling from the sky, so he grabbed a ladder, chain saw, and some rope and went up on the roof. Piece by piece and limb by limb, he methodically cut the branches and took them out to his driveway until most of the clearing was accomplished. He continued to hack away til 11p.m. By then, the glow of the fire reflected on his windows, and all his neighbors had evacuated hours earlier. "I was tired," said Star, "It was late. It was dark. I was whipped. I stood in the middle of the front yard looking back and forth from my truck to the house and back again, trying to decide what to take with me."

In his archery equipment closet, he had 18 bows, dozens of arrows, tools for building or repairing bows and arrows, all valued about \$10,000. He grabbed one bow and a dozen arrows and put them in his truck, along with one guitar. The smoke was becoming unbearable.

Then he went into his art gallery and looked around. "It was overwhelming to consider which or what to take. Literally over a million dollars of market value, otherwise priceless. That was when my eye caught a glimpse of the two books containing three hundred handwritten, original songs and I gasped at the thought of almost leaving them behind. Irreplaceable. And so was all else in that gallery, but the songs were my commission from God to bring message to the world. I had recorded just a fraction of them ... So I picked up the two books and headed for the door," Star

It occurred to him that he should take his computer. So he headed for the stairs and placed the two song books down for a moment. Possibly on the piano bench. In his office, he glanced at the shelves filled with thousands of hours of recording and editing tapes and hard drives, and more. But he only took one computer and one external hard drive and loaded them in his truck.



NOW WHAT?

By then it was 11p.m., and Star didn't want to drive the 100 miles to Idyllwild, and so, with no plan, he drove somewhere south to Pasadena and found a quiet street and "slept" until daybreak. When he awoke, he compulsively jumped behind the wheel and sped to Altadena, hopeful to confirm that his home had survived. There were roadblocks and downed power lines and trees blocking streets randomly but consistently. "I drove past house after house that were still in flames. I heard random small explosions coming from the smoldering carnage everywhere. Little by little, my 'hopeful' was eroded and transformed into dread. When I finally reached my home....it was a pile of ashes. The gas line for the vanished hot water tank was leaking and flaming. All that once waswas no more," explains Star.

THE LOSSES

As a result of the fire, Star's material losses were astronomical. He lost 70 years of fine art, writing and music that he created. Star adds. "And I lost the means of creating new art, writing and music. My economic losses totaled in excess of \$1,000,000. My greatest challenge was facing the reality that all of the tools and resources that I had assembled to accomplish my long time mission to save the world were gone."

"There was a moment the day after the fire," explains Star, "that I was rummaging through the back seat area where I had stashed the bow and arrows and computer, and I did not see my song books. After a few panicked moments of rummaging, I came to the harsh reality that somehow, after I set the books down on the piano bench, I forgot to pick them up again. Tragic. Beyond tragic."

CURRENTLY

Star found a place to stay in Topanga, and is now temporarily living there. He does not plan to rebuild his home.

When asked "So what are you going to do now?", he pauses and thinks. Finally, he answers, "I am working every day to save the world with one guitar and little or nothing else. Oh, I almost forgot about my main resource that is my 1997 Toyota Tacoma with 412,000 miles on the odometer."

Star does have a gofundme to help him rebuild his life. It is Donate to Help Star Recover After LA Wildfires, organized by Almadeus Star Gioeli

FITNESS AS A LIFELINE

September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. Suicide is the second leading cause of death for people ages 10-34 in the U.S. That fact alone shows how serious the issue is. Suicide actually affects people of all ages, genders, and backgrounds. Almost everyone has either struggled themselves or knows someone who has.

While suicide is a complicated issue, one powerful tool that often gets overlooked is exercise. Movement can literally help save lives. That doesn't mean a few push-ups will magically erase pain or replace professional help, but exercise can be a lifeline. A way to cope, connect, and find hope when things feel overwhelming.

Exercise changes the brain in ways that protect mental health. When you move your body, your brain releases endorphins (feel-good chemicals that act like natural painkillers) and serotonin (a neurotransmitter that helps regulate mood). People dealing with depression, which is one of

little, we give the brain a boost that medicine alone can't always provide. But the impact isn't just chemical. Exercise creates a sense of control at a time when someone

the strongest risk factors for suicide, often have lower levels of serotonin. By moving, even a

may feel like life is spinning out of control. A 20-minute walk may sound small, but for someone fighting hopelessness, that walk can feel like a victory — proof they're still in the fight.

Another major risk factor for suicide is social isolation. People who feel cut off from others are more at risk. Here's where fitness plays a huge role. Exercise often creates connection. Think about a walking group, a pickleball game, or even a yoga class. You don't have to talk about your struggles directly, but just showing up, being seen, and moving with others builds a sense of belonging.

That sense of belonging is more powerful than most of us realize. Human beings are wired for connection. Exercise can be the bridge that brings people together when words are hard to find.

Several studies have shown that people who exercise regularly have lower rates of depression and suicidal thoughts. One large study from Harvard found that just 15 minutes of running or an hour of walking each day can cut the risk of major depression by 26%. While exercise alone is not a "cure," it's a protective factor. Something that helps shield people from sliding deeper into despair.

Another study followed teenagers and found that those involved in sports were less likely to attempt suicide compared to their non-active peers. The reason wasn't just fitness. It was teamwork, friendship, and the sense of purpose that came from showing up for others.

One of the biggest barriers for someone struggling with suicidal thoughts is that even simple tasks feel overwhelming. Telling someone in deep pain to "just go exercise" can sound harsh or unrealistic. The key is starting with manageable steps that feel like real accomplishments.

If you know someone who's having a tough time, inviting them to move with you can be a gentle, non-threatening way to reach out. You don't need to have the perfect words. Just say:

- "Want to go for a short walk with me?"
- "Let's throw the ball around for a bit."
- "How about a bike ride to clear our heads?"

These small actions create forward motion. Each step provides a sense of control, a moment of relief, and a reminder that the body — and life — are still moving. Plus, the act of moving together can open the door to deeper conversations or simply provide quiet company, which can be just as healing.

Sometimes the best step is moving while talking — a walk-and-talk with a counselor, a friend, or a loved one combines physical movement with emotional support.

Exercise is not a replacement for professional help. Therapy, medication, and crisis support lines are often necessary and lifesaving. But fitness adds another layer of protection. It can lower risk, reduce isolation, and remind people that they still have strength inside of them.


If you are struggling, please know this: you are not alone. Reaching out for help is not weakness. It's courage. And if you know someone who is in distress, remember that even small invitations to move together can make a difference.

This Suicide Prevention Awareness Month, let's expand the conversation. Along with raising awareness, let's share tools of hope. Exercise may not solve everything, but it offers a path forward. One step, one breath, one movement at a time.

UNLOCK YOUR LIFE

VALUED PARTNER OR ELF ON THE SHELF? Stop Making Your Contribution Invisible.

Have you ever felt like the Elf on the Shelf, always there, always doing the behind-the-scenes work, but somehow... unseen? That quiet labor might seem small to some, yet it's what holds households, workplaces, and communities together.

Sociologists have named it invisible labor, the endless mental and emotional bookkeeping: coordinating schedules, anticipating needs, and smoothing over conflicts before anyone notices. It's

planning the holiday menu, stocking the fridge, and replacing toilet paper and lightbulbs before anyone misses them.

This invisible work often lands disproportionately on women—even when both partners work full-time. Researchers at the University of Bath found that mothers handle about 71% of all household mental-load tasks, while fathers manage far fewer. That's not just a gap, it's a chasm. (Another survey reported that 63% of women said they do more than their fair share of household labor, compared with just 22% of men. Studies of weekly chores show that women spend 50% more time on housework than men. In Australia, for instance, women average 18.4 hours a week, compared to 12.8 for men, and that inequality comes with resentment and stress. The consequences reach far beyond cluttered schedules. Harvard Business School's report The Caring Company warns that if employers continue overlooking caregiving and unseen labor, they'll risk losing talented women who simply can't sustain the burden.

Closer to home, I witnessed something striking at a neighborhood meeting. A fellow resident quietly handled everything—from printing agendas to setting out chairs—but as the meeting ended, only the speaker received thanks. The unseen work wrapped the evening together, yet the worker remained invisible.

Why does recognition matter? Because when labor goes unspoken, it's easy to assume it just... happens. And when it "happens" without acknowledgment, it erases both the task and the provider.

So, how do we shift that dynamic? First, and this is simple but powerful, name it. Tonight, jot down three invisible tasks you handled today. Then say one of them out loud. "Yes, I handled the school signup, scheduled my dad's check-up, and scheduled the dog grooming." Until it's spoken, it's invisible.

Second, share the mental load. Equitable partnerships mean dividing not just action, but planning and anticipating, even the nitty-gritty calendar logistics. Rotate responsibility. Let others own the thinking, not just the doing.

Third, value care as essential, not optional. We honor financial contributions; let's honor connection and consistency with equal respect. A family or workplace runs on money and care. Both matter.

Finally, stop doing things you don't want to do.

So here's your invitation: try the Visibility Practice this week. Each evening, write down three invisible tasks you did. Share one with your partner, someone close, or at work. Notice what happens when your contribution is seen. Next, pause and notice there are tasks that your partner did that you can appreciate. Check in with yourself mentally, don't fall into a trap of complaining. Notice what's there and build upon it. This is the perfect position to ask for help and a true partnership.

Because invisibility isn't humility: it's erasure. And our communities need us to be visible, not silent. Let's step off the shelf and step into the light.

I AM SAD THAT THE PASADENA

PUT THE LIGHTS ON



I moved to Sierra Madre from Venice Beach in 1979. My first marriage had dissolved, and I had hopes of gaining custody of my children. One day an old Law School friend of mine mentioned that he had an office in El Monte for which that he had signed a long-term lease, and it was becoming unsustainable for him to keep that office and his Beverly Hills practice going. He asked if I wanted to use the El Monte Office. Frankly, I was tired of Legal Aid so goodbye to Legal Aid and off to being a private lawyer in El Monte.

So in 1976 and I had this office in El Monte, but I didn't want to live there. One day the smog cleared, and I looked to the north and saw the magnificent San Gabriel Mountains and decided that's where I wanted to live. I remember driving up the beautiful streets with the purple jacaranda trees and wistaria blooming. Ĭ thought to myself that if I could live within that beauty, I would never be unhappy

I was directed to a local mailman who owned several properties including a house for sale. After seeing the house, I told him I wanted to buy it. He gave me a price, and I said fine. No negotiating. Thirty years later, right before he died, he told me he would have sold it to me for half of that price. We both laughed because now the house which I had rebuilt was now worth ten times what I had paid. You might notice that I am not much of a businessman, but I did gain custody of my kids to the relief of my-ex-wife.

When I moved to Sierra Madre I didn't know anyone in the area and there seemed to be no place that served food familiar to me. On the weekends the kids and I would go to Don Ricardo's in the Santa Anita Mall which provided 99 cent breakfasts and had a play area. I needed to find a place that was more appropriate for me. I found The Pasadena Sandwich Company.

I was raised in Chicago by immigrant parents who, especially my father, were big fans of Delis and friendly conversation. In Chicago he owned a grocery store which he named Stuart Food Mart, and I thought all the customers were his friends. Steve Fink had worked for 17 years with his parents in their NY-Styled Deli in the1950s in Pomona eventually he ventured out to establish his own business with the mission "to feed all the people of Pasadena."

Steve's style was unique. He treated me and probably all of his customers as friends. Rather than just taking orders and preparing them, he would suggest "trust the cook". I remember him telling me that he was happiest when cutting meat and preparing sandwiches.

Eventually in 1995 he opened the larger Pasadena Sandwich Company on Sierra Madre Villa Avenue. In time I realized that Steve had some rare blood disease which caused his death at age 59. He's described as follows "He never won the lottery, but family and friends say he left a legacy through his restaurant, where strangers were welcomed like family members."

After Steve's death his kids and continued running the restaurant. They, along with all their employees were always warm and cordial and remembered my name and would make suggestions. Still, it wasn't quite the same without their father and now I'm afraid that that it won't be quite the same without the restaurant.

So much of what I have valued has disappeared without me even recognizing how important they were. As our freedoms disappear in chaos and turmoil perhaps, I will recognize the importance of what I once had and took for granted. You know freedom of speech and freedom of dissent and not worrying that our children and grandchildren are in fear as they walk, or now, are driven to School.

As I think about it now, I even miss Venice.

I read the news last week that Governor | Nine years ago, Michelle Obama inspired Newsom signed legislation to hold a special election for a temporary redrawing of State Assemblyman Alex Lee (D-San our congressional districts; a measure to | Jose) calls this effort to counter Texas' counter Texas' gerrymandered addition move "a race to the bottom of gerrymanof five Republican-safe seats for the midterm elections. Just a few hours after that news broke, I checked my mailbox and I already had a flier urging a "no" vote.

The return address showed Protect Voters First, whose address (2350 Kerner Blvd. Ste. 250, San Rafael, CA) rang a bell. I checked, and yup - same address as Sierra Madre Neighbors for Fair-ness; the front group that a couple of years ago funneled \$300K to push their Bailey Canyon Mc-Mansion development on us. (I've been wondering whether our recent fires have given anybody second thoughts on that.)

The flier featured a quote in opposition by Gloria Chun Hoo, President League of Women Voters California. The League immediately put out a statement disavowing any connection to the cam-paign. Another quote was from Darius Kemp, Executive Director of California Common Cause - followed by another statement calling any suggestion of Common Cause affiliation "false".

The next day came a flier from another group, Right Path California - headed by California Republican Party Chairwoman Jessica Patterson, working with former House Speaker Kevin McCarthy. And then another from that same group the day I sat down to write this column.

There'll be much more to come, crammed into an eighty day campaign. More than \$100 million is figured to be spent battling over "Yes on 50 - Election Rigging Response Act"; not surprising, as it could well determine the future of our country.

Trump knew he risked losing his House majority in next year's midterms. Relying on voter support was not an option, so he turned to Gov. Greg Abbott (R) of Texas to redraw their districts to provide additional safe seats as a cushion. But even Gov. Abbott balked. Reapportionment takes place after each ten year census, as the Constitution requires. Mid-decade may not be illegal, but it simply wasn't done - especially just to appease a president wanting political advantage.

Then Abbott, along with Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton (R), received a letter from Harmeet Dhillon, head of the Civil Rights Division at the Department of Justice. Dhillon has attacked voting rights in trying to overturn the 2020 election. She's attacked women's right to choose while defending protestors harassing them at clinics. She's attacked anything hinting at DEI. She's removed consent decrees meant to curb thuggish police. And now she warned that Texas needed to address racially discriminatory congressional districts. The governor got the message, and the cover he needed.

us with, "When they go low, we go high." dering." Dora Rose, Deputy Director of the League of Women Voters says, "You don't save democracy by imitating those who seek to destroy it."

But Common Cause, a strong supporter of independent redistricting, has now changed their position and says not supporting Proposition 50 would "amount to a call for unilateral political disarmament in the face of authoritarian efforts to undermine fair representation and people-powered democracy." chairman Martha Tierney says we're here because "our country is sliding towards authoritarianism."

The evidence of this becomes clearer by the day: Trump continues attacking museums, schools, news organizations and even entertainers showing insufficient servility. He assumes entitlement to ignore court rulings and congressional actions. He marshals federal resources to target perceived enemies, in and out of government. Last week, he instructed Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth to form special National Guard units to deal with "public order issues". It's no longer funny (if it ever was) when he says, "A lot of people are saying, 'maybe we'd like a dictator.'"

As Gov. Newsom explains, "It's not good enough to just hold hands, have a candlelight vigil and talk about the way the world should be . . . we have got to meet fire with fire". And this, he says, is "a fivealarm fire for democracy". Mike Smith, president of House Majority PAC, says, This is happening in California, but it's bigger than California. It's about Democrats' effort to actually take a stand and win back the House."

Barack Obama says he has "tremendous respect for how Governor Newsom has approached this", adding, "I've had to wrestle with my preference, which would be that we don't have political gerrymandering, but what I also know is that if we don't respond effectively, then this White House and Republican controlled state governments all across the country, they will not stop, because they do not appear to believe in this idea of an inclusive, expansive democracy."

We can all expect a deluge of mailings in the coming weeks. Whether it'll be as much as we received from that San Rafael address a couple years ago pushing the housing development, I don't know.

What I do know is that, regardless how different the issues are, whether it's open space at our hillside or our democracy itself - once it's lost, it's awful hard to ever get it back.






