

Marie (Zarembski) Sullivan, a Chicago native who found her cherished community in Sierra Madre, passed away peacefully at home, surrounded by loved ones. She joins her beloved husband of 56 years, William "Bill" Sullivan, who passed away in

Marie was just 22 when she met Bill in Chicago. They married in 1955 and, in 1963, embarked on a new adventure, moving to Sierra Madre, California, with their three young children. They became mainstays of the community, first by purchasing and operating The Bottle Shop for over 20 years, and later by building and managing the Sierra Madre Self Storage. Both businesses remain family-owned and operated today. While building these businesses, Marie was a devoted mother, a successful real estate agent, and a dedicated volunteer for Sierra Madre Community Hospital, St. Rita Catholic Church, and Mater Dolorosa Retreat Center.

Together, Marie and Bill were also instrumental in founding Sierra Madre City College (SMCC), tirelessly promoting it by hosting parties and leading fundraisers to benefit the city. For years, they were a familiar sight in the Sierra Madre 4th of July parades, walking proudly beside their annual SMCC

Marie will be deeply missed by everyone who knew her, most of all by her children, Kathy Copeland (Paul), Bill Sullivan (Patty), and Dan Sullivan. Her spirit lives on through her six grandchildren, Melissa (Bobby), Michael, Jay (Caley), Jeff, Tracy, and Sarah, and her five great-grandchildren, Travis, , Braxton, BraeLynn James, and Avery. We will remember Marie for her remarkable optimism, her cheerful demeanor, her incredible work ethic, and her joy for playing cards.

A funeral Mass will be held at St. Rita Catholic Church on Friday, September 19th, at 10 a.m., with the Rosary at 9:30 a.m. The Mass will be livestreamed on the St. Rita Parish Facebook page.

\$20,000 MATCHING CHALLENGE TO **BENEFIT SIERRA MADRE PUBLIC LIBRARY**



The Sierra Madre Library Foundation has announced an exciting opportunity for the community to double its impact in support of the newly renovated Sierra Madre Public Library. Thanks to a generous pledge from longtime resident and supporter Bill Patzert, every dollar donated between September 2 and October 15, 2025, will be matched dollar for dollar, up to \$20,000.

This \$20,000 Matching Challenge gives Sierra Madre the chance to raise \$40,000 in just six weeks. Funds will directly support furnishing and equipping the new Library, including furniture, fixtures, and technology to create a welcoming, modern space for learning and connection. The new library will open in June 2026.

"This challenge is an incredible opportunity," said Robert Stockly, Chair of the Sierra Madre Library Foundation. "Every donation, no matter the size, will have double the impact. The library has always been at the heart of Sierra Madre, and this campaign is about ensuring it remains a vibrant resource for generations to come. We're asking everyone in the community to participate - together we can make this vision a reality."

The matching pledge comes from Bill Patzert, a respected climate scientist and 38-year Sierra Madre resident who has been an advocate for public education and community institutions. Patzert said he was inspired by the library's central role in town life, both as a hub of learning and a gathering place for all ages.

"Libraries represent the best of who we are - curious, generous, and hopeful," Patzert said. "I can't wait to see what Sierra Madre can accomplish together. I love the Sierra Madre Library. Getting my library card was when my life truly began - books sparked ideas, shaped my career, and continue to open me to worlds of adventure and beauty. Every child and adult in Sierra Madre deserves the same. Please contribute: a fully funded library is the greatest gift Sierra Madre can give its people."

The challenge was officially announced at the August 26 Sierra Madre City Council meeting, where Stockly introduced the challenge and Librarian Leila Regan shared an update on construction progress. With significant funds totaling \$1.1 million already raised through the Friends of the Library, the Day Trust, grants and community donors, this challenge represents a crucial final push toward the \$1.5 million goal to equip the new building.

"I've seen firsthand how the library serves this community. It's not just as a place for books, but as a center for ideas, discovery, and connection especially after the Eaton Fire," Librarian Leila Regan said. "By making this challenge gift, I hope Bill inspires neighbors to give whatever they can to help open the doors of a Library that reflects the strength and spirit of Sierra Madre."



PMH Getting Ready for Centénnial of Route 66



The year 2026 marks three major local and national major local and national milestones: The centennial of Route 66, the 150th anniversary of Colorado Boulevard, and the 250th anniversary of the United States. To commemorate these historic events, Pasadena Museum of History has partnered with an Anniversary Planning Council made up of more than thirty community groups. Together, they are creating a year-long calendar filled with special programs, festivals, and city-wide events celebrating the Crown City. PMH's Off Kicking Celebration: A Tribute to Route 66





Thanks to the generous support of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, this simulcast is free and open to all — a gift of music, community, and culture for Los Angeles.

CALTRANS COMMITS \$8.5 MILLION TO RIO HONDO ECOSYSTEM RESTORATION PROJECT

Monrovia is a member of the Rio Hondo San Gabriel River Watershed Management Authority (RH/SGR WMA), a Joint Powers Authority working to protect the local watershed, quality of rainwater runoff (stormwater) and help member agencies meet national environmental standards related to stormwater management. The Authority is currently in the design phase of the Rio Hondo Ecosystem Restoration Project, located at the Peck Road Conservation Park, which will improve water quality, recharge the local groundwater basin, and create new multi-benefit facilities for the community to enjoy

While the Authority makes progress toward the project's design, the group has made significant strides toward securing funds for both design and construction phases. Recently, Monrovia worked with the RH/SGR WMA to secure \$8.5 million from Caltrans to support the project's construction! Caltrans officially committed this funding through a letter of support provided in July. With these funds, the RH/SGR WMA will be able to construct a project that will provide immediate benefits to the ecosystem and community.

"Home for the Evening"

Home for the evening. 4 words that became a daily search

Walking day after day. More than 20-25 miles and 8-11 hours each day for 29 days.

A day of exhaustion. Excitement of the unknown. Unpredictable weather. Searching for snacks and water.

My petite body and energetic small feet continued moving forward. The rapid and consistent movement on the path of the Camino. Searching for the bright yellow arrows in random places. Daily scavenger hunt. Looking for Camino shells on the ground. Seeking the milestone marker made of grey stone with numbers reducing in kilometers as my body continued walking.

Numbers are getting smaller. Village signs are getting closer. A home for the evening is attainable.

My body is thrilled to arrive at Camino de Santiago soon. A goal to become a reality. But for now, I need a place to sleep. Shower. Laundry. Eat. Writing my daily log of events. Recharge phone and watch battery. After locating a home for the evening, the routine for the push needs to get done.

Preparing my bed. Paper bed sheet. Sleeping bag. Jacket on top of pillow. Organizing items for a shower. Searching for clean clothes and a towel. Toiletries in the noisy clear baggies. Organizing dirty laundry to make them clean and odor free. Hang wet clothes that didn't dry the day before on the roof of the bunkbed.

The clean clothes worn after the shower are the clothes to sleep in and worn the next day of walking.

The weather can be unpredictable. Having an additional long clean shirt for layering and rain jacket is accessible and routine. I had that well prepared. Gloves and rain cap hat in rain jacket pocket. Before going to sleep, I organized the items I was not sleeping with on the top of my sleeping bag for the next day.

Hat. Ear warmers. Bandana. Socks. Ace bandage. Sunglasses. Waist pack. Water bottle. Toiletries for the morning.

I had my system. Non-toiletry items fit in my hat. Toiletries needed



LA COUNTY DISPLAYS AERIAL ASSETS FOR FIGHTING WILDFIRES

VAN NUYS (CNS) - Los Angeles County Fire Department Chief Anthony Marrone hosted media briefing today in which he and other officials showcased SuperScoopers, a Helitanker and other resources that will be crucial in the battle against future

The event at the Air Tanker Base at Van Nuys Airport marked the seasonal arrival of two SuperScoopers from Quebec. a leased Coulson Group Chinook CH-47 helicopter known as a Helitanker 55 and the rest of the county fire department's fleet and aerial firefighting resources were also showcased.

Officials gave an update on the current wildfire season and an overview of the county fire department's ``Ready! Set! Go!" program that aims to help residents prepare for safe, rapid evacuations when fire danger comes.

``The question everyone wants to answer is, are we going to have a repeat of what happened in January (when the deadly Eaton and Palisades fires tore through Altadena and Pacific Palisades)?" asked Marrone. ``The forecast is for higher fire potential in Los Angeles County."

While fire season is now widely considered to be year-round in Southern California, the hottest weather typically comes in August and September.

Also Friday, California announced it has joined the Northwest Wildland Fire Protection Agreement, a compact created in 1998 that is one of eight of its kind operating across North America.

California and Nevada join the Canadian provinces of Alberta, Yukon Territory, Saskatchewan, Northwest Territories and British Columbia and the U.S. states Alaska, Idaho, Washington, Oregon, Montana and Hawaii.

The compact promotes `'effective prevention, suppression and control of forest fires in the Northwest wildland region of the United States and Western areas of Canada," according to a news release announcing that California and Nevada have joined. "It provides an efficient way for member states, provinces and territories to cope with wildland fires that might be beyond the capabilities of a single member agency, through information sharing, technology and resource distribution."

Order N-28-25 extends tenancy and occupancy protections to October 1, 2025 for people displaced by the wildfires.

LA SALLE GIRLS' TENNIS GAINING CONFIDENCE THROUGH PRESEASON TESTS

The La Salle girls' tennis team continues to shape its identity in the early stages of the season, with valuable lessons learned from both a tough 6-12 loss to Mayfield and a commanding 11-2 win over Duarte.

For head coach Javier Djeu, these preseason matches are about more than wins and losses — they're opportunities to fine-tune his lineup and prepare for the chal-

lenges ahead. "No one likes to cancel matches more than me," Coach Javier said after a scheduled match against Marshall was called off due to heat. "Preseason is where I get to test out doubles pairings, see the strengths and weaknesses of our singles players, and test our fitness. Luckily, the last two matches gave me a lot of data points to work off of. Pairings are looking good and fitness overall seems on par for where we are at in the season."



The Mayfield matchup provided a clear takeaway. "Playing the pressure points better — that was the only reason that match didn't go our way," Coach Javier explained. "We play a few points better and we win that match."

"That day we swept all nine sets, which gives me a lot of confidence going into the regular season where I am going to depend a lot on them."



Value Still Exists If You Know Where to Look By Peter Dills, L.A.'s King of Cuisine

My father once put together a pamphlet called Restaurants Under \$10. That was quite a feat back then, but try pulling that off today. These days, \$10 barely covers parking. Still, if you look hard enough, you can find a few places where your dollar stretches further than you'd expect.

Sprouts Grocery on Rosemead

You wouldn't think a grocery store deli would make the cut, but Sprouts has a \$5 sandwich that's the real deal. Pick your bread, pile on the meats, and for just \$1 more, add avocado. (And let's be honest, when is it ever just \$1 more for avocado?) For a price like that, I might start eating lunch in the produce aisle.

Plate 38 – Happy Hour Heaven

From 3 to 6 PM, Plate 38 gives you plenty of reason to clock out early. They've got discounted drinks and a lineup of small bites—tacos, fresh potato chips, even a mini burger. And if the burger doesn't quite do the job, there's no law against ordering two. Chef Robert Humphreys knows what he's doing, and so do the regulars who crowd the bar stools.

Kabuki - Sushi and Sake

Kabuki recently moved to San Gabriel and Colorado, but it's still one of my weekly stops. I did notice the Happy Hour Sapporo and sake went up from \$2 to \$3. I almost gasped—then I remembered we're living in 2025, and a \$3 beer is practically a unicorn. The sushi menu has plenty to choose from: spicy tuna rolls, salmon sashimi, hand rolls, even yellowtail jalapeño. For the price, it's still one of the better bargains around.

El Torito – Happy Hour Every Day

El Torito on Foothill stretches Happy Hour all the way from 3 to 9 PM every day. Six hours of specials—that's not a happy hour, that's a happy quarter of the day. Pints of beer are \$4, and the Spicy Piña Margarita is \$10. On the food side, here's where the bargains shine: \$4 street corn, mini tacos, and for you high rollers, \$10 mahi-mahi tacos. Thank you to my friend Scuba Joe for the recommendation. My only rule is this: if I can't taste the drink, it's not worth ordering. Fortunately, El Torito passes that test.

Final Thoughts

Hunting for value in 2025 is a little like looking for spare change under the couch cushions—it takes effort, but sometimes you come up with something good. Whether it's a \$5 sandwich, a \$3 beer, or tacos that don't break the bank, there are still deals out there if you know where to look. My father might not recognize the prices anymore, but I think he'd

agree: value is timeless, even if it costs a little more these days.

UNDERSTANDING THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN SKILLED NURSING AND ASSISTED LIVING

As we age, many of us begin to think about future care options. Two common choices—skilled nursing facilities and assisted living communities—are often confused, yet they serve very different needs. Knowing the difference can help seniors and their families make the best decision when the time comes.

Skilled nursing facilities provide 24-hour medical care and rehabilitation. These settings are appropriate for people recovering from surgery, illness, or those with chronic conditions requiring close supervision. Licensed nurses are always on site, and services can include physical therapy, IV treatments, wound care, and medication management. Skilled nursing is usually short term, serving as a bridge between a hospital stay and returning home. The good news is that skilled nursing is typically covered, at least in part, by Medicare or most health insurance plans.

Assisted living communities, on the other hand, are designed for seniors who want to maintain independence but may need help with daily activities. Residents typically live in private apartments or rooms and receive assistance with tasks such as bathing, dressing, meals, and transportation. Medical care is more limited than in skilled nursing, but staff are available around the clock to provide support and ensure safety. Assisted living is often private pay, which means residents or families are responsible for costs. However, long-term care insurance policies frequently cover assisted living, easing the financial burden for those who have planned ahead.

The choice between the two often comes down to health and financial needs. If a senior requires daily medical treatments or close monitoring, skilled nursing may be necessary. If the primary need is help with daily living and a supportive community, assisted living is usually the better fit.

Making informed choices ensures seniors receive the care—and quality of life—they deserve.

HOW TO GET HELP WITH YOUR MEDICARE COSTS

Dear Savvy Senior,

Does Medicare offer any financial assistance for struggling seniors? My mom lives primarily on her Social Security survivor benefit and is having a hard time paying her Medicare costs. Need Assistance



Dear Need,

There are actually several different financial assistance programs that can help Medicare beneficiaries who are having a difficult time paying their out-of-pocket health care costs. Here's what's available, along with the eligibility requirements and how to apply.

Medicare Savings Programs

Let's start with a program that helps pay premiums and out-of-pocket costs for Medicare Parts A and B. It's called the "Medicare Savings Program," and it has several different benefit levels for people based on their income and asset level. At its most generous the program will pay your Part A and B premiums and pretty much all your Medicare deductibles, coinsurance and copayments. At its least generous the program will pay just your Part B premium.

To qualify for a Medicare Savings Program, the minimum standard set by Medicare is an income under 135 percent of the federal poverty level, which at the moment works out to around \$1,715 a month for individuals (or \$2,320 for married couples). Everything counts towards income, including payouts from 401(k) plans, pensions, Social Security, and help from family members.

Medicare also allows states to impose an asset test, which can be as little as \$9,430 per individual (\$14,130 for married couples), not counting your house, car or personal belongs, but counting retirement savings and bank accounts.

But some states have made their Medicare Savings Programs a lot more generous, with much higher income limits and in some cases no asset tests at all. And the program may be called something else in your state. To find out if you qualify or to apply, contact your state Medicaid program. Visit Medicaid. gov or call all 800-633-4227 for contact information.

Medication Assistance

For help with Medicare (Part D) prescription drug plan costs, there is another completely separate lowincome subsidy program she may be eligible for called "Extra Help." To get it, your mom will need to apply through her Social Security office.

Depending on your mother's income level, this program will pay part or all of her Part D prescription drug plan's monthly premiums, annual deductibles and prescription co-payments. In 2025, individuals with a yearly income below \$23,475 (\$31,725 for a married couple), and assets under \$17,600 (\$35,130 for a married couple) can qualify for Extra Help.

If she's eligible to be in a Medicare Savings Program, she will automatically qualify for Extra Help. But because the requirements are slightly different, even if she doesn't qualify for a Medicare Savings Program for Part B, she might be able to get Extra Help for Part D. For more information or to apply, visit SSA.gov/medicare/part-d-extra-help or call Social Security at 800-772-1213.


Other Programs

Depending on your mom's income level, needs and location there are many other financial assistance programs that can help like Medicaid, SSI (Supplemental Security Income), PACE (Program of Allinclusive Care for the Elderly), SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program), (LIHEAP) Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program and many others.

To help you find out what types of assistance programs she may be eligible for, and learn how to apply for them, go to BenefitsCheckUp.org. This is a free, confidential website designed for people age 55 and older that contains more than 2,500 programs.

THIRTY YEARS IN THE JUNGLE Could You Do It? PART TWO

Can you imagine practicing your survival skills, completely living off the land, not for a summer, not for a year, but for 30 years? Two men did just that for 28 and 30 years. Both were World War II Japanese soldiers who steadfastly held to their orders to not surrender. Two of the more extreme cases were Shoichi Yokoi who was discovered in 1972, and Hiroo Onoda who finally came out in 1974. Both Yokoi and Onoda were on different islands with different circumstances, and neither would surrender.

We already learned the story of Shoichi Yokioi. Today we'll learn about Hiroo Onoda.

HIROO ONODA

Hiroo Onoda was sent to the jungle of Lubang Island of the Phillippines in December of 1944. His intelligence duties consisted of gathering information about the enemy movements and sabotaging the enemy rear. Within eight months the war was over, but Onoda refused to surrender until he had a direct order from his old commander. So Onoda and three enlisted men hid out on the island; one of the three others surrendered in 1950, and the two others died in a shootout with Philippine police in 1954 and 1972. But it would be 30 years before Onoda would be found, and convinced to surrender when they brought in his old commander. Onoda survived by setting up a series of hideouts on the 74 square mile island, and by stealing food (the island was occupied), and making sure his caches of live ammo were kept intact.

After returning home to Japan, Onoda said that the toughest part of the experience was losing his comrades. He added that there was nothing at all pleasant that happened to him during the entire 30 years. But, he added "My country today is rich and great. When my purpose in the war has been attained, in the fact that Japan today is rich and great, to have won or lost the war is entirely beside the point."

FOOD

Onoda survived on boiled bananas, and coconuts. They would pick the bananas as needed, cut it all up, skin and all, and boil it. The green bananas lost their bitterness this way, and they were often cooked in coconut milk or dried meats. "The result tasted like overcooked sweet potatoes. It was not good. But we ate this most of the time." Next to bananas, cows on the island provided meat for Onoda and his comrades. They killed about three a year. They would shoot cows that wandered away from the village, and shoot it in the evening, and best would be when there was a rain so the noise would be muffled. It took them about an hour to dismember a cow, and then they ate fresh meat for about three days, and dried the rest on drying racks.

WATER

Onoda always boiled his water since he believed it may have been contaminated by cattle.

CLOTHING

Onoda noted that his clothes were always rotting. He made a needle from some wire netting that he found, which he straightened and managed to put an eye on one end. He made thread from the fibres of a hemp-like plant that grew wild in the forest. He would patch and patch, and then even take pieces of canvas from the edges of his tents.

He would take old shoes and make sandals. He also wove straw sandals.

CIDE

Onoda did have ammunition which was used to make fire. He would remove the powder from ammo that was rusty and ignite it with a lens. He also would make fire using two dried pieces of split bamboo. One piece was hammered into the ground, and the other piece, held horizontally, would be stroked up and down to produce the coal. (He had plenty of time to practice!)

SHELTER

Onoda and the others would build a shelter during the wet season, and then just sleep in the open during the rest of the year. Site selection of the shelter was important. It had to be near food, but not too far from where the cows grazed. It had to be on the opposite side of the hill from the village so their fire or smoke would not be seen. They also built it on sloping ground. They would find one secure tree, and then build a pole structure that was secured to at least this one tree. Rafters were placed slantwise on the ridgepole and covered with coconut leaves. Everything was tied together with vines.

The stove consisted of two piles of flat rocks stacked close so that a fire could be built between them and a pole secured above to hang a pot. Onoda and a partner could build such a hut in seven or eight hours. Onoda stated that "during my entire 30 years on Lubang, I never once slept soundly through the night."

HEALTH

Onoda says he was sick "in bed" with a fever only once. Much time was spent digging and covering latrines; they used palm leaves for toilet paper. Though he had no soap, he often washed his clothes just in plain water and sometimes with kelp or lye from wood ashes. He washed his face daily, and brushed his teeth with the fibre from the palm trees. A doctor who examined Onoda after he came out of the jungle noted that he had no cavities.

Writing in Newsweek on March 25, 1974, Kermit Lansner states "As someone who is just about Onoda's age and served in the Great Pacific War (as the Japanese call it), I have spent most of my patrimony on dentists. There is not much I admire about Onoda, but I do hope we learn something from his teeth."

It seems unlikely that most readers will ever undergo anything as intense as the years spent in the jungle by Shoichi Yokoi and Hiroo Onoda. They demonstrated that one doesn't need the trinkets of modern society to remain healthy. By studying the rigors they underwent, we all should be able to see the folly of so many of our preferences and preconceptions, and should discover that most of our "limits" are far beyond what we have chosen to accept.



PUSH HARDER OR TRAIN SMARTER

For decades, the mantra in fitness was simple: push harder. Sweat, sore muscles, and long hours in the gym were seen as proof that you were working hard. ALL THINGS by Jeff Brown

WHAT IS THAT SPACE OBJECT FLYING BY?

NASA is tracking a mysterious, fast-moving object entering our solar system, raising questions about whether it's just a comet — or possibly something more advanced.



The object, known as 3I-ATLAS, was discovered on July 1 by a telescope in Chile. It's the third interstellar object ever recorded entering our solar system, and is hurtling toward the sun at about 130,000 miles per hour, making it the fastest of its kind ever detected.

Scientists estimate its size could range from the length of Boston's Ted Williams Tunnel, or 1.6 miles, to as long as Manhattan's diameter, about 14 miles across.

"From images, we also saw that this object is active, which means that around the nucleus, there is some coma, which is an indication that this object is, in fact, a comet," explained NASA navigation engineer Davide Farnocchia.

But a Harvard University physicist believes there's more to the story.

A Hubble Space Telescope image captured in July shows a glow coming from the object in an unusual direction, said Dr. Abraham "Avi" Loeb, director of Harvard's Institute for Theory and Computation."It shows a glow ahead of the object, not behind it," he said. "If it were a standard comet, we would expect some dust to be shed off the surface of the object, and the dust will be pushed behind the object as a result of the solar radiation pressure." Loeb has written about the object on his blog — even developing a probability scale to weigh the chances that it may not be a natural object.

"This object is unprecedented because of its inferred size, and its inferred trajectory, which is quite fine-tuned to be in the plane of the planets around the sun," he said.

For now, scientists are treating 3I-ATLAS as a comet. Its trajectory is expected stay away from Earth, passing by Jupiter, Mars and the sun before missing our planet by 170 million miles. Still, Loeb cautions that more observations are needed.

"As we get more data, when the sun puts more heat on this object, it might reveal its true nature," he said. "It could be a wakeup call for humanity if we realize that there is a smarter kid on our block."Currently, the object is near Jupiter. Researchers hope new telescope images will help determine what it is.

"Trump's excessive use of emergency powers is itself an emergency." – Timothy Noah in The New Republic

President Trump justified sending the National Guard to Washington, D.C. by declaring it a "public safety emergency" - despite its Metropolitan Police Department noting that violent crime was at a thirty-year low. If it seems there's been a lot of these "emergencies" declared recently, it's because there has – as a pretext for Trump do-

declared recently, it's because there has – as a pretext for Trump doing what he wants without having to bother with whatever our Constitution might say about it.

There were 13 "emergencies" declared during the eight years under George W. Bush, 12 during the two terms of Barack Obama. Trump nearly doubled the pace with 11 declared over the four years of his first term, with 9 during Joe Biden's term in office. It now looks like 10 "emergencies" already declared here in Trump's second term – and we're only about seven months in.

Similarities have been noted between Trump as president and when he was running his private businesses (as he probably still is). One such constant is using our court system to "run out the clock", or to simply wear down whatever opposition. It appears, though, that as appeals run out, courts are less willing to accept emergency declarations as an all-purpose excuse.

Three months ago, Trump sent ICE, National Guard and federal troops to "liberate Los Angeles from the Migrant Invasion". Last week, U.S. District Judge Charles Breyer ruled that the law expressly prohibits the military from engaging in civilian law enforcement, while it's clear from the evidence that's what they were doing. Breyer noted that "while there were indeed protests in Los Angeles, and some individuals engaged in violence . . . There was no rebellion, nor was civilian law enforcement unable to respond to the protests and enforce the law".

Testimony showed that troops had been given instructions on what they could and couldn't do under the Posse Comitatus Act. But that training was ditched when, "all the way from the top" at the Defense Department, notification came of some "constitutional exception" that applied. Judge Breyer made clear that "These actions demonstrate that Defendants knew that they were ordering troops to execute domestic law beyond their usual authority. Whether they believed that some constitutional or other exception applied does not matter; 'ignorance of the law is no excuse'". He concluded that Trump and Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth were effectively creating a "national police force with the president as its chief".

Also last week, the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that no, you can't just summarily round up and deport alleged gang members without due process under the Alien Enemies Act of 1798. Trump had argued it applied because they were somehow controlled by Venezuelan President Maduro – but didn't offer any evidence to back that up. Lee Gelernt, who argued the case for the ACLU, described the ruling as "a critically important decision reining in the administration's view that it can simply declare an emergency without any oversight from the courts".

On Friday before Labor Day, the U.S. Court of Appeals upheld a lower court ruling that no, those tariffs aren't constitutional. The power to impose tariffs rests solely with Congress. Trump argued he had emergency power to impose them under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act of 1977, which, as one of the judges noted, doesn't even mention tariffs – let alone authorize a president to ever impose one. This could get messy, as it might involve having to pay back countries for tariffs already collected. In response, Trump warns that, "If allowed to stand, this Decision would literally destroy the United States of America".

It looks like there might be yet another "emergency" just around the corner. Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent says, "We may declare a national housing emergency in the fall". A year ago, candidate Kamala Harris made housing a major issue in her campaign. Her proposal included tax credits for builders of starter homes and \$25,000 down payment assistance for first-time homebuyers. As for what Trump is proposing, Bessent says, "We're trying to figure out what we can do".

We know what Trump has done already. Tariffs on building materials and round-ups of undocumented construction workers have made housing more unaffordable still. As reported by Associated Press, Trump has wanted to axe a federal program that for decades has helped rural communities build and repair homes.

Timothy Noah pointed out in his New Republic article a major irony: how woefully lacking Trump has been in dealing with actual disasters. "Even as Trump makes up fake emergencies, he blows off the real ones." For the agency that actually has "Emergency" in its name, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), Trump has suggested doing away with it altogether.

As for this proposed new declaration of a housing emergency, House Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries (D-NY) told reporters; "Donald Trump promised that he would lower housing costs on day one. Here's a suggestion for the Trump administration: Try to legislate. And maybe we can find common ground in order to get something done on behalf of the American people."

With actually trying to "legislate" being off the table for both Trump and House Republicans, heading to the polls in coming months becomes not just participating in an election; it's dealing with a national emergency.
